ON THE ROAD TO ST. PAUL

The #6 St. Cloud State Huskies (22-12-5, 15-9-4 WCHA) will open play in the 2010 Red Baron WCHA Final Five on Friday, March 19, with a 2:07 p.m. game at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul against #3 Wisconsin (24-9-4). The winner of the game on Friday will then advance to play the winner of the other Friday game between #1 seed Denver and the winner of the Thursday game between North Dakota and Minnesota Duluth. The Final Five title game is slated for 7:07 p.m. on March 20, while the third place game will be held at 2:07 p.m. on March 20. All games will be broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel making the call. All games will also be on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org). The games will also be televised on FOX Sports North, which is channel 28 on the Charter Cable system in the St. Cloud area.

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

■ SCSU was ranked 4th in the Pairwise rankings on Mar. 15 at 1 p.m. These rankings mimic the criteria used by the NCAA to determine the 16 teams for postseason tournament play.

■ In the most recent USCHO.com poll, SCSU moved to #6. This marked the 14th consecutive week that the Huskies have been ranked among the top 20 teams in the USCHO.com poll this season. SCSU was also ranked #7 in the INCH Power Rankings and #6 USA Hockey poll on Mar. 15.

■ SCSU placed third in the final WCHA regular season standings, two spots ahead of the predicted fifth place finish in the league's pre-season poll. In 20 seasons of play in the WCHA, this marks the 3rd time SCSU has placed 3rd in the WCHA standings. SCSU also placed 3rd in 2000 and 1997. Of note, SCSU placed 2nd in the WCHA in 2001, 2002 and 2007.

■ Former Husky Ryan Malone (1999-2003) helped lead Team USA to a Silver Medal at the recent Winter Olympics in Vancouver. In his Olympic debut, Malone posted 3 goals and 2 assists during tournament play.

■ The Huskies earned their trip to the Final Five with a first round series win over Minnesota State. On March 12, the Huskies lost a 5-4 OT game, but they bounced back with a 3-2 win on March 13, and then gained a 3-2 OT win on March 14 at the NHC. This was the first time MSU and SCSU had tangled in the playoffs.

■ Senior defender Garrett Raboin is a top 10 finalist for the 2010 Lowe's Senior CLASS award.

■ The Huskies will be heading back to the Red Baron WCHA Final Five for the first time since 2008. This will mark the Huskies' 12th trip to the WCHA Final Five.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (18-17-3) placed sixth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (13-13-2 WCHA). The Huskies fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs in a two-game series at Minnesota. This was the 13th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the ninth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU was ranked 7th in the USCHO.com poll, #7 in the USA Hockey poll and 7th in the INCH poll this week...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a fifth place ranking for 2009-10...last year, the Huskies ended the season by receiving votes in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2008-09 WCHA preseason poll and they placed sixth.

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show airs every Monday during the season from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM. The show is broadcast live from Old Chicago in St. Cloud. Fans are encouraged to stop by Old Chicago to watch the show live. You can listen on the web at www.1450knsi.com



ON THE AIR: All SCSU games were broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 in the St. Cloud area with Don Lyons and Dave Reichel calling the shots this season. Fans were able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games were also broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). KARE 11 personality and SCSU grad Rob Hudson and former Husky great Mike Doyle will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans also watched the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro).

CALL THEM CAPTAIN: Senior Garrett Raboin will be wearing a letter on his sweater for the third consecutive season. Raboin will serve as the team captain this season for the second consecutive season, while junior forward Aaron Marvin will serve as an alternate captain for the Huskies this winter.

COACHING STAFF: SCSU will be led this season by fifth-season head coach Bob Motzko. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko earned WCHA Coach of the Year notice in 2006 and 2007. Assistant coach Eric Rud begins his fifth season in St. Cloud, while Mike Gibbons begins his third year as an assistant with the Huskies. Mike Ayers will be in his first year as the volunteer goalie coach at SCSU.

Some Quick Notes...

- The Huskies will be heading back to the Red Baron WCHA Final Five for the first time since 2008. This will mark the Huskies' 12th trip to the WCHA Final Five, and SCSU has made seven trips to the Final Five since 2000. The Huskies own a 7-14-0 record in Final Five action since they made their first trip to the Final Five in 1994.
SCSU won the WCHA Final Five in 2001, and the Huskies have advanced to the championship game in 2006 and 1994.
SCSU gained its bid to the WCHA Final Five with a thrilling 3-2 OT victory over Minnesota State in game three of their first round series on March 14, at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud. SCSU opened the series with a heart-breaking 5-4 OT loss on March 12, against MSU. The Mavericks scored in the closing second of play to tie the game and then won the match with a goal at :20 of the OT period. On March 13, the Huskies rallied with a 3-2 win over the Mavericks as Garrett Roe had two goals and one assist in the contest. To complete the set, SCSU's Drew LeBlanc scored the OT game winner on March 14, in the 3-2 win at the NHC.
SCSU will challenge Wisconsin at 2 p.m. On March 19 in the semi-finals of the WCHA Final Five at the Xcel Energy Center. SCSU is 1-1 against the Badgers in play at the Final Five. In 2007, SCSU lost a 4-3 OT decision against the Badgers in the third place game at the Xcel Energy Center. The Huskies also played their first-ever WCHA Final Five game against UW, as they posted a 3-2 OT win in the semi-final game on March 18, 1994.





MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

ONE POINT NEEDED: SCSU senior forward Ryan Lasch posted four assists over the weekend series vs. Mankato. Lasch now has 178 career points with the Huskies, which places him one point behind SCSU's all-time point leader Jeff Saterdalen (1988-92).

GOALIE NEWS: SCSU freshman Mike Lee earned the start in the Huskies' two wins over Minnesota State this weekend. He posted 33 saves on March 13 and completed the weekend with 27 saves on March 14. Lee is now 10-8-3 on the season with a .917 save percentage and a 2.73 goals against average.

WISE GUYS: The Huskies placed 16 student-athletes on the WCHA All-Academic team this season, which equals a team-high for most players on the All-Academic team. SCSU also had 16 players on the list in 2005-06. BIG SERIES VS. MSU: Garrett Roe moved into the team's point lead this weekend, as he posted three goals and two assists in first round playoff action. Roe now has 45 points (19g/26a). He needs just three points this year to hit his career season-high of 48 points charted in 2008-09. In his career, Roe now has 138 career points and he currently ranks 7th in the team records for most career points at SCSU.

TEAM NOTES: Drew LeBlanc gained his third game winning goal of the season on March 14. This ties him for the team's GWG lead along with Jarod Festler, Nick Oslund and David Eddy...SCSU has outscored its opponents 126-109 this season....Junior Tony Mosey continues to enjoy success in 2009-10. He has career season-highs this year with 12 goals, 22 assists, 34 points and a team-high 8 PPGs. He is also an impressive +14 on the +/- this season, which leads SCSU in 2009-10. ...SCSU seniors saluted at the game on March 6 included Jon Ammerman, Craig Gaudet, Ryan Peckskamp, Ryan Lasch and Garrett Raboin. Of note, Ammerman and Raboin also received their third consecutive WCHA Scholar-Athlete plaques at the game from SCSU Faculty Rep Dr. William Hudson...SCSU senior defender Garrett Raboin is a top 10 finalist for the Lowe's Senior CLASS award in 2009-10. Fans can vote for Raboin in the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award poll by visiting this website: www.seniorCLASSaward.com....Ryan Lasch has now played in a school record 157 consecutive games during his career with the Huskies. He is also closing in on the record for most games played in a game, which was set by Nate Dey from 2004-08 with 159 games played. ...at 12-4-2, Dan Dunn owns a .722 winning percentage this season. He currently ranks 5th in the nation for winning percentage this winter.

SHG SUCCESS STORY: The Huskies continue to lead the country with 9 shorthanded goals this season. They are tied for the lead along with Boston University and Army. The Huskies added their ninth SHG vs. MSU on March 12, as Travis Novak scored his second SHG of the season.

NICE SEASON AT SCSU: This marks the 8th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have won 22-or-more games in a season. SCSU's team record for wins in a season is 31, which was hit during the 2000-01 season. SCSU is 22-12-5 in 2009-10.

MOTZKO UPDATE: SCSU coach Bob Motzko is in his fifth season at SCSU and he this will mark his fourth trip to the Final Five (2006, 2007, 2008 and 2010). Motzko led the Huskies to the championship game in 2006, and he is 2-4 in action at the Final Five during his tenure at SCSU. In his career, Motzko owns a 103-72-24 record.

UP NEXT: If the Huskies win on March 19, they will advance to the championship game of the Final Five on March 20 at 7:07 p.m. If the Huskies lose, they would advance to the 3rd place game on March 20 at 2:07 p.m.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fifth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2009-10. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to four WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In five seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 103-72-24 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 64 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2008-09, Motzko led the Huskies to an 18-17-3, 13-13-2 WCHA record. In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by fourth-year coach Eric Rud and second-year coach Mike Gibbons. and first-year volunteer goalie coach Kevin Ayers. SCSU's support staff features tested veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, four-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and Coordinator of Business and Hockey Operations Matt Chapman.

SCSU WCHA PLAYOFF NOTEBOOK:

In the first round, SCSU gained a 2-1 series win over Minnesota State on March 12-14 (L, 5-4 OT, W 3-2, W 3-2 OT). This marked the first time SCSU and MSU had played in WCHA playoff action. SCSU has now played every team in the WCHA in post-season tournament play.

* The Huskies will returning to the WCHA Final Five, after missing a ticket to the Xcel in 2009. Since joining the WCHA in 1990-91, the Huskies own a 27-22-0 record in first round play of the WCHA playoffs. SCSU has hosted first round action in the WCHA playoffs in 3-of-the-last 5 seasons. The Huskies also hosted first round play in the WCHA playoffs during 2007 and 2008. The Huskies are 9-16-0 in WCHA first round playoffs on the road and they are 18-6-0 in first round action at the NHC. Last year, the Huskies lost a pair of games at Minnesota in first round play.

* In WCHA Final Five action, the Huskies are 7-14-0 and they have advanced to the Final Five in 1994, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2006, 2007 and 2008. SCSU has advanced to the Red Baron WCHA Final Five championship game in 1994, 2001 and 2006. The Huskies captured the WCHA's Broadmoor Trophy in 2001 with a historic 6-5 OT championship game victory over North Dakota.

* SCSU has only lost one first round series when it has hosted first round games at the NHC. In 1995, SCSU suffered a 3-2 and 5-2 series setback against visiting North Dakota, which prevented SCSU from earning a bid to the Final Five..

* In the last trip to the Final Five, SCSU posted a 3-2 loss vs. Minnesota on March 20, 2008. In the last meeting vs. Wisconsin, the Huskies lost 4-3 OT in the third place game on March 17, 2007.
