ON THE ROAD TO OMAHA

The Huskies will get a taste of their new stop in the WCHA with a weekend trip to the Mutual of Omaha Tournament at Nebraska Omaha on Oct. 8-9. The Huskies will open tournament play on Oct. 8 with a 4:37 p.m. date against 2010 NCAA Frozen Four participant RIT. To conclude the weekend in Omaha, the Huskies will battle Clarkson University at 4:07 p.m. on Oct. 9. Both games will be played at the Qwest Center Omaha (14,700 cap.) in Omaha, Neb...fans can listen to the game live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don Lyons making the call from Omaha.

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ *SCSU earned a #4 ranking in the first USCHO.com poll of the season on Oct. 4. The Huskies also posted a #6 ranking in the first INCH poll of 2010-11...the Huskies were picked #6 in the preseason Division I poll released by USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine on Sept. 27. SCSU was also picked #6 in the CHN preseason poll for 2010-11...in the WCHA preseason media poll, the Huskies were ranked 3rd and 2nd in the preseason coaches' poll.*

■ *SCSU finished the season with a #5 ranking in the USA Hockey poll and a #7 ranking in the final USCHO.com poll. SCSU was also ranked #5 in the final Inside College Hockey poll for 2009-10. SCSU was ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for over 16 consecutive weeks in 2009-10.*

■ *This will mark the first time that the Huskies have played in Omaha. In the all-time series against host UNO, the Huskies are 4-0 and all of those games were played at the NHC. Of note, the games in Omaha will mark the first regular season games for the Huskies in 2010-11...SCSU will face RIT on Oct. 8, which marks the first time these two teams have played. On Oct. 9, the Huskies will play Clarkson. SCSU is 5-4 in action against Clarkson since 1987-88.*

■ *Fans will want to mark Oct. 15-16 on the calendar as those dates will mark the opening of the regular home season for the Huskies. SCSU will host #3 Miami (Ohio) at the NHC on those nights. MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (24-15-5) placed third in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (15-9-4 WCHA). The Huskies won the first round of the WCHA playoffs vs. Minnesota State, and then placed 2nd at the WCHA Final Five. In NCAA tournament play, the Huskies scored a 4-3 double OT win vs. Northern Michigan at the West Regional, and then lost to Wisconsin by a 5-3 tally in the regional final. This was the 14th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the 10th time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500. This also marked the ninth time since 1993-94 that the Huskies have won 20-plus games.

POLL POSITION: Here are the current rankings for the Huskies: USCHO.com - 4th, USA Today/USAH Hockey: 6th, INCH: 6th, CHN Pre-season: 6th...SCSU was ranked 2nd in the WCHA preseason coaches poll for 2010-11, and the Huskies earned a 3rd place ranking in the 2010-11 WCHA preseason media poll.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from the Ground Round in St. Cloud.



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games will be broadcast live on KCMF FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans will be able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games will also be broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). Zach Fisch and former Husky legend Mike Doyle will provide play-by-play for Husky Productions this season.

THE CAPTAINS: Senior forward Aaron Marvin will wear the C for the Huskies this season on his sweater. Alternate captains for the Huskies in 2010-11 will be senior forward Garrett Roe and senior defender Chris Hepp.

WATCH ON THE WEB: Once again in 2010-11, all SCSU home games (and selected road games) will be available to watch on the America One Networks (formerly B2 networks) live video streaming service. COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by sixth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. The Huskies' assistant coaches include four-year veteran Mike Gibbons and first-year coach Steve Johnson. Mike Ayers is in his 2nd year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

NEW FACE ON THE BENCH: Steve Johnson begins his first season at SCSU as an assistant coach. He previously served as head coach at Fargo in the USHL, and also served as head coach at Lincoln and Fargo-Moorhead of the USHL. He played college hockey at North Dakota and was a Hobey Baker Award finalist and was named the WCHA Student Athlete of the Year in 1988. Johnson replaces Eric Rud, who was named the head coach at Green Bay (USHL) during the summer of 2010.

FROZEN FOUR EXPERIENCE: How tough is the Husky schedule in 2010-11? The Huskies will battle three of the four 2010 NCAA Frozen Four participants this winter. On Oct. 8, SCSU will play RIT and on Oct. 15-16, the Huskies will host Miami (Ohio). SCSU will also play WCHA rival and FF participant Wisconsin on Feb. 25-26 at the NHC.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

GREAT START: The Huskies got off to an excellent start on Oct. 2, with a 7-4 win over Manitoba at the NHC...SCSU relied on three unanswered goals in the 3rd period to ice the win...#1 star Drew LeBlanc posted two PPGs in the game, including the GWG at 7:28 of the 3rd period...senior Garrett Roe chipped in one goal and two assists, while newcomer Mitch MacMillan scored a goal and an assist in the win. Other Husky goals were added by Travis Novak, Nick Oslund and Bryce Johnson...in the nets, SCSU went with all three goalies. Mike Lee started the game and had 14 saves in the first (no goals allowed). Dan Dunn had 10 saves in the 2nd period, while Nate Hardy finished in the third with 6 saves and the victory...of note, SCSU was 2-of-5 on the power play.

SEASON OPENER: This weekend marks the open of the regular season for the Huskies. This is the 24th season of DI competition for the Huskies - dating back to the 1987-88 season...of note, SCSU is 10-11-2 in regular season openers since an 8-4 loss at Lake Superior State on Oct. 9, 1987...the Huskies are 2-3-0 in regular season openers during the Bob Motzko era at SCSU...of note, the Huskies own a strong 11-4-3 record in action during regular season tournaments since 1987-88. Over the years, SCSU has won regular season tournament titles at the UAH tournament (1990), Maine Ice Breaker (2001), Providence Coffee Pot (2003) and the Catamount Cup (2006).

NEW FACES/NEW POWER: In the exhibition win over Manitoba, SCSU rookies showed well. Mitch MacMillan gained the 3rd star in the game with his goal and assist in the win. Other first year players to register a point include Bryce Johnson (goal) and Cam Reid (assist).

TEAM NOTES: For the second consecutive season, reserve goalkeeper Nate Hardy posted a win in exhibition play. Hardy had six saves and the victory with his work in the 3rd period against Manitoba. Last year, Hardy posted a victory over Lethbridge...the Huskies have a senior class of nine in 2010-11...SCSU's roster in 2010-11 has 16 Minnesota residents on it. The roster also includes players from the states of Virginia, Iowa, Alabama, California, Wisconsin and Michigan...freshman defender Kevin Gravel is the son of former Husky standout Jim Gravel. The elder Gravel played for the Huskies from 1977-81 and he scored 51g/50a during his tenure in the Granite City...on the topic of records against teams from Canada, the Huskies own an all-time record of 13-3-1...the Huskies have 11 NHL draft picks on their roster this season. Newcomers who have been selected in the NHL draft include Kevin Gravel, Nic Dowd, Cam Reid and Nick Jensen. Returners picked in the draft include Mike Lee, Dan Dunn, Garrett Roe, Oliver Lauridsen, Nick Oslund, Aaron Marvin and Ben Hanowski.

ON TARGET: Senior Garrett Roe enters his senior season at SCSU with 142 points, which ranks 5th in the team charts. He is tied for fifth place in the career charts with Joe Motzko (1999-03). Roe needs 41 points this winter to tie the team's all-time career point record of 183 set by Ryan Lasch from 2006-10. Prior to Lasch breaking the record last winter, the Huskies' career scoring mark had been in the recordbooks for many seasons. The previous team record of 179 career points was set by Jeff Saterdalen, who played for the Huskies from 1988 to 1992.

NICE SEASON AT SCSU: Last year marked the 8th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have won 22-or-more games in a season. SCSU's team record for wins in a season is 31, which was hit during the 2000-01 season. SCSU was 24-14-5 in 2009-10. The 24 wins ranks 3rd in team history for most wins in a season. SCSU set a team record by playing in 43 games this season.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin season six with the Huskies in 2010-11. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to four WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007, 2008 and 2009 NCAA Division I tournaments. In five seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 105-74-24 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 67 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2009-10, SCSU was 24-14-5 and placed 3rd in the WCHA at 15-9-5. SCSU placed 2nd at the 2001 WCHA Final Five and advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2010 NCAA tournament thanks to a 4-3 2OT win over Northern Michigan at the NCAA West Regional.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.
