## 2004-05 SCSU MEN'S HOCKEY NEWS

Release Date: Oct. 4, 2004



**A NEW SEASON AT SCSU:** The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team will kick-off its 18th season of NCAA Division I competition on Saturday, Oct. 9, with a 1 p.m. (CT) game against St. Lawrence in the opening round of the University of New Hampshire IceBreaker tournament in Durham, N.H. In the other first round game, host UNH will play Ohio State. The Huskies will play either OSU or UNH in the final round of the tournament on Sunday, Oct. 10. Game times on Oct. 10 will be at 1 p.m. and 4 p.m., and SCSU's opponent will depend upon the results of Saturday's games. Of note, UNH will play in the late game on both days of the tournament.

**2003-04 RESULTS:** The Huskies finished their season with an 18-16-4, 12-12-4 WCHA/6th place). This was the fifth consecutive season that SCSU has finished above the .500 mark.

**SCSU COACH CRAIG DAHL:** SCSU head coach Craig Dahl is in his 18th season with the Huskies, and has been the team's only head coach since SCSU moved to the DI level in 1987-88. Dahl's record at SCSU is 324-286-49, and his all-time collegiate coaching record is 400-373-51. He will begin his 24th year as a collegiate head coach in 2004-05. Dahl served for one season as an assistant coach to Herb Brooks at SCSU in 1986-87, and prior to that he had head coaching assignments at UW-River Falls and Bethel College. Dahl is a 1976 graduate of Pacific Lutheran University.

**ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF:** Coach Dahl will be assisted in 2004-05 by Brad Willner and Fred Harbinson. Willner, a 1995 graduate of Lake Superior State, will begin his fifth season with the Huskies in 2004-05. Harbinson begins his third season as a member of the SCSU coaching corps in 2004-05. Harbinson is a 1995 graduate of Wisconsin-Superior.

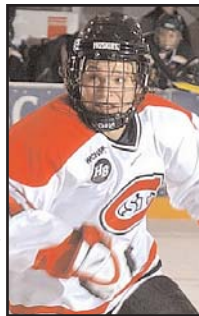


## MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

**HUSKIES RANKED 7TH:** The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team gained a seventh place ranking in the 2004-05 WCHA pre-season poll conducted by the Grand Forks Herald. The Huskies gained 30 points in the poll, while Minnesota-Duluth was the poll's top team with 79 points. The remaining teams in the poll included North Dakota (66), Wisconsin (64), Colorado College (61), Minnesota (51), Denver (45), MSU-Mankato (27), Michigan Tech (17) and Alaska Anchorage (10). Wisconsin goalie Bernd Bruckler was the top vote getter in the pre-season player of the year honors, while Travis Zajac of North Dakota was picked as the top rookie prospect. SCSU was not ranked in the USA TODAY/American Hockey Magazine poll, but it did receive votes in the USCHO pre-season poll for 2004-05.

**HUSKIES IN 2003-04:** The Huskies opened last year with a hot hand as they rolled to a 9-0-1 start, which included a 8-2 win to open the year against St. Clair (ex). SCSU's first loss of the season was a 2-1 setback at North Dakota. In contrast, SCSU lost the final seven games of the season, including two setbacks against Minnesota in the first round of the WCHA playoffs at Mariucci Arena in Minneapolis on March 12-13. Seniors departed from last year's team include 100-point club member Matt Hendricks (54g/58 a), forward Andy Lundbohm and defenders Colin Peters and Ryan LaMere.

**THE OUTLOOK:** The Huskies will return two goalies (Tim Boron and Jason Montgomery) along with five defenders (Casey Borer, Matt Gens, Justin Fletcher, TJ McElroy and Grant Clifton) in 2004-05. Up front, SCSU will bring back nine forwards - including team scoring leader Dave Iannazzo (16g/11a). Other returning scorers include Mike Doyle, Nate Raduns, Gary Houseman, Billy Hengen, Joe Jensen, Brock Hooton, Peter Szabo and Konrad Reeder.

**NEXT IN LINE:** Who's next for membership in SCSU's 100-point club. Well, senior Peter Szabo is the team top player for career points with 73 (18g/55a) during his first three seasons. He needs 27 points this year to become the 21st Husky to reach 100-career points since 1987. Senior forward Mike Doyle is another top candidate to join the club as he has 31g/41a for a career total of 72 points since 2001. Last year, Matt Hendricks joined the 100-point club as he ended his career with 54g/58a for 112 points.

**DRAFT UPDATE:** In 2004, two SCSU players were selected in the NHL draft. Casey Borer was selected as the 69th overall pick in the third round by Carolina. He was joined in the pool by newcomer Andrew Gordon, who was selected as the 197th overall pick by the Washington Capitals in the seventh round. Brock Hooton (Ottawa Senators) and Matt Gens (Vancouver Canucks) are the other two active SCSU players who have been drafted.

**MORE NEWS AND NOTES...**

**BREAKING OUT IN 2003-04:** Senior Dave Iannazzo had a breakout season in 2003-04. Last year, Iannazzo had 16g/11a to lead the team with 27 points. His previous season-high was 13 points during his frosh season. As a sophomore, Iannazzo dropped to 2g/3a before making his big leap as a junior. Another player making huge strides in 2003-04 was junior forward Billy Hengen. After a relative subdued rookie year with just two assists, Hengen burst into the spotlight with 8g/15a as a sophomore. He gained WCHA Player of the Week honors for his work against MSU in January and ranked 4th on the team in scoring last year. Others making a step up in 2003-04 included junior forward Brock Hooton (7pts in 2002-03 to 16 points last winter) and Joe Jensen (18 points in 2002-03 to 23 points in 2003-04.).

**NOTES ON THE ICEBREAKER:** The last time SCSU competed in a season kick-off tournament, the Huskies brought home top honors at the Maine Ice Breaker in 2001-02. SCSU defeated Clarkson (5-1) and Maine (6-2) to win the title. Last year, SCSU won tournament title honors at the Providence College Dunkin Donuts Coffee Pot Tournament with wins over Harvard and Providence ...if they play, SCSU would be playing Ohio State for the first time in team history. If they play, SCSU would be playing New Hampshire for the second time in team history. The first meeting between SCSU and UNH was a 3/28/03 date against the Wildcats in opening round play of the NCAA Regional tournament in Worcester, Mass. SCSU lost that match 5-2 to UNH...St. Lawrence leads the all-time series against SCSU by a 3-2 margin. The last time these two squads met was a 4-2, 5-2 series sweep by the Huskies in Oct. 1996 at the NHC. The first time SLU and SCSU tangled occurred on 10/23/87 with the Saints gaining a 7-5 win in New York.

**SOUTH FOR THE HOLIDAYS:** SCSU fans should make plans now to join the Huskies as they travel to sunny Florida for the Everblades Classic Tournament in Ft. Myers, Fla. on Dec. 28-29. The Huskies will play Maine in first round action, while Cornell and Boston College compete in the other first round showdown.
