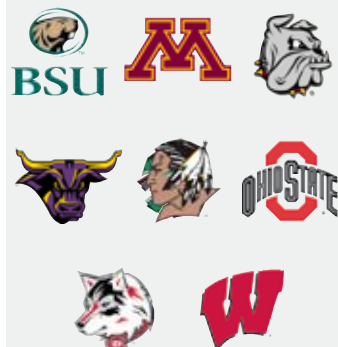

Five WCHA Teams Ranked in National Top 10 ... UM, UW Tied at No. 3, UMD No. 5, UND No. 7/8, OSU No. 10; Three Conference Series Set for Weekend of Oct. 15-17

North Dakota's Split with National Champion UMD Soars Sioux into Elite with Bulldogs, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Ohio State; Bemidji State Opens New Arena Friday by Hosting Top-Rated Mercyhurst; League Series this Weekend Have St. Cloud State at Ohio State, Minnesota State at Minnesota Duluth, North Dakota Visiting Minnesota

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, which has produced the women's national champion in each of the last 11 seasons, has five of its eight-member teams ranked in this week's two national polls. The USCHO.com Division 1 Women's Hockey Poll for Oct. 12 has Minnesota and Wisconsin tied at No. 3, Minnesota Duluth at No. 5, North Dakota at No. 8 and Ohio State at No. 10. The USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's College Hockey Poll for Oct. 12 has Minnesota at No. 3, Wisconsin at No. 4, Minnesota Duluth at No. 5, North Dakota at No. 7 and Ohio State at No. 10. It is believed to be the first time five WCHA teams have ever been ranked among the top 10 in the nation at one time.

The show of national dominance comes after the first full week of competition, a weekend where North Dakota split a home series with defending national champion and WCHA champion Minnesota Duluth. UMD (1-1-0, 1-1-0 WCHA) won the opener in Grand Forks last Friday (Oct. 8) as former Swedish Olympic goaltender Kim Martin made 23 saves and earned her 12 career shutout in a 4-0 decision before 2,366 fans at Ralph Engelstad Arena. On Sunday (Oct. 10) Jocelyne Lamoureux, who played with the U.S. Olympic team last season, had a goal and an assist and Stephanie Ney made 30 saves to lead North

Wisconsin (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) jumped into first place in the WCHA by sweeping visiting Bemidji State (1-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) twice at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis. Carlyne Prevost's three goals led the Badgers to a 7-1 victory over the Beavers in the series opener Oct. 8 and Becca Ruegsegger made 11 saves and recorded her second shutout of the season as UW took a hard-fought 2-0 decision from BSU on Sunday (Oct. 10).

In non-conference play last weekend, Ohio State (2-0-0) opened their 2010-11 regular season with a pair of 4-1 victories over Robert Morris in Pittsburgh as Natalie Spooner had a five point weekend (two goals and an assist last Friday and a goal and an assist last Saturday). Minnesota State (1-0-1), meanwhile, opened their season with a 3-2 home ice victory over Niagara behind two goals by Moira O'Connor. The Mavericks and Purple Eagles then teams skated to a 0-0 scoreless tie last Saturday. In single non-conference games this past weekend, visiting Wayne State beat St. Cloud State (0-3-0) 3-0 last Friday and then fell to Minnesota (3-0-0) 1-0 on Saturday as Amanda Kessel had the game's lone goal and Noora Raty had her second shutout.

St. Cloud State and Ohio State open their respective conference seasons this weekend in a head-to-head series Friday and Saturday (Oct. 15-16) at the OSU Ice Rink in Columbus, Ohio, while North Dakota plays its third straight nationally-ranked team when it travels to Minnesota for a Friday-Saturday series which features the return of Lamoureux and her twin sister Monique to Ridder Arena, where they played two seasons ago. Minnesota State opens league play when it travels to Minnesota Duluth for a Saturday-Sunday series.

And it will be a big weekend in Bemidji when the Bemidji State Beavers move into their new home Friday and Saturday against top-ranked Mercyhurst. The Beavers' Friday afternoon game at 2:07 pm will be the first hockey game played at the sparkling new Bemidji Regional Event Center.

WCHA Continues Shootouts; Implements Three-Point Wins in League Standings

receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings will show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.)

A team receives three points for winning a game in overtime (in regulation or overtime) and one point for an overtime tie. NCAA rules do not recognize shootout wins and for purposes to figure out a team's RPI, a game which ends tied after 65 minutes and prior to a shootout is recorded as a tie.

To reiterate the new WCHA women's league policy: Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since it's founding in 1999, released it's 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258) and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play it's first game in the new building on Oct. 15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line

to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field."

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (exh).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Bemidji State Beavers

- The Beavers open a new rink and host top-ranked Mercyhurst on Friday and Saturday, with game times set for 2:07 p.m. both days. Friday's game will be the first-ever hockey game played in the new Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258).
- Last year the Beavers traveled to Erie, Pa. to take on the Lakers, but lost both games by scores of 4-1 and 6-1. Erin Johnson scored both the goals against Mercyhurst last season and both came on the power-play.
- All-time the Beavers have only defeated the Lakers once, 2-1 in Erie on Oct. 9, 2004. The series belongs to Mercyhurst as BSU has a record of 1-9-2 against the Lakers.
- Opening conference play last weekend, the Beavers dropped two games to No. 5 Wisconsin in Madison. The first game last Friday saw the Badgers out-skate the Beavers to a 7-1 final score. In the following game on Sunday, the Beavers put together a better production, but fell to Wisconsin 2-0.
- BSU goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova made 70 saves in the Wisconsin series last weekend. Tomcikova has made 97 saves so far in three appearances this season. She picked up the team's first win in a 3-0 shutout over host Wayne State on Oct. 1. She turned away 27 shots, including 12 in the third period, to record her ninth career shutout. For her efforts in the Oct. 1 game, she was honored as the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 6. Winning her eighth career weekly honor, Tomcikova has won more player of the week awards than any other Bemidji State women's hockey player. The previous mark was set at seven by former goaltender Emily Brookshaw.
- Annie Bauerfeld had the lone goal for the visiting Beavers at Wisconsin, scoring on the power-play. Assisting on her goal was Erin Cody and Montana Vichorek. The goal was the first goal scored of the weekend, as BSU held a 1-0 lead over the Badgers going into the second period in Friday's contest.
- So far this season the Bemidji State defense has blocked 61 shots, including 38 last weeked at Wisconsin.

Minnesota Golden Gophers

- The Golden Gophers played an exhibition game and a regular season game this past weekend, earning two wins. The Golden Gophers earned a come-from-behind victory over the Minnesota Whitecaps, 3-2, last Friday and followed with a 1-0 win over Wayne State last Saturday. Minnesota is now 3-0-0 on the season.
- In last Friday's game, both teams went scoreless after the first period. Minnesota Whitecaps player and Boston College alum Allie Thunstrom scored a goal at 10:52 in the second to break the tie. Jen Schoullis knotted the game at 1-1. However, the Whitecaps responded when UMD alum Saara Tuominen scored at 18:40 with a single assist from Thunstrom. The Gophers added the pressure in the third when it outshot the Whitecaps, 13-4 in the third period and netted two goals for the win. Sarah Davis scored at 17:50 in the third on a rebound attempt from Kelly Terry. Schoullis scored her second goal of the game at 18:53 on the third when she placed it five-hole for the game-winning tally. Alyssa Grogan was in net for the Gophers and had 20 saves in the game. She had nine saves in the first, seven in the second and four in the third.
- In last Saturday's game, Amanda Kessel scored a goal at 5:38 in the first period and Noora Rätty recorded her second shutout of the season to lift the Gophers to a 1-0 win against Wayne State. Rätty stopped nine shots in the first, seven in the second and six in the third for 22 saves.
- With the shutout over Wayne State, the Gophers have not allowed a goal so far in the 2010-11 season, marking 180 minutes. In fact, dating back to last year, the Maroon and Gold have not allowed a goal in 200:45 minutes played. The last Gopher goal allowed came at 19:15 in the second

period of the 2010 NCAA Frozen Four.

- Minnesota opens the WCHA season against North Dakota this weekend, Oct. 15-16, with a 6:07 p.m. game on Friday and a 4:07 p.m. contest on Saturday.
- Minnesota enters its 11th season of WCHA competition this weekend. Entering the conference season, Minnesota is 219-47-22, dating back to the start of the WCHA Women's League in 1999-2000. Under head coach Brad Frost, the Gophers hold a 62-13-9 record in the past three years.

Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The No. 5-ranked Bulldogs split with No. 8 North Dakota in Grand Forks last weekend in the Bulldogs first WCHA action of the season.
- Then ranked No. 1, UMD picked up a 4-0 shutout behind the goaltending of senior Kim Martin on Friday (Oct. 8). Martin, who earned her 12th career shutout, saw four different Bulldogs score goals in the win.
- Sunday was a different matter altogether for UMD, who picked up 24 minutes worth of penalties enroute to the first Bulldog loss in North Dakota against the Sioux in program history. The 4-2 setback for UMD came despite outshooting UND, 32-19. Haley Irwin and Vanessa Thibault had goals in the loss.
- Nine players notched points over the weekend, including four that had two or more.
- Three players are sitting at three points with just two games played – Irwin (2g, 1a), Jessica Wong (1g, 2a) and Jocelyne Larocque (1g, 2a).
- Martin's 12th career shutout last Friday also marks her 54th career win at UMD.
- With her 292nd win last Friday, head coach Shannon Miller is just eight wins shy of reaching her 300th career win.
- The Bulldogs face Minnesota State in WCHA action this weekend at the DECC. UMD is 38-4-3 all-time against the Mavericks, and went 3-1 against MSU last season.
- Larocque became the No. 3 scoring defenseman in UMD history last weekend with 69 total points after picking up three points – including a game-winning goal – against North Dakota. The St. Anne, Manitoba native helped the Bulldogs shutout the Sioux last Friday night, scoring the game-winning goal on the power-play at 10:36 of the first period. Larocque then helped the Bulldogs hold UND to 0-of-5 on the man-advantage to help preserve the first shutout of the season.

Minnesota State Mavericks

- The Mavericks opened the season and defeated Niagara last Friday night, 3-2, but dropped Saturday's game in a shootout.
- Last Friday, the visiting Purple Eagles took advantage of an MSU penalty midway through the first period as freshman winger Kaleigh Chippy beat MSU netminder Alli Altmann stick side for a power-play goal. Maverick center Moira O'Connor scored the first of her two tallies with the equalizer, beating NU goalie Jenni Bauer with an extra skater. The power-play goal came at 10:31 in the second period. Linemates Emmi Leinonen and Kathleen Rogan both assisted on the score. Niagara recaptured the lead late in the second frame when NU's Kristen Richards beat Altmann. Midway through the third, Lauren Smith answered, tallying a short-handed goal for the Mavericks, tying the game at two. The momentum continued to sway towards MSU as O'Connor recorded her second score of the night to take a 3-2 lead. O'Connor's game-winning goal came off a nice set up pass from Rogan. Nina Tikkinen also recorded an assist on the play.
- In last Saturday's game, the two teams went scoreless through three periods and an overtime period and went to a shootout. The shootout went to the sixth round before someone was able to find the back of the net and that person was Niagara freshman Chelsea Witwicke. MSU had a chance to answer but Tikkinen's shot was denied, giving the Mavericks an overtime loss.
- Rogan, a freshman forward, owns a team-best +2.
- O'Connor has two goals, a team-high.
- Altmann owns all of the minutes in net so far this season, with 125:00, and sports a 2.00 goals-against average, a .941 save percentage (32 saves), and a 1-0-1-0 record.

North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- The Sioux opened league play this past weekend with a split against top-ranked and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth. It was the second split of the season for the Sioux who improved to 2-2-0 (1-1-0-0 WCHA).
- Last Friday, Bulldogs' goaltender Kim Martin proved to be the difference as the Sioux were held scoreless for the first time this season. UMD outshot the Sioux, 32-23, but Martin and the Bulldogs' defense were able to hold the Sioux 0-for-5 on the power-play and stop multiple breakaway attempts. Sisters Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and Jocelyne Lamoureux combined for 13 of UND's 23 shots while Jorid Dagfinrud made 32 saves in the game while allowing the four goals. The Bulldogs went 2-for-3 on the power-play.
- Decorated in pink tape to honor breast cancer awareness in the series finale on Sunday, roles were reversed as the Sioux took advantage of their scoring opportunities starting with Lamoureux scoring her third of the campaign and the game's first goal only :24 seconds into the opening frame (the goal tied a school record for fastest goal to start a game). Making up a top-line of all North Dakota born forwards, Allison Parizek and Lamoureux-Kolls would also score in the game, and combined with Lamoureux's goal, made up a "hat trick" by the starting forwards. Sara Dagenais also scored for the Sioux which would turn into the game-winning goal at 16:15 of the second period. UND netminder Stephanie Ney made her first start of the season and stopped 30-of-32 shots faced. Ney would also pick up an assist on Lamoureux-Kolls' power-play goal in the third stanza. In a complete team win, the Sioux had 19 shots from 11 different players and no skater had a negative plus/minus including returning points leader Alyssa Wiebe getting her first points of the season with two assists.
- The win over Minnesota Duluth marks the second time in the past two seasons that the Sioux have beaten a number one-ranked team. The first time was against Wisconsin in 2009.
- The win over UMD on Oct. 10 also marked the first time that the Sioux have beaten the Bulldogs at home and only the third win against them ever.

- The Sioux will be on the road this weekend for a highly anticipated match up against the Lamoureux's former team and third-ranked Minnesota on Friday and Saturday at 6:07 p.m. and 4:07 p.m., respectively. It will mark the third-straight opponent for the Sioux to open the 2010-11 season ranked in the top 10 and higher ranked than the Sioux.

Ohio State Buckeyes

- The Buckeyes opened the 2010-11 season with a sweep of Robert Morris on Oct. 8-9, winning both games by scores of 4-1 Friday and Saturday at RMU Island Sports Center in Pittsburgh.
- Ohio State has swept Robert Morris in its first two meetings starting last season (4-0-0). The Buckeyes have held the Colonials to a single goal in each game and outscored them 18-4.
- The Buckeyes are 13-6-3 all-time in the opening series of a season.
- This was the first of three series Ohio State will play against teams from the College Hockey America conference. The other two series will be in Columbus vs. Syracuse (Oct. 29-30) and vs. Wayne State (Dec. 30-31).
- In the first game at Robert Morris, junior assistant captains Laura McIntosh and Natalie Spooner each scored twice – McIntosh in the first period and Natalie Spooner in the third. They both added an assist for three-point games. Sophomore Hokey Langan also had a multiple-point game with two assists.
- Spooner added another goal and assist last Saturday as the Buckeyes scored four goals in the second to pull away for the win. Senior captain Christina Mancuso, senior defenseman Shannon Reilly and Langan also scored.
- McIntosh had another assist Saturday for a four-point series. She also extended her point streak to 10 games (carrying over from last season).
- Spooner has at least one point in each of the last 17 series with her five points vs. Robert Morris.
- McIntosh moved into 10th place in the Ohio State career point rankings with 88 and Spooner stands 12th with 79 points.
- Making the first starts of her career, freshman goalie Lisa Steffes backstopped the Buckeyes to the sweep at RMU by allowing only one goal in each game. She made 17 saves last Friday and 23 saves last Saturday, stopping 40 of 42 shots faced in the series for a .952 save percentage.
- For the second-consecutive season, Ohio State started a freshman in nets for the season-opener.
- The Buckeyes' power-play was 2-of-8 and penalty-kill was a perfect 7-of-7.
- Up next, Ohio State returns to Columbus for its WCHA and home-opener against St. Cloud State, Oct. 15-16. Games begin at 7:07 p.m. this Friday and 4:07 p.m. Saturday at the OSU Ice Rink.

St. Cloud State Huskies

- The Huskies (0-3-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) fell 3-0 to visiting Wayne State last Friday.
- The Huskies, who played their fastest game in school history against the Warriors (1:43), kept Wayne State off the scoreboard in the first frame, despite being out-shot 12-6 in the initial period. Ashley Nixon fell to 0-2-0 on the season after stopping 27 of the Warriors' 30 shots. Junior forward Brittany Toor and rookie Julia Gilbert led the Huskies with four shots apiece against WSU.
- St. Cloud State sophomore forwards Kylie Lane and Alex Nelson (Andover) each netted a goal in a 4-2 exhibition game loss to the Minnesota Whitecaps on Saturday, Oct. 9, at the National Hockey Center.
- The Huskies welcomed three former players back last Saturday. Those players included Sammy Nixon (2005-09), Megan McCarthy (2005-09) and Meaghan Pezon (2006-10).
- In 20 minutes of action on Oct. 9, SCSU's starting netminder, Tayler VanDenakker, stopped eight of the Whitecaps' 11 shots. Goalie Anna Donlan had a strong showing in the second frame for the Huskies as she stopped all eight Whitecaps shots in 20 minutes. Nixon then backstopped the Huskies with four saves in 20 minutes of action against the Whitecaps. The Huskies out-shot the Minnesota Whitecaps 31-24 in the loss.
- St. Cloud State will now head to Columbus on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 15-16, to open WCHA action against Ohio State. SCSU holds a slight advantage in the all-time series over the Buckeyes, 23-22-6, dating back to Oct. 22, 1999.

Wisconsin Badgers

- The Badgers are off this weekend and have two weeks to prepare for their Oct. 22-23 WCHA series with Ohio State at the Kohl Center.
- Wisconsin (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) owns a 39-7-6 all-time record against Ohio State. The Badgers are 2-4-0 in their last six meetings with the Buckeyes, splitting the four regular season games last season before dropping two games to OSU in the WCHA first round best-of-three series in 2009-10.
- With a pair of WCHA victories over Bemidji State last weekend, UW improved to 202-61-27 all-time in WCHA games for a .743 winning percentage.
- Wisconsin won its league-opener vs BSU last Friday, 7-1, before following up with a 2-0 victory over the Beavers last Sunday to complete the series sweep. The Badgers outshot BSU 79-22 in the series.
- After trailing 1-0 at the first intermission of last Friday's game, the Badgers scored seven unanswered goals to skate away with their third consecutive win. Led by junior Carlyne Prevost's three-goal hat trick, 10 different Badgers recorded points. Freshman Brittany Ammerman added two goals, while senior Meghan Duggan and junior Brooke Ammerman each tallied two assists.
- Last Sunday, the Badgers were led by sophomore Breann Frykas, who assisted on the game-winning goal and scored her second goal of the season to give UW the 2-0 lead midway through the third period. Prevost scored her second-straight game-winning goal to cap her four-goal weekend.
- Sophomore Becca Ruegsegger and freshman Alex Rigsby again split time in goal with Rigsby getting the nod last Friday before Ruegsegger posted her second shutout of the season on Saturday. Both have now made two starts on the season while combining for 42 saves with a 0.25 goals-against average, a .977 saves percentage and three shutouts.
- Prevost's hat trick in UW's 7-1 victory over Bemidji State on Oct. 8 marked her second career hat trick as a Badger. Her first goal of the game marked the game-winner when she beat BSU goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova five-hole on a shorthanded goal at the 9:18 mark of the second period. Less than six minutes later, Prevost tallied her second-straight goal. She netted her third goal off an assist from Duggan with just :50 seconds remaining in the game..

- The sister duo of junior Brooke Ammerman and freshman Brittany Ammerman teamed up on two goals for the Badgers against Bemidji State. On Oct. 8, the sisters joined forces on Wisconsin's sixth goal when Brooke intercepted the puck from the Bemidji State defense and centered it to younger sister Brittany, who flipped the puck high and knocked it past Tomcikova at the 18:04 mark of the third period. The sisters also set up UW's second goal in game two of the series on Oct. 10. Brittany Ammerman played the puck up the boards on the left side to junior Brooke Ammerman, who then found Frykas on BSU's blue line. Frykas skated up through the slot and solved Tomcikova to put UW up 2-0 at the 10:01 mark of the third period.
