WISCONSIN TO HOST MINNESOTA STATE IN THANKSGIVING WEEKEND WCHA SERIES; UM, UMD, OSU TO TAKE ON THREE NATIONALLY-RANKED ECAC HOCKEY-MEMBER TEAMS

MINNESOTA SWEEPS MAVERICKS ON NOV. 21-22 TO JUMP INTO LEAGUE LEAD; ST. CLOUD STATE TAKES PAIR FROM BSU; UMD, UND SPLIT; TOP-RANKED BADGERS WIN TWICE OVER UNH IN FLORIDA AS VETTER SETS NCAA WOMEN'S SHUTOUT RECORD; THREE WCHA TEAMS RANKED AMONG NATION'S TOP 10 IN LATEST NATIONAL POLL ... UW AGAIN NO. 1, UM NO. 2, UMD NO. 7 ... UND, SCSU ALSO RECEIVE VOTES; TICKETS ON SALE FOR 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, MARCH 7-8 AT RIDDER ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – The second-ranked Minnesota Golden Gophers jumped into first place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association with a pair of victories over Minnesota State at Ridder Arena on Nov. 21-22 and now heads into the Thanksgiving weekend with a three-point lead over unbeaten and No. 1-ranked Wisconsin. The Golden Gophers have won six straight.

Monique Lamoureux had seven points in UM's third straight conference series sweep last weekend. Lamoureux, a freshman forward, scored a shorthanded, game-winning goal in the Gophers' 2-1 win over the Mavericks in the series opener last Friday. Then last Saturday, Lamoureux had two goals and four assists in a 6-3 victory which gave Minnesota a 11-2-1 overall record. The Gophers are 10-1-1-0 in the WCHA.

Heading into the holiday weekend, the No. 2-ranked Gophers have 22 points, three more than top-ranked and second place Wisconsin (14-0-2, 8-0-2-2 WCHA). The Badgers, however, get a chance to leapfrog back into first place after their Friday, Nov. 28 and Sunday, Nov. 30 two-game WCHA set against visiting Minnesota State at the Kohl Center in Madison in the only league series being contested this week.

Three teams are currently separated by three points in the spirited battle for third place in the WCHA. St. Cloud State (9-5-2, 6-5-1-1 WCHA) has 14 points and is in third place while No. 7-ranked Minnesota Duluth (7-5-2, 5-5-2 WCHA) has 12 points, one more than North Dakota (8-5-1, 5-4-1-0 WCHA). Minnesota State (6-7-1, 3-6-1-1 WCHA) has eight points and is in sixth place, two better than Ohio State (5-9-0, 3-9-0 WCHA), which has six points. Bemidji State (1-11-2, 0-10-0-0 WCHA) is in eighth place without a point.

Three WCHA-member teams play outside the conference this weekend (Friday-Saturday, Nov. 28-29) against three nationally-ranked members of ECAC Hockey. Minnesota Duluth hosts first place and No. 3 Dartmouth (7-1-1) at the DECC, Ohio State travels to second place (tie) and No. 5 St. Lawrence (8-2-2), and Minnesota entertains second place (tie) and No. 9-ranked Harvard (4-2-2).

Last weekend (Nov. 21-22), in league play, St. Cloud State ran its winning streak to a school-best five with a pair of 2-0 shutout victories over WCHA rival Bemidji State at St. Cloud. Huskies' goaltenders Ashley Nixon and Taylor VanDenakker each recorded shutouts.

North Dakota split its WCHA road series against defending national champion Minnesota Duluth. Elin Holmlov scored four goals to lead UMD to a 6-2 victory in Duluth last Saturday afternoon before the Fighting Sioux rebounded with a 4-0 win in the series finale on Sunday (Nov. 23). UND freshman goaltender Stephanie Ney recorded her first career shutout in that game with 45 saves.

In non-conference action on Nov. 21-22, Wisconsin stayed unbeaten and stretched its season-opening unbeaten streak to 16 (14-0-2) by beating No. 3-ranked New Hampshire, 8-2 and 2-0 in Fort Myers, Fla. Erika Lawler had a goal and two assists in the series opener on Nov. 21 while goaltender Jessie Vetter had 30 saves and earned her 31st career shutout – the most in NCAA Div. 1 women's hockey history. She surpassed UNH goalie Melissa Bourdon who had 30 career shutouts from 2004-07.

In this week's USCHO.com national poll, the WCHA has three teams among the top 10. Wisconsin is again No. 1, Minnesota is No. 2, and Minnesota Duluth is No. 7. Also receiving votes were UND and SCSU.

of women's hockey, has plenty of new developments and exciting events that will earmark the 2008-09 season.

"We have enjoyed great fortune and success throughout the first nine seasons of WCHA women's hockey," said Sara Martin, WCHA Associate Commissioner, "and we look forward to celebrating our tenth season of play by continuing to develop our sport and expose our student-athletes and coaches to an ever-growing legion of fans. Coming off our ninth consecutive national championship, and based on the continuing emergence of all of our member teams, we're confident the WCHA as a whole will be even more competitive from top to bottom this season."

The battle for the WCHA regular season championship will again consist of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. The opening weekend of league competition was Oct. 10-11 with the regular season concluding the weekend of Feb. 20-22. The conference's post-season championship tournament will open the weekend of Feb. 27-Mar. 1 (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) with a first round, best-of-three series format at campus sites. The No. 1 seeded team will host the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed will host the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed will host the No. 5 seed.

The four first-round winners will then advance to the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., on Saturday and Sunday, March 7-8. On Saturday, there will be two semi-final match-ups at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game set for Sunday at 1:07 pm CT.

Following two weeks of WCHA playoffs, the NCAA Women's Div. 1 championship tournament will commence the weekend of March 13-15 at regional sites (TBA), followed by the 2008 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held March 20-22 at Boston, Mass.

WCHA WOMEN USING SHOOTOUT IN 2008-09

The WCHA is helping to re-introduce the shootout to women's college hockey. A National Hockey League-style three-player shootout is being used to determine a winner for all WCHA regular season games still tied after regulation and the standard five-minute (5:00) overtime.

Thus far this season four games have gone to shootout. SCSU beat UMD Oct. 17 at St. Cloud (SCSU won 2-1 in 3 rounds – Holly Roberts GWG). MSU beat UND Oct. 17 at Grand Forks (MSU won 2-1 in 5 rounds of shootout – Lisa Edman GWG). UM beat UW Oct. 24 at Madison (UM won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Sarah Erickson GWG). UW beat UMD Nov. 1 at Madison (UW won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Kelly Nash GWG).

The NCAA Rules and Ice Hockey Committees have allowed conferences the ability to implement this tie-breaking protocol so that every regular season league game will have a winner while preserving the integrity of the national rankings. Regular season games decided by a shootout will still be considered ties for NCAA purposes so there will be no effect on NCAA records for the purposes of the Pairwise and determining the national tournament field. Bonus points awarded will impact WCHA standings only. The WCHA standings should be read with two points for a win, zero points for losses, one point for a tie and one point for shootout wins.
