### MARCH MADNESS

The #4 St. Cloud State Huskies (20-11-5, 15-9-4 WCHA) will host Minnesota State (15-18-3, 9-17-2 WCHA) on March 12-14, in the best of 3 series in the first round of the 2010 Red Baron WCHA Final Five tournament. The games will all start at 7:07 p.m. at the National Hockey Center (5,371 cap/200x100) in St. Cloud. All games will be broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 ([www.lite999.com](http://www.lite999.com)) with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel making the call. All games will also be on KVSC FM 88.1 ([www.kvsc.org](http://www.kvsc.org)). The games will also be televised on Charter Cable's Mainstreet Network (channel 14 in the St. Cloud area).

### THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ SCSU was ranked 7th in the Pairwise rankings on Mar. 9 at 1 p.m. These rankings mimic the criteria used by the NCAA to determine the 16 teams for postseason tournament play.

■ In the most recent USCHO.com poll, SCSU moved to #7. This marked the 13th consecutive week that the Huskies have been ranked among the top 20 teams in the US-CHO.com poll this season. SCSU was also ranked #7 in the INCH Power Rankings and #7 USA Hockey poll on Mar. 8.

■ SCSU placed third in the final WCHA regular season standings, two spots ahead of the predicted fifth place finish in the league's pre-season poll. In 20 seasons of play in the WCHA, this marks the 3rd time SCSU has placed 3rd in the WCHA standings. SCSU also placed 3rd in 2000 and 1997. Of note, SCSU placed 2nd in the WCHA in 2001, 2002 and 2007.

■ Former Husky Ryan Malone (1999-2003) helped lead Team USA to a Silver Medal at the recent Winter Olympics in Vancouver. In his Olympic debut, Malone posted 3 goals and 2 assists during tournament play.

■ This will mark the second consecutive weekend of Husky-Maverick hockey. Last weekend, the squads finished the regular season with a 4-2 win by MSU, and a 2-2 tie. Since moving to the DI level, SCSU is 20-12-6 in games played against MSU. The first time these two MnSCU rivals played each other was in 1969-70, when the Huskies won 8-2 and 7-0 in that first series on the outdoor ice. This is the first time MSU and SCSU have tangled in the playoffs.

■ Senior defender Garrett Raboin is a top 10 finalist for the 2010 Lowe's Senior CLASS award.

■ This will mark the 10th time that SCSU has hosted first round action in the WCHA playoffs at the National Hockey Center. Call 1-877-SCSUTIX or 320-308-2137 for details.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU was ranked 7th in the USCHO.com poll, #7 in the USA Hockey poll and 7th in the INCH poll this week...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

About Last Week...

Feb. 19:#4 SCSU 5, #3 Wisconsin 1

In a battle of college hockey titans, the Huskies prevailed by a 5-1 margin at the Kohl Center in Madison on Feb. 19. Ryan Lasch opened the SCSU scoring in the first period, and Garrett Roe scored the eventual game winner at 2:25 of the second period. Ben Hanowski and Tony Mosey (PPG) also scored markers in the second period to give the Huskies a 4-1 lead headed in the final period. In the third period, SCSU's Brian Volpei carded his fourth goal of the season at 15:07 with assists from Nick Oslund and Jordy Christian to make it 5-1. UW's lone goal was scored in the second period by Derek Stepan. In the contest, UW outshot the Huskies 38-24, as junior netminder Dan Dunn made 37 big saves in the contest that pushed his season record to 12-2-1. Scott Gudmandson made 19 saves in the loss for UW. This win marked the first time since Feb. 17, 2001 that the Huskies had gained a victory in Madison. Of note, Drew LeBlanc had two assists in the contest for the Huskies. A total of 4 penalties were called in the game (two against each squad).

Feb. 20: #3 Wisconsin 7, #4 St. Cloud State 4

An offensive explosion in the Kohl Center, saw #3 Wisconsin post a 7-4 victory over #4 on Feb. 20. Garrett Roe got the ball rolling with his 14th goal of the season at 1:10 of the first period to give the Huskies a 1-0 lead. UW charged back with two goals in the first period. In the second period, UW made it 3-1 with a goal by Derek Stepan before SCSU's Oliver Lauridsen closed the gap with his goal at 19:14 of the second period. This was Lauridsen's fifth goal in the last six games. At the buzzer of the second period, Ben Street scored for UW to make it 4-2. The Huskies cut the lead to 4-3 at 8:15 of the third period with a marker by Aaron Marvin, but UW made it 5-3 with a goal by Jordy Murray at 11:35 of the third. The Huskies battled back to 5-4 with a goal by Drew LeBlanc at 11:54, but the Badgers completed the victory with goals by Andy Bohmbach and Aaron Bendickson in the final seven minutes of the game. UW outshot the Huskies 50-23, as Mike Lee made 43 saves (a career high for Lee) in the contest for SCSU. Gudmandson made 19 saves in the win for UW.



**MORE NEWS AND NOTES...**

**PLAYOFF FACTS:** The Huskies own a 25-19-0 record in first round play of the WCHA playoffs since 1991. Last year, SCSU lost two games at Minnesota by scores of 4-2 and 3-0 in the first round of the playoffs. The last time SCSU hosted first round play was in 2008, and the Huskies advanced to the Final Five with a 3-0, 4-3 OT series sweep against Wisconsin. Of note, SCSU is 16-5-0 in first round playoff games played at the National Hockey Center. This will mark the first time that SCSU and MSU have tangled in the WCHA playoffs, as the Huskies have played first round playoff games against every other WCHA squad...SCSU has advanced to the WCHA Final Five 11 times since 1994. The Huskies won first place honors in the WCHA Five Five in 2001, and they have advanced to the championship game of the Final Five three times (2006, 2001 and 1994). SCSU has advanced to the WCHA Final Five three times during Bob Motzko's tenure as head coach at SCSU (2008, 2007 and 2006). SCSU is 7-14-0 in action at the Final Five since 1994.

**FIVE POINTS AWAY:** Senior forward Ryan Lasch, a post-season honors candidate in 2009-10, charted his 40th point of the season with his goal at MSU on March 5. Lasch now has 174 points in his career at SCSU, and is just five points away from the team record of 179 points set by Jeff Saterdalen from 1988-92. Lasch has 18 goals and 22 assists this season, and it marks his third consecutive season with 40-plus points. In his career, Lasch has 77 goals and 97 assists.

**FINAL FIVE FACTS:** SCSU has advanced to the WCHA Final Five 11 times since 1994. The Huskies won first place honors in the WCHA Five Five in 2001, and they have advanced to the championship game of the Final Five three times (2006, 2001 and 1994). SCSU has advanced to the WCHA Final Five three times during Bob Motzko's tenure as head coach at SCSU (2008, 2007 and 2006). SCSU is 7-14-0 in action at the Final Five since 1994.

**HOT HANDS:** Sophomore Drew LeBlanc has been on fire in the final stretch of the regular season. In his last 10 outings, LeBlanc has posted 10 assists and one goal for a total of 11 points since Jan. 29. He now has 5g/20a for 25 points this season...Junior Tony Mosey has also enjoyed an 11-point run in his last 10 games for the Huskies. He has posted 2g/9a since Jan. 29, including a three assist effort in the games vs. MSU on March 5-6. Mosey currently ranks third on the team this season with 31 points (11g/20a), which is a career season-high for Mosey.

**TEAM NOTES:** Junior Garrett Roe continues to climb the charts at SCSU. His goal on March 6, was Roe's 16th of the season. He now has 51 career goals and 132 career points, which places him ninth in the team records for career points. He currently leads the Huskies in 2009-10 with 23 assists...SCSU seniors saluted at the game on March 6 included Jon Ammerman, Craig Gaudet, Ryan Peckskamp, Ryan Lasch and Garrett Raboin. Of note, Ammerman and Raboin also received their third consecutive WCHA Scholar-Athlete plaques at the game from SCSU Faculty Rep Dr. William Hudson...SCSU senior defender Garrett Raboin is a top 10 finalist for the Lowe's Senior CLASS award in 2009-10. Fans can vote for Raboin in the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award poll by visiting this website: [www.seniorCLASSaward.com](http://www.seniorCLASSaward.com)...Ryan Lasch has now played in a school record 154 consecutive games during his career with the Huskies. He is also closing in on the record for most games played in a game, which was set by Nate Dey from 2004-08 with 159 games played.

**A FEW MORE PLAYOFF NOTES:** In first round play in the WCHA playoffs, SCSU is 25-21 since 1991...in first round games at the NHC, SCSU is 16-5-0 and the Huskies are 9-16-0 in first round action on the road...the only time that SCSU has not advanced to the WCHA Final when the Huskies hosted first round play was during the 1995 playoffs. SCSU lost 3-2 and 5-2 to North Dakota that season in the first round at the NHC...this marks the third time in the past five seasons that SCSU has hosted first round action at the NHC.

**UP NEXT:** The winner of the series between SCSU and MSU will advance to the 2010 Red Baron WCHA Final Five at the Xcel Energy Center on March 18-20.

#### The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 101-71-24 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 63 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

**MOTZKO'S STAFF:** Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons. and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, four-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.

## SCSU WCHA PLAYOFF NOTEBOOK:

This will mark the first time that St. Cloud State and Minnesota State have met in the WCHA Final Five tournament. SCSU has now played every team in the WCHA in post-season tournament play.

\* The Huskies will be looking to return to the WCHA Final Five, after missing a ticket to the Xcel in 2009. Since joining the WCHA in 1990-91, the Huskies own a 25-21-0 record in first round play of the WCHA playoffs. SCSU has hosted first round action in the WCHA playoffs in 3-of-the-last 5 seasons. The Huskies also hosted first round play in the WCHA playoffs during 2007 and 2008. The Huskies are 9-16-0 in WCHA first round playoffs on the road and they are 16-5-0 in first round action at the NHC. Last year, the Huskies lost a pair of games at Minnesota in first round play.

\* In WCHA Final Five action, the Huskies are 7-14-0 and they have advanced to the Final Five in 1994, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2006, 2007 and 2008. SCSU has advanced to the Red Baron WCHA Final Five championship game in 1994, 2001 and 2006. The Huskies captured the WCHA's Broadmoor Trophy in 2001 with a historic 6-5 OT championship game victory over North Dakota.

\* SCSU has only lost one first round series when it has hosted first round games at the NHC. In 1995, SCSU suffered a 3-2 and 5-2 series setback against visiting North Dakota, which prevented SCSU from earning a bid to the Final Five..

\* In the last playoff series at the NHC, SCSU posted a 3-0 and 4-3 OT series sweep over Wisconsin on March 13-14, 2008.
