BROWN IN TOWN

The #19 St. Cloud State men's hockey team (8-7-3, 7-5-2 WCHA) will host Brown University (5-7-1, 3-4-1 ECAC), for a pair of 6:07 p.m. games at the National Hockey Center (5,371 cap./200x100) in St. Cloud, Minn.. The games will be aired live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel making the call. KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org) will broadcast the game live on both nights. On television, fans can watch Charter's Mainstreet Network channel 14 in the St. Cloud area for live coverage of the games with Rob Hudson providing the play-by-play. Fans can also watch the game on the web by tapping into the B2 Networks live video stream at www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics.

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ *In the most recent USCHO.com poll, SCSU was ranked #19 in the nation. This marked the third consecutive week that the Huskies have been ranked among the top 20 teams in the USCHO.com poll this season. SCSU was also ranked #20 in the INCH Power Rankings on Dec. 13.*

■ *SCSU freshman netminder Mike Lee was recently named to the roster of the 2010 U.S. National Junior Team. He is scheduled to be playing with Team USA at the World Junior Championships in Canada on Dec. 26-Jan. 5.*

■ *The Huskies have faced a tough schedule in 2009-10. So far this season, SCSU has played 14 games against teams with national rankings including Miami, Union, Minnesota Duluth, North Dakota, Denver, Wisconsin and Colorado College. SCSU is recognized as having the nation's toughest schedule in the most recent KRACH poll released by USCHO.com.*

■ *Brian Volpei had a weekend of career-firsts against Colorado College on Dec. 11-12. On Dec. 11, Volpei hit the first shorthanded goal of his college career. On Dec. 12, Volpei charted his first career penalty shot in a game vs. the Tigers. The penalty shot was SCSU's first penalty shot attempt since March 10, 2006.*

■ *On the subject of short-handed goals, SCSU now has six SHGs this season, which is tops in Division I hockey this winter.*

■ *It will be a busy weekend at the NHC, as a total of six college hockey games will be played at SCSU on Jan. 2-3. Prior to both games vs. Brown, the SCSU women's team will host the Easton Holiday Hockey Classic at the NHC featuring Providence, Mercyhurst, SCSU and Minnesota State.*

■ *SCSU will return to the National Hockey Center to complete a six-game homestand with two home games against Michigan Tech on Jan. 8-9. The Jan. 9 game will start at 5:07 p.m.*

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU was ranked 19th in the USCHO.com poll and 20th in the INCH poll this week. SCSU did receive vote's in this week's USA Hockey poll...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

About Last Week...

Dec. 11: at #17 SCSU 4, #6 Colorado College 4 OT

On Dec. 11, SCSU skated to a 4-4 OT tie against nationally ranked Colorado College at the NHC. Ben Hanowski, Tony Mosey, Garrett Roe and Brian Volpei all scored goals in the comeback tie against CC on Dec. 11. In the game, SCSU trailed 3-0 in the second before staging its rally that ended with Volpei's short-handed game tying goal in the third period. The short-handed goal by Volpei was his first as a Husky. Mike Lee made 41 saves in the game. SCSU was 2-of-6 on the power play and hit a season-high with 31 penalty minutes in the game. CC was 1-of-7 on the advantage, and Joe Howe had 33 savers in the game. Of note, CC outshot the Huskies 45-37.

Dec. 12: #6 Colorado College 4, at #17 SCSU 1

SCSU completed the weekend against #6 Colorado College with a tough 4-1 loss at the NHC before 6,053 fans. CC jumped to a 1-0 lead in the first period and stretch its lead to 2-0 before SCSU's Jared Festler scored an unassisted goal in the second period to make it 2-1. The rally was short-lived, as CC's Nick Dineen and Matt Overman scored a pair of goals in the second period to make the final 4-1. CC outshot the Huskies 26-20 in the game, as Mike Lee made 22 saves for the Huskies. Joe Howe was the goalie of record with 18 saves in the game. A second period highlight for the fans was a penalty shot attempt by the Huskies. CC was called for falling on a loose puck in their own crease, and Brian Volpei got the rare chance at the penalty shot at 14:26 of the second period. Howe forced a wide shot by Volpei on the attempt. On the power play, SCSU was 0-4 and CC was 0-3.

TEAM USA: SCSU freshman goalie Mike Lee has been named to the 2010 U.S. National Junior Team. Lee will be out this weekend with Team USA at the World Junior Championships, which will be held Dec. 26-Jan. 5, in Regina and Saskatoon, Sask. Lee joins an elite group of Huskies who have skated at the World Junior Championships for Team USA. This group includes Tony Burns (1991), Matt Cullen (1996), Mark Parrish (1996 and 1997), Bobby Goepfert (2003) and Casey Borer (2005). Current Husky Oliver Lauridsen played for the Danish National Junior Team in 2009, while Andreas Nodl (2004) and Gert Prohaska (1994) both skated for the Austrian National Junior Team at the World Championships.

TOUGH TASK: The first half of the 2009-10 season has been no easy task for the Huskies. SCSU has been rated with one of the toughest schedules in Division I hockey this winter, and the Huskies' opponents this winter have already included nationally ranked Miami, Union, Minnesota Duluth, North Dakota, Denver, Wisconsin and Colorado College. The second half of the season will see the trend continue with games scheduled against nationally ranked Quinnipiac, Colorado College, North Dakota and Wisconsin.

SHORT ORDER: As of Dec. 17, SCSU led all NCAA Division I teams this winter with six short-handed goals. Ironically, SCSU set a team record for fewest SHGs in a season last winter with just two during the 2008-09 campaign. The team record of 14 SHGs was set in 1993-94.

HUSKY TIDBITS: Junior forward Garrett Roe scored a goal and an assist in the Huskies' tie against CC on Dec. 11. He is now tied for the team's scoring lead at 14 points along with senior Ryan Lasch. Roe now has four goals and 10 assists this season. In his career, Roe has 39 goals, 68 assists for 107 points in 94 games as a Husky...Ryan Lasch, who ranks fourth in the SCSU career charts with 148 points (68g, 80a), saw his eight-game point streak snapped on Dec. 11. Lasch has played in 136 consecutive games during his career at SCSU...The Huskies received a rare penalty shot attempt on Dec. 12, after a CC player covered a loose puck in the crease during the second period. Brian Volpei's attempt on the penalty shot went wide of the target. Prior to that attempt, the last time SCSU received a penalty shot in a game was on March 26, 2006 at Colorado College. Of note, this marked the fifth time this season that CC has been involved in a penalty shot situation...Nick Oslund and Aaron Marvin are scheduled to sign autographs in the Husky Autograph Den on Jan. 2. Nate Hardy and Dan Dunn are scheduled to sign on Jan. 3... in action against teams from the ECAC, the Huskies are 26-13-3. In 2009-10, SCSU's other ECAC opponents include Union (T, 3-3, W 3-1) and Quinnipiac..Coach Bob Motzko is 1-0-1 during his career in games played against Brown.

ON DECK: The Huskies will complete a six-game homestay with a pair of WCHA dates at the National Hockey Center against Michigan Tech on Jan. 8-9. The game on Jan. 8 will begin at 7:07 p.m., while the Jan. 9 game will begin at 5:07 p.m. The game on Jan. 9 will also feature a salute to the area Top 10 Club, which recognizes the outstanding students at high school's in the St. Cloud area. The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 89-67-22 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 53 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons. and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, four-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.

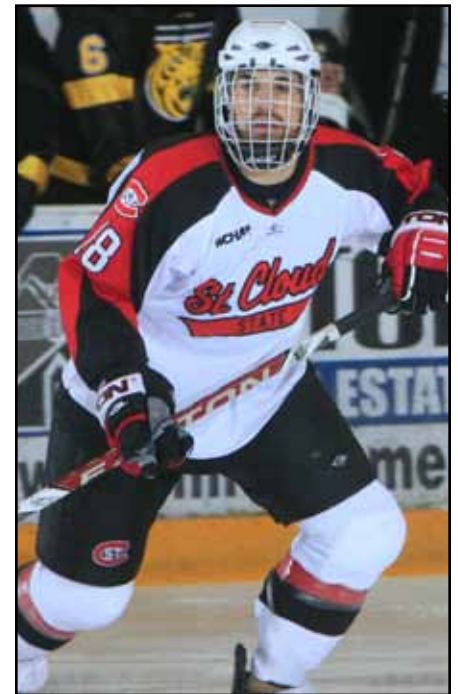
