BACK HOME IN MINNESOTA

The #4 St. Cloud State University (17-8-3, 12-6-2 WCHA) will host Alaska Anchorage (10-15-1, 8-13-1 WCHA) on Feb. 5-6. Both games will be played at the National Hockey Center (5,371 cap./200x100) in St. Cloud. The game on Feb. 5 will begin at 7:07 p.m. and the game on Feb. 6 will begin at 5:07 p.m. Both games will be broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel making the call. Both games will also be on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org). The games will be televised live on the Charter Mainstreet Network (channel 14 in the St. Cloud area) with Rob Hudson, Mike Doyle and Peter Tomala making the call. The television feed is also slated to be picked-up in Alaska this weekend.

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ SCSU was ranked 4th in the Pairwise rankings on Feb. 3 at 5 p.m. These rankings mimic the criteria used by the NCAA to determine the 16 teams for postseason tournament play.

■ In the most recent USCHO.com poll, SCSU moved up to #4 in the nation. This marked the 8th consecutive week that the Huskies have been ranked among the top 20 teams in the USCHO.com poll this season. SCSU was also ranked #5 in the INCH Power Rankings and #4 USA Hockey poll on Jan. 25. Of note, the #4 ranking is SCSU's best national ranking since a #4 ranking on March 12, 2007.

■ SCSU saw its nine-game win streak broken on Jan. 30 with a 6-4 loss at CC. The 9-game run was SCSU's best win streak since a 12-game stretch from Nov. 17, 2006 to Jan. 6, 2007.

■ Former Husky Ryan Malone (1999-2003) was named to the 2010 USA men's hockey team, which will compete at the upcoming Winter Olympic games in Vancouver.

■ Earlier this season, SCSU posted a 3-1, 3-2 series sweep at UAA. Since that weekend up north, the Huskies have charted an impressive 11-2-1 record.

■ Junior Garrett Roe has been on fire in 2010. He owns a 10-game point streak headed into the UAA series, and he leads the club with 20 assists and 29 points. Since Jan. 2, Roe has scored 15 points for the surging Huskies.

■ Junior goalie Dan Dunn leads the nation with an .833 win rate this winter (10-2-0). He has gained victories in his last seven starts for the Huskies and his GAA stands at 2.33 in 2009-10.

■ The #4 Huskies will be back home again on Feb. 12-13 for games against North Dakota. SCSU students will need to pick up their tickets at the NHC ticket office for these games - beginning on Feb. 8 at 9 a.m.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU was ranked 4th in the USCHO.com poll, #4 in the USA Hockey poll and 5th in the INCH poll this week...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

About Last Week...

Jan. 29: #5 SCSU 5, at Colorado College 4

SCSU won its ninth consecutive game with a 5-4 victory at #11 Colorado College on Jan. 29. SCSU's Ryan Lasch started the attack with a first period goal with an assist from Aaron Marvin. CC's Tyler Johnson tied the game in the first period, before SCSU's Taylor Johnson made it 2-1 with his second goal of the season with assists from Lasch and Marvin. Tim Hall then tied the game at 2-2 in the second. In the final period, the offensive fireworks continued as Bill Sweatt gave CC a 3-2 lead before a pair of David Eddy goals provided SCSU with a 4-3 lead. Sweatt added another marker to tie the game at 4-4, before Jared Festler scored the game winner at 11:34 of the final period with helpers from Lasch and Marvin. This was Marvin's third assist of the game and Lasch's third point of the night. In the nets, Dan Dunn moved to 10-2-0 on the season with his 21 save victory. SCSU outshot the Tigers 27-25 in the game.

Jan. 30: at #11 Colorado College 6, #5 SCSU 4

Another offensive outbreak in the Rockies. The Tigers overcame a 4-3 deficit in the third period to earn a 6-4 victory in Colorado Springs on Jan. 30. The seesaw battle started with a CC goal by Brian McMillin at 1:59 of the first period. Tony Mosey made it 1-1 with his goal at 3:55 of the first period, with an assist from Garrett Roe. Travis Novak scored his 6th goal of the year at 4:55 of the first period with assists from Drew LeBlanc and Sam Zabkowicz. CC's Andrew Hamburg added a goal at 9:58 of the first, before Roe scored at 17:01 of the first to give SCSU a 3-2 lead. In the second period, Hamburg and Roe dished up a pair of goals to keep the Husky lead at 4-3. In the final stanza, CC's Addison DeBoer, Ryan Lowery and Mike Testwuide all charted goals to give the Tigers the eventual 6-4 win, which included an ENG by Testwuide. Mike Lee was the goalie of record for SCSU with 31 saves, as the Tigers outshot the Huskies 37-32.

HUSKY HIGHLIGHTS: SCSU was ranked 4th in this week's college polls, which is the best rating for the Huskies since they hit #4 on March 12, 2007...junior defender Chris Hepp, who has played in all 28 games for the Huskies this winter, broke into the scoring column for the first time this season with an assist at CC on Jan. 30...junior Aaron Marvin hit a career game-high with his three assists against Colorado College on Jan. 29. Marvin now has 33 assists and 48 points as a Husky...Garrett Raboin continues to move up in the career charts with 18 goals and 57 assists for a total of 75 career points in the cardinal and black. Raboin ranks fifth among SCSU defensemen all-time with 75 career points. He trails Bret Hedican, who had 77 career points from 1988-91. SCSU's all-time leading defenseman for scoring is Kelly Hultgren, who had 107 points from 1991-95...Garrett Raboin was named the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week and David Eddy was named the WCHA Rookie of the Week on Jan. 26 for their play against Minnesota...David Eddy has posted six goals in his last five games...the Huskies have outscored their opponents 88-71 in 2009-10.

MORE FOR MOSEY: Junior Tony Mosey owns a six-game point streak for the Huskies, which includes his 1g/3a weekend at CC. He ranks third on the club with 24 points this season and is second on the team behind Lasch with 10 goals this winter. Mosey has 8 points (2g/6a) in the last six games.

VOTE FOR LASCH: Fans can register their vote for Ryan Lasch to participate in this year's Frozen Four Skills Competition. Visit the NCAA website to vote: www.ncaa.com/frozen-fourskillschallenge/index.html Lasch now has 161 career points, 71 career goals and 90 career assists with the Huskies. He is just 18 points away from SCSU's all-time point leader Jeff Saterdalen, who had 179 points from 1988-92. He ranks 2nd in team history with 32 power play goals at SCSU.

10 GAMES IN A ROE: Junior Garrett Roe continues his hot hand this winter, which includes a 10-game point streak that dates back to Jan. 2. Roe scored two goals and two assists in the weekend series at CC, which included two goals on Jan. 30. He currently leads the Huskies with 29 points and 20 assists this winter. In his career, Roe now has 122 points, 44 goals and 78 assists in 104 games played. He ranks 12th in the team totals for points and 10th for career assists, which ranks 2nd best in team history along with Mark Hartigan, who also had 32 PPGs from 1999-01.

DUNN IS ONE: SCSU junior goalie Dan Dunn continues to lead the nation in goalie win percentage with an .833 win rate this season. His season record now stands at 10-2-0 and he has won his last seven starts for the Huskies. Dunn's last loss between the pipes for the Huskies was a 3-2 loss to Denver on Nov. 28, 2009. He currently owns a 2.33 GAA rate and a .920 save percentage in 2009-10 rankings this winter.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 98-68-22 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 58 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons. and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, four-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.
