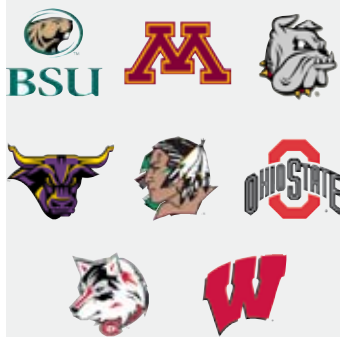

WISCONSIN HOSTS ST. CLOUD STATE, MINNESOTA VISITS NORTH DAKOTA, BEMIDJI STATE PLAYS AT MINNESOTA DULUTH IN UPCOMING DEC. 5-6 WCHA SERIES; WCHA HAS THREE OF TOP FOUR TEAMS IN LATEST NATIONAL POLL

WISCONSIN STAYS AT NO. 1, MOVES INTO LEAGUE LEAD BY SWEEPING MSU; MINNESOTA AT NO. 2, MINNESOTA DULUTH AT NO. 4 AFTER NON-CONFERENCE SWEEPS; SCSU, UND ALSO RECEIVE VOTES IN POLLS; MINNESOTA STATE TO HOST U.S. SELECT TEAM DEC. 4; TICKETS ON SALE FOR 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, MARCH 7-8 AT RIDDER ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – The University of Wisconsin extended its 2008-09 season-opening unbeaten streak to 18 games and jumped back into first place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association while the University of Minnesota and University of Minnesota Duluth both scored sweeps over Eastern powers over the Thanksgiving weekend. The result was that the pollsters say three of the top four women's teams in the country are from the WCHA.

Wisconsin maintained its top ranking and jumped over No. 2-ranked Minnesota into the league lead with two victories over Minnesota State, 8-0 on Nov. 29 and 7-2 on Nov. 30, in the only league series contested over the Thanksgiving weekend. In the first game at the Kohl Center in Madison last Saturday afternoon, Jessie Vetter notched her NCAA record 32nd career shutout and seventh of the season and the Badgers scored six goals in the second period. Right winger Hilary Knight had a five-point game with two goals and three assists while linemates Erika Lawler (center) and Angie Keseley (left wing) added 2-2-4 and 2-1-3, respectively. Then in the series finale last Sunday, UW forwards Meghan Duggan, Brooke Ammerman and Kyla Sanders each had two goals and an assist.

In WCHA series upcoming this weekend – Friday, Dec. 5 and Saturday, Dec. 6 – the Badgers host St. Cloud State at the Kohl Center, Bemidji State visits No. 4-ranked Minnesota Duluth and the DECC, and No. 2 ranked Minnesota takes on North Dakota at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks. Minnesota State will play host to the U.S. National Select Team on Thursday (Dec. 4).

After the Thanksgiving holiday and heading into the halfway mark in the season for many teams this week, the Badgers are 16-0-2 overall and 10-0-2-1 in the WCHA with 23 points, one more than the Golden Gophers (15-2-1, 10-1-1-0 WCHA), which beat No. 9-ranked Harvard 3-1 and 3-2 in a non-conference series at Ridder Arena on Nov. 28-29. Minnesota has now won eight games in a row. Three teams are separated by three points in the battle for third place in the WCHA. St. Cloud State (9-5-2, 6-5-1-1 WCHA) has 14 points in third while Minnesota Duluth (9-5-2, 5-5-2 WCHA) has 12 points, one more than fifth place North Dakota (8-5-1, 5-4-1-0 WCHA). Minnesota State (6-9-1, 3-8-1-1 WCHA) has eight points in sixth place, two better than Ohio State (5-11-0, 3-9-0 WCHA), which has six points. Bemidji State (1-11-2, 0-10-0-0 WCHA) is eighth.

Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth, now ranked No. 4 in the nation, disposed of then No. 3 Dartmouth, 2-1 and 4-1, over the Thanksgiving holiday weekend at the DECC. Forward Haley Irwin had three goals in the series for the Bulldogs.

The pre-Christmas schedule concludes the weekend of Dec. 12-14 when Minnesota State hosts Ohio State and North Dakota travels to Bemidji State in conference play. In non-conference action, Minnesota Duluth entertains Princeton on Dec. 13-14 while in exhibition play, Ohio State takes on the U.S. National Select Team on Dec. 14 in Blaine, Minn.

In this week's USCHO.com national poll, the WCHA has three of the nation's top four ranked teams. Wisconsin is again No. 1, Minnesota is No. 2, and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth is up to No. 4. Also receiving votes again were St. Cloud State and North Dakota.

of women's hockey, has plenty of new developments and exciting events that earmark the 2008-09 season.

"We have enjoyed great fortune and success throughout the first nine seasons of WCHA women's hockey," said Sara Martin, WCHA Associate Commissioner, "and we look forward to celebrating our tenth season of play by continuing to develop our sport and expose our student-athletes and coaches to an ever-growing legion of fans. Coming off our ninth consecutive national championship, and based on the continuing emergence of all of our member teams, we're confident the WCHA as a whole will be even more competitive from top to bottom this season."

The battle for the WCHA regular season championship will again consist of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. The opening weekend of league competition was Oct. 10-11 with the regular season concluding the weekend of Feb. 20-22. The conference's post-season championship tournament will open the weekend of Feb. 27-Mar. 1 (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) with a first round, best-of-three series format at campus sites. The No. 1 seeded team will host the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed will host the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed will host the No. 5 seed.

The four first-round winners will then advance to the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., on Saturday and Sunday, March 7-8. On Saturday, there will be two semi-final match-ups at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game set for Sunday at 1:07 pm CT.

Following two weeks of WCHA playoffs, the NCAA Women's Div. 1 championship tournament will commence the weekend of March 13-15 at regional sites (TBA), followed by the 2008 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held March 20-22 at Boston, Mass.

WCHA WOMEN USING SHOOTOUT IN 2008-09

The WCHA is helping to re-introduce the shootout to women's college hockey. A National Hockey League-style three-player shootout is being used to determine a winner for all WCHA regular season games still tied after regulation and the standard five-minute (5:00) overtime.

Thus far this season four games have gone to shootout: SCSU beat UMD Oct. 17 at St. Cloud (SCSU won 2-1 in 3 rounds – Holly Roberts GWG); MSU beat UND Oct. 17 in Grand Forks (MSU won 2-1 in 5 rounds of shootout – Lisa Edman with GWG); UM beat UW Oct. 24 at Madison (UM won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Sarah Erickson with GWG); UW beat UMD Nov. 1 at Madison (UW won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Kelly Nash with GWG).

The NCAA has allowed conferences the ability to implement this tie-breaking protocol so that every regular season league game will have a winner while preserving the integrity of the national rankings. Regular season games decided by a shootout will still be considered ties for NCAA purposes so there will be no effect on NCAA records for the purposes of the Pairwise and determining the national tournament field. Bonus points awarded will impact WCHA standings only. The WCHA standings should be read with two points for a win, zero points for losses, one point for a tie and one point for shootout wins.
