DAWN OF A NEW YEAR:

The St. Cloud State men's hockey team will open the 2009-10 season with an exhibition game on Oct. 4, against the University of Lethbridge. Game time at the National Hockey Center (5,371 cap./200x100) is scheduled for 5:07 p.m. The game will be broadcast live on the Husky hockey flagship station KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the plays. The game will also be broadcast on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org). Fans can watch the game on Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area, with Rob Hudson and Mike Doyle providing the coverage for Husky Productions. If you would like to watch the game on the web, a pay-per-view service is available through the Husky Home Page at www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics.

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ SCSU finished the 2008-09 season with an 18-17-3 overall record and a 13-13-2 sixth place finish in the always rugged WCHA. Lethbridge ended its 2008-09 season at 19-15-1 and 14-13-1 in the Canada West Conference

■ Two-time All-WCHA selection Ryan Lasch was selected in the recent Grand Forks Herald preseason poll as the 2009-10 Preseason WCHA Player of the Year. He shared the honor with Jordan Schroeder of Minnesota.

■ On the subject of the preseason poll, freshman netminder Mike Lee was named the WCHA Preseason Rookie of the Year, while the Huskies were picked to finish 5th in the preseason WCHA poll.

■ In the preseason USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll, the Huskies were ranked 13th.

■ SCSU coach Bob Motzko begins his fifth season with the Huskies in 2009-10. He owns an 81-60-19 record during his first four seasons in the Granite City.

■ The Huskies will also return All-WCHA award winners senior defender Garrett Raboin and junior forward Garrett Roe. Raboin had a career-high 10G/23A in 2008-09, while Roe only need seven points to join SCSU's elite 100-point club.

■ The Huskies bring back eight of their top 10 point producers from 2008-09, and this group includes their top four point scorers from last winter (Roe, Lasch, Raboin and Aaron Marvin).

**MORE NEWS AND NOTES...**

**LAST YEAR:** The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

**POLL POSITION:** In the first USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll for 2009-10, the Huskies were ranked 13th. The other college polls have not been released at this point of the season...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

**THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW:** The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. **ON THE AIR:** All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 ([www.kvsc.org](http://www.kvsc.org)).

**LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD:** All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

**WISE GUYS:** Junior Jon Ammerman, junior Garrett Raboin and senior Brent Borgen were named WCAH Scholar-Athletes for the second consecutive season in 2008-09. They were joined this year for WCHA Scholar-Athlete honors by sophomore Nick Oslund and sophomore Brian Volpei. The five honorees are the most in a single season for the Huskies since the award was introduced in 2005-06.

**COACHING STAFF:** SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007, and he currently owns a 81-7-18 overall record with the Huskies. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies.

**MORE NEWS AND NOTES...**

**FIRST TWICE:** Junior forward Ryan Lasch earned All-WCHA First Team notice for the second consecutive season in 2008-09. This was the first time in team history that a Husky forward earned All-WCHA First Team honors for two consecutive seasons. Lasch is the fourth SCSU forward to earn All-WCHA First Team honors. Lasch led the Huskies with 18 goals, nine power play goals and five game winners this season. He ranks 8th in the team's all-time scoring list with 134 points. Tops on that list is Jeff Saterdalen with 179 points.

**HALL OF FAME:** Jeff Saterdalen, who played for the Huskies from 1988-92, will be inducted into the SCSU Athletic Hall of Fame this year. He posted a school record 101 assists and 179 points during his career at SCSU. The Hall of Fame ceremony will take place on Oct. 24. Please call 320-308-3102 for more information on the Hall of Fame ceremonies at SCSU for 2009.

**THE OUTLOOK:** As St. Cloud State looks ahead to the upcoming season, the return of 22 players and four of team's top five point producers from 2008-09 certainly bode well for the team's success during the winter of 2009-10. SCSU will return eight defenders, 12 forwards and two goaltenders from a team that posted a solid 18-17-3 overall record in 2008-09. The Huskies were 13-13-2 in the rugged WCHA last year, and they were ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for much of the 2008-09 campaign. SCSU's top returning scorer is junior forward Garrett Roe, who led the club with 31 assists and 48 points. Senior Ryan Lasch led the team with 18 goals and tied a team record with five game winners last year, and senior Garrett Raboin hit career-highs in 2008-09 with 10 goals, 23 assists and 33 points. Roe, Lasch and Raboin all received All-WCHA notice last season for the Huskies.

**HUSKIES FEEL THE DRAFT:** St. Cloud State University men's hockey was well-represented in the 2009 NHL Entry Draft, which took place this summer. SCSU freshman forward Ben Hanowski was selected 63rd in the draft by the Pittsburgh Penguins, while freshman goalie Michael Lee was also selected in the third round by the Phoenix Coyotes. The group of new draftees was completed by sophomore defender Oliver Lauridsen, who was picked in the seventh round of the draft by the Philadelphia Flyers. There are currently seven Huskies on the 2009-10 roster, who have been drafted by NHL squads. The other players selected in previous drafts include Garrett Roe (Los Angeles), Dan Dunn (Washington), Aaron Marvin (Calgary) and Nick Oslund (Detroit).

**SUPER SOPHS:** The Huskies will be assisted this season by a solid class of sophomore players. Forwards Jared Festler scored seven goals and 10 assists last winter, while Drew LeBlanc and Jordy Christian each posted 15 points apiece. The group of soph forwards was completed by Travis Novak, who had 5 goals and 10 assists. Of note, Travis Novak's sister Brittany Novak is a member of the SCSU volleyball team this fall. On defense, SCSU's sophomore class is highlights by Sam Zabkowicz and Oliver Lauridsen.

**THE KIDS:** SCSU will welcome four newcomers to its roster in 2009-10. Those freshman skaters include forwards Ben Hanowski (Little Falls) and David Eddy (Woodbury), defender Taylor Johnson (Hugo) and goalie Mike Lee (Roseau). Hanowski set a MSHSL career scoring record during his tenure at Little Falls High School with 405 points (196 goals and 209 assists). Lee was named the USHL Goaltender of the Year at Fargo in 2008-09, and he was also named USA Hockey's Junior Goalie of the Year. Eddy was a standout player for Sioux Falls of the USHL, while Johnson earned notice for his play at Green Bay in the USHL.

**SENIOR SALUTE:** SCSU outscored its opponents 122-107 in 2008-09...Aaron Marvin and Sam Zabkowicz led the Huskies in 2008-09 with a +8 on the plus/minus...junior goaltender Dan Dunn is back with the Huskies this winter after posting a solid 2.60 goals against average and a .904 save rate in 2008-09...SCSU seniors in 2009-10 include Jon Ammerman, Ryan Lasch, Garrett Raboin, Craig Gaudet and Ryan Peckskamp...SCSU skaters earning WCHA Scholar-Athlete honors in 2008-09 included Ammerman, Raboin, Nick Oslund, Brian Volpei and Brent Borgen...SCSU's 18-17-3 record in 2008-09 marked the fourth consecutive winning season for the Huskies...Ryan Lasch has played in 118 consecutive games during his career. Garrett Roe is on track to join the 100-point club, as he now has 93 career points at SCSU.percentage.

#### The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 81-60-19 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 49 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

**MOTZKO'S STAFF:** Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons. and third-year volunteer goalie coach Justin Johnson. SCSU's suport staff features 14-year veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, three-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.
