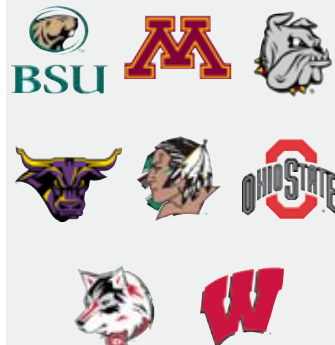

## Top 10 Teams Wisconsin, Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota and North Dakota Comprise Field for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Playoff Championship Set for Friday-Saturday at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Regular Season Champion Badgers Sport 22-Game Unbeaten Streak; Defending FINAL FACE-OFF Champion UMD Bulldogs Unbeaten Over Last 11; WCHA Individual Awards to Be Released Thursday, March 3 ... UW's Duggan is WCHA Scoring Champion, UMD's Martin Claims League Goaltending Title; WCHA Has Eight Nominees for 2011 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award; WCHA's Non-Conference Record at 24-11-3 (.671); Four WCHA-Member Teams Again Ranked Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Poll ... UW No. 1, UM No. 3, UMD No. 6, UND No. 8 ; Tickets Still Available for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis

MADISON, Wis. – Four nationally-ranked teams – Wisconsin, Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota and North Dakota – compose the field for this week's 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the league playoff championship for the home of 11 consecutive national championship teams.

The tournament will be held Friday, March 4 and Saturday, March 5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Div. 1 tournament.

The No. 1 seeded Badgers (32-2-2) will face-off against No. 4 seed North Dakota (20-12-3) in the playoff championship's first semi-final match up at 4:07 pm CT on Friday. The second semi-final will have No. 2 seed Minnesota Duluth (22-7-3) going up against No. 3 seed Minnesota (25-8-2) at 7:07 pm CT. The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championship game will be played on Saturday, March 5, at 7:07 pm CT.

Wisconsin enters the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF with a 22-game unbeaten streak at 20-0-2 while Minnesota Duluth sports an 11-game unbeaten string at 10-0-1.

The pairings for the NCAA Div. 1 Women's Tournament will be announced on Sunday, March 6 at 5:30 p.m. (on broadband at [www.ncca.com](http://www.ncca.com) <<http://www.ncca.com/>>) and all four FINAL FACE-OFF participants are contenders for a berth in the national tournament. In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, Wisconsin is ranked No. 1, Minnesota is ranked No. 3, Minnesota Duluth is No. 6 and North Dakota is No. 8.

During the regular season, Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth met four times with UMD holding a 2-1-1 edge. The Bulldogs are 4-1-1 in their last six games with the Golden Gophers. The Bulldogs defeated the Gophers 3-2 last season in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championship game on March 7, 2010 and then knocked off the Gophers two weeks later in the NCAA semifinals, en route to winning the 2010 NCAA Women's Frozen Four and national championship. Both games were at Ridder Arena. The Gophers have been in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championship game the last two seasons.

Wisconsin won all four games against North Dakota during the regular season, including a sweep in Madison Feb. 11 & 13. It is the first time North Dakota has played in the FINAL FACE-OFF.

This weekend's tournament will be streamed on the league's website ([www.wcha.com](http://www.wcha.com) <<http://www.wcha.com/>>) with veteran broadcaster Jack Swanson and former Minnesota coach Laura Halderson as the commentators.

In last weekend's first round, best-of-three series, all the home teams triumphed:

At Eagles' Nest in Verona, Wis., top-ranked and host Wisconsin ran its unbeaten streak to 22 games by sweeping St. Cloud State in two games in first round playoff action. Hilary Knight, Briana Decker and Meghan Decker combined for six goals and seven assists in last Friday's series opener, a 9-3 UW victory. Knight, who has a nation's best 46 goals, had two goals in a series-clinching 5-1 victory on Saturday. Decker led the Badgers with seven points as UW earned a place in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF with a pair of wins over St. Cloud State last weekend. The series marked Decker's second-straight seven-point weekend. Her total included three goals and four assists. Decker tallied four points in Friday's 9-3 win, including two power-play goals and her nation-leading 11th game-winning goal. Saturday's 5-1 UW win saw Decker figure into the first three goals of the game, assisting two tallies before scoring on a solo effort at 4:44 of the second to give the Badgers a 3-0 lead. Decker ranks third in the nation in assists (41) and fourth in points (72), points per game (2.00) and assists per game (1.09). The sophomore is fifth in total goals (31) and has a +63 rating in 36 games this season.

At AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minnesota Duluth ran its unbeaten streak to 11 games (10-0-1) and blanked Minnesota State 3-0 and 5-0 to sweep the series 2-0. Elin Holmlov had two goals and senior goalie Kim Martin made 20 saves in the 3-0 victory last Friday while Holmlov and Haley Irwin

each had three assists and sophomore goalie Jennifer Harss made 25 stops in the series—clinching 5-0 shutout on Saturday. Minnesota Duluth has accrued 12 shutouts this season, a school record.

At Ridder Arena in Minneapolis last weekend, Jen Schoullis had two goals on Friday as No. 3 Minnesota beat Ohio State 4-2 and then Amanda Kessel had one goal, the game-winner with 3:09 left to play, and an assist as the Golden Gophers edged the Buckeyes 3-2 on Saturday to sweep the series, 2-0. Since Minnesota's loss to Wisconsin Jan. 29, the Gopher line of Kessel, Sarah Erickson and Schoullis have led the Gophers' scoring driving with 42 points. In the past eight games, Kessel has contributed 16 points, followed by Erickson with 15 and Schoullis with 11. In that span, the trio also scored five power-play goals, two shorthanded goals and three game-winning goals.

At Purpur Arena in Grand Forks, North Dakota defeated Bemidji State in the only first round series which went three games. On Sunday, Monique Lamoureux-Kolls netted the winner at 16:00 of overtime to give the Fighting Sioux a 3-2 (ot) victory. Bemidji forced a deciding third game with a 3-0 victory on Saturday as Zuzana Tomcikova made 22 saves and sophomore forward Sadie Lundquist had a goal and an assist. In game one of the series, North Dakota used two goals from Stephanie Roy to take a 3-2 decision from the Beavers last Friday.

Wisconsin's all-time leading scorer Meghan Duggan won the league's scoring championship for 2010-11 and Minnesota Duluth's Kim Martin was the WCHA's top goaltender. Duggan, a senior forward from Danvers, Mass., had 27 goals, 34 assists and 61 points in 28 league games, averaging 2.18 points per game. She topped teammates Brianna Decker (23-28=51) and Hilary Knight (29-21=50) for the honor. Martin, a senior from Stockholm, Sweden, had a WCHA-best 1.51 goals-against average, besting Minnesota's Noora Rätty (1.70 GAA).

Both Duggan and Rätty were named Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award nominees, announced on Monday by USA Hockey. The Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award is given annually to the top Division I women's hockey player and will be presented in conjunction with the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four in Erie, Pa.

The list of 26 nominated players for the 2011 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award includes 17 forwards, five goaltenders and four defensemen hailing from 12 different schools and all four NCAA Division I women's ice hockey leagues. Eight of the 26 nominees are from the WCHA, and in addition to Duggan and Rätty include Wisconsin's Decker and Knight, Minnesota Duluth's Haley Irwin and Jocelyne Larocque, and North Dakota's Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls.

Division I women's hockey coaches will select the top-10 finalists from among the group of 26 nominees, with the announcement taking place March 3. A 13-member selection committee will choose the three finalists (announced March 10), as well as the award recipient, which will be announced live at the brunch ceremony in Erie, Pa., on March 19. All NCAA Division I women's ice hockey head coaches were asked to nominate players for the award. New to the selection process in 2011 is the stipulation that a player had to be nominated by at least two coaches in order for her to make the official nomination list.

In this week's (Feb. 21) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, four of the WCHA's eight-member teams are again ranked in the top ten. In addition to Wisconsin at No. 1, Minnesota is tied with Mercyhurst for No. 3, Minnesota Duluth is ranked No. 6, and North Dakota is No. 8.

Through games of March 1, the eight WCHA women's teams are a combined 24-11-3 in non-conference play this season for a .671 winning percentage.

## Eight WCHA Players Among Nominees for 2011 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award

### 26 Players Nominated for Top Honor in Women's College Hockey

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Twenty-six players are among the list of nominees for the 2011 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, presented by Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine. An award of The USA Hockey Foundation, the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award is annually bestowed upon the top player in NCAA Division 1 women's ice hockey.

Held in conjunction with the NCAA Women's Frozen Four, the 2011 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, presented by LECOM, will be given out at a brunch ceremony on March 19 at the Bayfront Convention Center in Erie, Pa.

The list of 26 nominated players includes 17 forwards, five goaltenders and four defensemen hailing from 12 different schools in all four NCAA Division 1 women's leagues. Mercyhurst College, host of the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, leads all schools with five nominated players.

The 34 NCAA Division 1 women's ice hockey head coaches will select the top-10 finalists from among the group of 26 nominees, with the announcement taking place March 3. A 13-member selection committee will choose the three finalists (announced March 10), as well as the award recipient, which will be announced live at the brunch ceremony in Erie on March 19.

Tickets to the 14th annual Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award Ceremony, presented by LECOM, may be purchased by calling 719-538-1184 or by submitting a completed ticket form (located at PattyKaz.com). Individual seats are \$65, while tables of 10 are available for \$600.

Notes: All 34 NCAA Division 1 women's ice hockey head coaches were asked to nominate players for the award. New to the selection process in 2011 is the stipulation that a player had to be nominated by at least two coaches in order for her to make the official nomination list ... Among the 26 nominees are 10 seniors, six juniors, seven sophomores and three freshmen ... the Western Collegiate Hockey Association leads

all conferences with eight nominees, while College Hockey America has seven, ECAC Hockey has six and Hockey East has five. Mercyhurst College leads all schools with five nominees, while Cornell University has four; Boston University and the University of Wisconsin each have three; Boston College, the University of Minnesota Duluth and the University of North Dakota each have two; and the University of Minnesota, Niagara University, Quinnipiac University, Syracuse University and Yale University each have one ... Eight of the nominated players were also nominated in 2010, including last year's winner Vicki Bendus (Wasaga Beach, Ont./Mercyhurst College); top-three finalist Noora Rätty (Espoo, Finland/Univ. of Minnesota); top-10 finalists Bailey Bram (Ste. Ann, Man./Mercyhurst College) and Jesse Scanzano (Montreal, Que./Mercyhurst College); and Jenni Bauer (St. Catharines, Ont./Niagara Univ.), Laura Fortino (Hamilton, Ont./Cornell Univ.), Lauriane Rougeau (Beaconsfield, Que./Cornell Univ.) and Jackee Snikeris (Downingtown, Pa./Yale Univ.) ... Meghan Agosta (Ruthven, Ont./Mercyhurst College) was a top-three finalist in 2007, 2008 and 2009 prior to taking the 2009-10 season off for the 2010 Olympics. Rebecca Johnston (Sudbury, Ont./Cornell Univ.), Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, Idaho/Univ. of Wisconsin), Monique Lamoureux-Kolls (Grand Forks, N.D./Univ. of North Dakota), Molly Schaus (Natick, Mass./Boston College) and Jenn Wakefield (Pickering, Ont./Boston Univ.) were all top-10 finalists in 2009 prior to taking the 2009-10 season off for the 2010 Olympics ... The award is named in honor of the late Patty Kazmaier, who was a four-year varsity letter-winner and All-Ivy League defenseman for Princeton University from 1981-86. An accomplished athlete who helped lead the Tigers to the Ivy League Championship in three consecutive seasons (1981-84), Patty Kazmaier-Sandt died on Feb. 15, 1990, at the age of 28, following a long struggle with a rare blood disease ... ## WCHA Announces Record Group of 90 Men's and Women's Scholar-Athletes for 2010-11 Sixth Annual Class Includes 30 Repeat Honorees

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, University of Alaska Anchorage Faculty Representative Steve Strom (Chair, men's league) and University of North Dakota Faculty Representative Sue Jenö (Chair, women's league) today (Feb. 10, 2011) announced that a total of 90 men's and women's student-athletes make up the sixth annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients. Over the first six years of the award, there have now been 414 honorees representing all 12 men's member and all eight women's member institutions. The previous record for honorees in one season was 80 in 2009-10.

The prestigious WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through Association member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

"The Western Collegiate Hockey Association is both thrilled and exceptionally proud to announce this group of men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes for the 2010-11 season," said WCHA Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. ## **WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11**

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play. In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

## WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

### Bemidji State Beavers

- The Beavers' 2010-11 season came to a close Sunday as they fell in overtime of game three to North Dakota 3-2.
- The only series in the first round of playoffs to go to three games, the Beavers and Sioux battled to a 2-2 tie at the end of regulation, forcing the extra period of play.
- In game one of the series, a couple costly defensive mistakes in the third period by BSU would give the game to North Dakota by a score of 3-2. After giving up a 1-0 lead early in the game on a shorthanded goal, the Beavers responded with Emily Erickson and Erin Cody scoring two goals in the second period within :30 seconds. However, Stephanie Roy scored two goals in the third period to put the game out of reach.
- Battling back on Saturday in game two, the Beavers played one of their best games of the season while blanking the Sioux 3-0. Erika Wheelhouse scored the game-winner, which was also her first of her college career. Lauren Williams and Sadie Lundquist scored unassisted goals in the third period to secure the victory. Zuzana Tomcikova also played one of her finest games in nets, making 22 saves including two clutch saves at key points to keep UND off the board.
- In game three, Bemidji State jumped on the board first with a goal by Marlee Wheelhouse in the second period. The Sioux would then score twice, capitalizing once on the power play, to take a 2-1 lead. But before the end of the period, Lundquist scored a goal to tie the game. In the overtime period, at the 16:00 mark, Monique Lamoureux-Kolls would skate the puck from one end to the other and deke her way to a goal advancing the Sioux to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.
- The Beavers finished the season with the most conference wins in a single season (11) and the most home wins in a single season (9).
- They also finished the season with the best conference penalty-kill with a 90.4% efficiency.
- Erin Cody became the first player in school history to record multiple seasons of scoring at least 20 goals. Scoring at the 9:20 mark of the third period on Feb. 18 against Ohio State, Cody netted her 20th goal of the season, marking back-to-back seasons to put up 20 goals.
- The Beavers secured a sole fifth-place finish in the WCHA, the best in program history. Last season the Beavers finished tied for fifth in the WCHA, BSU has also finished fifth before in the WCHA, but never with an eight-team conference before.
- The Beavers set the school record for the best home record in a single season, going 9-5-2 (.652). The record surpasses the 1999-2000 season when that year's squad finished with a 8-7-2 (.592) home record.

### Minnesota Golden Gophers

- The No. 3-ranked Golden Gophers will compete at the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Friday and Saturday night at Ridder Arena. The Golden Gophers will play No. 2 seed Minnesota Duluth on Friday at 7:07 pm at Ridder Arena.
- Minnesota advanced to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF with a two-game sweep over Ohio State last weekend at Ridder Arena.
- In last Friday's game, the Gophers took a commanding 4-0 lead after Kelly Seeler, Jen Schoullis (2) and Sarah Erickson scored. OSU, however, responded back when Laura McIntosh scored two goals at 13:33 and again at 14:06 to put the game at 4-2 after two. Minnesota contained the comeback to just the two goals and earned the win.
- In last Saturday's playoff game, the Gophers again jumped out to an early lead after the first period. Erickson and Sarah Davis each scored a goal to go up, 2-0. OSU's Paige Semenza scored a shorthanded goal to put the game at 2-1 after two and Shannon Reilly scored at 6:21 in the third to tie the game up, 2-2. However, Amanda Kessel scored the game-winning goal at 16:51 to give the Gophers the win and a trip to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.
- Minnesota has won the WCHA tournament championship three times in 2002, 2004 and 2005. The Gophers have played in the WCHA

Championship game the last two years.

- In the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF last year, Minnesota won a double overtime game against Ohio State in the semifinals, 5-4. Laura May scored the game-winner at 3:31 into the double OT. Minnesota lost in the championship game, 3-2, to Minnesota Duluth. The Bulldogs jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first, but Sarah Erickson scored a goal late in the first to put the game at 2-1. UMD's Audrey Cournoyer scored 11:21 for the eventual game-winner. Erickson scored her second goal of the game at 16:28, also in the second, but Minnesota couldn't catch UMD and was handed the loss.
- Since Minnesota's loss to Wisconsin on Jan. 29, the Gopher line of Kessel, Erickson and Schoullis have led the Gophers' scoring driving with 42 points. In the past eight games, Kessel has contributed 16 points, followed by Erickson with 15 and Schoullis with 11. In that span, the trio also scored five power-play goals, two shorthanded goals and three game-winning goals.
- The NCAA has announced that the NCAA Women's Ice Hockey selection show will be broadcast on broadband via [www.NCAA.com](http://www.ncaa.com/) <<http://www.ncaa.com/>>. The shows will air, Sunday, March 6 at 6:30 pm ET (5:30 pm CT). During that time, the NCAA will announce the eight-team field and the home teams for the top seeds.
- The Golden Gophers are currently fourth in the PairWise Rankings, a tool generally used for the NCAA committee to determine the NCAA field in March.

### Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The No. 6 Bulldogs extended their NCAA second-best unbeaten streak to 11 games this past weekend with a two-game sweep over Minnesota State, Mankato in the first round of the WCHA playoffs.
- The Bulldogs, who are now 17-2 all-time in the first round of league playoffs, held the Mavericks scoreless in both games with a 3-0 win last Friday night and a 5-0 triumph on Saturday evening.
- Senior forward Elin Holmlov led the Maroon and Gold Friday night with two goals and an assist, Haley Irwin added two assists and Kim Martin made 20 saves to secure UMD's fourth-straight game with a shutout. The Bulldogs outshot the Mavericks 40-20, but went 0-of-4 on the power-play.
- Last Saturday night was more of the same for UMD, which blew open a 1-0 game in the second period with three goals, two coming just :26 seconds apart six minutes into action. Irwin and Holmlov each had three assists, and the Bulldogs had five different goal scorers in the contest. Sophomore netminder Jennifer Harss made 25 saves for UMD to improve her overall record to 8-2-3. The Bulldogs again outshot MSU 43-25, for a series total of 83-45, and went 1-of-7 on the power-play over both games.
- With the back-to-back shutouts, UMD has accrued a program record of 12 shutouts this season, surpassing the mark of 10 (reached by two Bulldog teams, most recently in 2007-08).
- UMD has not allowed a goal in 246:52 of action – 16:10 shy of the Bulldog program record for the longest shutout streak.
- UMD is 44-4-3 against the Mavericks over the past 12 years, and went 6-0 against MSU this past season, including ending on a 329:39 shutout streak.
- UMD is led in scoring by senior forward Holmlov, who has recorded 52 points (18g, 34) in 32 games played. Holmlov has now scored 170 points in her UMD career (67g, 103a) and ranks No. 6 all-time in Bulldog career scoring history. Her 103 career assists rank her No. 6 all-time, one assist short of tying Erika Holst in the No. 5 spot, and she is the first player since Caroline Ouellette to notch more than 100 helpers over her career. Ouellette did it between 2002-05.
- UMD – the second most stingy team in the nation – will play No. 3-ranked Minnesota Friday at 7:07 pm at Ridder Arena. The Bulldogs are 23-27-6 all-time against the Gophers, making Minnesota the only team in the NCAA that UMD is sub-.500 against. UMD went 2-1-1 this season

against Minnesota, and is 4-1-1 in its last six games with the Gophers. The Bulldogs defeated the Gophers last season in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championship game by a score of 3-2 back on March 7, 2010, and then went on to knock off the NCAA Frozen Four hosts two weeks later en route to winning the 2010 NCAA title.

## Minnesota State Mavericks

- The Mavericks finished the 2010-11 season with an 8-25-3 record overall, while going 7-20-1-0 in the WCHA.
- The Mavericks finished seventh in the WCHA standings with 22 points and were swept by sixth-rated and second-seeded Minnesota Duluth, dropping last Friday's contest, 3-0, then falling to the Bulldogs, 5-0, on Saturday.
- In game one, UMD scored the opening goal at 6:44 of the first period when Elin Holmlov cleaned up a rebound on MSU goaltender Alli Altmann's glove side. After a scoreless second frame, the Bulldogs added two goals in the third period – by senior defenseman Jocelyne Larocque at 2:49 and Holmlov at 8:19. Altmann allowed all three goals and stopped 37 saves, while Minnesota Duluth netminder Kim Martin earned the shut-out and 20 saves.
- Last Saturday, Minnesota Duluth jumped out to a 1-0 lead at 14:08 of the first frame on its first power-play chance of the game. Junior center Haley Irwin's shot was saved by Altmann, but sophomore Audrey Cournoyer put in the rebound for the Bulldog goal. Early in the second UMD added two goals just 26 seconds from each other. The first, scored by sophomore center Katie Wilson at the 6:24 mark, and the other was scored by sophomore defenseman Jessica Wong at the 6:50 mark. Minnesota Duluth increased its lead to 4-0 with a goal scored by Larocque at the 16:44 mark. UMD made it 5-0 at 9:18 of the third frame when freshman Noora Jaakkola's shot from the point was tipped over Altmann's shoulder glove side by sophomore forward Vanessa Thibault. Altmann finished with 38 saves and UMD sophomore goaltender Jennifer Harss earned the shut-out and 25 saves.
- MSU is now 0-3 against UMD in post-season action with the only other loss being a 10-1 loss in the 2000-01 season.
- Minnesota State is 2-16 in all-time playoff games. The two wins came in 2008-09 when they earned their first ever playoff game and playoff series win over St. Cloud State.
- Freshman forward Kathleen Rogan earned 12-9=21 over the course of the 2010-11 season, a team-best for the season.
- Sophomore forward Lauren Smith tallied 15 points (4-11=15), second most on the team.
- Senior forward Nina Tikkinen (5-7=12) and junior forward Moria O'Connor (6-6=12) earned 12 points tied for third-best on the squad.
- Rogan's 12 goals on the season was a team-best, while Smith's 11 assists was a season-high.

## North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- The Sioux are moving on to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF for the first time in program history after defeating Bemidji State in the opening round last weekend.
- It took the longest game in UND's history, a 3-2 victory over the Beavers in the rubber match of the series, when the Sioux were able to score 16 minutes into the extra frame to win their first playoff series. Monique Lamoureux-Kolls took the puck from her own end, skated through neutral ice, faked a shot to get around a defenseman and buried a backhand in front of the crease for the series-clinching goal. Jocelyne Lamoureux also scored in the game and was offensively UND's most consistent player even though not playing at 100-percent. Sophomore Mary Loken also scored for the Sioux.
- Both team's best players in the series were its netminders. UND backstop Stephanie Ney made a total of 83 saves in the three games with a .922 save percentage. BSU goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova made

some highlight-reel saves on the weekend in the losing effort. Ney also had two assists in game three, a single-game record for the Sioux.

- The win gave UND 20 victories overall on the season, another of many firsts on the year, improving them to 20-12-2.
- UND won the playoff series opener last Friday also by a 3-2 score, the first playoff win for the Sioux. Jocelyne Lamoureux scored shorthanded for the game's first goal before lone senior Stephanie Roy scored back-to-back goals for her second game-winner in as many games.
- The Sioux dropped the middle game against Bemidji State as Tomcikova completed the 3-0 shutout with 22 saves and BSU scoring two goals, including two on the power-play.
- The Sioux will play in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF opening game against top-seed and the nation's top-ranked team Wisconsin. The Sioux went winless in four attempts against the Badgers this year.

## Ohio State Buckeyes

- The Buckeyes concluded the 2010-11 season with a 3-2 loss to No. 3-ranked Minnesota Saturday and finished the season 14-19-3 overall and 8-19-3-3 in the WCHA after being swept in the best-of-three series at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn.
- Down 2-0, the Buckeyes battled back to even the score at 2-2 in the third period, but a late goal by Minnesota ended Ohio State's season. Minnesota would strike first with a goal from Sarah Erickson at 10:48 of the first period. Carding her 100th career point, Erickson connected with Amanda Kessel for the goal. The Gophers' Sarah Davis then capitalized on an Ohio State hooking penalty just over a minute later at 11:54 to bring the Gopher lead to two. Skating four-on-five, the Buckeyes were able to generate some offensive momentum when sophomore Paige Semenza fired a shorthanded goal from sophomore Minttu Tuominen at 5:14 of the second stanza. The Buckeyes held Minnesota scoreless in the period, as rookie goalie Lisa Steffes stopped all 15 shots on goal. Ohio State put 16 shots on net in the period. The Buckeyes would get on the board again to even the score at 6:21 in the third, when senior Shannon Reilly tallied her ninth goal of the season. The power-play goal was assisted by Tuominen who ended the game with two points. Racking up 15 shots on goal to the Buckeyes' six in the final period, the Gopher offense remained strong. At 16:51, Kessel fired the unassisted game-winner to send Minnesota to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF. Ohio State pulled Steffes for the extra attacker with 1:10 remaining in regulation but were unable to get a shot on net.
- Lisa Steffes concluded her rookie season with 35 saves and a record of 14-19-3. She ended the year with an Ohio State record 1,085 saves and leads the country in minutes played and saves.
- Both squads were able to capitalize on the power-play opportunity last weekend. The Buckeyes were 1-of-2, while the Gophers went 1-of-3. Ohio State tallied 32 shots on goal to Minnesota's 38.
- Ohio State opened its WCHA First Round Playoff series with a 4-2 loss to No. 3 Minnesota last Friday at Ridder Arena. Down 4-0, the No. 6-seed Buckeyes got two goals from Laura McIntosh in :33 seconds, but it was not enough to edge the No. 3-seed Golden Gophers who capitalized on two power play opportunities. The Gophers jumped on the board first with an unassisted goal by Kelly Seeler at 2:10. Holding the Scarlet and Gray to just six shots on goal in the first stanza, Minnesota's Jen Schoullis would then find the net on the power-play at 15:53. Minnesota continued its control of the puck out of the break with two more goals. Sarah Erickson tallied her 17th goal of the season at 6:49, while Schoullis converted another power play opportunity at 11:29. The Buckeyes were able cut the deficit in half when McIntosh fired back-to-back goals to swing the momentum in Ohio State's favor. Connecting with sophomores Tina Hollowell and Hokey Langan, McIntosh's first goal came at 13:33. The Waterloo, Ontario, native then scored again unassisted just 33 seconds later at 14:06. Ohio State continued to fight in the final period, but its efforts were not enough for the Gopher defense who held the Buckeyes scoreless to secure the win. Between the pipes, Steffes made 34 saves.

### St. Cloud State Huskies

- The Huskies fell twice to top-ranked Wisconsin, 9-3 and 5-1, in the first round of the WCHA playoffs, a best-of-three series at Verona, Wis.
- Senior defender Diana Karouzos had the Huskies' only goal of the contest as the Badgers ended the SCSU season by a score of 5-1 last Saturday, Feb. 26, swept the Huskies and advanced to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.
- Karouzos' goal, which was assisted by rookie forward Molli Mott on the power-play, marked the fourth of the senior's career.
- Senior netminder Ashley Nixon played in all 60 minutes last Saturday, which marked her final game in a Husky uniform. The Blaine, Minn., native backstopped the Huskies with 33 saves and completed her career at SCSU ranked second all-time with 2,988 career saves between the pipes.
- Last Friday night, sophomore Alex Nelson had two goals and rookie Julia Gilbert posted her sixth goal of the season in the Huskies' 9-3 loss to the Badgers.
- St. Cloud State completes the 2010-11 season with a 1-33-1 overall record (1-26-1-1 WCHA).

### Wisconsin Badgers

- The No. 1-ranked Badgers (32-2-2, 24-2-2-2 WCHA) travel to Minneapolis for the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF this weekend. The Badgers face No. 4 seed North Dakota (20-12-3, 16-10-2-0 WCHA) in Friday's first semifinal, set for 4:07 pm at Ridder Arena.
- The Badgers continue their quest for their fourth WCHA postseason title this weekend. UW earned the league's postseason crown in 2009, 2007 and 2006.
- Wisconsin advanced to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF by defeating No. 8 seed St. Cloud State in the best-of-three first round of the WCHA playoffs last weekend. The Badgers took the series with a 9-3 win and a 5-1 victory to advance to the league tournament. Brianna Decker led the Badgers with seven points in the series, marking her second-straight series totaling seven points. Meghan Duggan and Hilary Knight added six points apiece, and Carlyne Prevost recorded five points in the two games.
- Last Friday's playoff game saw Duggan lead UW with five points while Decker added four, including two power-play goals and her nation-leading 11th game-winning goal. Prevost provided a boost for UW in the third period, tallying two goals and one assist in the final 20 minutes to seal the 9-3 win.
- In last Saturday's 5-1 win over SCSU, Wisconsin got two goals from Knight, including the game-winner on the power-play just 9:04 into the game. Decker figured into the first three goals of the game, assisting two tallies before scoring on a solo effort at 4:44 of the second.
- Freshman goaltender Alex Rigsby earned both first round playoff wins for the Badgers. She made 18 saves last Friday and followed up with a 16-save performance Saturday night. Rigsby is now 22-1-2 on the year.
- The Badgers are currently on a 22-game unbeaten streak, posting a 20-0-2 record since losing to Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 28, 2010.
- Wisconsin owns a 30-2-0 all-time record against North Dakota. UW swept North Dakota in two regular season series, winning 4-3 and 6-2 on the road (Dec. 4-5) and picking up 5-0 and 8-4 wins at the Kohl Center (Jan. 28-29). UW is undefeated (4-0-0) against the Fighting Sioux in the postseason.
- Two Badgers are on the verge of scoring milestones. Decker is one point shy of the 100-career point mark, and Knight is four points away from reaching 200 career points.
- Knight is currently riding a 20-game point streak, posting 48 points from Dec. 10-Feb. 26. Her streak ties the second-longest streak all-time, a record held by Decker (Nov. 6, 2010-Feb. 4, 2011) and Meghan Hunter (Oct. 14, 2000 to Jan. 12, 2001).

## WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5. Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- f) Shootout wins used during the regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
