**THIS WEEK:** North Dakota takes to the road for a key Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) series at St. Cloud State on Friday and Saturday.

UND enters the week in seventh place in the WCHA with 16 points, one point ahead of eighth-place SCSU and one point behind sixth-place Michigan Tech.

UND has lost just twice in the past 11 games (8-2-1), while the Huskies have just three wins in their past 11 (3-6-2).

The Huskies lost a 3-1 decision on Friday, and then rallied with a 5-4 overtime victory the following night. Senior **Jordy Christian** scored the game-winner in OT for the Huskies.

Freshman goalie **Ryan Faragher** has made 18 consecutive starts for the Huskies, a streak that began with a 4-0 shutout win at UND on Oct. 28.

**SCSU COACHING STAFF: Bob Motzko** (SCSU '87) is in his seventh season at St. Cloud State and is 129-103-33 (.549).

Motzko's coaching staff includes assistant coaches **Mike Gibbons** (Bemidji State '81) and **Steve Johnson** (North Dakota '88).

Johnson starred at UND from 1984-88, amassing 191 points (70g, 121a) in 153 games, which ranks seventh all-time at UND. He was a Hobey Baker Award finalist and a first-team All-American as a senior.

**SERIES HISTORY:** This weekend will mark the 99th and 100th meetings between the two programs. UND owns a 57-30-11 (.638) advantage in the all-time series.

The two teams split an October series in Grand Forks earlier this year, with the Huskies taking the opener 4-0 before UND rebounded with a 3-1 win to earn the split.

UND has gone 19-8-6 (.667) against the Huskies during **Dave Hakstol's** eight seasons as head coach.

Junior **Corban Knight** (High River, Alberta) leads all active skaters with 11 points (4g, 7a) in 11 career games against SCSU.

Goalies **Brad Eidsness** (Sr., Chestermere, Alberta) and **Aaron Dell** (Jr., Airdrie, Alberta) have combined for a 10-4-1 lifetime record against the Huskies.

**UND'S LAST ACTION:** UND is coming off of a home split with Minnesota, winning 2-1 on Friday and losing 6-2 on Saturday.

Junior defenseman **Andrew MacWilliam** (Calgary, Alberta) scored his first career goal and sophomore forward **Brock Nelson** (Warroad, Minn.) notched the game-winner with 3:35 remaining in Friday's win.

UND was unable to overcome a 4-0 deficit on Saturday despite cutting the gap to 4-2 at one point. **Danny Kristo** (Jr., Eden Prairie, Minn.) and **Michael Parks** (Fr., St. Louis, Mo.) accounted for the team's goals.

The loss ended UND's 5-game unbeaten streak (4-0-1) and was just the second defeat in the team's last 11 games (8-2-1).

**POLL POSITION:** UND maintained its No. 17 ranking in the most recent USCHO.com poll released on Monday.

UND climbed one spot to No. 16 in the latest Inside College Hockey Power Rankings, released on Sunday.

UND remained unranked in the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* poll, but did garner eight votes.

**INJURY UPDATES:** On Wednesday, head coach **Dave Hakstol** indicated that UND would be without forwards **Derek Rodwell** (So., Taber, Alberta), **Brendan O'Donnell** (Fr., Winnipeg, Manitoba) and **Rocco Grimaldi** (Fr., Rossmoor, Calif.), as well as defenseman **Derek Forbort** (So., Duluth, Minn.), this weekend.

Hakstol also said that the status of forward **Michael Parks** (Fr., St. Louis, Mo.), who was injured Saturday night, has yet to be determined.

Grimaldi has missed the last 13 games, and 19 of 23 games this season, due to a knee injury.

O'Donnell suffered an upper body injury last Saturday, while Forbort has missed the last three games after suffering a lower body injury while playing at the World Junior Hockey Championship.

Earlier this month, Hakstol announced Rodwell would miss the remainder of the season due to a shoulder injury that requires surgery.

**WE'RE GOING STREAKING!:** Despite last Saturday's loss to Minnesota, UND has lost just twice in the last 11 games, going 8-2-1 during that stretch.

The other loss during that period was a 2-1 overtime loss to Nebraska Omaha (Dec. 9).

Prior to the Minnesota loss, UND had been riding a 5-game unbeaten streak (4-0-1).

**IT'S HOW YOU FINISH:** With just one loss in five games to start the second half, UND has continued its trend of playing its best hockey after Christmas under eighth-year head coach **Dave Hakstol**:

**SUPER DAVE:** With 199 career wins, **Dave Hakstol** is on the verge of joining John "Gino" Gasparini (392 wins, 1978-94) and Dean Blais (262 wins, 1994-2004) as the only UND coaches to win 200 games.

With 32 wins last season, UND has reached the 20-win plateau in each of Hakstol's first seven seasons behind the bench. It was also the 3rd-highest win total in program history.

Hakstol's streak of seven straight 20-win seasons is the second-longest in UND history, behind only Gasparini's 13 in a row (1978-79 to 1990-91).

**DAN THE MAN:** With 98 career games under his belt, junior forward **Danny Kristo** (Eden Prairie, Minn.) is on pace to play in his 100th career game Saturday in St. Cloud.

Kristo leads all active UND players with 89 career points, and this season is tied with **Brock Nelson** (So., Warroad, Minn.) for the team scoring lead with 25 points.

Kristo would become the fifth active UND player to reach the 100-games milestone, joining seniors **Ben Blood** (141 GP) and **Mario Lamoureux** (129), and juniors **Andrew MacWilliam** (103) and **Corban Knight** (101).

Knight reached the milestone last Friday against Minnesota.

**BIG MAC ATTACK:** It took him 102 career games to do it, but junior defenseman **Andrew MacWilliam** (Calgary, Alberta) scored his first career goal in last Friday's 2-1 win over Minnesota.

The goal tied the game at 1-1 with just nine seconds left in the second period.

The following night, MacWilliam added an assist to extend his point-scoring streak to three games, which is the longest active streak on the team and matches the longest of his career.

MacWilliam also put together a 3-game point streak last season from Jan. 22 to Jan. 29, when he had one assist in three straight games.

In 23 games this season, MacWilliam has a goal and three assists. He had just one assist in his first 20 games.

**BROCK AND ROLL:** Sophomore forward **Brock Nelson** (Warroad, Minn.) remains tied for the NCAA lead with nine power-play goals despite having gone the last seven games without one.

Last year's team leader, Hobey Baker Award finalist and first-team All-American Matt Frattin, had 10 in 44 games.

Through 23 games this season, Nelson leads UND with 16 goals and is tied for the team scoring lead (with Danny Kristo) with 25 points.

Nelson had eight goals and 13 assists in 42 games as a freshman.

**SUPER MARIO:** Senior captain **Mario Lamoureux** (Grand Forks, N.D.) drew an assist in each game against Minnesota, the first time he has reached the scoresheet in consecutive games since last year's NCAA Midwest Regional against RPI and Denver.

Lamoureux's assist on Friday snapped a personal 7-game point drought, and was his first point since scoring the game-winning goal on Nov. 19 in a 5-2 win at Bemidji State.

**CROWDED HOUSE:** Saturday's series against Minnesota drew UND's two largest home crowds of the 2011-12 season.

Friday's announced attendance was 11,846, while the following night's game drew another season-high at 11,964.

UND is averaging 11,186 fans per game in the 11,634-seat Ralph Engelstad Arena.

**CHILLIN' LIKE DILLON:** Although he failed to reach the scoresheet in the Minnesota series, sophomore defenseman **Dillon Simpson** (Edmonton, Alberta) has 11 points (all assists) in his last 14 games.

He had been held without a point through the first nine games of the season.

Simpson leads UND in plus/minus with a +9.

**GET CARTER:** Junior forward **Carter Rowney** (Sexsmith, Alberta) enjoyed the first 2-goal game of his career in a Jan. 7 win over Clarkson, scoring the game-tying and game-winning goals in the second period 3 minutes, 18 seconds apart.

Rowney now has a career-high 14 points (7 goals, 7 assists) in 23 games season after amassing 13 points over his first two years combined.

After opening the season with five points (2g, 3a) in the first 12 games, Rowney has nine points (5g, 4a) in his last 11 games.

**NORTHERN EXPOSURE:** UND's win over Clarkson at the MTS Centre in Winnipeg on Jan. 7 drew 7,075 fans, out-drawing all but three NCAA Division I men's hockey games that night.

Only New Hampshire vs. Maine (38,456 at Fenway Park), RIT at Wisconsin (12,453) and Notre Dame at Minnesota (10,242) drew more.

Dubbed the 'U.S. College Hockey Classic,' the game was UND's first on Canadian soil in 59 years. The last time UND played a men's hockey game in Canada was Dec. 29-30, 1953, when UND lost a pair of games to host Fort Frances (Ontario).

The last time UND played outside of the United States was Dec. 26-29, 1982, when the team competed in the Spengler Cup in Switzerland.

**NICK OF TIME:** Freshman **Nick Mattson** (Chanhassen, Minn.) assisted on **Carter Rowney's** (Jr., Sexsmith, Alberta) game-winning goal Jan. 7 against Clarkson to give him 13 points (5g, 8a) in 23 games this season.

Mattson's 13 points lead all UND freshmen and defensemen.

Mattson ranks third among WCHA rookie defensemen in scoring, trailing only Denver's Joey LaLeggia (24 points) and St. Cloud State's Andrew Prochno (16).

Mattson's second of two goals in a 4-4 tie against Harvard (Dec. 30). was the first short-handed goal by a UND defenseman since Derrick LaPoint on Oct. 16, 2009, against Minnesota.

**VOTE FOR HOBEY:** Senior defenseman **Ben Blood** (Plymouth, Minn.) and junior forward **Danny Kristo** (Eden Prairie, Minn.) are among the 77 players on the ballot for the Hobey Baker Award 'Vote for Hobey' fan balloting.

Blood, who logs more minutes than any other UND player, has emerged as one of the top two-way defensemen in NCAA hockey.

He has played in all 21 games this season, registering two goals and eight assists. Both of his goals have been game-winners, tying him for fifth-most by a UND defenseman in a single season. Blood leads all active UND skaters with 139 games played and has appeared in 121 straight games. His career rating of +40 also tops all active UND players. Last season, Blood led the nation with a +32 rating and was named to his second straight Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) All-Academic Team.

Kristo is tied for the team scoring lead with 24 points (11 goals, 13 assists) in 21 games and leads the team with three game-winning goals. The Eden Prairie, Minn., native has figured in on seven of UND's 11 game-winning goals this season, scoring three and assisting on four. He is also tied for the team lead among forwards with a +5 rating and has enjoyed eight multi-point games this season. The 2009-10 WCHA Rookie of the Year, Kristo is UND's active scoring leader with 88 points (34g, 54a) in 96 career games.

This first phase of fan balloting will run now through March 4, 2012. Phase two of fan balloting will begin on March 16 from the list

of Top 10 Hobey Baker finalists. The fan vote accounts for a full 1 percent of the total ballot in each phase in selecting this year's award recipient.

**DUDE, WE'VE GOT A DELL:** Junior goalie **Aaron Dell** (Airdrie, Alberta) earned a 26-save shutout in UND's 1-0 win over Nebraska Omaha (Dec. 10) to close out the first half of the season. It was his first shutout of the season and eighth of his career, which ranks fourth all-time at UND:

**EIDSWIDE SHUT:** Senior goalie **Brad Eidsness** (Chestermere, Alberta) stopped 26 of 28 shots in a Dec. 2 win at UAA to earn his 53rd career victory.

That moved Eidsness past former NHLer Jon Casey (1980-84) and 1997 NCAA champion Toby Kvalevog (1993-97) for sole possession of fifth all-time at UND:

Eidsness also ranks fifth all-time at UND in goals against average (2.45), sixth in save percentage (.904), tied for eighth in shutouts (four), ninth in saves (2,084) and 10th in winning percentage (.661).

In six games (three starts) this season, Eidsness is 3-1-0 and leads the team in goals against average (2.48) and save percentage (.915).

**HELLO, MY NAME IS:** UND head coach Dave Hakstol announced on Jan. 10 that forward **Mitch MacMillan** (So., Penticton, British Columbia) transferred to UND and will join the team immediately. MacMillan is eligible to begin practicing with the team, but will not be eligible to compete until January 2013.

MacMillan will have two years of NCAA eligibility remaining when he resumes competition next January.

MacMillan transferred to UND from St. Cloud State, where he had five assists in 14 games this season. In 28 games last season as a freshman, MacMillan had four goals and two assists.

MacMillan's younger brother, Mark, is currently a freshman forward at UND. The last time the two were teammates was in 2009-10 with Alberni Valley of the British Columbia Hockey League (BCHL), when they were the team's top two scorers and combined for 173 points (87 goals, 86 assists) in 59 games.

**ASSISTANCE PLAN:** Junior goalie **Aaron Dell** (Airdrie, Alberta) has four career assists, a total topped by only one goalie in the history of the program: current volunteer assistant coach **Karl Goehring**.

Goehring amassed a school-record seven assists from 1997 to 2001.

**MARIO'S MILESTONE:** When senior captain **Mario Lamoureux** (Grand Forks, N.D.) scored the game-winning goal on Nov. 19 at Bemidji State, he entered the UND history books by scoring the 10,000th goal in program history.

Perhaps it was fitting that Lamoureux would be the one to score the milestone goal, considering he is from Grand Forks, and his extensive family ties to UND hockey.

Lamoureux's sisters, Jocelyne and Monique, are junior forwards on UND's women's hockey team.

His father, Pierre, played goalie for UND from 1979-82 and was a member of two NCAA championship teams.

His brother, Jean-Philippe, was a goaltender at UND from 2004-08 and was an All-American as a senior.

Another brother, Pierre-Paul, is currently in his third season on UND's coaching staff as assistant video coordinator.

Finally, his uncle, Roger Lamoureux, was a four-year letterwinner at forward for UND from 1973 to 1977.

**SUPER MARIO:** In addition to the 10,000-goals milestone, Lamoureux's tally on Nov. 19 was significant for another reason.

With the goal, UND improved to 13-0-0 all-time when Lamoureux scores.

**LOWE'S AND BEHOLD: Brad Eidsness** (Sr., Chestermere, Alberta) is one of 20 national candidates for the prestigious Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

On the ice, Eidsness is a two-time All-WCHA selection and is one of only two goalies in UND history (with Karl Goehring) to have won 20 games in each of his first two years.

In the classroom, Eidsness was the 2010-11 men's hockey recipient of the NCAA Elite 88 Award, given to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade point average at his or her sport's championship site. Already in

graduate school pursuing a master's degree in business administration, Eidsness received his bachelor's degree in entrepreneurship last spring. He is a two-time Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) Scholar-Athlete and a two-time Academic All-WCHA selection. An active member of the community, Eidsness has logged significant hours of community service with a variety of organizations in each of his first three years at UND, including the Sioux Kids Club, the National Honor Society, the Northlands Rescue Mission, Pucks for Plates and more.

The 20 candidates will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, Division I men's coaches and fans who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

Eidsness' former teammate, Chay Genoway, was a finalist last season for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award and was named to the 2010-11 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award All-America first team.

**THE EAGLE SOARS INTO THE HALL:** UND legend **Ed Belfour** made history on Nov. 14 when he became the first UND product to be inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame.

Belfour parlayed a historic 1986-87 freshman season into a distinguished professional career that saw him become the third-winningest goalie in NHL history. Only Martin Brodeur (636 wins) and Patrick Roy (551) have won more games than Belfour, who won 484 from 1988 to 2007.

A native of Carman, Manitoba, Belfour won a UND-record 29 games (since broken) in 1986-87 and was named an NCAA All-American after leading UND to the 1987 national championship. He was the backbone of the famed "Hrkac Circus" team that won a then-NCAA-record 40 games.

Belfour twice won the Vezina Trophy as the NHL's best goalie and helped lead the Dallas Stars to a Stanley Cup championship in 1999.

A six-time all-star game participant, Belfour ranks third in NHL history in wins (484), fourth in games played (963) and saves (24,750), and ninth in shutouts (76). He finished his career with a 2.50 goals against average and a .906 save percentage.

Belfour also excelled on the international stage, winning a Canada Cup in 1991 and an Olympic gold medal in 2002 for Canada.

**WE WERE MERELY FRESHMEN:** Forwards **Rocco Grimaldi** (Rossmoor, Calif.) and **Mark MacMillan** (Penticton, British Columbia) were both ranked among the top 20 freshman forwards in the country by InsideCollegeHockey.com in October.

Grimaldi was ranked No. 5 and MacMillan was ranked No. 11.

UND's overall freshman class was ranked No. 2 in the nation behind only Miami's.

**CALLING ALL CAPTAINS:** Senior forward **Mario Lamoureux** (Grand Forks, N.D.) was named team captain at UND's annual preseason media day luncheon.

In 43 games last season, Lamoureux established career highs in points (17) and assists (14) while earning his second straight WCHA All-Academic selection. In 109 career games, Lamoureux has amassed 13 goals and 22 assists.

Lamoureux's younger sister, Jocelyne, was named captain of UND's women's this season.

Mario Lamoureux joins Steve Johnson (1987-88), Jeff Panzer (2000-01) and Andy Schneider (2003-04) as the only Grand Forks natives to captain their hometown team.

Senior defenseman **Ben Blood** (Plymouth, Minn.), junior defenseman **Andrew MacWilliam** (Calgary, Alberta) and junior forward **Corban Knight** (High River, Alberta) were named assistant captains.

**HELLO, MY NAME IS:** UND welcomes 10 freshmen to the lineup this season, including forwards **Rocco Grimaldi** (Rossmoor, Calif.), **Connor Gaarder** (Edina, Minn.), **Mark MacMillan** (Penticton, British Columbia), **Brendan O'Donnell** (Winnipeg, Manitoba), **Michael Parks** (St. Louis, Mo.), **Stephane Pattyn** (Ste. Anne, Manitoba) and **Colten St. Clair** (Gilbert, Ariz.), and defensemen **Nick Mattson** (Chanhassen, Minn.), **Dan Senkbeil** (Fremont, Calif.) and **Andrew Panzarella** (Washington, D.C.). It is UND's largest freshman class since 2005-06, when UND brought in 13 freshmen.

That class included future NHLers Jonathan Toews, T.J. Oshie, Taylor Chorney and Brian Lee, as well as 2006-07 Hobey Baker Award winner Ryan Duncan.

**FEELING A DRAFT:** The 2011-12 UND roster boasts 15 National Hockey League draft picks, including 2011 selections **Rocco Grimaldi** (Fr., Rossmoor, Calif.) and **Dillon Simpson** (So., Edmonton, Alberta).

Grimaldi was taken in the second round (33rd overall) by Florida, while Simpson went in the fourth round (92nd overall) to Edmonton.

Simpson's father, Craig, won two Stanley Cups with Edmonton during his 10-year NHL career. He is now the lead color analyst on the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation's (CBC) *Hockey Night in Canada*.

UND's current collection of draft picks features two 1st-rounders (**Derek Forbort**, **Brock Nelson**), two 2nd-rounders (**Rocco Grimaldi**, **Danny Kristo**), three 4th-rounders (**Ben Blood**, **Mark MacMillan**, **Dillon Simpson**), four 5th-

rounders (**Brad Eidsness**, **Corban Knight**, **Michael Parks**, **Derek Rodwell**), two 6th-rounders (**Nick Mattson**, **Brendan O'Donnell**) and two 7th-rounders (**Joe Gleason**, **Andrew MacWilliam**).

Now in his eighth season as the head coach at the University of North Dakota, Dave Hakstol has established himself as one of the most accomplished and well-respected bench bosses in NCAA hockey.

Through his first seven seasons, Hakstol has compiled a 187-93-27 (.653) overall winning percentage and a 113-64-19 (.625) WCHA record.

Already a six-time finalist for the prestigious Spencer Penrose Award as the national coach of the year, Hakstol guided the Fighting Sioux to the NCAA Frozen Four in 2010-11, giving UND an incredible five Frozen Four berths in Hakstol's first seven years as head coach.

He also led UND to a second MacNaughton Cup in three years as WCHA champions, giving the Sioux an NCAA men's hockey-leading 15 conference titles. UND also won its second straight Broadmoor Trophy as WCHA playoff champions. In the process, Hakstol and the Sioux turned in the third-winningest season (32 wins) in the program's illustrious history.

Three of Hakstol's players garnered All-America honors in 2010-11: forward Matt Frattin (first team), defenseman Chay Genoway (first team) and goalie Aaron Dell (second team). Frattin, who led the nation with 36 goals, was also a Hobey Baker Award 'Hobey Hat Trick' finalist and the WCHA Player of the Year. Genoway was named the WCHA's Most Outstanding Student-Athlete, while Dell won a school-record 30 games, topping a 24-year-old record previously held by Hockey Hall of Famer Ed Belfour.

In the classroom, UND placed a program-record 16 student-athletes on the WCHA All-Academic team and boasted five WCHA Scholar-Athlete honorees.

In 2009-10, Hakstol and the Sioux added another piece of hardware to UND's championship lore with a Broadmoor Trophy as the WCHA Final Five champions, the second Broadmoor Trophy of Hakstol's distinguished tenure. Hakstol led the Sioux to a 25-13-5 overall record and a 15-10-3 WCHA mark, landing an eighth straight NCAA postseason appearance, the third-longest streak in the nation.

The Fighting Sioux went 24-15-4 overall and 17-7-4 in conference play in 2008-09 en route to their WCHA-leading 14th league championship. Hakstol was also recognized as WCHA Coach of the Year for the first time in his career.

Hakstol joined rare company when he took the Sioux to the Frozen Four in his first four seasons as a collegiate head coach, joining Jack Parker and Doug Woog as the only three coaches to accomplish that feat.

In Hakstol's first season (2004-05) as head coach, he led a team with nine seniors to the Frozen Four. In his second season (2005-06), he led a team with 13 freshmen and just two seniors to the Frozen Four.

In his third season, Hakstol took UND to the Frozen Four yet again, and sophomore forward Ryan Duncan won the Hobey Baker Memorial Award as the best player in college hockey.

In 2007-08, his fourth season, Hakstol led UND to a 28-11-4 overall record and 18-7-3 WCHA mark (second place).

A key in Hakstol's success has been surrounding himself with an outstanding coaching staff. His first two seasons, he was joined by associate head coach Brad Berry and assistant coach Cary Eades. Eades has won championships on every level at which he has played or coached.

Berry's outstanding work at UND resulted in him accepting an assistant coach position in the NHL's Vancouver Canucks organization in the summer of 2006.

To fill the vacancy created by Berry's departure, Eades was promoted to associate head coach and Hakstol hired former Sioux and NHL player Dane Jackson as an assistant coach.

Jackson, who had an 11-year career as a professional hockey player, has become an integral part of the coaching staff by working individually with each Fighting Sioux player on developing their skills.

The trademark of the Fighting Sioux during Hakstol's first seven seasons has been UND's ability to play its best hockey at the most crucial time of the year – in

the playoffs.

During his first seven years, Hakstol has led the Sioux to an overall postseason record of 36-14 (.720) that includes a 25-8 WCHA playoff record and 11-7 NCAA playoff mark. UND's 36 NCAA and WCHA playoff wins the last six seasons are more than any other WCHA team during that time.

UND has developed a reputation for doing an outstanding job in preparing players for professional hockey careers and careers beyond hockey. Last season, an astonishing 45 former Sioux played professionally, including 16 who played in the National Hockey League. Among those 16 were Frattin, who made his NHL debut with Toronto on Hockey Night in Canada a mere two days after UND's season came to an end.

In 2008-09, 17 former Fighting Sioux played in the National Hockey League, the program's most since the 1993-94 season. Thirteen of those players were coached by Hakstol during his nine seasons on the UND staff.

In the last five seasons alone, nine of Hakstol's former UND players have debuted the NHL the year after completing their collegiate careers, including Frattin (2010-11), Chris VandeVelde (2010-11), T.J. Oshie (2008-09), Chris Porter (2008-09), Taylor Chorney (2008-09), Brian Lee (2007-08), Matt Smaby (2007-08), Drew Stafford (2006-07) and Travis Zajac.

In 2007-08, All-American Jonathan Toews made the jump directly to the NHL's Chicago Blackhawks after playing two years at UND. He was a finalist for the NHL's Rookie of the Year Award and in the summer of 2008 was named the captain of the Blackhawks, becoming the third-youngest captain in NHL history. Toews was 20 years and 79 days old when he assumed the role as Chicago's captain. In 2010, Toews led the Blackhawks to their first Stanley Cup Championship in 49 years, capturing Conn Smythe Trophy honors as playoff MVP in the process. Earlier that same year, Toews led Canada to a gold medal at the Olympics in Vancouver and was named the tournament's top forward.

In the last seven seasons, 33 UND players have been selected in the NHL Entry Draft, including six in the 2007, 2008 and 2010 NHL Drafts.

UND men's hockey players are also outstanding students. Last season, a school-record 16 student-athletes were named to the WCHA All-Academic team. In each

of the previous two seasons, 11 Fighting Sioux were named to the WCHA All-Academic team. Last year, five individuals were also named WCHA Scholar-Athletes. In 2008-09, junior defenseman Chay Genoway, was named to the *ESPN the Magazine* Academic All-America third team.

In 2007-08, 10 UND men's hockey players earned WCHA All-Academic honors, most in the league. In 2006-07, 11 Fighting Sioux were named to the WCHA All-Academic team, tying for the WCHA league high.

Hakstol, 35 years old when he was named UND's head men's hockey coach on July 9, 2004, is just the 15th head men's hockey coach in school history and only the fourth Fighting Sioux head coach in the past 43 years. Hakstol, a Sioux player from 1989-92, is also just the fifth former UND player to also become head coach at North Dakota.

Taking over a tradition-rich program that is synonymous with the word "excellence" was no small task, but Hakstol's background prepared him for the challenge. Prior to taking over as UND's head coach, the former Sioux captain was a member of Dean Blais's coaching staff for four seasons and in that stint helped coach the Sioux to a 101-47-19 (.662) overall record and 63-33-16 (.634) WCHA record.

During Hakstol's four years under Blais, UND won two WCHA titles, made three NCAA appearances and finished as the 2001 national runnerup.

Named a UND assistant coach on July 1, 2000, Hakstol was elevated to associate head coach in December 2000, and he served as the team's recruiting coordinator in his four seasons working under Blais.

In that capacity, Hakstol played a vital role in helping attract top-caliber student-athletes to UND. Eleven UND players or recruits were drafted by National Hockey League teams while Hakstol and former associate head coach Brad Berry were Sioux assistants.

Prior to joining the UND staff on July 1, 2000, Hakstol spent four seasons (1996-2000) as the general manager and head coach of the Sioux City Musketeers of the United States Hockey League, posting winning seasons in his last three seasons. Overall, Hakstol had a 101-109-13 record with the Musketeers. He was named the USHL Coach of the Year in 1997-98, when he led Sioux City to a 32-21-3 record.

While coaching at Sioux City, Hakstol also coached the 1998 USA/USHL hockey team at the IIHF Four Nationals Cup in Oslo, Norway, and he was the head coach of the Central District team (USA Hockey) at the National Select 16 Festival in Ann Arbor, Mich., in 1998.

Before beginning his coaching career, Hakstol played professional hockey with the IHL's Minnesota Moose from 1994-96, serving as team captain for two years, and with the IHL's Indianapolis Ice from 1992-1994, serving as team captain for one season. In five professional seasons, Hakstol played in 250 games, scoring 12 goals and recording 37 assists. He also accumulated 455 penalty minutes.

As a defenseman on the Sioux hockey team from 1989-92, Hakstol was a three-year letterwinner and served as team captain from 1990 to 1992. He played in 107 games for UND, scoring 10 goals and adding 36 assists for 46 points. He had 77 penalties for 191 minutes.

Hakstol and his wife, Erinn, have two children: daughter Avery and son Brenden.
