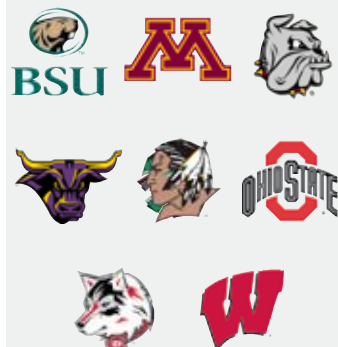

Early Season WCHA Tests Featured this Week

Defending Conference Champion, No. 1-Ranked Minnesota Duluth Opens League Play at No. 8 North Dakota ... No. 5-Ranked Wisconsin Hosts Bemidji State in Conference Openers; Ohio State Launches Regular Season at Robert Morris, Minnesota State Starts at Home Against Niagara, No. 4-Ranked Minnesota, St. Cloud State Host Wayne State, Minnesota Whitecaps

MADISON, Wis. – The 2010-11 Western Collegiate Hockey Association season opens this weekend with three of the women's league's nationally-ranked teams in action in key conference matchups.

Defending NCAA and conference champion Minnesota Duluth, ranked No. 1 in the national polls with 12 returning players and four players back from competing in the Winter Olympics last season, gets a big test when it travels to improved and No. 8-ranked North Dakota for games Friday (Oct. 8) night at 7:07 pm CT and Sunday afternoon at 2:07 pm CT. The Fighting Sioux, which features Olympians Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and her twin sister Jocelyne, gave notice they were for real last weekend by beating then No. 6 Boston University, 6-2, before 2,855 in the season opener at Grand Forks on Oct. 2, but BU rallied the next day, scored three shorthanded goals and took a 6-2 victory.

Lamoureux-Kolls had a four-point game in UND's win and a five-point weekend. Lamoureux-Kolls had an assist in the game's first goal last Saturday, an assist on the third goal and scored the last-lead goal and game-winning goal at 16:08 of the second period and 4:20 of the third period respectively. She was +2 in the game and led the team with 13 shots on goal. Jocelyne had a goal in each game.

CT, Bemidji State (1-1) visits No. 5-ranked Wisconsin (2-0). The Badgers defeated Rensselaer 7-0 and 6-0 last weekend at the Kohl Center in Madison as coach Mark Johnson returned behind the bench after a one-year sabbatical with the U.S. Women's Olympic Hockey Team. Hilary Knight, who played for Johnson in the Olympics and was the WCHA player of the year in 2009, returned to the Badgers and had a six-point weekend, including three goals in the series finale.

Bemidji State got a 26-save shutout from junior goalie Zuzana Tomcikova, the WCHA co-player of the year last season, and won at Wayne State 3-0 on Oct. 1, but the home team took the series finale on Oct. 2, 4-2. Emily Erickson had a four-point weekend for the Beavers.

Ohio State and Minnesota State open their respective 2010-11 regular seasons this weekend in a pair of non-conference series. The Buckeyes skate at Robert Morris on Friday (7:00 pm ET) and Saturday (2:00 pm ET) while the Mavericks Minnesota State entertain Niagara at 7:07 pm CT Friday and 3:07 pm CT Saturday at All Seasons Arena in Mankato.

St. Cloud State, standing 0-2 after losing two games to No. 2-ranked Mercyhurst last weekend in Erie, Pa., hosts Wayne State Friday evening at 7:07 pm CT at the National Hockey Center while No. 4-ranked Minnesota (2-0 after beating Clarkson twice in a rematch of last year's NCAA quarterfinal) entertains Wayne State Saturday afternoon (2:07 pm CT) at Ridder Arena. The Golden Gophers and Huskies also both play the Minnesota Whitecaps in exhibition games this weekend, with the Whitecaps at UM's Ridder Arena Friday night at 6:07 pm CT and then at St. Cloud State at 4:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon.

The battle for the 2010-11 WCHA regular season championship will again consist of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. The league schedule concludes Feb. 19.

WCHA to Continue Shootouts; Implements Three-Point Wins in League Standings

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association will continue to use shootouts and implement a three-point system in women's league play, Associate Commissioner Sara Martin has announced.

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings will show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.)

A team receives three points for winning a game in overtime (in regulation or overtime) and one point for an overtime tie. NCAA rules do not recognize shootout wins and for purposes to figure out a team's RPI, a game which ends tied after 65 minutes and prior to a shootout is recorded as a tie.

To reiterate the new WCHA women's league policy: Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

Minnesota Duluth Retains No. 1 Ranking in USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's College Hockey Poll

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – The University of Minnesota Duluth retains the No. 1 ranking in this week's USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's College Hockey Poll. The Bulldogs accumulated 188 points and 17-of-19 first-place votes to claim the top spot.

Cornell University remains at No. 2 with 163 points, while Mercyhurst College stays at No. 3 with 160 points and one first-place vote. The University of Minnesota (128) collected one first-place vote and moves up two spots to No. 4 after defeating then-No. 7 Clarkson University twice over the weekend, while the University of Wisconsin (119) holds the No. 5 spot, having earned two victories over Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.

The University of North Dakota (40) makes its 2010-11 poll debut at No. 8 after splitting a pair of games with No. 6 Boston University, while the University of New Hampshire (38) is ranked No. 9 after topping the University of Connecticut.

Highlighting this weekend's games is a Top-10 WCHA match-up between No. 1 Minnesota Duluth and No. 8 North Dakota.

Notes: The WCHA leads all conferences with four ranked teams, while the Hockey East Association has three ranked teams and ECAC Hockey has two.

About the Poll: The 14th annual USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's College Hockey Poll is conducted each week in conjunction with the American Hockey Coaches Association. The poll includes

input from coaches and journalists representing each of the four NCAA Division I ice hockey conferences, as well as composite votes from officers of the AHCA and USA Hockey Magazine, the most widely distributed hockey magazine in the world.

2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since it's founding in 1999, released it's 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,500

and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play its first game in the new building on Oct. 15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (exh).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena

in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

Bemidji State Beavers

The Beavers open conference play this weekend with two games in Madison, Wis. against Wisconsin in a Friday-Sunday series ... Last season the Beavers split the series with Wisconsin picking up two shutouts in the two games won ... In 2009-10 the Badgers were the first conference foe for the Beavers and BSU went on to win the first game 1-0 that was played in Coleraine, Minn. ... Following a 6-1 defeat in the Camp Randall Hockey Classic in Madison, Wis., the Beavers bounced back to win 2-0 in the Kohl Center ... Overall the series between Wisconsin and Bemidji State has the Badgers owning a large lead, going 41-3-2 all-time against BSU ... In the opening weekend of the 2010-11 season, the Beavers split at Wayne State, falling 4-2 on Oct. 2 after winning the first game 3-0 on Oct. 1 ... Goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova set the tone early in the Oct. 1 game stopping a Warrior breakaway for her first save of the game ... Tomcikova went on to turn away 26 more shots to record her ninth-career shutout ... The forward line of Erin Cody, Sadie Lundquist and Emily Erickson recorded six points in the Oct. 1 game at Wayne State ... Each person on the line had one goal and one assist ... Erickson followed up her performance in the Oct. 2 game with an additional goal and an assist, even though the Beavers fell 4-2 ... On the weekend she recorded two goals and two assists and leads Bemidji State with four points ... For the weekend the Beavers out-shot the Warriors, 66-40.

Minnesota Golden Gophers

The Golden Gophers opened the 2010-11 season against No. 7 Clarkson last weekend and earned a road series sweep over the Golden Knights, 5-0 and 3-0 ... Minnesota held its opponents scoreless and outshot CU, 86-41 ... In last Friday's game, Minnesota received goals from Jen Schoullis and Amanda Kessel at 10:08 and 15:28 in the first ... Red-shirting last season, the goal and game for Schoullis, was her first since March 20, 2009 when she played in the 2009 NCAA Frozen Four ...
