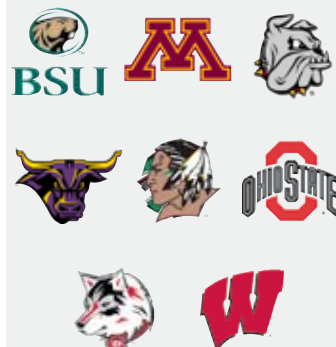

OPENING WEEKEND SHOCKER

NORTH DAKOTA BLANKS DEFENDING NCAA CHAMPION WISCONSIN IN MADISON TO GET SPLIT; MINNESOTA TAKES TWO FROM SYRACUSE WHILE THREE TEAMS HALVE OPENING SERIES AND BEMIDJI SWEEP BY MERCYHURST; UPCOMING WEEKEND OF OCT. 9-11 FINDS BADGERS FACING BSU TWICE IN NORTHERN MINNESOTA, GOPHERS VISITING OHIO STATE AND MINNESOTA DULUTH HOSTING ST. CLOUD STATE IN LEAGUE PLAY; ERIC MEANS DEBUTS AS MINNESOTA STATE COACH AT MAINE; NORTH DAKOTA PLAYS TEAM USA IN WARROAD, MINN.

MADISON, Wis. – Defending Western Collegiate Hockey Association champion Minnesota recorded a pair of non-conference victories over Syracuse while North Dakota spoiled defending national champion Wisconsin's party by shocking the Badgers, 2-0, in a pair of highlights which got the 2009-10 women's season off to a running start Oct. 2-3.

The Sioux came away with what is probably their biggest win in program history last Friday night as they went into the Kohl Center and stunned top-ranked Wisconsin, 2-0, on the night the Badgers hung their 2009 national championship banner. Freshman Ashley Furia scored her first collegiate goal in the first period and senior Alex Williams added a second period score while redshirt freshman goalie Jorid Dagfinrud made 29 saves in earning the shutout in her first collegiate start. Last Saturday, Wisconsin used two goals by preseason pick for WCHA Rookie of the Year, Brianna Decker, and the shutout goaltending of freshman Becca Ruegsegger to gain a split against UND with a 3-0 victory. Ruegsegger had 18 saves.

In non-conference series last weekend, Minnesota took two victories from Syracuse in Minneapolis as Chelsey Jones scored a power-play, game-winning goal with 2:58 remaining to help the Gophers to a 4-3 triumph last Friday and then continued her success last Sunday when she scored two goals and

assisted on another for a three-point game aiding the Gophers to a series sweep.

St. Cloud State split a home series with Niagara, winning 4-3 and losing 3-1; Ohio State tied Boston University, 1-1 and 4-4, in Boston, while Minnesota Duluth split with Robert Morris, winning 5-2 last Friday behind a goal and three assists from Laura Fridfinnson, and losing 4-1 last Saturday. Bemidji State went on the road to Erie, Pennsylvania and lost twice to Mercyhurst, 4-1 and 6-1.

There are three conference series this weekend – Oct. 9-11 – as Minnesota plays at Ohio State Friday and Saturday night, Wisconsin plays Bemidji State in Coleraine, Minn., on Friday and then the teams play the series final Sunday afternoon in Bemidji, while Minnesota Duluth hosts St. Cloud State Saturday night and Sunday afternoon.

In non-conference play this weekend, Maine hosts Minnesota State Friday night and Saturday afternoon in Eric Means' debut as the Mavericks' head coach and North Dakota plays the U.S. National Team on Saturday at 7:00 pm in Warroad, Minn. in the second game of Team USA's Qwest Tour.

Since the inception of the NCAA Women's Frozen Four in 2001, three different WCHA teams have won the national championship. The Badgers extended the string and kept the WCHA's national title streak alive in 2008-09 when they won their third national title by defeating Mercyhurst, 4-0, in Boston in the NCAA title game last March. The victory capped a memorable season for the WCHA, which placed three teams in the Frozen Four including league champion Minnesota, traditional power Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin, which won the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the league playoff championships.

Last season's success marked the tenth straight national championship won by a WCHA-member institution. Minnesota Duluth won the first three NCAA titles in 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2008. The Badgers have won national crowns in 2006, 2007 in addition to last season. Minnesota took home the titles in 2004 and 2005, and the Golden Gophers also won the 2000 AWCHA Div. 1 national collegiate championship, prior to the inception of the NCAA tournament, giving the league nine straight national championships in nine years.

Since this season will be contested during an Olympic year, the race for the league title may be more wide open than ever. There are two new coaches – Eric Means moves from being a men's assistant at Minnesota State, Mankato to leading the Mavericks' women and Tracey DeKeyser takes over at Wisconsin for Mark Johnson, who is taking a sabbatical to coach the U.S. Olympic team.

The battle for the 2008-09 WCHA regular season championship will again consist of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. During the course of the season, there will be a total of eight weekends that will consist of all eight member teams engaged in WCHA play. They are Oct. 16-18, Dec. 11-13, Jan. 15-17, Jan. 22-23, Jan. 29-31, Feb. 5-8, Feb. 12-13 and Feb. 19-20. The league schedule concludes Feb. 20.

The WCHA family will watch the 2010 Winter Olympics with great pride, knowing that many familiar faces will dot various Olympic team rosters. There are 17 underclassmen among the 36 former WCHA stars who are on national team rosters as of Sept. 25. Here is the list of WCHA players, underclassmen and alums, who hope to play in Vancouver in the Winter Games in February. DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPION WISCONSIN

PICKED TO WIN WCHA IN 2009-10

COACHES PICK DEFENDING WCHA CHAMP MINNESOTA SECOND, UMD THIRD IN PRESEASON POLL; UW'S AMMERMAN IS PRE- SEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR, UW'S DECKER IS PRE-SEASON ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

MADISON, Wis. – Defending national champion University of Wisconsin is without its head coach and many familiar faces, but the Badgers are still the preseason pick to win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association women's title, according to a poll of league-member head coaches.

The Badgers collected six first place votes and 48 total points in the poll of the eight head coaches and edged out defending WCHA regular season champion University of Minnesota, which placed second with 43 points and two first place votes. The University of Minnesota Duluth, with 38 points, was selected to finish third. All three of those teams qualified for the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Frozen Four last season.

St. Cloud State University was picked to finish fourth in the final regular season standings, followed by Ohio State University in fifth, University of North Dakota in sixth, Minnesota State University, Mankato in seventh place and Bemidji State University in eighth.

Wisconsin's sophomore forward Brooke Ammerman (River Vale, NJ) received five votes and is the head coaches' pick to be preseason player of the year in the WCHA. Ohio State sophomore forward Natalie Spooner (Scarborough, ON) is the pick of two coaches for player of year and Minnesota Duluth senior forward Saara Tuominen (Ylojarvi, Finland) also received a vote.

Wisconsin's Brianna Decker (Dousman, WI), a forward, received six votes and is the coaches' choice as preseason conference rookie of the year while Ohio State forward Hokey Langan (Chatham, ON) and Minnesota Duluth goaltender Jennifer Harss (Rieden, Germany) each received a vote.

With the 2010 Winter Olympics taking place in February, many WCHA-member team rosters are juggled this season. Wisconsin coach Mark Johnson has taken a sabbatical to coach Team USA and his job at UW has been filled by veteran assistant coach Tracey DeKeyser. Johnson's 22-member Team USA roster is filled with 15 current and former WCHA players, including UW's Hilary Knight and Meghan Duggan and North Dakota's Monique and Jocelyn Lamoureux who are all underclassmen. Currently there are 33 current and former WCHA players listed on national team rosters and planning to play in the Winter Games in Vancouver, B.C. in February.

Eric Means, who takes over the coaching duties at Minnesota State, Mankato this season, joins DeKeyser as a new voice behind the bench in the WCHA.

WCHA MEMBER TEAM WEEKLY NOTEBOOKS

BEMIDJI STATE

- The Beavers will host the defending national champions No. 4 Wisconsin Badgers this weekend.
- The Saturday game will be played in Coleraine, Minn., while the game Sunday will be played at the John S. Glas Fieldhouse in Bemidji.
- The two games played this weekend will be the 43rd and 44th meetings between the two teams and Wisconsin holds the advantage in the series going 1-39-2 against BSU.
- The Badgers have won the last six games against the Beavers, with the Beavers getting a 0-0 tie against the Badgers on Nov. 24, 2007.
- The only win against Wisconsin was on Dec. 9, 2001 at Madison.
- Beaver goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova has made one appearance this season gathering 38 saves on 44 shots. She has a .905 saves percentage on the season while recording a 4.00 goals-against average.
- The trio of Erin Cody (2a), Erin Johnson (2g), and Annie Bauerfeld (2a) have accounted for all the offensive production so far for the Beavers.



MINNESOTA

- The Golden Gophers opened the 2009-10 season with a pair of wins against non-conference opponent, Syracuse, last Friday and Sunday. The Golden Gophers earned a 4-3 win Friday and followed with a 4-1 win Sunday en route to a series sweep.
- The Gophers open WCHA play this weekend at Ohio State, Friday and Saturday.
- In the season opener vs Syracuse on Oct. 2, Minnesota scored its first goal of the season at 13:42 in the first when Emily West scored an unassisted goal. West scored her second goal of the game at 5:03 in the second period with a rebound attempt. The Orange's Julie Rising scored a power-play goal at 9:13 in the second, bringing the game to 2-1 after two. Syracuse tied the game early in the third period when Janelle Malcolm scored a power-play goal. Brittany Francis helped the Gophers re-gain the lead just :36 seconds later. Malcolm scored her second goal of the period at 9:30 when she scored on a rebound attempt. Minnesota, however, took advantage of its third power-play attempt at 17:02 in the third when Chelsey Jones tipped in a Kelly Seeler slapshot. The Friday win marked the 12th time in school history the Gophers opened their season with a win. The only time in school history that the Gophers did not win the first game of the season came last year in a loss to Robert Morris.
- This past Sunday (Oct. 4) vs Syracuse, Anne Schleper and Jones each scored two goals to secure the series sweep. Minnesota got on the board twice in the first period when Schleper scored back-to-back power-play goals :50 seconds in between each other at 7:03 and 7:53. Syracuse cut the Gophers' lead to one when Megan Skelly took advantage of a Minnesota turnover at 11:03 in the second. However, Jones put the game back to a two-goal lead when she scored her second goal in two days at 15:29 in the second. Jones added an additional goal at 18:39 in the third period. Noora Rätty played in her first collegiate game on Sunday. She had six saves in the first, six in the second and five in the third for a three-period total of 17. Minnesota went 2-for-5 on the power-play, while holding the Orange scoreless in five attempts, including a five-on-three power-play.



MINNESOTA DULUTH

- The Bulldogs split over the Oct. 2-4 weekend with Robert Morris at the DECC, posting a 5-2 triumph last Saturday night before suffering a 4-1 setback last Sunday afternoon.
- Junior forward Laura Fridfinnson scored a goal and added three assists in last Saturday's grand opening, while rookie forward Jessica Wong added the final two tallies of the contest. UMD outshot the Colonials, 52-16.
- Last Saturday's win marks the seventh-season opener success in a row for the Bulldogs. Robert Morris handed UMD its first loss to a College Hockey American opponent in program history last Sunday afternoon. The Bulldogs, who are now 8-1-2 against CHA foes, outshot the Colonials 46-23, but only senior forward Emmanuelle Blais found the back of the net in UMD's 4-1 defeat. UMD was 0-of-5 on the power-play Sunday and 0-of-8 in the series, but outshot Robert Morris 98-46 during the two outings.
- Laura Fridfinnson leads all UMD scorers after her four-point weekend, and is now averaging 2.00 points per game, good enough to rank her second in the NCAA.
- Emmanuelle Blais owns a two-game scoring streak after notching points in both skates (a goal and an assist).
- Jessica Wong's two-goal debut last Saturday night is only the second time ever that a Bulldog rookie has scored two or more goals in their first collegiate game. Erika Holst tallied a hat-trick in her first UMD outing, all the way back on Oct. 8, 1999 against Wisconsin in Madison.
- The Bulldogs will host WCHA rival St. Cloud State this upcoming weekend. UMD is 36-8-2 all-time against the Huskies, but last season went just 1-2-1 against SCSU, including a split in Duluth on Jan. 30-31. 2008-09 marked the first time the Bulldogs had ever lost twice to the Huskies in the same year.



MINNESOTA STATE

- The Mavericks opened the season on Friday, Oct. 2, taking on the Minnesota Whitecaps in an exhibition in Mankato. The two teams took the game to overtime after a 2-2 tie in regulation, but neither team could capitalize and bury the puck for a victory. Just 4:55 into the game, the Whitecaps posted the first goal of the game from Allie Sanchez. Freshman forward Lauren Smith knotted the game, but the tie did not last long as the Whitecaps' Chelsey Brodt capitalized on nice passes from Jessica Koizumi and Jinelle Zaugg to take the 2-1 lead into the second period. MSU killed off five power-plays and scored the game-tying goal from senior forward Ashley Young. Minnesota State entered the overtime period on a power-play, however the Mavericks could not put the puck in the net and the overtime ended in a tie. The game then went to a shootout and was decided by a Whitecaps shootout goal from Erin Keys. Statistically, the Mavericks out shot the Whitecaps 53 to 25. Sophomore forward Jenna Peterson and Lisa Edman led the squad in shots with seven apiece. Sophomore goaltender Alli Altmann played the first two periods, giving up two goals and earning 13 saves. Junior Paige Thunder finished out the game earning 10 saves in the third and overtime periods.
- The Mavericks start non-conference action this weekend, Friday and Saturday, October 9 and 10, when they travel to Orono, Maine to face the University of Maine Black Bears at 7:00 pm ET and 2:00 pm ET.

NORTH DAKOTA

- The Fighting Sioux will face the U.S. Women's National Team in exhibition action Saturday, Oct. 10, with a scheduled 7:00 pm start in Warroad, Minn. The Sioux will face teammates Jocelyne and Monique Lamoureux.
- UND opened the regular season with a series split against top-ranked and defending national champion Wisconsin Badgers on Oct. 2-3. The Sioux came away with what is probably their biggest win in program history last Friday as they went into the Kohl Center and shutout the Badgers 2-0 on the night they hung their national championship banner. Freshman Ashley Furia scored her first-collegiate goal at 19:22 of the first period. What was the eventual game-winning goal, Furia put a wrist shot on net, skated around a defender and chipped it over the goaltender. Sara Dagenais and Ashley Holmes assisted on the goal. Senior Alex Williams scored a cushion goal for the Sioux late in the second period as with a top-shelf snipe far side.
- Redshirt freshman Jorid Dagfinrud made 62 saves in the series at Wisconsin with 29 of them coming in last Friday's shutout, her first collegiate start.
- The shutout win broke Wisconsin's 29-game winning streak and the shutout loss at home was the first time for Wisconsin since Minnesota Duluth defeated the Badgers 2-0 on Nov. 2, 2005.
- Last Saturday, the Sioux tried to weather the storm but the Badgers answered back with a shutout of their own. Preseason pick for WCHA Rookie of the Year, Brianna Decker, scored two goals. Alyssa Wiebe let the team with seven shots-on-goal in the series while both Kelly Lewis and Mary Loken had six.
- North Dakota was ranked 11th and received 14 points in the USCHO.com poll this week.



OHIO STATE

- The Buckeyes opened their 2009-10 season with a nonconference road series at No. 10 Boston University, Oct. 2-3. Ohio State came from behind twice in the third period to tie the Terriers in overtime 1-1 last Friday and 4-4 last Saturday. It was the first time in the program's 11 years the Buckeyes opened the season with a tied game. The series also marked the first time OSU tied a team twice since Jan. 13-14, 2006 with 1-1 and 2-2 OT ties in Columbus.
- The first game of the season was head coach Jackie Barto's 500th career contest behind the bench. She is in her 11th season at the helm of the Buckeyes and is in her 16th year overall as a head coach.
- Ohio State and Boston University have tied in three of four games all time, having first met last January.
- Starting in net for the Buckeyes was freshman Chelsea Knapp. She became the first rookie to start the season in the Ohio State goal since the inaugural season in 1999-2000. The Buckeyes rotated two freshmen goalies that season in April Stojak and Melissa Glaser. Knapp wrapped up the series with a total of 57 saves for a .919 save percentage and 2.50 goals-against average.
- Scoring twice for the Buckeyes was sophomore forward Melissa Feste. She entered the season with just three goals from her rookie campaign. The Bloomington, Minn., native scored the third period game-tying goal last Friday and opened the scoring for Ohio State last Saturday.
- Notching the game-tying goal last Saturday was sophomore forward Kim Theut. Trailing 4-2 with just over six minutes remaining in regulation, freshman forward Minttu Tuominen scored a 5-on-3 goal with Theut following :34 seconds later with a power-play goal of her own.
- Also registering two points against the Terriers were junior defenseman Teal Bishop and Tuominen with a goal and assist each, as well as senior forward Raelyn LaRocque with two helpers. The goal by Bishop was her first in 44 games. She was scoreless her sophomore season with 10 assists. The last time the assistant captain scored was Jan. 26, 2008 at Niagara.
- A total of 11 Buckeyes had a point in the season-opening series at BU. Recording the first points of their OSU careers were rookies Tuominen (1g, 1a), Hokey Langan



(1a) and Paige Semenza (1a).

- After both ties, the teams held shootouts that did not count toward the final score, but were good preparation for both squads as the WCHA and Hockey East hold shootouts to decide tied overtime conference games. The Buckeyes won both, 2-1, with Natalie Spooner and Tuominen scoring in game one and Kelly Wild and Tuominen scoring in game two.
- Ohio State scored all but one of its goals in the series on the power-play posting a 4-of-14 mark for a 28%.
- On the penalty-kill at BU, the Buckeyes were successful on 10-of-11 chances for a 90.9 mark.
- Ohio State begins the WCHA season with a home series against No. 3 Minnesota, Oct. 9-10. The Buckeyes are looking to snap a six-game losing streak to the Golden Gophers. Games begin at 7:07 pm ET both Friday and Saturday at the OSU Ice Rink.

ST. CLOUD STATE

- The Huskies open league play this weekend at Duluth with a two-game series against No. 4-ranked Minnesota Duluth on Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 10-11, at the DECC.
- The Huskies are 1-1-0 overall in 2009-10 and have yet to play a league game this season.
- SCSU's head coach Jeff Giesen is 3-12-1 all-time against Minnesota Duluth.
- Minnesota Duluth leads the all-time series with the Huskies, 34-8-2, dating back to Nov. 5, 1999. Last season, the Huskies went 2-1-1 against the nationally-ranked Bulldogs.
- To open the 2009-10 season, St. Cloud State entertained non-conference opponent Niagara University on Oct. 2-3. The Huskies split with the Purple Eagles, garnering the 4-3 win in the first game of the tilt, and dropping the second game of the series, 1-3.
- SCSU's season opening win on Oct. 2 marked just the fifth season-opening victory in school history and head coach Jeff Giesen became the all-time winningest coach at St. Cloud State in women's hockey history, improving his all-time mark to 46-51-16 that evening. Giesen surpassed former head coach, Jason Lesteberg, who totaled 45 wins in his four-year stint at the helm from 2002-06.
- Senior forward Caitlin Hogan kicked off her final collegiate season with strong start, scoring two goals and adding as assist in the series against Niagara. Hogan's game-winning goal last Friday marked the fifth GWG of her career.
- Four first-year skaters for the Huskies tabbed their first collegiate points in the Cardinal and Black against Niagara University. Callie Dahl, Jocelyn Zabrick, Kylie Lane and Katie Allen all tallied assists in the win last Friday night, and Zabrick added her second assist of the series last Saturday afternoon in the 1-3 Husky loss.
- Meaghan Pezon tabbed a goal and an assist against NU in the first game of the series on Friday, Oct. 3 and now ranks 14th all-time at SCSU with 30 goals and 29 assists in 102 games played.
- Caitlin Hogan ranks fourth all-time at SCSU with 87 career points (36g, 51a) while senior forward Holly Roberts ranks ninth all-time at SCSU with 78 points (33g, 45a). Both look to be the next Husky to join the 100-point club at SCSU. Currently, former Husky Roxanne Stang (71g, 48a) is the only player to score 100 career points in the Cardinal and Black.
- St. Cloud State's Ashley Nixon and Tayler VanDenakker split time in net this past weekend. Nixon, SCSU's junior, garnered the win on Friday night (Oct. 2) after stopping 30 NU shots. On Saturday (Oct. 3) sophomore VanDenakker suffered the loss, giving up three goals and backstopping the Huskies with 25 saves.

WISCONSIN

- The Badgers go on its first road trip of the season, visiting conference foe Bemidji State. On Oct. 10 the Badgers head to Coleraine, Minn. for the first game of the series to face the Beavers at the Hodgins-Berardo Arena at 7 p.m. The series continues on Oct. 11 when both teams travel to Bemidji, Minn. to battle at the John Glas Fieldhouse at 4 p.m.
- After dropping the 2009 national championship banner, the Wisconsin women's hockey team fell 2-0 to league-rival North Dakota in the season-opener at the Kohl Center on Oct. 2. In front of a crowd of 2,590 the Badgers unveiled its third championship banner before the drop of the puck on the 2009-10 season.
- The freshmen proved essential in the Badgers' 3-0 win over North Dakota last Saturday at the Kohl Center. In just their second game donning Cardinal and White, two freshmen accounted for all three goals, Brianna Decker had two and Lauren Unser had one.
- In her first collegiate start, Becca Ruegsegger stopped 18 shots for the shutout.
- In the 2-0 loss, Wisconsin suffered its first shutout and fell to 8-3 in season openers since its inception in 1999. The loss marks the first-ever against the Fighting Sioux, bringing the all-time record to 25-1-0. The loss was the first shutout to start a season in program history and the first at the Kohl Center since Nov. 24, 2006 against Minnesota Duluth.
- Brianna Decker had Wisconsin's first goal of the season, also marking her first multi-goal game as she lit the lamp twice in UW's 3-0 win.
- Lauren Unser scored for Wisconsin in just her second shift as a Badger and Ruegsegger had 18 saves to shut out the Fighting Sioux in her first collegiate start. The last Badger to earn a shutout in her first collegiate start was current senior Alannah McCready against Union College on Sept. 29, 2007.
- Jasmine Giles had two assists and Maria Evans had one assist as the only upperclassmen to contribute in the scoring effort against the Fighting Sioux.
- Even though the Badgers have lost their head coach and some key players from its championship season, the Badgers first NCAA title came during an Olympic year in 2006. Interim head coach Tracey DeKeyser is no stranger to the program, she has been with UW since its inception and has been at the helm of the program twice before as a co-coach with former assistant Dan Koch. DeKeyser will enlist in the help of UW alums, Peter Johnson and Jackie Friesen, to assist the Badgers in the 2009-10 season.
- This week's opponent, Bemidji State (0-2) was picked to finish eighth in the WCHA preseason coaches' poll. Last season the Beavers went 2-22-3 in WCHA play. BSU enters the weekend after a 0-2 series with Mercyhurst. In the first of the series, Mercyhurst downed the Beavers 4-1 and capped off the series with a 6-1 win Saturday night. Sophomore Erin Johnson scored both goals for Bemidji during their opening series against Mercyhurst. All-WCHA Second Team selection, sophomore Zuzana Tomcikova, was in goal for the Beavers during last Friday night's 4-1 defeat and sophomore Alana McElhinney was in the net during Saturday's 6-1 loss. All-time, the Badgers lead the Beavers 41-1-2. Wisconsin saw its only loss to Bemidji on Dec. 9, 2001. Last season the Badgers shut out the Beavers in three of the four meetings, outscoring Bemidji State 21-2.
- Alannah McCready played in net in the third period in the first-ever U.S. Women's Hockey Hall of Fame Game in Eveleth, Minn.
- The Badgers, the defending national champions are the coaches' preseason pick to win the WCHA women's title. The Badgers collected six first-place votes and 48 points in a poll of the eight coaches and edged out defending WCHA champion Minnesota, which placed second with 43 points and two first-place votes. Minnesota Duluth, with 38 points, was selected to finish third. All three of those teams qualified for the NCAA Frozen Four last season. St. Cloud was picked to finish fourth, followed by Ohio State, North Dakota, Minnesota State, Mankato and Bemidji State.
