The #17 St. Cloud State University men's hockey team (2-3-1, 1-1-0 WCHA) will begin a 6-game homestand with a pair of home dates at the National Hockey Center (5,371 cap./200x100) against Quinnipiac University (3-1-0, 0-0-0 ECAC) on Oct. 29 and Oct. 30. Both games will start at 7:07 p.m. KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) will cover the game live with Don Lyons and the All-American Dave Reichel providing the call from the press box at the NHC. SCSU BY THE NUMBERS

3,000 The first 3,000 fans at the Husky-Quinnipiac game on Oct. 29 will receive a 2010-11 SCSU men's hockey magnet schedule courtesy of Little Caesar's Pizza in St. A Cloud.

148 Senior Garrett Roe now has 148 career points as a Husky and he ranks 5th in the team career records. He also ranks 4th in the recordbook with 92 assists and 9th with 56 goals. Roe is closing in on SCSU legend Mark Hartigan, who ranks 4th in the team records with 165 points from 1999-2002. Roe had 1g/2a at Minnesota on Oct. 22 - including his first SHG as Husky.

40 Sophomore goalie Mike Lee made 40 saves in the Huskies' 5-2 win at Minnesota on Oct. 22. Lee now owns a 2-1-0 record this season with a 3.18 GAA. This was Lee's 14th career win at SCSU.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (24-15-5) placed third in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (15-9-4 WCHA). The Huskies won the first round of the WCHA playoffs vs. Minnesota State, and then placed 2nd at the WCHA Final Five. In NCAA tournament play, the Huskies scored a 4-3 double OT win vs. Northern Michigan at the West Regional, and then lost to Wisconsin by a 5-3 tally in the regional final. This was the 14th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the 10th time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500. This also marked the ninth time since 1993-94 that the Huskies have won 20-plus games.

POLL POSITION: Here are the current rankings for the Huskies: US-CHO.com - 17th, USA Today/USAH Hockey: RV, INCH: RV, CHN Pre-season: 6th...SCSU was ranked 2nd in the WCHA preseason coaches poll for 2010-11, and the Huskies earned a 3rd place ranking in the 2010-11 WCHA preseason media poll.

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). Zach Fisch and former Husky legend Mike Doyle will provide play-by-play for Husky Productions this season.

WATCH ON THE WEB: Once again in 2010-11, all SCSU home games (and selected road games) will be available to watch on the America One Networks (formerly B2 networks) live video streaming service. COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by sixth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. The Huskies' assistant coaches include four-year veteran Mike Gibbons and first-year coach Steve Johnson. Mike Ayers is in his 2nd year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

NEW FACE ON THE BENCH: Steve Johnson begins his first season at SCSU as an assistant coach. He previously served as head coach at Fargo in the USHL, and also served as head coach at Lincoln and Fargo-Moorhead of the USHL. He played college hockey at North Dakota and was a Hobey Baker Award finalist and was named the WCHA Student Athlete of the Year in 1988. Johnson replaces Eric Rud, who was named the head coach at Green Bay (USHL) during the summer of 2010.

ALUMNI DAY IS NOV. 6: The St. Cloud State University men's hockey alumni day has been set for Saturday, Nov. 6, when the Huskies host Bemidji State University for a 7:07 p.m. WCHA game at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud. MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

ABOUT LAST WEEK: To open the WCHA season, the Huskies split in weekend action at #20 Minnesota. On Oct. 22, the Huskies posted a 5-2 win over the Gophers. In the contest, Brian Volpei, Jared Festler, Tony Mosey, Garrett Roe and Nic Dowd all charted goals for the Huskies, while Roe added two assists to bring his game point total to 3. The Huskies led 5-0 headed into the final 10 minutes of play before UM broke the shutout with a pair of late goals. Mike Lee was a wall in goal with 40 saves (UM outshot the Huskies 42-35 in the game). On the power play, SCSU was 2-of-6 and it was 4-of-4 on the PK. Of note, SCSU's senior class posted 3 goals, 4 assists, one power play goal and the game winner in the contest. SCSU ended the weekend with 2-1 loss in a rare Sunday matinee on Oct. 24 at Mariucci. Defender Brett Barta scored the lone goal in the game for the Huskies with helpers from Kevin Gravel and Mitch MacMillan at 6:12 of the first period.

FIRST ONE: Freshman forward became the first resident of Alabama to score a goal for St. Cloud State with his marker at 13:33 of the 2nd period at Minnesota. Dowd played junior hockey last year with Indiana (USHL)...Huskies charting their first goals of the new season on Oct. 22 included Brian Volpei and Garrett Roe, who gained his first shorthanded goal as a Husky with his marker vs. the Gophers...on Oct. 24, Brett Barta's slapper from the point provided his first goal of the season and his 3rd career goal.

BACK ON ICE: Junior forward Jordy Christian, who was an injury scratch in SCSU's first 4 games of the season, saw ice time for the first time this season vs. Minnesota. Christian made a quick impact with his assist on Dowd's Oct. 22 goal.

A POWER PLAYER: Senior Tony Mosey added his second power play goal of the season on Oct. 22 vs. Minnesota. Mosey led the Huskies last winter with nine goals on the advantage and he now has 14 PPGs in his career - which is tied for 23rd in the team DI records.

TEAM NOTES: Senior Chris Hepp has already equalled his 2009-10 season point total. Hepp posted his second assist of the 2010-11 season on Oct. 22, with the helper on Garrett Roe's SHG. Last year, Hepp had 2 assists in 42 games. In his career at SCSU, Hepp has 2g/10a...junior Drew LeBlanc saw his point streak stopped at 4-games this weekend. He scored an assist on Oct. 22, but he was held off the scoresheet in the 2-1 loss on Oct. 24. LeBlanc already has 1g/4a this season and ranks second on the team with 5 points this year...did you know that Tony Mosey and Mitch MacMillan each notched their first assists of the 2010-11 in the Minnesota series.

ON TARGET UPDATE: Senior Garrett Roe now has 148 career points thanks to his 1g/2a vs. Minnesota. He now ranks 5th in the team charts for career points. Roe needs 35 points this winter to tie the team's all-time career point record of 183 set by Ryan Lasch from 2006-10. He is the 5th SCSU player to score 90 assists in a career and he ranks 4th on the all-time assist list with 92.

QUINNIPIAC 101: The Huskies will host Quinnipiac on Oct. 29-30 for a pair of games at the NHC, which marks the first trip to St. Cloud for the Bobcats...last year, the Huskies and QU kicked-off this series in Hamden, Conn. at the TD Bank Sports Center rink. On Jan. 15-16, 2010, the Huskies won 3-1 and 3-2...Quinnipiac joined the ECAC in 2005, as the Bobcats replaced Vermont (which moved to Hockey East that season). SCSU is 30-13-3 in games played against ECAC programs since the Huskies moved to the DI level in 1987-88...Quinnipiac is 3-1-0 this season which includes wins over Bentley and Holy Cross last weekend. QU opened the year with a split at home against Ohio State. The Bobcats have not played any ECAC games this year...last year at QU, Tony Mosey had an empty net goal and an assist while Garrett Roe and Ben Hanowski each had a pair of assists in the weekend series. Dan Dunn (21 saves) and Mike Lee (35 saves) each picked up a win out east.

ON DECK: The six-game home stand, the longest of the 2010-11 season, will continue on Nov. 5-6 with two conference home dates against league newcomer Bemidji State. The games at the NHC will start at 7:07 p.m. each night. Call 1-877-SCSUTIX or 320-308-2137 for all the details on tickets for these big games.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin season six with the Huskies in 2010-11. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to four WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007, 2008 and 2010 NCAA Division I tournaments. In five seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 107-77-25 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 70 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2009-10, SCSU was 24-14-5 and placed 3rd in the WCHA at 15-9-5. SCSU placed 2nd at the 2010 WCHA Final Five and advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2010 NCAA tournament thanks to a 4-3 2OT win over Northern Michigan at the NCAA West Regional.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

SCSU goalie Mike Lee played goalie for Team USA at the World Junior Championships in 2010. Team USA won the gold medal at the tournament, as Lee posted a 4-0-0 record for Team USA in tournament play.

Home ice was kind to the Huskies last winter, as they owned a 12-4-5 record in 2009-10 at the NHC. The Huskies are 241-127-42 since the doors opened at the NHC in 1989. SCSU is 0-1-1 at the NHC in 2010-11.

The SCSU captain for 2010-11 will be senior forward Aaron Marvin. He is the grandson of U.S. Hockey Hall of Famer Cal Marvin and the brother of Gigi Marvin, a member of the 2010 USA Olympic women's hockey team. The SCSU alternate captains in 2010-11 will be senior forward Garrett Roe and senior defender Chris Hepp. Of note, Hepp played his first year of college hockey at Air Force before making the transfer to SCSU.

Last year marked the 8th time in team history that the Huskies have gained an NCAA tournament bid. Last year, the Huskies advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals thanks to a 2OT victory over Northern Michigan (4-3) in first round play at the Xcel EC.
