NORTH TO ALASKA

The St. Cloud State men's hockey team (6-6-2, 5-4-1 WCHA) will travel to the University of Alaska Anchorage (6-10-0, 4-8-0 WCHA) on Dec. 4-5 for a pair of WCHA games at Sullivan Arena (6,251 cap./200x100) in Anchorage, Alaska. The games will be aired live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don Lyons making the call from UAA. The games are also available for viewing on the Internet. THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

After the trip to UAA, the Huskies will have played 8 of their last 10 games on the road. This rugged stretch of WCHA games included games at #2 ranked Denver (Nov. 27-28) and #2 ranked North Dakota (Nov. 13-14). SCSU will return to the friendly confines of the NHC on Dec. 11-12 for a weekend series against Colorado College. This will start a six-game homestand for the Huskies that will also include home dates against Brown (Jan. 2-3) and Michigan Tech (Jan. 8-9).

SCSU senior Ryan Lasch moved into the team's scoring lead with his work at Denver on Nov. 27-28. He now has 8g/4a for 12 points in 2009-10. He also owns a six-game point streak, and has 6g/3a during his most recent scoring run. In his career, Lasch ranks 4th in the team records with 146 points

The Huskies have faced a tough schedule in 2009-10. So far this season, SCSU has played six games against teams ranked #1 (Miami) or #2 (North Dakota and Denver) and it has also played #14/18 UMD and #15 Wisconsin. SCSU's schedule in 2009-10 is currently ranked the second toughest schedule in the nation in the latest KRACH poll released by USCHO.com. SCSU also moved back into the top 20 of the USCHO.com poll this week, with a #20 ranking.

Frosh David Eddy owns a three-game point streak and has scored four points in those last three games.

SCSU is 45-13-5 in the all-time series against Alaska Anchorage. Last year, the Huskies split at Sullivan Arena with a 3-1 win on Feb. 6, 2009 and a 2001 loss on Feb. 7, 2009. SCSU is 8-1-1 in the last 10 outings against the Seawolves.

Tony Mosey, who leads the Huskies this year with 5 power play goals, scored a career game-high two goals against Denver on Nov. 28.

The Huskies will host #5/6 Colorado College on Dec. 11-12, at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU was ranked 20th in the USCHO.com poll and the INCH poll this week. SCSU did not receive vote's in this week's USA Hockey poll...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

About Last Week...

Nov. 27: at #2 Denver 5, SCSU 3

SCSU lost a 5-3 decision at #2 University of Denver on Nov. 27. The Huskies jumped out to a 1-0 lead in the game with Ryan Lasch's seventh goal of the season at 4:34 of the first period. Denver rallied to score two unanswered goals in the first period to gain a 2-1 lead. The first goal was posted by DU's Chris Knowlton at 6:08 of the first period. The second DU goal was posted by Rhett Rakhshani at 14:46 of the second. In the second period, Denver pushed its lead to 4-1 with a pair of goals by Jesse Martin. His first goal was scored at 6:22 of the second, and Martin's second goal was posted at 9:08 of the second period. The Huskies managed to stage a solid second period comeback with two goals that closed the gap to 4-3. The first SCSU marker was scored by Ben Hanwoski at 17:30 of the second period. The third SCSU goal was posted by Travis Novak at 18:34 of the second period. In the third period, Denver padded its lead to 5-3 with a goal by Matt Donovan at 13:03. In the contest, SCSU was outshot 29-28. Mike Lee (Roseau) was the goalie of record for SCSU with 24 saves in the game, while Denver's Marc Cheverie had 25 saves in the game.

Nov. 28: SCSU 3, at #2 Denver 2

SCSU brought home a weekend split thanks to a 3-2 victory over the Pioneers on Nov. 28. SCSU jumped to a 2-0 lead in the first period, which helped the Huskies gain early control of the game. Ryan Lasch scored the game's first goal with a tally at 4:32. Tony Mosey padded the Husky lead to 2-0 with a power play goal at 10:22. Lasch and Eddy each posted their fourth assists of the 2009-10 season on the play. Denver clawed its way back into the fray with a goal by Tyler Ruegsegger at 11:15 of the third period. Mosey notched the game winner at 11:55 of the third period with his sixth goal of the season. Denver hit the ice with an extra attacker late in the third period, and closed the gap to 3-2 with a goal by Ruegsegger at 17:30. Dan Dunn managed to stem the Denver attack after Ruegsegger's final goal, as he had 26 saves in the game. On the night, Denver outshot the Huskies 28-27. SCSU was 1-of-6 on the power play and Denver was 1-of-2 on the advantage.



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

SIX-GAME STREAK: St. Cloud State senior forward Ryan Lasch owns a six-game point scoring streak. In the last six outings, Lasch has scored six goals and three assists in the last six games for a total of nine points. He moved into the team's scoring lead this past weekend with 12 points and eight goals. In his career, Lasch now ranks fourth in the team's all-time scoring charts with 146 points. He now ranks fifth in the career records with 67 goals and he is tied for seventh in the team lists with 79 career assists.

RUGGED ROAD: The Huskies' schedule in 2009-10 has been rated the second toughest schedule in NCAA Division I hockey so far this season in the current USCHO.com KRACH rankings. The Huskies' rugged schedule in 2009-10 has included meetings against Miami, Minnesota Duluth, North Dakota, Wisconsin and Denver. All of these teams were ranked in the nation's top 20 at the time SCSU skated against them this season. Of note, Miami was ranked number one, while North Dakota and Denver were ranked second in the nation at the time of their meetings against SCSU this winter. One of the non-ranked teams that SCSU has played this winter was Union College, and the Dutch earned votes in the latest USCHO.com poll. In the latest USCHO.com and INCH polls, the Huskies were ranked 20th. This marks the Huskies' first top 20 ranking in the USCHO.com poll since Oct. 12.

FAST EDDY: Freshman forward David Eddy, who missed the first eight games of the season as an injury scratch has made a quick impact on the Husky roster in the last six games for SCSU. At Denver, Eddy added three assists to push his season totals to one goal and four assists for five points in 2009-10.

POWER PLAYER: Junior Tony Mosey has been a force on the SCSU power play this season. He hit again on Nov. 28 with a power play marker at Denver. He now has five power play goals this season and one even-strength goal this season. The six goals are a new career season-high for Mosey, and he ranks fifth in the nation with his five power play goals this season.

DUNN BRINGS ANOTHER ONE HOME: Dan Dunn gained his fourth victory of the season on Nov. 28 against #2 Denver. The four victories are a career season-high for Dunn. He owns a 2.32 goals against average this season with a .913 save rate with a 4-2-0 record. In his career, Dunn is 9-8-3 at SCSU with a 2.53 GAA and a .913 save rate.

HUSKY TIDBITS: The five goals allowed by the Huskies on Nov. 27, in a 5-3 setback against #2 Denver, were the most goals allowed in a game this season by the Huskies... Freshman Ben Hanowski snapped a seven-game point scoring drought with his goal at Denver on Nov. 27. Hanowski now has three goals and one assist for the Huskies in 2009-10... Sophomore Travis Novak owns a two-game point streak headed into the games against UAA. Novak had a goal and an assist in the Huskies' series at Denver... Junior Garrett Roe added an assist in the Huskies' win over Denver on Nov. 28. Roe leads the Huskies this winter with eight assists. In his career, Roe ranks 19th in the team records with 104 points and 16th with 66 career assists. He also has 38 goals as a Husky.

NATIONAL LEADERS: Ryan Lasch ranks 28th in the nation with 0.57 goals per game (8).....Tony Mosey ranks sixth among NCAA Division I players with his five power play goals this season...Dan Dunn ranks 22nd in the nation with a 2.32 goals against average and Mike Lee is 34th at 2.60....Dunn is 13th in the nation with a .926 save rate and Lee is 35th at .911...SCSU ranks 17th in the nation with a 2.57 goals allowed per game average... of note, UAA is the most penalized team in the nation with 327 penalty minutes, for an average of 20.4 PIM per game.

LIFE ON THE ROAD: The Huskies will resume their road warrior role next weekend, as they travel to WCHA rival Alaska Anchorage on Dec. 4-5. The Huskies have logged many miles in recent weeks with eight of their last 10 games being played on the road. SCSU's itinerary has included road games at Michigan Tech (Oct. 30-31), North Dakota (Nov. 13-14), Denver (Nov. 27-28) and the upcoming trip to UAA (Dec.4-5). The lone home stay for the Huskies was a pair of games against Wisconsin on Nov. 20-21.

ON DECK: The Huskies will finally return home for a pair of games against WCHA rival #5/6 Colorado College on Dec. 12-13.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 87-66-21 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 52 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons, and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, four-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.
