MILE HIGH HUSKIES

The St. Cloud State men's hockey team (5-5-2, 4-3-1 WCHA) will travel to #2 University of Denver (8-3-1, 6-1-1 WCHA) on Nov. 27-28 for a pair of WCHA games at Magness Arena (6,026 cap./200x85) in Denver, Colo. The games will be aired live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don Lyons making the call from DU. The game on Nov. 27, is slated to be televised on Fox Sports Rocky Mountain (DirecTV channel 683). You can also get live video streaming of these games from the Denver website at <http://www.denverpioneers.com>

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ *The Huskies have faced a very strong schedule over the past few weekends. On Nov. 13-14, SCSU split a two-game set at North Dakota (then ranked #2 in the nation). Last weekend, the Huskies split a series against #15 ranked Wisconsin. On Nov. 27-28, SCSU will battle Denver, which is currently ranked #2 in the nation. After the Denver games, the Huskies will have played six of their first 14 games of the 2009-10 season against teams ranked #1 or #2 in the nation. Of note, the Huskies received votes in all the college hockey polls this week.*

■ *Rookie netminder Mike Lee picked up his first WCHA victory on Nov. 20, with his 38 save performance against #15 Wisconsin. Lee owns a 2.25 GAA this season and was named the **WCHA Rookie of the Week** on Nov. 24 for his work in the UW victory.*

■ *SCSU's Ryan Lasch scored two goals and one assist vs. Wisconsin. He moved into fourth place on the Huskies' scoring charts with those points. He now has 143 career points, 65 career goals and 78 career assists. Lasch enters the DU series with a four-game point streak.*

■ *Frosh David Eddy scored his first goal as a college player on Nov. 21, during the Huskies' 4-1 setback against Wisconsin. Eddy is a freshman from Woodbury, Minn.*

■ *Four of the Huskies' five losses this season have been against nationally ranked teams. The list includes losses to #1 Miami (2), #2 North Dakota and #15 Wisconsin.*

■ *Garrett Roe now has 103 career points and ranks 19th in the team career charts for points. Roe has 38 career goals and 65 career assists during his first three seasons with the Huskies. He scored his first collegiate empty net goal last weekend against Wisconsin.*

■ *The Huskies will travel to Alaska Anchorage on Dec. 4-5 for a pair of WCHA games in Alaska.*

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU received votes in the USCHO.com poll and the INCH poll this week. SCSU also received vote's in this week's USA Hockey poll...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

About Last Week...

Nov. 20: at SCSU 4, #15 Wisconsin 1

The Huskies gained another victory against a nationally ranked team with a 4-1 victory over #15 Wisconsin at the National Hockey Center on Nov. 20. The Huskies scored first in the game with a power play marker by Ryan Lasch at 5:08, as SCSU took advantage of a 5x3 PP. Garrett Raboin and Garrett Roe added assists on the play. UW's Blake Geoffrion tied the game with a PP goal at 8:49 of the first, before Drew LeBlanc etched the game winner at 6:24 of the second period with assists from Jared Festler and Sam Zabkowicz. In the final period, SCSU iced the game with an empty net goal by Garrett Roe at 19:13, as Zabkowicz had the lone assist on the play. Lasch added an insurance run with an unassisted breakaway goal at 19:39 of the third. In the game, Mike Lee earned WCHA Rookie of the Week honors with his 38 save effort. Brett Bennett had 21 saves for the Badgers. SCSU was 1-of-3 on the PP, and UW was 1-of-4 in the contest. SCSU was outshot 39-25 in the game by UW.

Nov. 21: #15 Wisconsin 4, at SCSU 1

The Huskies' two-game win streak against nationally ranked teams was halted with a 4-1 setback against #15 Wisconsin on Nov. 21 before a packed house of 6,081 at the friendly National Hockey Center. Wisconsin got the ball rolling in the first period with a power play goal by Brendan Smith. SCSU tied the contest with David Eddy's first collegiate goal at 6:30 with outstanding passing work from Garrett Raboin and Ryan Lasch. UW charted the game winner in the second period with a goal by John Mitchell. In the final period, Jordy Murray and Pat Johnson made it 4-1 in favor of the Badgers. In the contest, SCSU was outshot by the Badgers 33-19, as junior Dan Dunn had 29 saves for the Huskies in the nets. Scott Gudmandson had 18 saves for the Badgers. On the power play, SCSU was 0-of-7 and UW was 1-of-5.



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

TOP FOUR AT SCSU: Senior forward Ryan Lasch owns a four-game point streak headed into the Denver series. Lasch has posted six points (4g/2a) in the last four games. In the first eight games of the season, Lasch only scored three points for the Huskies. Lasch scored two goals in the Huskies' win over UW on Nov. 20, and also had an assist on Nov. 21. Lasch's scoring this weekend moved him into fourth place on the team's career scoring list with 143 points. He ranks sixth in the team charts with 65 career goals and ninth with 78 career assists. Lasch moves ahead of Joe Motzko, who had 142 points from 1999 to 2003.

STREAK SNAPPED: The Huskies broke a season-long Friday night winless streak on Nov. 20, with a 4-1 victory over #15 Wisconsin before a sellout crowd at the NHC. SCSU is now 1-3-2 in games played on Friday nights this season. On Saturday nights this season, SCSU is 4-2-0 and the 4-1 loss on Nov. 21 against Wisconsin was the Huskies' first second night loss since a 2-0 setback at #1 Miami.

EDDY SCORES: Freshman forward David Eddy scored his first goal as a college player on Nov. 21, in the 4-1 loss against Wisconsin at the NHC. Eddy is a resident of Woodbury and he played junior hockey with Sioux Falls of the USHL.

WCHA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK: Freshman goalie Mike Lee earned first star of the game honors for his sterling play in a 4-1 victory over #15 Wisconsin on Nov. 20. Lee was also named the WCHA Rookie of the Week on Nov. 24 by the league office. Lee had 38 saves in the win over the Badgers, as UW outshot SCSU 39-25 in the contest. The lone goal allowed by Lee was on the power play. A resident of Roseau, Lee owns a 2.25 GAA this season and this was his first WCHA victory at St. Cloud State. On Nov. 20, Lee faced fellow Phoenix Coyotes' draft pick Brett Bennett of Wisconsin in the nets. Lee was selected by Phoenix in the NHL entry draft during the summer of 2009.

HELPING HAND MILESTONE: Senior defender Garrett Raboin, a resident of Detroit Lakes, scored his 50th career assist on Nov. 20 on Ryan Lasch's power play goal. He added another assist on Nov. 21, which boosted his season total to five assists in 2009-10. A two-time WCHA Scholar Athlete and All-WCHA Academic award winner, Raboin now has 13 goals and 51 assists at SCSU. Of note, Kelly Hultgren (1991-95) leads the Huskies records for most assists by a defenseman with 79 career assists.

HUSKY TIDBITS: Sophomore Drew LeBlanc (Hermantown) scored the first game winning goal of his career during the Huskies' 4-1 victory over Wisconsin on Nov. 20. LeBlanc now has 10 goals and 10 assists for 20 points as a Husky... SCSU junior Garrett Roe score the first empty net goal of his career on Nov. 20. Roe scored the ENG against Wisconsin at 19:13 of the third period after the Badgers had pulled starting goalie Brett Bennett. This marked the first ENG for the Huskies since they scored one against UMD on Jan. 10, 2009. On the subject of Roe, he now has 103 career points and ranks 19th in the team career charts for points. Roe has 38 career goals and 65 career assists during his first three seasons with the Huskies. Roe is a draft pick of the Los Angeles Kings... Wisconsin resident Sam Zabkowicz, a St. Cloud State sophomore defender, scored two assists in the Huskies' 4-1 victory over the Badgers on Nov. 20... SCSU has scored 29 goals this season, and the Huskies have also allowed 29 goals this season... Freshman defender Taylor Johnson is leading the Huskies this season on the plus/minus at +4 in 2009-10... former Huskies Andrew Gordon (2004-07) and Andreas Nodl (2006-08) were both called up to the NHL this week. Gordon plays for Washington, while Nodl is with Philadelphia.

NATIONAL LEADERS: Mike Lee ranks 19th in the nation with a goals against average of 2.25, while teammate Dan Dunn ranks 25th with a 2.39 GAA this season....Dunn ranks 19th in the nation with a save percentage of .925 and Lee ranks 21st with a save rate of .923. Of note, DU goalie Marc Cheverie ranks 1st in the nation with a .961 save rate and a 1.19 goals against average in 402:01 minutes of play this season... Tony Mosey ranks sixth among NCAA Division I players with his four power play goals this season.

ON DECK: The Huskies will be back on the road next weekend as they travel to Alaska-Anchorage on Dec. 4-5. Of note, SCSU will be back at the National Hockey Center on Dec. 11-12 for a pair of home games against Colorado College.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 86-65-21 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 51 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons. and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, four-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.
