### SEASON OPENER

The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team will open its 2011-12 season on Oct. 7-8 with a pair of games at the Kendall Hockey Classic in Anchorage, Alaska. This marks the first trip to the Kendall Hockey Classic for the Huskies. On Oct. 7, the Huskies will battle University of Alaska at 8:07 p.m. (CT) and on Oct. 8, the Huskies will play host Alaska Anchorage at 10:07 p.m. (CT). Both games will be played at Sullivan Arena (6,251 cap./200x100) in Anchorage, Alaska...fans can listen to the games live on KNSI AM 1450 (www.1450knsi.com) with Don Lyons making the call from Alaska.

## SCSU BY THE NUMBERS

**2442** The number of miles from St. Cloud, Minn. to Anchorage, Alaska is 2,442...making this the longest road trip of the season for the Huskies. This is the lone trip to Alaska this season for the Huskies, as the Seawolves will travel to St. Cloud State on Feb. 17-18 for a pair of WCHA games. Of note, the game at UAA this weekend is considered a non-conference game.

**39** Junior forward Drew LeBlanc led the Huskies in all three offensive categories in 2010-11. LeBlanc topped SCSU's point leaderboard with 39 points. He also led the team with 13 goals and 26 assists. For goals, LeBlanc was tied for the team goal scoring lead along with Ben Hanowski at 13 goals apiece. For assists, LeBlanc tied Garrett Roe for the team lead at 26 assists each last winter. SCSU returns 2 goalies, 5 defenders and 10 forwards from last year. Of note, SCSU will lose 1 goalie, 4 forward and 3 defensemen from last year.

**8** SCSU will return eight of their top 10 point producers from last year's roster. This group includes Drew LeBlanc, Cam Reid, Jared Festler, Nick Jensen, Ben Hanowski, Nic Dowd, David Eddy and Travis Novak. The two players from that list who graduated are Garrett Roe and Aaron Marvin.

**8** SCSU is one of eight teams that will join the new National Collegiate Hockey Conference in 2013-14. The other teams who will form The National include Colorado College, Denver, North Dakota, Miami, Western Michigan and Nebraska Omaha and Minnesota Duluth.

**5** The 2012 WCHA Final Five will be held on March 15-17 at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul. Purchase tickets in person at Xcel Energy Center box office, online at www.ticketmaster.com or by phone at (800) 745-3000.

## MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

**LAST YEAR:** The Huskies (15-18-5, 11-13-4 WCHA) placed eighth in the WCHA regular season standings. In first round play of the WCHA play-offs last year, the Huskies were eliminated in two games at Minnesota Duluth on March 11-12...SCSU received votes in the final USCHO.com Division I national poll of the 2010-11 season.

**POLL POSITION:** Here are the final rankings for the Huskies: USCHO.com - received votes, USA Today/USAH Hockey: Received Votes... SCSU earned a 7th place ranking in the 2011-12 WCHA preseason media poll and WCHA coaches' preseason poll.

**THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW:** The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show will broadcast live from the Green Mill in downtown St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to attend this show live at the Green Mill and admission is FREE. You can also listen to the show live on the web at [www.knsi1450.com](http://www.knsi1450.com)



**ON THE AIR:** All SCSU games will be broadcast live on KNSI AM 1450 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at [www.knsi1450.com](http://www.knsi1450.com). Selected Husky games will also be broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 ([www.kvsc.org](http://www.kvsc.org)) in 2011-12. KVSC's crew will be led by sports directors Dave Overlund and Zack Fisch.

**LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD:** All SCSU home games will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (St. Cloud Charter Cable Channel 87 in stunning HD). A select number of home games are slated to be televised live on Comcast Cable (channel 23 Minneapolis and channel 13 St. Paul) in 2010-11.

**WATCH ON THE WEB:** Once again in 2011-12, all SCSU home games (and selected road games) will be available to watch on the America One Networks (formerly B2 networks) live video streaming service. To learn more about this pay-per-view web service, please check out the Audio/Video link on the Husky Home Page.

**COACHING STAFF:** SCSU will be led this season by seventh-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. The Huskies' assistant coaches include five-year veteran Mike Gibbons and second-year coach Steve Johnson. Matt Chapman will serve as the team's coordinator of hockey and video operations and Jeremiah Minkel is back once again as the team's equipment manager in 2011-12.

**THE NATIONAL:** St. Cloud State University will join the National Collegiate Hockey Conference in 2013-14. The Huskies accepted the invitation to join The National on Sept. 22, and they will join Colorado College, University of Denver, University of Minnesota Duluth, University of Nebraska Omaha, Miami University, University of North Dakota and Western Michigan as members of the new league. SCSU will remain as a member of the WCHA until the 2013-14 season. The Huskies became an NCAA Division I affiliate in 1987-88 and they joined the WCHA in 1990-91.

**TOUGH SCHEDULE:** SCSU was recognized as having one of the toughest schedules in all of Division I hockey latest season. The upcoming schedule appears to be just as strong. In 2011-12, the Huskies are scheduled to play 11 opponents (out of 15) that are ranked or received votes in this year's preseason polls. Top 10 ranked opponents for SCSU this winter include Denver, North Dakota, Colorado College and Minnesota Duluth.

**MORE NEWS AND NOTES...**

**AWARD WINNER:** SCSU junior Drew LeBlanc was named to the 2011 All-WCHA Third Team. This marks the 45th time a SCSU player has earned All-WCHA status since the Huskies joined the league in 1990-91. In WCHA play last winter, LeBlanc ranked 10th in the league for scoring with 28 points (along with teammate Garrett Roe) in 28 games. LeBlanc led the Huskies last season with 39 points (13g/26a). This marks the first All-WCHA award for LeBlanc.

**GET SMART:** The Huskies placed 7 student-athletes on the WCHA Scholar-Athlete list in 2011. This group included two-time recipients Drew LeBlanc, Jordy Christian, Travis Novak and Brian Volpei. First time recipients included Oliver Lauridsen, Aaron Marvin and Mike Lee. Huskies named to the 2011 All-WCHA Academic squad were Brett Barta, Christian, Jared Festler, Ben Hanowski, Lauridsen, LeBlanc, Lee, Marvin, Nick Olsund, Novak, Nic Rioux, Garrett Roe, Volpei and Sam Zabkowicz.

**GREAT EFFORT:** SCSU finished its season with a pair of setbacks at UMD on March 11-12 in the first round of the WCHA playoffs. The Huskies lost 4-2 on March 11 and then lost in triple overtime on March 12 by a 3-2 tally. The overtime game was the second longest in team history at 101:13. SCSU goalie Mike Lee was incredible in the game with 60 saves to his credit (2nd most saves in a game in team history). He made 15 saves alone in the first OT session and also had 28 saves in the three OT periods combined. Lee established himself as SCSU's starting goalie midway through the season in 2010-11. He now has 1,632 career saves, which ranks 8th in team history. At this point of his career, Lee is averaging 28.14 saves per game (tops on the SCSU career charts). The current saves per game leader is Bobby Goepfert at 27.59 from 2005-07.

**HOW WE FINISHED:** The Huskies' goals against average of 2.83 for 2010-11 ranks 9th best in team history...SCSU's team save percentage of .907 ranks 10th best in team history...SCSU's 28.11 saves per game rate in 2010-11 ranks 8th best in team history... SCSU's total of 1,068 saves ranks 15th in the team records...the five tie games in 2010-11 is tied for second for most ties in a season by the Huskies (SCSU set a record with 7 ties in 2006-07)...SCSU posted its second fewest penalties in a season with 211 in 2010-11. The Huskies' penalty minute total of 466 is the second fewest number of PIMs in a season. The team low for penalties was set in 2007-08 at 194-437...Cam Reid's four game winning goals in 2010-11 is tied for 7th in the team records...Mike Lee's average of 29.15 saves per game in 2010-11 ranks 2nd in the team records behind Jake Moreland's 29.19 saves per game in 2002-03.

**TOURNAMENT TESTED:** The Huskies seem to enjoy tournament play. In regular season tournaments played as an NCAA Division I affiliate, the Huskies have posted a 11-4-3 record since 1987-88. This resume of regular season tournament performances includes first place finishes at the UAH tournament in 1990, the Providence Coffee Pot in 2003, Vermont's Catamount Cup in 2006 and the Florida College Hockey Classic in 2010. Of note, SCSU played Alaska at the Maine tournament in 1987 and charted a 5-4 OT win over the Nanooks that season. At the Alabama-Huntsville tournament in 1990, the Huskies gained a 3-2 win over Alaska Anchorage on their way to the tournament title. SCSU scored a 6-1 win over UAH to clinch the crown that season.

**DEPARTED SENIORS/PRO NEWS:** SCSU will say goodbye to a solid group of senior athletes in 2010-11. This groups includes defenseman Brett Barta, goalie Dan Dunn, forward and team captain Aaron Marvin, forward Nick Oslund, forward/defender Nic Rioux, forward Garrett Roe and forward Brian Volpei. Of note, defender Oliver Lauridsen signed a professional hockey contract with the Philadelphia Flyers organization at the end of the 2010-11 season. Lauridsen left SCSU after three seasons of play with 7 goals and 15 assists in 108 games played as a Husky. He had one year of eligibility left at SCSU. Lauridsen (6-6, 230-pounds) was a 2009 draft pick of the Flyers and he hails from Gentofte, Denmark. Lauridsen joined Adirondack of the AHL to finish out the 2010-11 season... Aaron Marvin finished the 2010-11 season with the Abbotsford Heat of the AHL and has been assigned to play with Chicago of the ECHL this fall...former goalie Dan Dunn has signed to play pro hockey with the Rio Grande Valley Killer Bees of the CHL.

**TEAM CAPTAINS:** SCSU team captains for the 2011-12 season will be senior Drew LeBlanc, a forward from Hermantown; junior Ben Hanowski, a forward from Little Falls; and junior Mike Lee, a goalie from Roseau, Minn.

### The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin season seven with the Huskies in 2011-12. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to four WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007, 2008 and 2010 NCAA Division I tournaments. Motzko has charted an impressive 120-92-29 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 71 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2009-10, SCSU was 24-14-5 and placed 3rd in the WCHA at 15-9-5. SCSU placed 2nd at the 2010 WCHA Final Five and advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2010 NCAA tournament thanks to a 4-3 2OT win over Northern Michigan at the NCAA West Regional. Last year, Motzko led SCSU to a 15-18-5, 11-13-4 WCHA record.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United States Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

**MOTZKO'S STAFF:** Motzko will be assisted this winter by Mike Gibbons and Steve Johnson. SCSU's support staff features equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Hockey and Video Operations Matt Chapman.

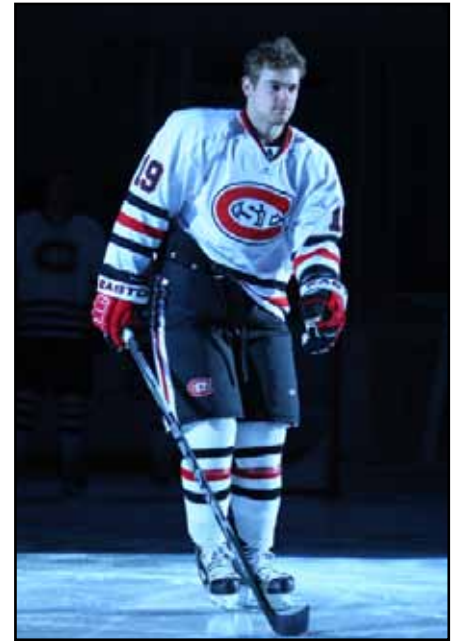

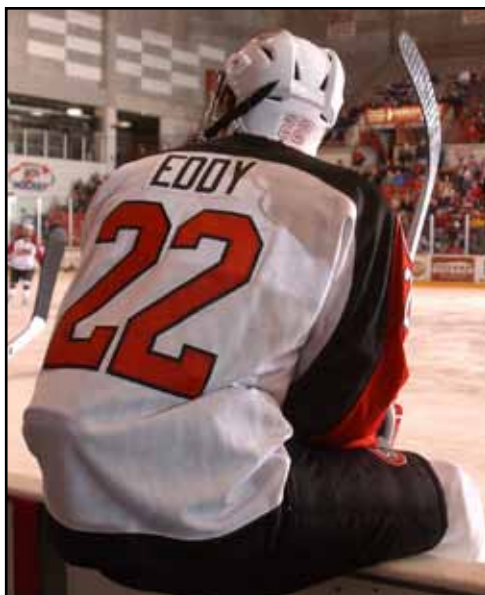

### ***MORE NEWS AND NOTES...***

**WAIT TIL NEXT YEAR:** The Huskies return 17 players from their 2010-11 roster. The Huskies will return 4 of their top 5 point producers from 2010-11 and they will also be eligible to return 8 of their top 10 points from 2010-11. Tops on that list of possible returners is Drew LeBlanc, who led the Huskies with 39 points, 13 goals and 26 assists in 2010-11. LeBlanc was tied for the team's goal lead along with sophomore forward Ben Hanowski, who is also eligible to skate at SCSU in 2011-12. In fact, three of SCSU's top four goal scorers are slated to be back on the ice at the NHC in 2011-12 - LeBlanc (13 goals), Hanowski (13 goals) and Jared Festler (12 goals)...in fact, SCSU's eligible returning players posted 81 goals, 141 assists and 222 points in 2010-11 (out of a total of 112 goals, 202 assists and 314 points)...in the nets, sophomore Mike Lee returns for his junior campaign in 2011-12. He led SCSU with 874 saves in 1879:40 minutes of play this winter. His GAA was 2.75 and his save rate was .910. Reserve goalie Nate Hardy also returns for his senior season in 2011-12.

**NATION WIDE:** Wondered where the Huskies stacked up at the NCAA level in 2010-11. SCORING: 28th (2.95 GPG), SCORING DEFENSE: 35th (2.97 GAPG), PENALTY MINUTES: 43rd (12.0 PIM per game), POWER PLAY PERCENTAGE: 28th (18.3%), PENALTY KILL: 16th (83.9%).

**NATIONAL LEADERS:** On an individual basis, here are where some of the Huskies rated among the NCAA leaders in 2010-11: POINTS PER GAME - Drew LeBlanc (.50th, 1.03 ppg) & Garrett Roe (69th, 0.95 ppg); ASSISTS PER GAME - Drew LeBlanc & Garrett Roe (38th, 0.68 apg); SHORTHANDED GOALS - Garrett Roe (16th, 2 SHGs); GAME WINNING GOALS: Cam Reid (20th, 4 GWGs); POINTS PER GAME - DEFENSESMAN: Nick Jensen (33rd, 0.61 ppg); POINTS PER GAME - ROOKIE: Cam Reid (20th, .78 ppg); GOALS AGAINST AVERAGE: Mike Lee (41st, 2.75 GAA); SAVE PERCENTAGE: Mike Lee (37th, .910 SV%).

**HOW WE FINISHED:** The Huskies' goals against average of 2.83 for 2010-11 ranks 9th best in team history...SCSU's team save percentage of .907 ranks 10th best in team history...SCSU's 28.11 saves per game rate in 2010-11 ranks 8th best in team history...SCSU's total of 1,068 saves ranks 15th in the team records...the five tie games in 2010-11 is tied for second for most ties in a season by the Huskies (SCSU set a record with 7 ties in 2006-07)...SCSU posted its second fewest penalties in a season with 211 in 2010-11. The Huskies' penalty minute total of 466 is the second fewest number of PIMs in a season. The team low for penalties was set in 2007-08 at 194-437...Cam Reid's four game winning goals in 2010-11 is tied for 7th in the team records...Mike Lee's average of 29.15 saves per game in 2010-11 ranks 2nd in the team records behind Jake Moreland's 29.19 saves per game in 2002-03.

**DEFENSE ON THE OFFENSE:** SCSU freshman defender Nick Jensen, a draft pick of the Detroit Red Wings, led the SCSU blueliners last winter with five goals, 18 assists and 23 points. How does this total stack up with some of SCSU's legendary defensive players during their respective rookie seasons? Well, NHL standout Bret Hedican scored 5 goals and 3 assists during his freshman season at SCSU in 1988-89. SCSU's all-time leading defensive for points is Kelly Hultgren (107 points from 1991-95) posted 7 helpers from his blueline location in 1991-92. Another SCSU defense leader Taj Melson had 4g/6a in his first year at SCSU and the notable Justin Fletcher had 6g/7a in his first campaign on the Husky blueline in 2003-04.

**THE ROOKIE:** Newcomer Cam Reid had 29 points last season for the Huskies (8 goals and 21 assists). This marked the most points for a Husky rookie since Garrett Roe had 45 points during his rookie season in 2007-08 at St. Cloud State.

**TEAM NOTES AND TRIVIA:** SCSU was 11-0-1 in 2010-11 when the Huskies scored 4-or-more goals in a game...SCSU was 10-1-1 when the Huskies limited their opponents to two or less goals in a game during the 2010-11 season...SCSU was 0-9-1 when the Huskies four-or-more goals in a game during the 2010-11 season...SCSU set a team record in 2010-11 for fewest shots on goal in a season at 1,046...the Huskies finished their 24th season as an NCAA Division I affiliate in 2010-11 and their 21st season as a proud member of the always rugged WCHA in 2010-11.

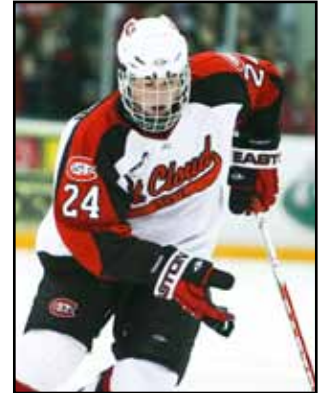
