WCHA SHOWDOWNS

Two of college hockey's hottest teams will meet this weekend in St. Cloud and Minneapolis. #12 St. Cloud State (14-7-3, 9-5-2 WCHA) will host Minnesota (12-10-2, 7-7-2 WCHA) on Friday, Jan. 22 at 7:07 p.m. at the National Hockey Center (5,371 cap./200x100). On Jan. 23, the Huskies and Gophers will head back to the Cities for a 5:07 p.m. game at Mariucci Arena (10,000 cap./200x100) in Minneapolis. Both games will be broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) and KVSC 88.1 FM (www.kvsc.org). The game on Jan. 22, will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet Network (channel 14 in the St. Cloud area) and also on Fox Sports North (channel 28 in the St. Cloud area). The game on Jan. 23 will be televised live on Fox Sports North (channel 28 in the St. Cloud area). Fans can watch the Jan. 22 game live on the web through the B2 Networks by checking the Husky Home Page at www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

- SCSU was ranked 6th in the Pairwise rankings on Jan. 20 at 1 p.m. These rankings mimic the criteria used by the NCAA to determine the 16 teams for postseason tournament play.
■ In the most recent USCHO.com poll, SCSU moved up to #12 in the nation. This marked the sixth consecutive week that the Huskies have been ranked among the top 20 teams in the USCHO.com poll this season. SCSU was also ranked #13 in the INCH Power Rankings and #12 USA Hockey poll on Jan. 18. Minnesota received votes in the INCH and USCHO.com polls this week. Of note, the #12 ranking is SCSU's best national ranking since a #11 ranking on Mar. 31, 2008.
■ SCSU senior Ryan Lasch scored his 70th career goal on Jan. 15 at Quinnipiac. He is only the fifth Husky to reach the 70-goal plateau at the DI level.
■ Junior Garrett Roe continued his dynamic offensive output at Quinnipiac. He now owns a six-game point scoring streak and also leads the team with 22 points and 16 assists.
■ Former Husky Ryan Malone (1999-2003) was named to the 2010 USA men's hockey team, which will compete at the upcoming Winter Olympic games in Vancouver.
■ SCSU has scored a power play goal in its last six games, which coincides with the Huskies' current six-game winning streak. SCSU has 12 power play goals in those six games.
■ The Huskies will return to action in the WCHA on Jan. 29-30 with a pair of road games at Colorado College in Colorado Springs, Colo.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU was ranked 12th in the USCHO.com poll #12 in the USA Hockey poll and 13th in the INCH poll this week...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

About Last Week...

Jan. 15: #14/15 SCSU 3, at Quinnipiac 1

The Huskies continued their winning ways with a 3-1 win at Quinnipiac in the debut of this new series. Ryan Lasch kicked-off the scoring at 8:53 of the first period with a power play goal that was assisted by Taylor Johnson and Garrett Raboin. Quinnipiac scored at 3:38 of the second period to tie the game before Raboin notched the GWG with a SHG at 11:59 of the second. Travis Novak added the lone assist on the play. This was Raboin's 2nd SHG of the season (and his career). To finish off the Bobcats, Tony Mosey posted an ENG at 19:49 of the third period with the single helper being credited to Lasch. In the nets, Dan Dunn added his 8th win of the season with 21 saves for the Huskies. SCSU outshot QU 27-22, and the Huskies went 1-of-4 on the PP and 4-of-4 on the PK.

Jan. 16: #14/15 SCSU 3, at Quinnipiac 2

The SCSU sweep trend was continued on Jan. 16 with a 3-2 win at Quinnipiac in Hamden, Conn. This marked the Huskies' third consecutive weekend sweep of the season and it pushed the SCSU win streak to 6-games. The game opened in the second period with a goal by David Eddy at 1:39, as assists were added by Tony Mosey and Garrett Roe. Brett Barta padded the SCSU lead to 2-0 with his first goal of the season at 4:22 of the second period. Ben Hanowski and Sam Zabkowicz each had an assist on the play. The Huskies earned the GWG at 14:16 of the second with a power play marker by Eddy, as the Little Falls' connection of Hanowski and Jared Festler scored the assists. QU added a pair of goals in the closing period, but it was not enough to snap the SCSU win streak. In the nets, Mike Lee was solid with 35 saves to his credit. Of note, SCSU was outshot 37-21 in the match. On the power play, SCSU was 1-of-5 and the Huskies were 5-of-6 on the PK. These two games were the first time that SCSU has played against Quinnipiac as a Division I hockey program. SCSU is now 5-0-1 against ECAC squads this winter.



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

THE OVER 70 CROWD: Senior forward Ryan Lasch became just the fifth Husky in team history to score 70 career goals on Jan. 15. Lasch posted a power play goal against Quinnipiac, which was his team leading 11th goal of the season. Lasch now has 32 power play goals in his career, which ranks 2nd best in team history along with Mark Hartigan, who also had 32 PPGs from 1999-01.

DUNN MAKES IT HAPPEN: SCSU junior goaltender Dan Dunn currently ranks third among NCAA Division I goalies with a .800 win rate this season. He improved to 8-2-0 on the season with a 3-1 victory at Quinnipiac on Jan. 15. In that contest, Dunn collected 21 saves for the Huskies. His .926 save rate this season ranks seventh in the nation and his current 2.10 GAA is eighth in the nation.

GET SHORTY: Senior Garrett Raboin scored his second short-handed goal of the season on Jan. 15. The goal was Raboin's fourth of the season and he has charted four goals in the last five games for SCSU. SCSU currently leads the nation with eight SHGs this season.

HOT ROLL: SCSU is on a roll thanks to a 6-0-0 win streak dating back to Jan. 2, and a 9-2-1 record dating back to Nov. 27, 2009...in the last six games, SCSU is a sterling 33.3% on the power play (12-of-36). On the penalty kill, SCSU is impressive at 89.3% (25-of-28). Over those six games, SCSU has outscored its opponents 25-10...since Nov. 27, SCSU has outscored its opponents 42-28. SCSU is operating at a 25.8% rate on the power play during those 12 games (17-of-66) and the Huskies are 88.7% on the penalty kill (6-of-53).

THE STREAK: Junior Garrett Roe continued his dynamic offensive output at Quinnipiac. He now owns a six-game point scoring streak and also leads the team with 22 points and 16 assists.

HUSKY NOTES: Freshman David Eddy hit a career game-high with his two goals against Quinnipiac on Jan. 16. In his first year with the Huskies, Eddy now has five goals and seven assists for 12 points...Freshman goalie Mike Lee had 35 saves in SCSU's 3-2 victory on Jan. 16. Lee's record now stands at 6-5-3 on the season, which includes a .917 save rate and a 2.47 goals against average.

HUSKY NOTES PART DEUX: The Huskies own the second longest active win streak in NCAA hockey at six games. SCSU's win streak dates back to a victory over Brown on Jan. 2...SCSU's penalty kill rate of 89-of-103 (86.4%) currently ranks 10th in the nation among NCAA Division I teams...SCSU ranks 11th in the nation with a 2.38 goals against average this season... SCSU has been outshot this season 706-666 by its opponents this season, but at the same time, SCSU has outscored its opponents 71-57 this season. SCSU has outscored its opponents 28-14 on the power play this season... A total of nine players have 10-or-more points this season for the Huskies... Junior Tony Mosey has already hit career season-highs this season with nine goal, 7 power play goals and 18 points this season... Freshman defender Taylor Johnson and sophomore defender Sam Zabkowicz both rank first on the team this season with +5 plus/minus rankings this winter....Brett Barta scored his first goal of the season (and 2nd career goal) on Jan. 16 at Quinnipiac. A junior from Moorhead, Barta now has 1g/3a this winter for SCSU.

ON DECK: The Huskies will travel to Colorado College on Jan. 29-30 for a pair of games at the World Arena in Colorado Springs, Colo.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 95-67-22 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 56 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons, and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, four-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.
