## Storylines of the Week

- The Tigers play a WCHA opponent for the first time since mid-December when St. Cloud State University invades the World Arena for two important league games on Friday and Saturday. The series marks SCSU's first trip to Colorado Springs in two years, since late January 2010.
- While No. 8-ranked Colorado College is 9-3-1 at home and 11-2-1 overall on Olympic-size ice surfaces this season, the Huskies are accustomed to playing on a big sheet of their own at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud.
- CC needs to rediscover its touch around the net, as well as its winning formula at the World Arena, after scoring just seven goals and going just 1-2-1 in the first four outings of its current six-game home stand that reaches a conclusion this weekend.

## Icers Looking to Solidify WCHA Position In Two-Game Series vs. St. Cloud State

**Big Points at Stake:** Colorado College resumes league play for the first time in nearly a month this weekend when the Tigers take on St. Cloud State University in a pair of key contests at the World Arena (7,380 seating capacity). Faceoff is 7:37 p.m. MT Friday and 7:07 p.m. Saturday.

**For the Record:** CC, which currently occupies third place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association with a 9-5 mark in league play, is 12-7-1 overall after last week's 3-1 loss and 3-3 tie against non-conference opponent Cornell University at home...The Huskies, who haven't played since splitting a non-conference series with Western Michigan University at St. Cloud's National Hockey Center two weekends ago, are 8-10-4 overall and 5-6-3 in the WCHA. They're tied with Michigan Tech for seventh place heading into this week's action.

**Coach's Corner: Scott Owens** (Colorado College '79), the program's all-time leader in terms of both coaching longevity and victories, is in his 13th season at the helm. He's 293-176-42 (.614) in 511 games behind the bench, including a 21-15-4 (.575) mark against St. Cloud State...**Bob Motzko** (SCSU '87) is in his seventh season as head coach at his alma mater, where he has compiled a record of 128-102-33 (.549).

**The All-Time Series:** Friday's series opener marks the 82nd all-time meeting between Colorado College and the Huskies. CC owns a 44-31-6 advantage in the previous 81 after winning at St. Cloud's National Hockey Center in December 2010. However, the Tigers are just 12-11-2 (.520) in 25 encounters at the World Arena, where SCSU earned a split in its last visit almost two years ago, in late January 2010.

**In the Polls:** Colorado College is No. 8 in this week's national polls published on Monday by *U.S. College Hockey Online* and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine*. The Tigers are No. 7 in *Inside College Hockey's* power rankings and tied for No. 9 in the Pairwise rankings that mirror the selection process for the 16-team NCAA tournament field...St. Cloud State, currently tied for 30th in the Pairwise, is not listed in either poll or in the INCH power rankings.

**Opponents to Watch:** St. Cloud State's top scoring threat up front is junior **Ben Hanowski**, with 24 points (12g,12a) in 22 games. Two senior forwards, **Jared Fester** (9g,8a) and **Travis Novak** (7g,10a) – along with sophomore defenseman **Nick Jensen** (4g,13a) – have 17 apiece.

Freshman **Ryan Faragher** has started 17 games in net, posting a 2.80 goals-against average and .910 saves percentage to go long with his 6-8-3 record. Hanowski and Jensen, who has been credited with two game-winning goals this season, are among seven NHL draft picks on the Huskies' roster.

**A Look Back at Last Week:** Despite peppering Cornell's goaltender with 40 shots on target in Friday's series opener, the Tigers could manage only a power-play tally by senior center/team captain **Nick Dineen (Omaha, NE)** in the 3-1 defeat. They salvaged Saturday's tie when sophomore left wing **Jaden Schwartz (Wilcox, SK)**, who returned to the lineup after a six-game absence, struck for his second red lightner of the game with 29.1 seconds left in regulation and junior goalie **Joe Howe (Plymouth, MN)** on the bench in favor of a sixth attacker. Howe finished with 19 saves in the game, while sophomore **Josh Thorimbert (Saskatoon, SK)** made 21 in his sixth consecutive start a night earlier. Schwartz, who served as team captain for bronze medalist Canada at the recent IIHF Junior World Championship, also set up older brother **Rylan Schwartz's (Wilcox, SK)** 17th goal of the season on Saturday, when senior defenseman **Gabe Guentzel (Woodbury, MN)** contributed his second and third assists of the weekend.

**Continuing Trend:** Fourteen of Colorado College's 20 outings this season, including two in which its opponent has clinched victory with an empty netter in the final minute of play, have been one-goal games (Cornell scored an ENG with 7.6 seconds left in last Friday's contest to put the finishing touch on its 3-1 triumph). CC is 7-6-1 in those 14 outings, including a 2-0-1 mark in overtime.

**Special Teams Update:** The Tigers have held their opponent scoreless on the power play in three consecutive games and in 11 overall so far this campaign. They've scored at least one PPG of their own in 15 outings, including both last weekend when they converted on three of nine chances against Cornell. They rank first in the WCHA and sixth nationally in power-play efficiency, at 26.1 percent (24-for-92) overall for the season, but still are just eighth league-wide and 42nd in the country in penalty killing, at 79.3 percent (65-of-82). In 14 conference games to date, CC also leads the WCHA at 28.1 percent (18-for-64) on the power play but is dead last in penalty killing at 73.8 percent (45-of-61).

**Keeping Elite Company:** Rylan Schwartz, who was named WCHA Offensive Player of the Week three times during the first half of the season, heads into this week's series against St. Cloud ranked first in the league and second nationally with 0.89 goals per game in '11-12. Schwartz has scored 21 times in his last 22 outings after totaling 12 tallies in his first 77 appearances as a Tiger. three and assisting on one. He's scored seven GWG and assisted on 15 during his career. This week's series opener marks his 100th game in a Colorado College uniform.

**Production from the Blue Line:** The three assists by Guentzel and one by junior **Mike Boivin (Delta, BC)** last weekend gave CC's defensive corps a total of 53 points (13g,40a) for the season. With six goals, 13 assists and 19 points, Boivin already has more than doubled his career totals in all three categories and is tied for third in overall scoring among WCHA blue-line specialist. He's posted four multiple-point performances and collected at least one in 15 games this campaign, sharing the team lead in that category with Rylan Schwartz.

**The Team's Iron Man:** Alternate captain Guentzel heads into this week's series against St. Cloud State having played in 116 consecutive games for the Tigers. He's missed only two, both during his freshman season, of a possible 142 during his collegiate career. Of his 84 points (15g,69a) in a Colorado College jersey, 50 (8g,42a) have come on power plays after he helped set up a PPG in each contest against Cornell last week. The 84 points overall ranks second to Rylan Schwartz's 92 (33g,59a) among current CC players, and Guentzel's 16 overall (3g,13a) for the season places him at No. 8 among defensemen throughout the WCHA.

**Signs of Consistency:** Thorimbert backstopped the Tigers to a 4-2 record, all without Jaden Schwartz in the lineup, during his recent streak of six consecutive starts. Now 7-3 for the season and 12-7-1 for his collegiate career, he heads into this week's action with the fifth lowest goals-against average (2.46) and sixth best saves percentage (.913) in the WCHA after posting a 1.83 GAA and .928 saves ratio in those last six appearances between the pipes.

**Tiger Bites:** Still a perfect 10-0 this season when leading after two periods, Colorado College is just 1-5 when trailing and 1-2-1 when tied after 40 minutes of play...CC attempted a season-high 92 shots, including the 40 that reached the Cornell goalie, in last Friday's 3-1 defeat...Despite scoring just seven times in their last four outings, the Tigers continue to rank third nationally behind WCHA rivals Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota with an average of 3.70 goals per game...Colorado College no longer owns the dubious distinction of leading the nation in shorthanded goals allowed, as the University of Maine and Sacred Heart now have given up eight apiece compared to CC's seven...The Tigers completed the non-conference portion of their regular season schedule with a 3-2-1 record vs. opponents from outside the WCHA. Five of those games, in which they went 3-1-1, were against teams from the ECAC...Including a 17-1-1 mark in exhibition games, Colorado College is 217-87-15 (.704) in 319 all-time dates at the World Arena.
