## SCSU BY THE NUMBERS

**149** SCSU senior forward Garrett Roe scored his 149th career point on Nov. 5 in play against Bemidji State at the NHC. Roe is just the 5th player in team history to reach the 149-point plateau at SCSU. Roe has 57 goals and 92 assists in his career with the Huskies.

**24** SCSU legend Bret Hedican, who played for the Huskies from 1988-91 and went on to play in the NHL from 1991 to 2009, had his #24 retired in a special pre-game ceremony at the NHC on Nov. 6. This marks the first time a player number has been retired in the history of the hockey program at SCSU.

**6** The Huskies will conclude a six-game homestand this weekend with games against Nebraska Omaha. The next scheduled home games for the Huskies after this weekend will be a weekend set against Colorado College on Dec. 10-11.

**4** The Husky Family Four Packs will be offered for the UNO game on Nov. 12. **4** The Huskies own a 4-0-0 record in action against Nebraska Omaha. The last time these two clubs played, the Huskies recorded a rare weekend shutout with a 2-0 and 5-0 sweep on Feb. 12-13, 1999 at the NHC. The series opened with a 2-1, 6-2 SCSU sweep over UNO at the NHC on Jan. 9-10, 1998.

**3** Sophomore forward Ben Hanowski scored his first collegiate hat trick on Nov. 5 with his three goals against Bemidji State at the NHC. Prior to Hanowski's trifecta, the previous SCSU hat trick was charted by Ryan Lasch on Feb. 6, 2009 at UAA.

## MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

**LAST YEAR:** The Huskies (24-15-5) placed third in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (15-9-4 WCHA). The Huskies won the first round of the WCHA playoffs vs. Minnesota State, and then placed 2nd at the WCHA Final Five. In NCAA tournament play, the Huskies scored a 4-3 double OT win vs. Northern Michigan at the West Regional, and then lost to Wisconsin by a 5-3 tally in the regional final. This was the 14th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the 10th time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500. This also marked the ninth time since 1993-94 that the Huskies have won 20-plus games.

**POLL POSITION:** Here are the current rankings for the Huskies: USCHO.com - RV, USA Today/USAH Hockey: Not Ranked, INCH: RV, CHN Preseason: 6th...SCSU was ranked 2nd in the WCHA preseason coaches poll for 2010-11, and the Huskies earned a 3rd place ranking in the 2010-11 WCHA preseason media poll.

**THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW:** The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from the Ground Round in St. Cloud.



**ON THE AIR:** All SCSU games will be broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans will be able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at [www.lite999.com](http://www.lite999.com). Selected Husky games will also be broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 ([www.kvsc.org](http://www.kvsc.org)).

**LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD:** All SCSU home games will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). Zach Fisch and former Husky legend Mike Doyle will provide play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. A select number of home games will also be televised live on Comcast Cable (channel 23 Minneapolis and channel 13 St. Paul) in 2010-11. The games include MSU (Jan. 28-29), UND (Feb. 19) and UW (Feb. 25-26).

**WATCH ON THE WEB:** Once again in 2010-11, all SCSU home games (and selected road games) will be available to watch on the America One Networks (formerly B2 networks) live video streaming service. **COACHING STAFF:** SCSU will be led this season by sixth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. The Huskies' assistant coaches include four-year veteran Mike Gibbons and first-year coach Steve Johnson. Mike Ayers is in his 2nd year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

**NEW FACE ON THE BENCH:** Steve Johnson begins his first season at SCSU as an assistant coach. He previously served as head coach at Fargo in the USHL, and also served as head coach at Lincoln and Fargo-Moorhead of the USHL. He played college hockey at North Dakota and was a Hobey Baker Award finalist and was named the WCHA Student Athlete of the Year in 1988. Johnson replaces Eric Rud, who was named the head coach at Green Bay (USHL) during the summer of 2010.

**SKATE WITH THE HUSKIES:** Always a fan favorite at the NHC, the annual Skate with the Huskies event will take place on Sunday, Nov. 14 at 4:30 p.m. This event is FREE and open to the public. Fans will have an opportunity to skate on the ice at the NHC with members of the St. Cloud State men's and women's hockey teams. ## MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

**ABOUT LAST WEEK:** In their first meetings as WCHA opponents, SCSU and visiting Bemidji State split a weekend series at the NHC on Nov. 5-6. The Huskies opened the weekend with a 6-3 victory and then BSU charged back to gain a 3-2 OT decision at the NHC on Nov. 6. In the SCSU victory, Ben Hanowski grabbed the spotlight with his first collegiate hat trick in the contest. Other SCSU goals were added by Drew LeBlanc, Garrett Roe (GWG) and Aaron Marvin. Mike Lee was the goalie of record for SCSU with 23 saves in the game. In the loss on Nov. 6, Nick Jensen posted his first collegiate shorthanded goal in the contest. The second SCSU goal was netted by Marvin - who now owns a three-game goal streak for the Huskies. Dan Dunn was the goalie of record for SCSU with 18 saves in the OT loss. Of note, this marked the first loss to Bemidji State for the Huskies at the NHC. At the DI level, the Huskies still own an impressive 12-2-0 series lead over BSU.

**HAT RACK:** Ben Hanowski's hat trick was the first for a Husky since Ryan Lasch hit one on Feb. 6, 2009 at Alaska Anchorage. This was also the first hat trick scored at the NHC since Lasch posted three in a game vs. rival Minnesota on Jan. 17, 2009. No Huskies scored a hat trick during the 2009-10 season.

**ALMOST 150:** Senior Garrett Roe posted a goal and an assist in the 6-3 win over BSU. This pushes his career point total to 149 points (57g/92a). He now ranks 5th in the team records for career points. He ranks 4th in the team records for career assists and 9th for career goals. Next up on the points list for Roe to aim for is Mark Hartigan, who had 165 points from 1999-02. Tops on the list is Ryan Lasch, who scored 183 career points from 2006-10.

**ON A ROLL:** Senior Aaron Marvin owns a three-game goal scoring streak for the Huskies, which includes 4 goals in the last three games for SCSU. Marvin was scoreless in his first five outings this season, but he has since been on fire with 4 goals and 2 assists in the last four games. Marvin has 62 points (22g/40a) in his career with the Huskies.

**RETIREMENT PARTY:** The Huskies provided the ultimate tribute to former SCSU great Bret Hedican by officially retiring his #24 at a pre-game ceremony on Nov. 6 at the NHC. Hedican is the first Husky hockey player to have his number retired at SCSU. In three seasons at SCSU, Hedican scored 22g/50a for 77 points. He went on to play in the NHL from 1991 to 2009, and he was part of two Winter Olympic games with Team USA in 1992 and 2006. Hedican also helped Carolina win the Stanley Cup in 2006. Congratulations Bret!

**TEAM LEADER:** Junior Drew LeBlanc enjoyed another multi-point effort with his 1g/2a night against BSU on Nov. 5. He now has three multi-point games this season and he also ranks first on the team with 12 points and 10 assists. In the back-to-back games on Oct. 30 and Nov. 5, LeBlanc scored 1 goal and 6 assists for a two-game total of 7 points.

**FAB FROSH:** Rookie defender Nick Jensen scored his first collegiate shorthanded goal on Nov. 6 vs. BSU. Jensen owns a 4-game point streak headed into the UNO series, and he also ranks second on the team with 9 points (2g/7a). Jensen's SHG was the Huskies' second SHG of the season.

**ON DECK:** The Huskies will end their long homestand with a pair of WCHA contests at Alaska Anchorage on Nov. 19-20. Both games up north will begin at 10:07 p.m. Fans can listen to the call from UAA on KCML FM 99.9 ([www.lite999.com](http://www.lite999.com)). SCSU's next scheduled home games are Dec. 10-11 vs. Colorado College. Call 1-877-SCSUTIX or 320-308-2137 for complete ticket information. ### The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin season six with the Huskies in 2010-11. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to four WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007, 2008 and 2010 NCAA Division I tournaments. In five seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 109-79-25 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 71 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2009-10, SCSU was 24-14-5 and placed 3rd in the WCHA at 15-9-5. SCSU placed 2nd at the 2010 WCHA Final Five and advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2010 NCAA tournament thanks to a 4-3 2OT win over Northern Michigan at the NCAA West Regional.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

Home ice was kind to the Huskies last winter, as they owned a 12-4-5 record in 2009-10 at the NHC. The Huskies are 243-129-42 since the doors opened at the NHC in 1989. SCSU is 2-3-1 at the NHC in 2010-11.

The SCSU captain for 2010-11 will be senior forward Aaron Marvin. He is the grandson of U.S. Hockey Hall of Famer Cal Marvin and the brother of Gigi Marvin, a member of the 2010 USA Olympic women's hockey team. The SCSU alternate captains in 2010-11 will be senior forward Garrett Roe and senior defender Chris Hepp. Of note, Hepp played his first year of college hockey at Air Force before making the transfer to SCSU.

Last year marked the 8th time in team history that the Huskies have gained an NCAA tournament bid. This was also the third bid for the Huskies during the Bob Motzko era, and the Huskies' 7th NCAA trip since 2000. Last year, the Huskies advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals thanks to a 2OT victory over Northern Michigan (4-3) in first round play at the Xcel EC.

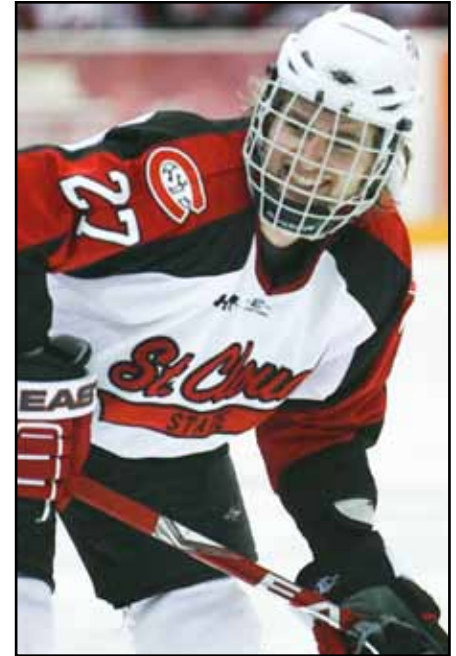
