The #5 St. Cloud State University (17-7-3, 11-5-2 WCHA) will travel to #11 Colorado College (14-9-3, 10-7-3 WCHA) on Jan. 29-30. The game on Jan. 29 will start at 8:37 p.m. (CT) and the game on Jan. 30 will start at 8:07 p.m. (CT). Both games will be played at the World Arena (7,343 cap./200x100) in Colorado Springs, Colo...fans can listen to the game live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don "The Voice of the Huskies" Lyons making the call from shadow of Pikes Peak.

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ *SCSU was ranked 5th in the Pairwise rankings on Jan. 25 at 1 p.m. These rankings mimic the criteria used by the NCAA to determine the 16 teams for postseason tournament play.*

■ *In the most recent USCHO.com poll, SCSU moved up to #5 in the nation. This marked the seventh consecutive week that the Huskies have been ranked among the top 20 teams in the USCHO.com poll this season. SCSU was also ranked #7 in the INCH Power Rankings and #5 USA Hockey poll on Jan. 25. CC was ranked #11 in the polls. Of note, the #5 ranking is SCSU's best national ranking since a #4 ranking on March 12, 2007.*

■ *The Huskies have won eight consecutive games dating back to Jan. 2, 2010. This is the second longest active win streak in DI hockey, and this is SCSU's longest win streak since a 12-game run from Nov. 17, 2006 to Jan. 6, 2007.*

■ *Garrett Raboin named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week and David Eddy named WCHA Rookie of the Week on Jan. 26.*

■ *The last time SCSU lost a game was a 4-1 setback against Colorado College on Dec. 12, 2009 at the NHC. SCSU is 11-1-1 since Nov. 28, 2009.*

■ *Former Husky Ryan Malone (1999-2003) was named to the 2010 USA men's hockey team, which will compete at the upcoming Winter Olympic games in Vancouver.*

■ *Garrett Roe owns an 8-game point streak going into the CC series. He leads the club with 18 assists and 25 points, while Ryan Lasch leads the team with 11 goals this winter.*

■ *Junior goalie Dan Dunn ranks first among DI goalies with a .818 winning rate this winter (9-2-0). He also ranks second in the WCHA with .926 save rate and a 2.18 GAA in 2009-10.*

■ *The #5 Huskies will return to the NHC on Feb. 5-6 for a pair of games against Alaska Anchorage. Game time on Feb. 5 is 7:07 p.m., and the game on Feb. 6 will start at 5:07 p.m. at the NHC.*

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU was ranked 5th in the USCHO.com poll, #5 in the USA Hockey poll and 7th in the INCH poll this week...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

About Last Week...

Jan. 22: at #12 St. Cloud State 4, Minnesota 3

SCSU snapped a 7-game losing streak against Minnesota with a big 4-3 victory at the NHC on Jan. 22. The Huskies grabbed a 3-0 lead in the contest and held on for the win. In the first period, SCSU's Garrett Raboin, Jared Festler and Garrett Roe all scored goals to give the Huskies a 3-0 lead. In the second period, UM's Tony Lucia made it 3-1 at 2:18, before SCSU's David Eddy grabbed the game winner at 6:12 of the second. He was assisted on the play by Tony Mosey and Taylor Johnson. The goal was needed as UM replied in the closing minutes of the second period with goals by Jacob Cepis and Jake Hansen to make the final 4-3. In the game, SCSU was outshot 42-33, but Dan Dunn made 39 saves and brought home his 9th win of the season and his .6th consecutive win. SCSU was 0-4 on the PP and UM was 1-3.

Jan. 23: #12 St. Cloud State 4, at Minnesota 1

SCSU gained its 4th weekend sweep of the new year with a strong 4-1 victory at Mariucci Arena on Jan. 23. This was SCSU's first win at Mariucci since a 3-1 win on Jan. 11, 2008. The Huskies wasted little time in setting the game's tempo as Taylor Johnson scored his first collegiate goal with a power play marker at 2:07 of the first period with helpers from Sam Zabkowicz and Garrett Roe. David Eddy gained his third consecutive GWG at 13:09 of the first with his goal as assist were added by Roe and Tony Mosey. In the second period, Jared Festler scored at 4:21 with assists from Ryan Lasch and Garrett Raboin. Minnesota snapped the shutout for Mike Lee at 3:35 of the third period with a goal by Cade Fairchild. In the closing minutes of play, Festler scored an empty netter with an assist from Lasch at 18:57. The Huskies were outshot in the game 43-21, but it didn't matter since Lee loomed large between the pipes with a career-high 42 saves for the Huskies. On the power play, SCSU was 1-2 and UM was 0-2. In this classic two-game series, a combined total of over 16,000 fans watched these games (6,178 at SCSU and 10,022 at UM).



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

FIRST TIMER: Freshman defender Taylor Johnson notched his first goal as a collegiate player with a power play marker at Mariucci Arena that gave the Huskies a 1-0 lead in the first period. He added an assist on Jan. 22, which pushed his season totals to one goal and four assists in 2009-10.

STREAK SNAPPED: The victory over Minnesota on Jan. 22 snapped a seven-game losing streak by the Huskies against the Gophers, and an eight-game winless streak. The weekend sweep marked the first time the Huskies have swept the Gophers since Feb. 23-24, 2007 (when the Huskies won 5-1 and 5-3). The victory on Jan. 23, was SCSU's first win at Mariucci Arena since Nov. 11, 2008. The victory on Jan. 22, was the first win for the Huskies over Minnesota at the NHC since Feb. 23, 2007.

EDDY PULLS GOPHERS DOWN - POW: Rookie forward David Eddy also enjoyed a strong debut against Minnesota with two games winning goals in the series. Eddy now has seven goals and seven assists this winter. He has also posted the GWG in SCSU's last three victories. Eddy was named the WCHA Rookie of the Week for his play vs. UM.

CAREER-HIGH: Freshman goalie Mike Lee gained his seventh victory over 2009-10 with a career-high 42 saves in the Huskies' 4-1 victory over Minnesota on Jan. 23. This was Lee's first appearance at Mariucci Arena and his goals against average now stands at 2.38 this year.

BEST IN THE NATION: Junior goalie Dan Dunn opened the weekend with a 39 save victory over Minnesota on Jan. 22, at the NHC. Dunn leads the nation's goalies with a 81.8% winning rate this winter (9-2-0).

EIGHT GAMES AND COUNTING: Junior Garrett Roe leads the Huskies with an eight-game scoring streak that dates back to Jan. 2. Over this stretch, Roe has 3 goals and 8 assists. He leads the Huskies this year with 25 points (7g/18a). In his career, Roe now ranks 14th in the team charts with 118 points (42g/76a). He also ranks 10th in team history with 76 assists.

RABOIN ON A RUN - POW: Senior defender Garrett Raboin continued his mid-season scoring surge with a goal and an assist against Minnesota. Raboin has eight points in the last eight games and his season totals include five goals and 10 assists. In his career, Raboin now has 18 goals and 56 assists for 74 points. Raboin now ranks 5th in the team records for career points by a defenseman. He needs just three points to tie Bret Hedican's 77 points at SCSU (1988-91). For his efforts, Raboin earned his second WCHA Defensive POW award of the season for his work against the Gophers on Jan. 26.

HUSKY NOTES: SCSU's current eight-game win streak ranks second in the nation behind Sacred Heart's nine-game winning streak... On the subject of career leaders, senior Ryan Lasch continues his move up the charts at SCSU. Lasch added four assists this weekend and he now has 6g/15a in play against Minnesota during his career. Lasch has 158 career points (70g/88a) and ranks 4th in the SCSU record for career points, 5th for career goals and 4th for career assists. He is closing in on SCSU legend Mark Hartigan who had 165 points from 1999-02. Tops on the SCSU scoring charts is Jeff Saterdalen, who had 179 points from 1988-92. Lasch leads team with 11 goals this season... Sophomore Jared Festler enjoyed a strong weekend against the Gophers with two goals, one assist and nine shots on goal. He scored two goals in the Huskies' 4-1 win at Mariucci. Festler now has 8g/9a for 17 points this season, which equals his season point output for 2008-09.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 97-67-22 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 57 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons, and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, four-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.
