HOME FOR THE HOLIDAY

The #17 St. Cloud State men's hockey team (8-6-2, 7-4-1 WCHA) will host #6 Colorado College (10-4-2, 7-3-2 WCHA) on Dec. 11-12, for a pair of 7:07 p.m. games at the National Hockey Center (5,371 cap./200x100) in St. Cloud, Minn.. The games will be aired live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel making the call. KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org) will broadcast the game live on both nights. On television, fans can watch Charter's Mainstreet Network channel 14 in the St. Cloud area for live coverage of the games with Rob Hudson and Mike Doyle providing the play-by-play. Fans can also watch the game on the web by tapping into the B2 Networks live video stream at www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics.

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ *The Huskies have moved up three spots in the national polls this week to #17 on the USCHO.com and INCH polls, which were released on Dec. 7. SCSU received votes in the USA Hockey poll this week.*

■ *For the second time this season, freshman netminder Mike Lee, a Phoenix Coyotes draft pick in 2009, was named the WCHA Rookie of the Week for his stellar play against Alaska Anchorage on Dec. 4-5. Lee was recently named to the preliminary roster of the 2010 U.S. National Junior Team.*

■ *The Huskies have faced a tough schedule in 2009-10. So far this season, SCSU has played eight games against teams with national rankings #1 (Miami) or #3 (North Dakota, #2 Denver, #11 Wisconsin and #12 Minnesota Duluth). SCSU's schedule in 2009-10 is currently ranked the second toughest schedule in the nation in the latest KRACH poll released by USCHO.com. No rest for the weary this weekend, as the Huskies will host #6 ranked Colorado College at the NHC on Dec. 11-12.*

■ *Senior Ryan Lasch brings an eight-game point scoring streak into the games vs. CC this weekend. Lasch has scored 148 points (68 goals/80 assists) during his fabled career with the Huskies.*

■ *The sweep at UAA was the first of the season for the Huskies, and it marked the first time that the Huskies have charted a sweep on the road since Feb. 15-16, 2008 at Alaska Anchorage.*

■ *The last time the Huskies played the CC Tigers at the NHC, the two teams split. On Dec. 14, 2007, the Huskies lost 3-1 and on Dec. 15, 2007, the Huskies gained a 4-2 win at the NHC. Last year at the World Arena, SCSU skated to a 4-4 tie and a 6-1 win on Jan. 23-24, 2009.*

■ *The Huskies will enjoy a two-week break for the Holidays before returning to action on Jan. 2-3 for a pair of 6:07 p.m. starts against Brown. This will be a rare Saturday-Sunday weekend series at the NHC.*

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU was ranked 17th in the USCHO.com poll and the INCH poll this week. SCSU did receive vote's in this week's USA Hockey poll...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

About Last Week...

Dec. 4: #20 SCSU 3, at Alaska Anchorage 1

SCSU brought home the victory in game one of the UAA series with a three-goal first period that was started with a power play goal at 7:42 by Ryan Lasch. The Huskies pushed their lead to 2-0 with a power play goal at 12:28 by Nick Oslund. To finish the SCSU offense for the evening, Jordy Christian charted a short-handed goal at 18:42 of the first period. UAA closed the gap to 3-1 in the second period with a goal at 16:56 by Sean Wiles. SCSU freshman netminder Mike Lee shut the Seawolves in the third period, and helped SCSU maintain its two-goal lead until the final horn. Lee had 15 saves in the contest and UAA goalie Jon Olthuis had 14 saves in the game. In the game, SCSU outshot the Seawolves 17-16. On the power play, SCSU was 2-of-7 and UAA was 0-of-5 in the game. SCSU dominated the game early as it outshot UAA 14-3 in the first period.

Dec. 5: #20 SCSU 3, at Alaska Anchorage 2

The Seawolves gained a 1-0 lead at 2:34 of the first period with a power play goal by Kevin Clark. Assists were provided by Tommy Grant and Alex Gellert. The Huskies tied the game at 15:47 of the first period with an even-strength tally by Oslund. SCSU gained a 2-1 lead in the game with a short-handed goal by junior Aaron Marvin at :25 of the second period. Marvin continued his offensive surge at 8:13 of the second period with the game-winning goal against UAA. UAA's Craig Parkinson pushed the score to 3-2 with a goal at 1:25 of the third period. Once again, SCSU's Mike Lee was solid in the nets with 11 saves in the third period to help the Huskies ice the game. In total, Lee notched 27 saves in the game as UAA outshot the Huskies 29-24. Bryce Christianson was the goalie of record for UAA with 21 saves. Lee is now 4-4-2 on the season, and his goals against average has now dropped to 2.38 and his save rate stands at .915 in 2009-10. On the power play, SCSU was 0-of-6 and the Seawolves were 1-of-3 in the contest.



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

WCHA HONOR ROLL: For the second time this season, Mike Lee was named the WCHA Rookie of the Week on Dec. 8. Lee gained wins in both games for the Huskies at UAA with a total of 42 saves over the weekend. On the 2009-10 season, Lee owns a 4-4-2 overall record with a 2.38 goals-against average and a .915 saves percentage. He is a draftee of the NHL's Phoenix Coyotes. He also gained league ROW honors on Nov. 24.

EIGHT AND COUNTING: Senior forward Ryan Lasch continued his hot hand at UAA, as he now owns an 8-game point scoring streak headed into the CC series. Lasch scored a power play marker on Dec. 4, and also notched an assist on Aaron Marvin's game winner on Dec. 5. Lasch has now scored 7 goals and 4 assists for 11 points in the last eight games. In his career, Lasch ranks 4th in the Huskies records with 148 points. He also has 68 goals and 31 power play goals in his career at SCSU.

ON THE SHORT LIST: SCSU ranks first in the nation with five short-handed goals in 2009-10. At UAA, Jordy Christian scored a SHG on Dec. 4 and Aaron Marvin carded a shorthy on Dec. 5. This marked the first time that Christian and Marvin have scored SHGs during their careers at SCSU. This already marks the most SHGs scored in a season for the Huskies since they hit seven SHGs in 2005-06. The team record for SHGs in a season is 14 in 1993-94... Marvin, who scored 10 goals in 2008-09, returned to the goal scoring column this weekend with two goals in the Huskies' 3-2 win on Dec. 5. These were Marvin's first goals of the 2009-10 season. Marvin scored the game winner against UAA on Dec. 5.

TEAM LEADERS: Junior Nick Oslund owns a two-game goal scoring streak for the Huskies and he now has 3g/7a in 2009-10. Ryan Lasch continues to lead the team with 14 points this season (9g/5a) while junior Garrett Roe ranks second on the club with 12 points. Roe leads the team with nine assists this winter. Of note, Oslund leads the team with two game winning goals this season.

DID YOU KNOW?: SCSU is 6-0-1 when it leads the game after the end of the 2nd period. SCSU is 7-1-2 when it scores on the power play this season. SCSU is 1-5-0 when it fails to score on the power play this season.

HOME SWEET HOME: The upcoming games against Colorado College will mark the start of a 6-game homestand for the Huskies. Home ice has been a rare commodity for the Huskies in recent weeks. Since Oct. 30, the Huskies have played eight of their 10 games on the road, including trips to Michigan Tech, North Dakota, Denver and UAA. In addition to the games against CC, the Huskies will also host Brown on Jan. 2-3 and Michigan Tech on Jan. 8-9. Of note, SCSU is 3-1-2 at home in 2009-10, and the Huskies are 5-5-0 on the road. SCSU will play 7 of its next 9 games at the National Hockey Center.

HUSKY TIDBITS: Sophomore defender Oliver Lauridsen, a draft pick of the Philadelphia Flyers in 2009, scored two assists in the Huskies' win over UAA on Dec. 5... SCSU ranks 13th in the nation with a goals against average of 2.44 this season.... the Huskies will face another nationally ranked team next weekend when they host #6 Colorado College. SCSU has the second strongest schedule in Division I hockey this winter according to the current KRACH poll issued by USCHO.com. SCSU's schedule this season has included games against #1 Miami, #3 North Dakota, #2 Denver, #12 Minnesota Duluth and #16 Wisconsin. SCSU is 4-5-1 in games played against those nationally rated teams this season.... The Huskies own a three-game winning streak and have won 5 of their last 7 games this season...SCSU moved up 3 spots in the latest USCHO.com and INCH college polls to #17 this week. The Huskies also received votes in the USA Hockey poll for the first time since Nov. 23...Sam Zabkowicz is an impressive +10 on the plus/minus during his career with the Huskies.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 89-66-21 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 52 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons. and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, four-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.
