In another meeting of nationally ranked programs, the #4 St. Cloud State University men's hockey team (19-9-4, 14-7-3 WCHA) will travel to #3 Wisconsin (18-7-4, 13-6-3 WCHA) on Feb. 19-20. Both games at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis. (15,237 cap./200x97). Both games will be broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel making the call. Both games will also be on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org). I.

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ SCSU was ranked 4th in the Pairwise rankings on Feb. 17 at 1 p.m. Wisconsin was ranked 3rd in this week's PWR ranking. These rankings mimic the criteria used by the NCAA to determine the 16 teams for postseason tournament play.

■ In the most recent USCHO.com poll, SCSU stayed at #4, while Wisconsin is ranked #3. This marked the 10th consecutive week that the Huskies have been ranked among the top 20 teams in the USCHO.com poll this season. SCSU was also ranked #5 in the INCH Power Rankings and #4 USA Hockey poll on Feb. 15. Of note, the #4 ranking is SCSU's best national ranking since a #4 ranking on March 12, 2007.

■ SCSU and Wisconsin will be jockeying for position in the WCHA this weekend. SCSU is second in the league with 31 points, while UW and UMD are tied for 3rd with 29 points. Denver leads the league with 32 points.

■ Former Husky Ryan Malone (1999-2003) is making his Olympic debut for Team USA in men's hockey this week in Vancouver. He posted a goal in SCSU's recent win over Switzerland.

■ The Huskies have not played in Madison since 2007-08, 2007. In the last game at Madison, SCSU lost a 4-3 match on Dec. 1, 2007. Earlier this season, SCSU split with th Badgers at the NHC by scores of 4-1 (W) and 4-1 (L).

■ Sophomore defender Oliver Lauridsen enters this weekend with a four-game goal scoring streak.

■ Senior defender Garrett Raboin is a top 10 finalist for the 2010 Lowe's Senior CLASS award, and senior forward Ryan Lasch is a candidate for the 2010 NCAA Frozen Four Skills Challenge.

■ The Huskies will enjoy a bye week on Feb. 26-27, as they prepare for the final two regular season games on their 2009-10 schedule. SCSU will next play a home-home series against Minnesota State on Mar. 5 (at MSU) and Mar. 6 (at SCSU).

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU was ranked 4th in the USCHO.com poll, #4 in the USA Hockey poll and 5th in the INCH poll this week...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

About Last Week..

Feb. 12:#4 SCSU 4, #11 North Dakota

The Huskies collected a 4-3 victory over UND on Feb. 12 at the NHC in St. Cloud. In the first period, SCSU gained a 1-0 lead at the :40 mark with a quick marker by Oliver Lauridsen. Assists on the goal were added by Tony Mosey and Taylor Johnson. UND then pushed the score to 1-1 with a goal by Jake Marto in the first period, and UND ended the period with a goal by Brett Hextall to give it a 2-1 lead. In the second period, a power play goal by Garrett Roe tied the game at 1:26, as assists were tallied by Drew LeBlanc and Ryan Lasch. UND's Chris VandeVelde gave UND a 3-2 lead in the game, but that was shortlived as the Huskies fired back with a goal at 16:03 of the second by Lasch on the PP. Johnson and LeBlanc carded helpers on the play. Sophomore Travis Novak earned the game winner with his goal at 19:03 of the second period. Ben Hanowski and Sam Zabkowicz each had assists on the play. In the nets, Dan Dunn notched his 11th win of the season with a solid 43 saves in the game.

Feb. 13: #11 North Dakota 8, #4 SCSU 1

The Huskies suffered their biggest defeat of the season on Feb. 13 with an 8-1 loss at home against UND. After a scoreless first period for both squads, North Dakota sparked in the second period with six goals. UND posted two power play goals in the second period, as Darcy Zajac scored the eventual game winner at 3:22. In the third period, SCSU managed to break the shutout with a goal by Oliver Lauridsen at 9:46. Assists on the play were added by Jordy Christian and Brian Volpei. The point for Volpei snapped a 10-game point scoring drought and the goal helped Lauridsen maintain a four-game goal scoring streak that dates back to Feb. 5. UND then added a power play goal and a shorthanded goal to end the game. In the nets, Mike Lee was the SCSU goalie of record with 27 saves, while Dan Dunn relieved in the third period with six saves. Brad Eidsness had 24 saves for UND. In the game, UND outshot the Huskies 41-25. On the weekend, UND outshot the Huskies 87-51.



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LOWE'S AWARD FINALIST: Senior defender Garrett Raboin, who is a top 10 finalist for the 2010 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, missed his first game on Feb. 12, since he was out of the line-up on Dec. 6, 2006. Raboin played in 132 consecutive games before missing the game on Feb. 12, 2010. Raboin returned to action on Feb. 13. He now has 77 career points at SCSU, which places him in a tie for career points by a SCSU defender along with longtime NHL standout Bret Hedican. MOTZKO WINS 100th AT SCSU: Congratulations are in order for SCSU coach Bob Motzko as he won his 100th career game at SCSU on Feb. 12, with his squad's 4-3 victory over visiting North Dakota. Motzko now owns a 100-69-23 career record during his five seasons in St. Cloud. He ranks third in the all-time SCSU win list behind Craig Dahl and Charlie Basch. Motzko took over the helm at SCSU in 2005-06, and has averaged over 20 wins per season since that time.

GREAT TEAMS: SCSU will continue its race in the WCHA on Feb. 19-20, with a pair of games at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis., against #3 Wisconsin. This will mark the 10th series this season that the Huskies have played a nationally ranked squad. The fortunes for both of these teams have improved since UW visited SCSU on Nov. 20-21. At that time, UW was ranked #15 in the nation while the Huskies were not ranked in the national polls. In the polls this week, UW was ranked #3 and SCSU was ranked #4.

RANKS THIRD: Ryan Lasch enjoyed his 49th multi-point game of the season on Feb. 12 (1g/1a). He has 10 multi-point games this season, and he currently leads the team with 16 goals and 35 points this winter. In his career, Lasch now has 169 points (75g/94a). He is just 10 points away from the team's all-time career point record set by Jeff Saterdalen (1988-92) with 179 points. Of note, SCSU still has four regular season games left this winter along with at least two playoff games.

OFFENSE ON DEFENSE: Sophomore Oliver Lauridsen seems to have found his inner Bobby Orr. After scoring a goal in the team's season opener on Oct. 9, Lauridsen went 27 games without a goal. He has now scored goals in his last four outings. Lauridsen fourth consecutive marker prevented a shutout on Feb. 13, during the Huskies' loss to UND. He also posted the Huskies' opening goal in the big 4-3 win at the NHC on Feb. 12. Lauridsen now has five goals and five assists this season.

RANKS SECOND: SCSU junior goalie Dan Dunn maintained his unbeaten streak in the nets with his 43 save victory over UND on Feb. 12. Dunn made 17 saves in the second period and 16 saves in the final period to bring home his 11th win of the season. Dunn has not lost a game since as 4-1 loss vs. Wisconsin on Nov. 21, 2009. His win rate of .821 ranks second among DI players.

RARE EVENT: SCSU's loss to UND on Feb. 13, was SCSU's first loss at the NHC since a 4-1 setback against Colorado College on Dec. 12. The Huskies are 10-3-4 in home action this season. The seven-goal loss was SCSU's biggest margin of defeat since a 9-1 loss to Colorado College on Feb. 25, 1996. The six goals allowed by the Huskies in the second period on Feb. 13, also tied a team record for most goals allowed in a period. The Huskies also allowed six goals in a period on Dec. 11, 1987 at Northern Michigan in the second period.

STREAK SNAPPED: SCSU junior Garrett Roe saw his 13-game point streak snapped on Feb. 13 during SCSU's tough 8-1 setback at home against North Dakota. Roe had previously posted points in every game since Jan. 2 vs. Brown. He now has 12 goals and 22 assists this season and ranks second on the team with 34 points. Roe charted 20 points during his recent 13-game run.

HUSKY ON A ROLL: Since a sweep at UAA on Dec. 4-5, the Huskies own an impressive 13-3-2 record. Of note, SCSU will enjoy a bye week on Feb. 26-27. On March 5-6, SCSU will play a home-home series vs. Minnesota State (Mar. 5 at MSU, Mar. 6 at SCSU).

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In four seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 100-69-23 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 60 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons. and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, four-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.
