TIME FOR SOME HUSKY HOCKEY

The St. Cloud State men's hockey team will open its 2010-11 season on Oct. 2 with a home exhibition game against the University of Manitoba at the National Hockey Center (5,371 cap./200x100). Game time is slated for 7:07 p.m. Fans can listen to this game (and all games in 2010-11) on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com). The game will also be broadcast on KVSC. Fans can watch the game on Charter Mainstreet cable channel 14 in the St. Cloud area.

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ *The Huskies were picked #6 in the preseason Division I poll released by USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine on Sept. 27. SCSU was also picked #6 in the CHN preseason poll for 2010-11...in the WCHA preseason media poll, the Huskies were ranked 3rd and 2nd in the preseason coaches' poll.*

■ *SCSU finished the season with a #5 ranking in the USA Hockey poll and a #7 ranking in the final USCHO.com poll. SCSU was also ranked #5 in the final Inside College Hockey poll for 2009-10. SCSU was ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for over 16 consecutive weeks in 2009-10.*

■ *SCSU placed third in the final WCHA regular season standings, two spots ahead of the predicted fifth place finish in the league's pre-season poll. In 20 seasons of play in the WCHA, this marked the 3rd time SCSU placed 3rd in the WCHA standings. SCSU also placed 3rd in 2000 and 1997. Of note, SCSU placed 2nd in the WCHA in 2001, 2002 and 2007.*

■ *Postseason awards candidate Garrett Roe has 142 career points heading into his senior season. He needs just 41 points this season to tie the team record of 183 career points set by Ryan Lasch during the 2009-10 season. Prior to Lasch breaking the record last year, the old Husky point of 179 was set from 1988-92 by Jeff Saterdalen.*

■ *Lasch, Garrett Roe, Dan Dunn and Garrett Raboin were all named to the All-WCHA team in 2010.*

■ *Garrett Roe and Tony Mosey were both named to the All-Tournament at the NCAA West Regional in 2010. Of note, SCSU defeated Northern Michigan 4-3 in OT to open regional play. In the regional title game, SCSU lost a tough 5-3 match against WCHA rival Wisconsin. The NCAA win was the first for the Huskies, as the team has gained three NCAA bids under the direction of Bob Motzko.*

■ *The match between SCSU and Manitoba will mark the third time these squads have played. The Huskies are 2-1 in games vs. the Bison. In 1987-88, SCSU gained a 3-2 loss and a 5-2 win in St. Cloud. In 1933-34, the Huskies won a 3-2 OT decision.*

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (24-15-5) placed third in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (15-9-4 WCHA). The Huskies won the first round of the WCHA playoffs vs. Minnesota State, and then placed 2nd at the WCHA Final Five. In NCAA tournament play, the Huskies scored a 4-3 double OT win vs. Northern Michigan at the West Regional, and then lost to Wisconsin by a 5-3 tally in the regional final. This was the 14th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the 10th time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500. This also marked the ninth time since 1993-94 that the Huskies have won 20-plus games.

POLL POSITION: In the 2010-11 USA Today/USA Hockey preseason poll, the Huskies were ranked 6th and they were also ranked #6 in the CHN preseason poll...SCSU was ranked 2nd in the WCHA preseason coaches poll for 2010-11, and the Huskies earned a 3rd place ranking in the 2010-11 WCHA preseason media poll.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from the Ground Round in St. Cloud.



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games will be broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans will be able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games will also be broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). Zach Fisch and former Husky legend Mike Doyle will provide play-by-play for Husky Productions this season.

THE CAPTAINS: Senior forward Aaron Marvin will wear the C for the Huskies this season on his sweater. Alternate captains for the Huskies in 2010-11 will be senior forward Garrett Roe and senior defender Chris Hepp.

WATCH ON THE WEB: Once again in 2010-11, all SCSU home games (and selected road games) will be available to watch on the America One Networks (formerly B2 networks) live video streaming service. COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by sixth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. The Huskies' assistant coaches include four-year veteran Mike Gibbons and first-year coach Steve Johnson. Mike Ayers is in his 2nd year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

NEW FACE ON THE BENCH: Steve Johnson begins his first season at SCSU as an assistant coach. He previously served as head coach at Fargo in the USHL, and also served as head coach at Lincoln and Fargo-Moorhead of the USHL. He played college hockey at North Dakota and was a Hobey Baker Award finalist and was named the WCHA Student Athlete of the Year in 1988. Johnson replaces Eric Rud, who was named the head coach at Green Bay (USHL) during the summer of 2010.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LEADER OF THE PACK: Senior Ryan Lasch ended his storied SCSU career in 2009-10. He departs the campus as the team's first three-time All-WCHA award winner (along with teammate Garrett Roe). An All-American and Hobey Baker Top 10 Finalist in 2008, Lasch set team career records with 183 points and 104 assists at SCSU. He also tied a team record with 13 GWG and ranks second in team history with 79 career goals and 37 career PPGs. He played in a team record 161 consecutive games, which also is the team record for most career games played (he never missed a game during his four-year career in the Granite City). He moves ahead of former SCSU point leader Jeff Saterdalen, who had 179 points from 1988-92. Lasch also broke Saterdalen's career assist record on March 20. On March 19, Lasch's game winner tied the team record for career game winning goals at 13 (Joe Jensen also had 13 from 2002-06). For career games played, Lasch broke the record previously own by Nate Dey, who played in 159 games from 2004-08.

A SEASON TO REMEMBER: The Huskies posted 24 victories in 2009-10, which is the third most wins posted in a season for SCSU since they moved to the NCAA DI level in 1987-88...the Huskies scored 138 goals this season, which ranked 11th in team history...SCSU charted five ties this season which ranks 2nd in team history...and SCSU had 10 short-handed goals, which ranks 4th in team history...the SCSU goalies this season made a team record 1,286 saves and the Huskies allowed a team record 1,404 shots on goal this season.

All-WCHA HONORS: Ryan Lasch was named to the All-WCHA Second Team this winter, while third team award winners for the Huskies at the WCHA awards banquet were Garrett Roe, Garrett Raboin and Dan Dunn. Roe and Lasch are the first three-time All-WCHA award winners in team history, while Raboin was earning All-WCHA honors for the second time in his storied career. Dunn received his first All-WCHA notice this winter.

TEAM NOTES: Ryan Lasch and Garrett Roe led the Huskies with 49 points apiece this season, they also shared the team's lead this winter with 20 goals apiece and 29 assists apiece. Of note, the 49 points is ninth best in team history, while the 20 goals ranks 19th in team history and the 29 assists ranks 11th in team history for goals and assists in a season...Tony Mosey, who scored a career-high 40 points this winter, led the Huskies with 9 power play goals and Lasch was second with 8 PPGs. Mosey also led the club with an impressive +15 ranking on the plus/minus. Drew LeBlanc, Jared Festler, David Eddy and Nick Olsund shared the team lead with 3 game winning goals apiece this year, while the SHG lead this season was shared by Festler, Garrett Raboin and Travis Novak with two apiece.

SHG SUCCESS STORY: The Huskies tied for first in the nation this season with 10 short-handed goals in 2009-10. SCSU shared the national lead along with Boston University.

NICE SEASON AT SCSU: Last year marked the 8th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have won 22-or-more games in a season. SCSU's team record for wins in a season is 31, which was hit during the 2000-01 season. SCSU was 24-14-5 in 2009-10. The 24 wins ranks 3rd in team history for most wins in a season. SCSU set a team record by playing in 43 games this season.

A FEW MORE HUSKY FACTS FOR 2010-11: The Huskies have a senior class of nine in 2010-11...SCSU's roster in 2010-11 has 16 Minnesota residents on it. The roster also includes players from the states of Virginia, Iowa, Alabama, California, Wisconsin and Michigan...freshman defender Kevin Gravel is the son of former Husky standout Jim Gravel. The elder Gravel played for the Huskies from 1977-81 and he scored 51g/50a during his tenure in the Granite City...in action against Canadian teams, the Huskies own an all-time record of 12-3-1. Manitoba is one of only two Canadian teams that have gained victories against the Huskies over the years. The other team with two wins over the Huskies is the University of Alberta...the Huskies have 11 NHL draft picks on their roster this season. Newcomers who have been selected in the NHL draft include Kevin Gravel, Nic Dowd, Cam Reid and Nick Jensen. Returners picked in the draft include Mike Lee, Dan Dunn, Garrett Roe, Oliver Lauridsen, Nick Oslund, Aaron Marvin and Ben Hanowski.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin season six with the Huskies in 2010-11. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to four WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007, 2008 and 2009 NCAA Division I tournaments. In five seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 105-74-24 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 67 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2009-10, SCSU was 24-14-5 and placed 3rd in the WCHA at 15-9-5. SCSU placed 2nd at the 2001 WCHA Final Five and advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2010 NCAA tournament thanks to a 4-3 2OT win over Northern Michigan at the NCAA West Regional.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Mike Gibbons, 1st year coach Steve Johnson, and 2nd-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.

HUSKY NOTES AND NEWS

The Huskies outscored their opponents 138-122 last season. SCSU also posted 42 power play goals, while allowing 36 PPGs last winter. SCSU ranked 17th in the nation at 3.21 goals scored per game, and the Huskies ranked 24th in the nation on defense with a goals allowed rate of 2.84 per game.

SCSU freshman goalie Mike Lee played goalie for Team USA at the World Junior Championships in 2010. Team USA won the gold medal at the tournament, as Lee posted a 4-0-0 record for Team USA in tournament play.

Home ice was kind to the Huskies in 2008-09, as they owned a 12-4-5 record in 2009-10 at the NHC. The Huskies are 241-126-41 since the doors opened at the NHC in 1989. SCSU was 12-10-0 in games played on the road last season.

The Huskies were 20-3-4 when they score on the power play in 2009-10. On the flipside of that stat, SCSU was 4-11-1 when the Huskies fail to score on the power play last winter. Of note, SCSU was 23-4-5 if they scored 3-or-more goals in a game last winter.

2009-10 SEASON WRAP . . .

OVER FORTY: The last time the Huskies had three players score 40-plus points in a season was during the 2007-08 season, when Ryan Lasch (53), Andreas Nodl (44) and Garrett Roe (45) scored 40-plus points during that season.

SCSU GAMERS: Ryan Lasch, Drew LeBlanc, Nick Oslund, Oliver Lauridsen, Ben Hanowski and Tony Mosey all set team records this season by each playing in 43 games in 2009-10.

DUNN DEAL: At 12-5-2 this season, Dan Dunn ranked 8th in the nation among DI goalies with a .684 win rate. Dunn led the club with a 2.58 goals against average. Frosh Mike Lee had a team high .917 save rate, and he was 12-9-3 in his rookie season at SCSU. Lee led the team with two shutouts this winter.



CLASS ACTS: Here is a breakdown of the scoring efforts of each class at SCSU in 2009-10. SCSU's five seniors had 81 points (30g/51a) this winter. SCSU's 10 juniors had 114 points (41g/73a) this winter, while SCSU's 7 sophomores had 82 points (35g/57a). SCSU's four rookies added 43 points (19g/24a).

RETURNING HELP: On paper, the Huskies return 19 players from their 2009-10 squad. This would represent 239 points, 95 goals and 154 goals. SCSU returns all three of its goalies. This group combined for 1,286 saves (a team record for saves in a season) in 2009-10..SCSU returns eight of their top 10 scorers from 2009-10 (which represented 218 points in 2009-10).

SUPER SOPHS: Did you know that five sophomores charted new career season-highs for points in 2009-10. Soph Jared Festler hit career highs with 11 goals, 13 assists and 24 points this season, while Oliver Lauridsen also had career highs with 6g/6a and 12 points. Drew LeBlanc avoided the sophomore slump with a breakthrough season. He hit career highs with 25 assists and 31 points in 2009-10. Travis Novak also hit career highs with 11 goals and 16 points this season, while Sam Zabowicz scored a career high 12 assists and 12 points in 2009-10.

MORE ON MOSEY: On the topic of breakout seasons, Tony Mosey ranked 3rd on the team with 40 points in 2009-10. He far surpassed his previous season-high of 16 points, which he hit in 2007-08. As a sophomore, Mosey slumped to nine points. As a junior, Mosey hit career, season-highs with 40 points, 14 goals, 26 assists and nine power play goals. He was also +15 on the +/- this season. For his efforts, Mosey was named to the 2010 WCHA Final Five All-Tournament Team and the 2010 NCAA West Regional All-Tournament Team.

2009-10 TEAM AWARD WINNERS: The 2009-10 SCSU Team Award winners were announced at the team's awards banquet on April

11. Junior forward Garrett Roe was named the recipient of the team's Frank Brimsek Award, which is presented annually to the Huskies' Most Valuable Player. Senior defender Garrett Raboin and senior forward Ryan Lasch both were named the Leroy Radovich Alumni Award winner, which is presented each season to the team's Outstanding Senior. Raboin was also selected as the club's Sam LoPresti Award winner (most determined player). Senior forward/defender Jon Ammerman earned the team's Brendan J and Vernie McDonald President's Award for the third consecutive season. This award honors the team's outstanding student-athlete. The 2009-10 Dave Award (outstanding goaltender) was presented to junior goaltender Dan Dunn and the Roland Vandell Award (outstanding first year player) was presented to freshman forward David Eddy. To complete the team award list, sophomore defender Oliver Lauridsen was named the squad's William Radovich Award (most improved player) recipient for this winter. Of note, Ryan Lasch was the recipient of the St. Cloud Times Star of the Season Award, which is presented annually by the St. Cloud Times.
