MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (24-15-5) placed third in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (15-9-4 WCHA). The Huskies won the first round of the WCHA playoffs vs. Minnesota State, and then placed 2nd at the WCHA Final Five. In NCAA tournament play, the Huskies scored a 4-3 double OT win vs. Northern Michigan at the West Regional, and then lost to Wisconsin by a 5-3 tally in the regional final. This was the 14th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the 10th time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500. This also marked the ninth time since 1993-94 that the Huskies have won 20-plus games.

POLL POSITION: Here are the current rankings for the Huskies: US-CHO.com - Not ranked, USA Today/USAH Hockey: Not Ranked, INCH: Not Ranked, CHN Preseason: 6th...SCSU was ranked 2nd in the WCHA preseason coaches poll for 2010-11, and the Huskies earned a 3rd place ranking in the 2010-11 WCHA preseason media poll.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from the Ground Round in St. Cloud.



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games will be broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans will be able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games will also be broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). Zach Fisch and former Husky legend Mike Doyle will provide play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. A select number of home games will also be televised live on Comcast Cable (channel 23 Minneapolis and channel 13 St. Paul) in 2010-11. The games include MSU (Jan. 28-29), UND (Feb. 19) and UW (Feb. 25-26).

WATCH ON THE WEB: Once again in 2010-11, all SCSU home games (and selected road games) will be available to watch on the America One Networks (formerly B2 networks) live video streaming service. COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by sixth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. The Huskies' assistant coaches include four-year veteran Mike Gibbons and first-year coach Steve Johnson. Mike Ayers is in his 2nd year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

NEW FACE ON THE BENCH: Steve Johnson begins his first season at SCSU as an assistant coach. He previously served as head coach at Fargo in the USHL, and also served as head coach at Lincoln and Fargo-Moorhead of the USHL. He played college hockey at North Dakota and was a Hobey Baker Award finalist and was named the WCHA Student Athlete of the Year in 1988. Johnson replaces Eric Rud, who was named the head coach at Green Bay (USHL) during the summer of 2010.

FACTS AND FIGURES: Tony Mosey and Jared Festler each lead the Huskies this season with three power play goals apiece...Nic Dowd earned his first multi-point game with two helpers on Nov. 20 at UAA...rookie Cam Reid owns the team game-winning goal lead this season with two...the Huskies are a perfect 3-0-0 if they chart 30-or-more shots on goal in a game this season...Drew LeBlanc leads the team with 5 multi-point games this season...SCSU is 4-0-1 if the Huskies score four or more goals in a game this season.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST TIME OUT: The Huskies enjoyed a bye week for Thanksgiving, as they did not play games on Nov. 26-27. The last time out, the Huskies split a weekend decision up at Alaska Anchorage. On Nov. 19, the Huskies lost a tough 3-2 OT decision at UAA. The Huskies are now 0-2-2 in OT games this season. Jared Festler and Tony Mosey scored for the Huskies in the contest, as UAA notched the game winner at 3:34 of th the OT session. Mike Lee was the goalie of record for the Huskies with 17 saves in the game. In the loss, SCSU was impressive on the penalty kill with a 7-of-7 effort...on Nov. 20, the Huskies avoided the sweep with a 4-3 win at UAA. Cam Reid pushed home the game winner with a power play marker at 4:12 of the third period. Drew LeBlanc added two goals and one assist in the game, while the other Husky goal was notched by Festler. Of note, Nic Dowd (2a) and Reid (1g/1a) both had multi-point games along with LeBlanc. Dan Dunn gained the victory in the nets with 22 saves to his credit. This marked Dunn's first win vs. UAA in his career.

OLD RIVALS: The Huskies will hit the road for another big WCHA series on Dec. 3-4 at the University of North Dakota...the oldest rivalry among any of St. Cloud State's WCHA opponents, the first time the Huskies played UND was in 1946-47. In that first meeting between these two squads, the Huskies prevailed 8-2. Since that time, North Dakota owns a 53-29-10 lead in the all-time series (53-28-10 at the NCAA Division I level).

NORTH DAKOTA CONNECTION: SCSU assistant coach Steve Johnson is a Grand Forks, N.D. native. Johnson skated for the University of North Dakota from 1984 to 1988. He earned All-WCHA and All-America status during his collegiate career, and also helped guide UND to a national title in 1987. In his senior season, Johnson was a Hobey Baker Award finalist and was named the WCHA Student-Athlete of the Year in 1988. In his four years at UND, Johnson recorded 191 points (70g/121a) over 153 career games. As a senior, Johnson posted 85 points (34g/51a) for UND. A 1987 draft pick of the Vancouver Canucks, Johnson played professionally for two seasons in the IHL with the Milwaukee Admirals and the Phoenix Roadrunners. Johnson is in his first season as an assistant coach at St. Cloud State.

NUMBER FIVE AND CLIMBING: Garrett Roe has 152 points as a Husky, which places him 5th in the all-time SCSU scoring charts. He also has 95 assists in his career, which ranks fourth in the career charts at SCSU. Roe has 2g/8a this season for the Huskies. He is a draft pick of the Los Angeles Kings.

HUSKY NOTES: Dan Dunn hit a career-high last year with his 47 saves at UND on Nov. 14, 2009...senior defender Brett Barta leads the Huskies on the plus/minus with a +5 rating this winter. He also has 1g/6a to his credit this year... Junior Drew LeBlanc sits atop the SCSU scoring list in 2010-11 with 17 points and 12 assists. He ranks second on the team with five goals this winter...SCSU junior Jared Festler leads the club with six goals this season...SCSU's junior class leads the team this season with 38 points, 13 goals and 25 assists... the Huskies enjoyed a bye week on Nov. 26-27. The Huskies' other bye week in 2010-11 is slated for Jan. 14-15

ON DECK: St. Cloud State will return home on Dec 10-11 for a pair of games against Colorado College. The Huskies will finish out the first half of their season on Dec. 29-30 with a trip to the Florida College Classic in Estero, Fla. SCSU is set to play Cornell in first round play at the Florida College Classic. The other two teams involved in the tournament include Maine and Miami (Ohio). The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin season six with the Huskies in 2010-11. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to four WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007, 2008 and 2010 NCAA Division I tournaments. In five seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 110-81-26 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 71 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2009-10, SCSU was 24-14-5 and placed 3rd in the WCHA at 15-9-5. SCSU placed 2nd at the 2010 WCHA Final Five and advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2010 NCAA tournament thanks to a 4-3 2OT win over Northern Michigan at the NCAA West Regional.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.
