Wisconsin leads 43-28-8 (15-16-4 in St. Cloud)  
Badgers lost the last two games of their series with St. Cloud, falling 4-2 and 7-3 last Feb. 25-26 in St. Cloud.

#### Series Notes

The games will mark the 80th and 81st meetings in the all-time series ... UW Head Coach Mike Eaves spent the 1987-88 season as an assistant coach at St. Cloud State ... St. Cloud State senior defenseman Sam Zabkowicz hails from Greendale, Wis. ... the Badgers are 4-4-0 against SCSU in the last eight meetings, including a 5-3 victory at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn., in the NCAA West Regional Final that earned the Badgers a trip to the 2010 NCAA Frozen Four ... St. Cloud State visits the Kohl Center on Feb. 3-4.

### Key Notes to Consider

▶ Wisconsin (4-4-0, 3-3-0 WCHA) heads to St. Cloud State (3-4-1, 1-1-0 WCHA) for a Friday-Saturday series to open November. Friday's game begins at 7:30 p.m., while Saturday's contest is a 7 p.m. start.

▶ Both teams posted splits last weekend. The Badgers dropped a 5-4 game to Nebraska Omaha, before taking a 6-3 victory, while St. Cloud State put up a 4-0 shutout over North Dakota, before absorbing a 3-1 loss.

▶ Wisconsin has scored first in three of its last four games after falling behind in each of its first four contests of the season. The Badgers are 3-1-0 in their last four games.

▶ The Badgers have at least one power play goal in each of their last four games and seven of eight games overall.

However, Wisconsin has also allowed at least one power-play goal in three of its last four games. The Badgers have allowed at least two power-play goals in four of their eight games this season.

▶ Sophomore forward Mark Zengerle (Rochester, N.Y.) took an early lead in the WCHA scoring race with 10 league points after a five-point weekend (2g, 3a) against UNO. Zengerle's performance included a spin-o-rama primary assist on the rush for a highlight-reel play on Friday, as well as his first career short-handed goal on Saturday.

▶ Mark Zengerle (4-7=11) is one of three Badgers with seven-game scoring streaks. The other streaking Badgers include junior defenseman Justin Schultz (1-10=11) and sophomore forward Tyler Barnes (5-4=9).

- ▶ Wisconsin has been outshot in all but one game this year, but sit 4-3-0 in games on the short end of the shot total.
- ▶ Eight different Badgers scored the team's 11 goals last weekend against Nebraska Omaha, continuing a trend of balanced goal scoring. UW had nine Badgers score goals the prior weekend against North Dakota.
- ▶ Sophomore defenseman Frankie Simonelli (Bensenville, Ill.) scored a power-play goal last Saturday against Nebraska Omaha, which also proved to be the game-winning goal. He now has two career power-play and game-winning tallies. Simonelli's goal was his first since Dec. 30, 2010 against Massachusetts, a span of 27 games between scores.
- ▶ Sophomore defenseman Chase Drake (Mosinee, Wis.) made his collegiate debut last Saturday against Nebraska Omaha. Drake was one of 15 Badgers in the game who are either sophomores (10) or freshmen (5).
- ▶ Freshman forward Matt Paape (Appleton, Wis.) scored in the first period of last Saturday's game against Nebraska Omaha, marking his first goal as a Badger.
- ▶ Sophomore forward Jason Clark (Eden Prairie, Minn.) made his 2011-12 debut for the Badgers, playing both games for the Badgers last weekend. Clark skated in 14 games last season as a freshmen.
- ▶ Sophomore forward Tyler Barnes (Eagan, Minn.) scored two goals last Friday to give a Badger skater their first multi-goal game of the season. The pair of goals marked the second time in Barnes' career he scored twice in a contest, matching his Nov. 19, 2010 performance against then-No. 1 and eventual NCAA champion Minnesota Duluth.
- ▶ Sophomore Tyler Barnes (Eagan, Minn.) leads the Badgers with five goals. His total through just eight games matches his total from his freshman season. He posted five goals in 41 games last year as a rookie.
- ▶ Junior forward and assistant captain Ryan Little (Fond du Lac, Wis.) is working on a career-high scoring streak after scoring a goal last Saturday. Little has points in each of his last four games, including two goals and six points. Little already boasts six points on two goals and four assists through eight games played. He set a career high last year with 10 points.
- ▶ Sophomore forward Jefferson Dahl (Eau Claire, Wis.) notched his first point of the season last Saturday, scoring into an empty net to seal Wisconsin's 6-3 victory over Nebraska Omaha.
- ▶ UW continues to rotate its goaltending duties between freshmen Landon Peterson and Joel Rumpel.
- ▶ One week after making 38 saves in a 5-4 victory over North Dakota, freshman goaltender Joel Rumpel (Swift Current, Saskatchewan) stopped 39 shots in a 6-3 triumph over Nebraska Omaha. That performance is the most saves for a Badger goaltender in a win since Shane Connelly stopped 43 shots in a 3-2 victory at Minnesota on Feb. 6, 2009. Rumpel is now 3-1-0 with a 3.00 goals-against average and .917 save percentage in four games played.
- ▶ All nine Wisconsin freshmen have seen action for the Badgers this season, including seven of the nine last weekend against North Dakota. Forward Joseph LaBate (Eagan, Minn.) leads the way offensively with two goals and five assists.
- ▶ Junior Justin Schultz (West Kelowna, British Columbia) needs 20 points to become the first UW defenseman since Brian Rafalski in the 1994-95 season to reach 100 career points. He would also become the 12th UW student-athlete who played strictly as a defenseman during their careers to reach the mark. Schultz also sits in striking distance of Wisconsin's career top-10 lists for defensemen with 25 career goals and 80 career points. Two more goals will tie him for 10th on UW's career goal scoring for defensemen, while 23 points will do the same on the career points list for defensemen.
- ▶ Sophomore center Mark Zengerle (Rochester, Minn.) scored five goals out of 36 points as a rookie, taking a total of 60 shots the entire season. That averaged to just under 1.5 shots per game. Already in 2011-12, Zengerle has fired 24 shots in eight games, an average of 3.0 shots per game. Zengerle is tops on the Badgers in shots on goal so far this season and owns four goals.

► Freshman goaltenders Landon Peterson (Oregon, Wis.) and Joel Rumpel (Swift Current, Saskatchewan) made their collegiate debuts against Northern Michigan during the season opening weekend. With both rookies playing, that marked the first time since the 1989-90 season that two freshmen goaltenders saw action in the same season. Jon Michelizzi and Matt Glaesman both saw action in 1989-90. The last time two freshmen started games in goal for the Badgers came in 1988-89 when both Curtis Joseph and Duane Derksen started games.

► Head Coach Mike Eaves, in his 10th season at Wisconsin, sits four victories shy of 200 for his Wisconsin coaching career. He currently sports a 196-142-42 (.571) mark through 380 games behind the Badger bench.

Jeff Sauer, with 489 victories between 1982 and 2002, and Bob Johnson with 367 victories between 1966 and 1982, are the UW's top-two coaches in all-time wins.

Eaves is only the third Wisconsin head coach since 1966. Bill Rothwell served as interim head coach for 1975-76 while Bob Johnson coached the U.S. Olympic team.

► The Badgers boast just one senior on the roster in defenseman Eric Springer (Wrightstown, Wis.). Redshirt junior forward Ryan Little (Fond du Lac, Wis.) will also be in his fourth year as a Badger.

► Wisconsin returns its leading scorer in junior defenseman Justin Schultz (West Kelowna, British Columbia). Schultz, a top-10 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist in 2010-11, as well as the WCHA Defensive Player of the Year last season, scored 18 goals and 47 points to lead all defensemen in the country.

Schultz is the first non-goaltending Badger All-American to return to the UW lineup since defenseman Jeff Dessner and forward Dany Heatley played for the Badgers a season after earning 2000 All-American honors. Goaltenders Brian Elliott (2006-07) and Bernd Brückler (2004-05) returned for their senior seasons after earning first-team All-American honors in 2006 and 2004, respectively.

► Junior defenseman John Ramage (St. Louis) serves as the team's captain, while junior defenseman Justin Schultz and junior forward Ryan Little will serve as assistant captains.

► Sophomores lead the return on offense for the Badgers with forwards Mark Zengerle (5-31=36), Michael Mersch (8-11=19) and Tyler Barnes (5-12=17) returning as UW's second, third and fourth leading returning scorers from last season. Sophomore defenseman Frankie Simonelli (2-9=11) ranks sixth among returners in scoring.

► Wisconsin must replace five of its top seven scorers from last season as forward Craig Smith (19 goals, 43 points), defenseman Jake Gardiner (10 g, 41 pts), forward Jordy Murray (18 g, 26 pts), forward Podge Turnbull (13 g, 20 pts) and Patrick Johnson (8 g, 19 pts) either graduated or became professionals.

In all, Wisconsin returns 53 out of 129

goals (30.46 percent) and 183 of 357 points (51.26 percent) from last year's offense.

► Three Badgers left school early to sign professional contracts, including seniors-to-be defenseman Jake Gardiner (Toronto - NHL) and forward Jordy Murray (Rapperswil-Jona Lakers - Swiss National League A), as well as junior-to-be forward Craig Smith (Nashville - NHL).

► For the first time since the 1964-65 season, the second season after UW restarted its program, Wisconsin enters a season without a goaltender with collegiate playing experience. Junior Mitch Thompson and freshmen Joel Rumpel and Landon Peterson will compete for playing time.

Wisconsin has entered a few seasons having a goaltender with limited experience, including most recently during the 1988-89 season when only senior John Lambie had played. He skated 11 minutes of action during the 1987-88 season. UW had a solid incoming duo that season with future NHL-great Curtis Joseph and eventual All-American and NCAA champion Duane Derksen entering as rookies.

Wisconsin does boast a history of quality rookie goaltenders, including three who won what is now the WCHA Rookie of the Year award — Curtis Joseph, Mike Richter and Jim Carey. Most recently, Bernd Brückler was named to the 2001-02 WCHA All-Rookie Team.

► Wisconsin welcomes nine newcomers to the roster for 2011-12 — a pair of goaltenders in Joel Rumpel and Landon Peterson, two defensemen in Patrick Daly and Jake McCabe and five forwards in Matt Paape (pronounced Poppy), Joseph LaBate, Brendan Woods, Tyler Lopic and Brad Navin.

► Construction on La Bahn Arena will continue throughout the season. The arena will house the team's new practice sheet of ice (200' x 90') and will sit just west of the Kohl Center, UW's gameday home. The facility will include new locker rooms.

La Bahn Arena will also serve as the game facility for UW women's hockey, with new locker rooms for that program. The men's and women's swimming programs will also get new locker rooms with the construction.

The facility is scheduled for completion in October 2012.

► In four of the previous seven seasons, UW's leading scorer was a freshman (Joe Pavelski, 2004-05; Kyle Turris, 2006-07) or a defenseman (Jamie McBain, 2008-09; Justin Schultz, 2010-11), and only one time during that stretch has a senior led the team in scoring (Andrew Joudrey, 2006-07).

► Twenty of Wisconsin's 26 student-athletes are either freshmen (9) or sophomores (11) eligibility-wise.

► Wisconsin welcomes Border rival Minnesota to the Kohl Center for games on Nov. 11-12. Friday's game is a 7 p.m. start, while Saturday's contest begins at 7:30 p.m.

## Kohl Center Facts, Folklore and Traditions

- ▶ The Kohl Center, which opened in 1998, is the second-largest on-campus rink in the nation (15,325). The only on-campus facility with a larger capacity is Value City Arena (17,500) in Columbus, Ohio. The building is the third-largest rink played in regularly by college hockey schools, behind Value City Arena and CenturyLink Center Omaha (16,680).
- ▶ Wisconsin has won at least 10 games in a season at the Kohl Center on nine occasions.
- ▶ The Kohl Center played host to NCAA regional action for the first time in 2008 when the 2008 NCAA Midwest Regional took place on March 29-30. The building had previously played host to the 1998 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championships, a 2002 NCAA Men's Basketball Regional and 2007 NCAA Women's Ice Hockey Quarterfinal contest.
- ▶ The Kohl Center cost \$76.4 million to construct and is named after U.S. Senator Herb Kohl, a 1956 UW graduate who donated \$25 million towards the project.
- ▶ The Kohl Center ice sheet is 200 feet long by 97 feet wide.
- ▶ Thirty-five of Wisconsin's 40 Kohl Center sellouts have come after Jan. 1.

# La Bahn Arena



On Nov. 17, 2010, the Wisconsin State Building Commission gave final approval to a multi-level, hockey and swimming competition and training facility to be constructed adjacent to the Kohl Center on the UW-Madison campus. La Bahn Arena will be named after Charles (UW-Madison '49) and Mary Ann La Bahn, the lead donors for the project.

"Mary Ann and I are delighted to participate in the funding for this excellent facility for men's and women's hockey and men's and women's swimming," Charles La Bahn said. "The concept is sound and generations of student-athletes will benefit from the comprehensive design and availability of the structure. [UW Director of Athletics] Barry Alvarez and his associates are to be commended for their foresight in planning this much needed facility."

Construction is underway, with the facility set to open in the fall of 2012.

La Bahn Arena will be a tri-level complex that will include, among other items:

- 90' by 200' ice sheet for men's and women's hockey practice and women's competition, with seating for approximately 2,400 spectators
- Men's and women's hockey team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room
- Underground connection to the Kohl Center

The total cost of the project will be \$27.9 million, with two-thirds of that coming from gifts to UW Athletics and the remainder coming from bonding.

"The new rink will be the final jewel in the crown we have here as a hockey program," said Head Coach Mike Eaves. "It will be one-stop shopping. Our Fetzer Center is there for academics, our weight training is there, we have training table there. We'll have everything under one roof.

"The fact that we are moving forward with the project, there are so many people to thank. We've had alumni, businessmen, the general fan step up and want to be a part of the program because Badger hockey has been a big part of their lives in some form or fashion. They've been so gracious and generous in stepping up and helping out financially in a way that has made it possible for us to actually be coming closer to putting a shovel in the ground."
