## 2004-05 SCSU WOMEN'S HOCKEY TEAM NEWS

**HUSKIES ARE BACK ON THE ROAD THIS WEEK:** The St. Cloud State University women's hockey will travel to Wisconsin for their third road trip this season. Both weekend games on Friday and Saturday are set to begin at 2:05 pm. in the Kohl Center in Madison, Wisconsin.

**HUSKIES SPLIT ON SEASON HOME-OPENER WEEKEND:** The St. Cloud State women's hockey team (2-4-0, 2-4-0 WCHA) took one of two games from North Dakota this past Homecoming weekend at SCSU. It was a must-win weekend for the Huskies, so coming away from the weekend with just one win will make their upcoming weekend even more critical. On Friday, October 22, SCSU dropped a tough must-win game in the WCHA to North Dakota, 5-3. For the Huskies, it was junior forward Kristy Ooninx (2-2-4) earning her fourth point of the season in the second period. Senior assistant captain Carrie Holldorf (0-2-2) slashed in from the wing to assist Ooninx, who had the quick tap in from the front of the slot. In the third period the Huskies stormed back to score two more goals, making the game 4-3 in North Dakota's favor. Both goals were scored by junior forward Ashley Stewart (3-0-3). Her first goal was assisted by sophomore forward Jacqueline Jensen (0-1-1) and sophomore forward Hailey Clarkson (0-2-2) from the center of the slot. Her second goal was assisted by Jensen (0-2-2) and senior captain Tina Ciraulo (2-1-3). In the goal for the Huskies was freshman goalie Carmen Lizee (0-2-0). Lizee accumulated 15 saves in two periods of play. Freshman goaltender Kendall Newell earned her first ice-time for the Huskies in the third period. She accumulated 11 saves in 18:44 minutes of play. On Saturday, October 23, the Huskies redeemed themselves with a 1-0 win over North Dakota. Junior forward Kristy Ooninx score the game-winning goal for the Huskies at 1:32 in the second period. She was assisted on the power play goal by junior Ashley Stewart and first year Marie-Michel Lemieux. First year goaltender Kendall Newell (Phoenix, Ariz.) earned her first career start as a Husky and accumulated 32 saves to her credit, as UND outshot St. Cloud State 32-24. SCSU was also 8-of-8 on the penalty kill and 1-of-8 on the power play in this defensive struggle. "I saw the puck very well today," Newell said of her first collegiate shutout at SCSU. "Our defense played great throughout the game, and they did a great job of clearing the zone. It was a great team effort today, my name might be next to the shutout, but the shutout really was a total team effort." SCSU jumped out early in the game with 15 shots on net in the first period, but UND tested Newell in the late going with 15 shots on net in the second and 12 shots on goal in the third period.

**SCSU COACH JASON LESTEBERG:** Jason Lesteberg, A 1996 graduate of Gustavus Adolphus College, is in his third season with the Huskies as he joined the St. Cloud State University women's hockey program as its head coach in July, 2002. He is the second coach in the history of the program. In his first season at SCSU, the Huskies posted an 11-23-0, 5-19-0 WCHA record under Lesteberg's leadership. Last season the Huskies finished 7-24-1, 4-19-1 WCHA, which was good for a 6th place finish in the conference. His career record stands at 45-75-10 in collegiate coaching.

**ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF:** Joining Lesteberg on the bench this season is David Prokop, who is in his seventh season on the women's hockey staff. Prokop is one of team's top recruiters. Jeff Giesen is in his second season as an assistant coach. His primary duties are to work with the Huskies' defensive players and recruiting.

**HUSKIES MAKING MARK IN THE WCHA:** Senior captain Tina Ciraulo and junior forward Kristy Oonincx have found themselves currently ranked on the WCHA scoring leaders' list. Oonincx ranks 19th on the points scored list with five total points. Ciraulo ranks 8th in power play goals with two goals. SCSU currently has two goaltenders that are ranked in the WCHA as well. Sophomore goaltender Lauri St. Jacques ranks 11th in goals against average with an averaged of 3.44 and is ranked 8th in winning percentages with a .333 percentage. She also ranks 11th in save percentage with an .882 average. Sophomore goaltender Carmen Lizée ranks 14th in save percentages with an .823 average.



**PUDSEY PLAYS IN 100TH CAREER GAME:**

Senior Forward Melanie Pudsey (Erin, Ontario) played in her 100th career game as a Husky on Friday, October 22, against North Dakota. In her career Pudsey has accumulated 16 goals and 13 assists for 29 total career points.

The No. 4 Wisconsin women's hockey team suffered its first loss of the season to Western Collegiate Hockey Association rival, Ohio State, 3-1, Saturday night in Columbus, Ohio. The loss takes the Badgers to 5-1-0 on the season and 3-1-0 in the WCHA.

The Badgers are led in scoring by sophomore forward Lindsay Macy (Ellendale, Minn.) who has accumulated five goals and nine assists in six games for UND. Sophomore forward Sara Bauer (St. Catharines, Ontario) is second on the Badger scoring list with seven goals and four assists for 11 points. And senior defender Molly Engstrom (Siren, Wis.) is third in scoring with three goals and six assists for 10 points on the season. The net time has been split between junior goaltender Meghan Horras (3-0-0) and sophomore goaltender Christine Dufour (2-1-0). Horras has 42 saves on the season and Dufour has 53 saves on the season.

### Series Notes

Wisconsin swept the Huskies in their last meeting on Jan. 30-31, 2004 (4-1, 6-2). They swept this series by scoring two goals in the first period and three goals in the second to rout the Huskies at their own National Hockey Center in the second game of the series. The Huskies look to revenge that loss in a pivotal WCHA game this Friday night in Madison, Wisconsin.
