SCSU BY THE NUMBERS

87 SCSU hockey fans in the St. Cloud area will be able to watch the Huskies on local TV this weekend. Charter Cable Channel 87 is scheduled to carry the live game feed from Minnesota State this weekend.

50 Junior forward Ben Hanowski scored his 50th collegiate point at SCSU with a goal on Nov. 5 vs. Wisconsin. Hanowski now has 28g/22a during his three seasons in St. Cloud. Last weekend, Hanowski scored three goals for SCSU and he now is tied for the team goal lead this winter at 6 along with fellow Little Falls H.S. graduate senior Jared Festler. A team captain this year, Hanowski ranks second on the team with 11 points (6g/5a). Sophomore Cam Reid also has 11 points this season (3g/8a).

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (15-18-5, 11-13-4 WCHA) placed eighth in the WCHA regular season standings. In first round play of the WCHA play-offs last year, the Huskies were eliminated in two games at Minnesota Duluth on March 11-12...SCSU received votes in the final USCHO.com Division I national poll of the 2010-11 season.

POLL POSITION: Here are the current national rankings for the Huskies: USCHO.com - Received votes, USA Today/USAH Hockey: did not receive votes...SCSU earned a 7th place ranking in the 2011-12 WCHA preseason media poll and WCHA coaches' preseason poll.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show will broadcast live from the Green Mill in downtown St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to attend this show live at the Green Mill and admission is FREE. You can also listen to the show live on the web at www.knsi1450.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games will be broadcast live on KNSI AM 1450 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.knsi1450.com. Selected Husky games will also be broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org) in 2011-12. KVSC's crew will be led by sports directors Dave Overlund and Zack Fisch.

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (St. Cloud Charter Cable Channel 87 in stunning HD). A select number of home games are slated to be televised live on Comcast Cable (channel 23 Minneapolis and channel 13 St. Paul) in 2011-12. Jim Rich and Tom Saterdalen will be making the call from the NHC this season.

WATCH ON THE WEB: Once again in 2011-12, all SCSU home games (and selected road games) will be available to watch on the America One Networks (formerly B2 networks) live video streaming service. To learn more about this pay-per-view web service, please check out the Audio/Video link on the Husky Home Page.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by seventh-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. The Huskies' assistant coaches include five-year veteran Mike Gibbons and second-year coach Steve Johnson and first-year volunteer goalie coach Dave Rogalski. Matt Chapman will serve as the team's coordinator of hockey and video operations and Jeremiah Minkel is back once again as the team's equipment manager in 2011-12.

THE NATIONAL: St. Cloud State University will join the National Collegiate Hockey Conference in 2013-14. The Huskies accepted the invitation to join The National on Sept. 22, and they will join Colorado College, University of Denver, University of Minnesota Duluth, University of Nebraska Omaha, Miami University, University of North Dakota and Western Michigan as members of the new league. SCSU will remain as a member of the WCHA until the 2013-14 season. The Huskies became an NCAA Division I affiliate in 1987-88 and they joined the WCHA in 1990-91.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: SCSU was recognized as having one of the toughest schedules in all of Division I hockey latest season. The upcoming schedule appears to be just as strong. In 2011-12, the Huskies are scheduled to play 11 opponents (out of 15) that are ranked or received votes in this year's preseason polls. Top 10 ranked opponents for SCSU this winter include Denver, North Dakota, Colorado College and Minnesota Duluth. MSU did not receive votes in this week's USCHO poll.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

THREE AGAINST UW: St. Cloud State enjoyed a big weekend back home on Nov. 4-5 with a 7-2 victory and a 3-3 tie against WCHA rival Wisconsin...the Huskies now own a four-game unbeaten streak against the Badgers...rookie netminder Ryan Faragher continues to impress with his play this winter. In starts against UW, Faragher earned the win and tie and also coined 59 saves over the weekend. He now has a 2.19 GAA and a .930 saves rate this winter with a 2-2-1 record. Faragher gained the starting nod two weeks ago against North Dakota due to an injury to SCSU junior team captain Mike Lee.

BIG WEEKENDS: Junior forward David Eddy had a breakout weekend against UW. Eddy scored his first two goals of the campaign on Nov. 4 and he completed the weekend with an assist on Ben Hanowski's goal on Nov. 5. Eddy now has two goals and three assists this year...on the topic of big weekends, Hanowski scored two goals on Nov. 4 and he also had SCSU's important third goal on Nov. 5. Hanowski and fellow Little Falls H.S. graduate senior forward Jared Festler own the team's goal scoring lead this year with six apiece after 10 games.

THORSON SCORES: SCSU sophomore forward Cory Thorson scored his first career goal at 8:18 of the 2nd period in SCSU's win on Nov. 4 (the goal was also the GWG for the Huskies)... freshman defender Tim Daly found his way onto the scoresheet for the first time in his career with an assist on Thorson's game winner against UW on Nov. 4.

NIC AT NIGHT: Sophomore Nic Dowd scored his first career shorthanded goal on Nov. 4, with a sweet breakaway goal against the Badgers at 11:02 of the third period

HOT HAND: Rookie defender Andrew Prochno continues to turn heads in 2011-12. He scored the first goal for the Huskies in both games against Wisconsin this weekend. He now has three goals and two assists for SCSU this winter.

HELPING OUT: Senior defender Zam Zabkowicz, a resident of Wisconsin, added his first assist of the year for the Huskies with a helper on David Eddy's goal on Nov. 4.

TEAM CAPTAINS: SCSU team captains for the 2011-12 season will be senior Drew LeBlanc, a forward from Hermantown; junior Ben Hanowski, a forward from Little Falls; and junior Mike Lee, a goalie from Roseau, Minn.

TGIF: The Huskies are 4-1-0 in games played on Friday night this season, with the lone loss being at Northern Michigan on Oct. 14. In contrast, SCSU is 0-3-2 in games played on Saturday night this season. Last year, SCSU was 8-8-2 on Friday nights and 5-9-3 on Saturday night games...of note, SCSU seems to be enjoying being at home more this season as the Huskies are 2-0-2 in two games played at the NHC this year. Last year, SCSU was an uncharacteristic 6-8-4 in games played at the NHC.

RANDOM NOTES: The Huskies and Mavericks have enjoyed a long history of competition in all sports and the hockey series between these two programs started in 1969-70, when the Huskies posted a 3-1 record against Minnesota State (then called Mankato State) that season... in the last five outings against MSU, the Huskies own a 2-2-1 record and they are 3-4-3 against MSU in the last 10 games...last year at the NHC, the Huskies tied 3-3 and lost 6-2 on Jan. 28-29, 2011, which was the only meeting between the two teams in 2010-11...in fact, the Huskies have hosted the Mavs in six consecutive games at the NHC. The last time SCSU played in Mankato was on March 5, 2010, when the Huskies lost 4-2 at the Verizon Wireless Center...SCSU coach Bob Motzko is 5-10-4 in games played against MSU during his career in St. Cloud... freshman forward Brooks Bertsch, who played for Dubuque of the USHL last year, made his collegiate debut for the Huskies on Nov. 5 against Wisconsin...SCSU team captain senior Drew LeBlanc suffered a lower body injury in the closing seconds of the second period on Nov. 5. The game officials opted to end the period early due to the length of time it took to provide the needed care for LeBlanc. Both teams came back out on the ice after the intermission and completed the final :29 of the second before switching ends and immediately starting the third period. LeBlanc will miss the upcoming series at Minnesota State and his return status is still uncertain at this time. LeBlanc had played in an impressive 129 consecutive games for the Huskies during his career. A 2011 All-WCHA third team selection and a two-time All-WCHA Academic team pick, LeBlanc has been selected as a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS award in 2011-12.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin season seven with the Huskies in 2011-12. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to four WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007, 2008 and 2010 NCAA Division I tournaments. Motzko has charted an impressive 124-96-31 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 71 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2009-10, SCSU was 24-14-5 and placed 3rd in the WCHA at 15-9-5. SCSU placed 2nd at the 2010 WCHA Final Five and advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2010 NCAA tournament thanks to a 4-3 2OT win over Northern Michigan at the NCAA West Regional. Last year, Motzko led SCSU to a 15-18-5, 11-13-4 WCHA record.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United States Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by Mike Gibbons and Steve Johnson. SCSU's support staff features equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Hockey and Video Operations Matt Chapman.

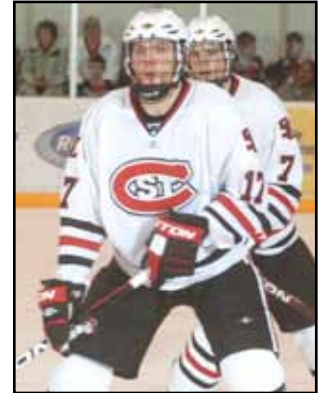
