BATTLE AGAINST THE BOBCATS

The #14/15 St. Cloud State men's hockey team (2-7-3, 9-5-2 WCHA) will travel to Hamden, Conn. this weekend for a weekend series at non-conference rival #17 Quinnipiac University on Jan. 15-16. Both games at the TD Bank Sports Center (cap. 3,084) will start at 6:00 p.m. (Central Time). The games will be aired live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don Lyons making the call. You can also watch these games on the web through the Quinnipiac home page. Check out <http://www.quinnipiacbobcats.com> for all the details.

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ SCSU was ranked 10th in the Pairwise rankings on Jan. 12 at 1 p.m. These rankings mimic the criteria used by the NCAA to determine the 16 teams for postseason tournament play.

■ Garrett Raboin was named the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week on Jan. 12. Raboin also earned Player of the Week honors vs. MTU in 2008-09.

■ In the most recent USCHO.com poll, SCSU moved up to #14 in the nation. This marked the fifth consecutive week that the Huskies have been ranked among the top 20 teams in the USCHO.com poll this season. SCSU was also ranked #17 in the INCH Power Rankings and #15 USA Hockey poll on Jan. 11. Quinnipiac is #17 in the USCHO.com poll and #15 in the INCH poll this week.

■ SCSU freshman netminder Mike Lee has helped lead Team USA to a gold medal finish at the 2010 World Junior Championships last week. In tournament play, Lee was 4-0 in the nets for Team USA. He returned to the nets on Jan. 9 for the Huskies with a 30 save win over MTU.

■ Sophomore forward Jared Festler owns a five-game point streak headed into the Huskies' showdown out east against nationally ranked Quinnipiac on Jan. 15-16. Festler has charted 3g/3a his last five games, and over the weekend he posted 1 goal and 2 assists against MTU.

■ Former Husky Ryan Malone (1999-2003) was named to the 2010 USA men's hockey team, which will compete at the upcoming Winter Olympic games in Vancouver.

■ SCSU junior Tony Mosey ranks seventh in the nation with seven power play goals this season. Mosey added his seventh power play goal of the season on Jan. 8. In 2009-10, Mosey has 8g/8a for a total of 16 points.

■ The games this weekend in Hamden, Conn. will mark the first time that St. Cloud State and Quinnipiac have played against each other. These games will mark the final non-conference games of the regular season for the Huskies. SCSU is 3-0-1 in action against ECAC teams this season, and the Huskies are 28-13-3 all-time against teams from the ECAC.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU was ranked 14th in the USCHO.com poll #15 in the USA Hockey poll and 17th in the INCH poll this week...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

About Last Week...

Jan. 8: at #17 St. Cloud State 4, Michigan Tech 2

SCSU opened its weekend with a 4-2 victory over Michigan Tech at the NHC on Jan. 8. SCSU outshot MTU 35-23 in this contest. Drew LeBlanc opened fire with a power play goal at 8:14 of the first period, and then SCSU built its lead to 2-0 with a power play goal by Travis Novak at 5:36 of the second period. SCSU charted the game winner at 7:51 of the second period with a goal by Travis Novak. MTU broke the shutout at 1:19 of the third period with a goal by Malcom Gwilliam, before the Huskies iced the contest with their third PPG of the night. This time, Tony Mosey scored his 7th PPG of the season at 9:04. To finish the scoring, Jordan Baker scored at 19:44 of the third for MTU. In the nets, Dan Dunn made 21 saves to claim his 7th win of the season for SCSU. SCSU was 3-of-7 on the power play, and MTU was 1-of-4. MTU was called for 37 minutes of penalties in the game on nine calls.

Jan. 9: at #19 St. Cloud State 5, MTU 1

The Huskies added sweep #3 of the season with a solid 5-1 stomping of Michigan Tech at the NHC. Bennett Royer of MTU gave his Huskies a 1-0 lead at 10:07 of the first period, but the lead was short as Garrett Roe scored on the PP for SCSU at 12:57 of the first. In the second period, Garrett Raboin gained his first SHG as a Husky at 13:05 - as this proved to be the GWG. Travis Novak scored his 5th goal of the season at 18:23 of the second to make it 3-1 in favor of SCSU. The goals kept rolling in with Raboin's power play score at 1:47 of the third period. Teammate Jared Festler ended the day with his fifth goal of the season at 19:31 of the third period. In the game, MTU outshot the Huskies 31-24, but SCSU's Mike Lee stood tall with 30 saves to his credit. On the PP, SCSU was 2-of-5 and MTU was 0-of-3. Of note, Jon Ammerman posted his first point of the season with an assist on Festler's goal late in the third period.



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

WCHA POW: SCSU is tops in the country with seven short-handed goals in 2009-10. Senior defender Garrett Raboin, who didn't score his first goal of the season until Jan. 3, added the Huskies' seventh SHG of the season on Jan. 9. This was the first SHG of Raboin's career at SCSU. He also scored a power play goal in the game on Jan. 9, which pushes his season totals to 3g/9a. For his work this weekend, Raboin was named the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week! Raboin is a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in 2009-10.

LEE WINS GOLD: SCSU freshman goalie Mike Lee returned to the nets for the Huskies on Jan. 9, and provided a sterling 30 save effort in the Huskies' 5-1 win over MTU. Lee is now 5-5-3 on the season for SCSU, which includes a .914 save rate and a 2.51 GAA. A member of the 2010 USA Junior Team, Lee helped guide Team USA to a gold medal at the 2010 World Junior Championships. In tournament action, Lee posted a 4-0 record that included big wins over Finland and Sweden. Team USA went on to capture the gold medal on Jan. 5, with a thrilling 6-5 OT win Canada.

THE FESTLER FIVE: Sophomore forward Jared Festler owns a five-game point streak headed into the Huskies' showdown out east against nationally ranked Quinnipiac on Jan. 15-16. Festler has charted 3g/3a his last five games, and over the weekend he posted 1 goal and 2 assists against MTU. He now has 5 goals and 7 assists, and he also leads the club with a +5 on the plus/minus this winter.

THE SENIOR ADVANTAGE: Senior defender Craig Gaudet, who entered the season with just 2 goals and 4 assists in 18 games played during his SCSU career, has been a mainstay at the SCSU blueline this winter. He hit a career game-high with his three assists in SCSU's win on Jan. 8. In 2009-10 alone, Gaudet has already surpassed his previous career totals as he has played in 22 games this season with 3 goals and 7 assists to his credit.

NATIONAL LEADERS: On the topic of goaltenders, junior Dan Dunn collected a 21 save victory over MTU on Jan. 8. Dunn ranks fifth in the nation with a 77.8% winning rate this winter at 7-2-0. He also ranks 10th in the nation with a .924 save percentage. His goals against average this year stands at 2.22.... SCSU junior Tony Mosey ranks seventh in the nation with seven power play goals this season. Mosey added his seventh power play goal of the season on Jan. 8. In 2009-10, Mosey has 8g/8a for a total of 16 points.

HUSKY TIDBITS: Sophomore Travis Novak scored a goal on each night of the Huskies' sweep over MTU...SCSU junior forward Garrett Roe added his first three-point game of the season with 1g/2a vs. MTU on Jan. 9. On the weekend, Roe had 1g/3a and he leads the club now with 20 points and 14 assists this year. In his stellar career at SCSU, Roe has 41g/72a for 113 points...SCSU junior Drew LeBlanc owns a three-game point streak, and he has 2g/4a in the last three games for the Huskies. On the season, LeBlanc ranks fourth on the team with 13 points (4g/9a)...Nick Oslund scored his team-leading third game winning goal of the season on Jan. 9. His three GWGs rank 8th in the nation... The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team (12-7-3, 9-5-2 WCHA) completed its second consecutive weekend sweep at the National Hockey Center with a 4-2 victory over Michigan Tech on Jan. 8, and a 5-1 win over MTU on Jan. 9. This was SCSU's third weekend sweep of the 2009-10 season, and the Huskies are an impressive 6-1-1 since Dec. 1, 2009...SCSU is 10-1-3 this season when it scores 3-or-more goals in a game...SCSU is 4-0-0 when either Drew LeBlanc or Nick Oslund scores a goal this season...SCSU is 11-1-3 when it scores on the power play this season.

ON DECK: The Huskies will be back at the National Hockey Center on Jan. 22 for a 7:07 p.m. match against WCHA rival Minnesota. All seats for this game were sold out, but a limited number of standing room only tickets were available. The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 93-67-22 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 55 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons, and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers.
