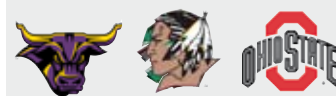

FINAL WEEKEND OF ON-ICE PLAY FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2009 FEATURES FOUR WCHA SERIES FOR DEC. 11-13 AS UM VISITS UND, UMD HOSTS BSU, UW HEADS TO MSU, SCSU HOSTS OSU BEMIDJI STATE MOVES UP INTO FOURTH PLACE AFTER DEC. 5-6 SWEEP OF UND; WISCONSIN, ST. CLOUD STATE PICK UP THREE POINTS EACH; LATEST USCHO.COM DIV. 1 POLL HAS UM NO. 2, UMD NO. 5, UW NO. 7; TICKETS ON SALE FOR 2010 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF MARCH 6-7 AT RIDDER ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – Bemidji State heads into the final weekend of pre-Christmas holiday play in a rare spot – in fourth place and in the first division of the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association – after scoring a two-game sweep over league rival North Dakota in a home-and-home series Dec. 5-6.

The Beavers, who won 3-0 at UND last Saturday and 3-2 (ot) at home on Sunday, will try to build on that momentum when they travel to Minnesota Duluth this weekend, a team they have never beaten, in one of four league series that will conclude the first half of the 2009-10 WCHA season.

Upcoming this weekend – Friday-Sunday, December 11-13 – is a full slate of four head-to-head WCHA series. Ohio State heads to St. Cloud State (Friday/Saturday), No. 7-ranked Wisconsin visits Minnesota State, Mankato (Friday/Saturday), No. 5-ranked Minnesota Duluth tries to build on a 43-0-1 series record when it hosts Bemidji State (Saturday/Sunday), and North Dakota entertains No. 2-ranked Minnesota (Saturday/Sunday) in a series which has seen the Gophers win all 24 previous meetings.

Minnesota Duluth and St. Cloud have played exactly 50% of their respective 28-game conference schedules, two more games than the other teams. Here are the league standings through games of Dec. 8: defending WCHA champion Minnesota (13-3-2, 9-2-1-1 WCHA) continues to lead the league with 20 points, Minnesota Duluth (12-7-1, 8-5-1-1 WCHA) is second with 17 points, defending national champion Wisconsin (10-5-3, 7-4-1 WCHA) is third with 15 points, and Bemidji State (6-10-2, 5-5-2-2 WCHA) is fourth with 14 points. Ohio State (6-7-3, 5-6-1 WCHA), which was idle the last two weeks, and St. Cloud State (8-9-1, 5-8-1 WCHA) are tied

for the fifth spot with 11 points apiece, Minnesota State (4-6-4, 2-6-4-2 WCHA) is seventh with 10 points and North Dakota (3-8-3, 3-8-1 WCHA) is eighth with seven points.

Last weekend, UMD goalie Jennifer Harss stopped 73 off 77 shots and helped No. 5-ranked Minnesota Duluth get a 2-2 tie with No. 7 Wisconsin on Sunday and escape the Kohl Center with a vital point when it won the shootout 2-0. The Badgers won 3-1 over the visiting Bulldogs in the series opener last Friday afternoon, moving within two points of UMD.

Bemidji State got a 26-save shutout from goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova and two goals from Erin Cody and posted a 3-0 shutout victory at North Dakota last Saturday in Grand Forks to move into fourth place. Then on Sunday, Cody scored twice more, including the overtime game-winner, and the Beavers posted a sweep with a 3-2 victory in Bemidji. Sadie Lundquist assisted on all three BSU goals.

In one other WCHA series played this past weekend, St. Cloud State ran its unbeaten streak to five games (4-0-1) last Saturday by posting a 1-0 triumph over visiting Minnesota State behind Holly Roberts' game-winning goal and Ashley Nixon's 32-save shutout. The Huskies and Mavericks played to a 4-4 overtime tie last Friday in Mankato. MSU won the shootout to gain the extra point, thanks to Kala Buganski's winner.

In non-conference play, league-leading Minnesota was held scoreless for the second straight game last Saturday, playing a 0-0 overtime draw at Harvard after falling 1-0 to the host Crimson last Friday. The WCHA's record in non-conference outings stands at 18-11-7 (.597). Prior to allowing the goal last Friday, Golden Gophers' goaltender Noora Rätty hadn't allowed a goal in 217:30 consecutive minutes played and then Rätty stopped all 39 shots on goal in Saturday's tie at Boston. Rätty has only allowed one goal in the last five games, but the No. 2 ranked Gophers are just 3-1-1 in that span.

Following the two-week Christmas holiday break, play resumes for WCHA-member teams in a series of non-conference matchups over the New Year's weekend of Jan. 1-3. North Dakota will venture east to take on Union College of ECAC Hockey (Friday/Saturday), Ohio State will entertain Robert Morris of College Hockey America (Saturday/Sunday), and St. Cloud State will host WCHA-rival Minnesota State, Mercyhurst of College Hockey America and Providence of the Hockey East Association in the two-day, four-team Easton Holiday Showcase at the National Hockey Center.

In this week's (Dec. 7) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota is ranked No. 2, Minnesota Duluth is No. 5 and Wisconsin is No. 7.

UMD 1 @ UW 3 (WCHA): At the Kohl Center in Madison on Friday afternoon, host Wisconsin captured a 3-1 league victory over Minnesota Duluth before 1,741 as right winger Brooke Ammerman had the game-winning goal and one assist and center Brianna Decker added a pair of helpers. The Badgers, who outshot the Bulldogs, 43-14, never trailed in the contest. After UW defenseman Saige Pacholok opened the game with a power-play goal at 1:15 of the first period, Ammerman sealed the victory with the winner at 8:13 of period two. For UMD, center Gina Dodge pulled the Bulldogs to within one at 2-1 with a third period power-play goal at 15:34 while Jennifer Harss had 40 saves in nets. Adding an empty-netter for Wisconsin was Carolyne Prevost at 19:55.

SCSU 4 @ MSU 4 ot (WCHA): At All Season's Arena in Mankato on Friday, host Minnesota State and St. Cloud State played to a 4-4 overtime tie before 219 before the Mavericks prevailed 1-0 in a three-round shootout to gain the extra point. Leading the way for MSU was left winger Emmi Leinonen (1g, 1a), while center Ashley Young, defensemen Holly Snyder and Jackie Otto added goals and Alli Altmann had 27 stops between the pipes. For the Huskies, the line of center Caitlin Hogan (1g, 2a), right winger Holly Roberts (2g, 1a) and left winger Felicia Nelson (1g) combined for seven points while winger Meaghan Pezon added two assists and goaltender Ashley Nixon had 26 stops. On the power-play, SCSU was 2-of-9 while MSU was 0-of-2.

UM 0 @ Harvard 1 (nc): In Boston on Friday, visiting Minnesota fell 1-0 to Harvard in non-conference play before 409 as right winger Liza Ryabkina scored the lone goal at 0:33 of the third period. The Golden Gophers, who outshot the Crimson, 24-21, had 20 saves from Noora Rätty in nets but were blanked on all four of their

BSU 3 @ UND 0 (WCHA): At Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks on Saturday evening, visiting Bemidji State rallied behind a pair of goals from left winger Erin Cody and a 26-save shutout performance from goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova to defeat North Dakota, 3-0, in WCHA play before 875. The Beavers, who were outshot, 26-16, capitalized on 2-of-2 power-play chances while holding the Sioux scoreless in seven man-advantage opportunities. Scoring the game-winner for BSU was left winger Erin Johnson who tallied just 1:45 into the first period, while right winger Annie Bauerfeld added a pair of assists. For UND, Brittany Kirkham had 13 saves in nets.

MSU 0 @ SCSU 1 (WCHA): At the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud on Saturday night, the host St. Cloud State Huskies captured a 1-0 shutout over conference foe Minnesota State before 232 as right winger Holly Roberts knocked home the game-winner at 12:21 of the third period. Roberts' goal broke up a goaltending duel between the Huskies' Ashley Nixon, who finished with 32 saves and the Mavericks' Alli Altmann, who made 22 stops. Neither team could score on the power-play, with both clubs going 0-of-6.

UM 0 @ Harvard 0 ot (nc): In non-conference play on Saturday, visiting Minnesota played to a 0-0 overtime tie against host Harvard before 703 as Golden Gophers' goaltender Noora Rätty stopped all 39 shots on goal. Neither team could capitalize with the man-advantage, as Minnesota was 0-of-3 and Harvard was 0-of-8. For the host Crimson, Christina Kessler had 29 saves.

UMD 2 @ UW 2 ot (WCHA): Right winger Jessica Wong scored a game-tying goal at 7:42 of the third period to lift visiting Minnesota Duluth into a 2-2 tie with Wisconsin on Sunday afternoon before 2,248 at the Kohl Center. The Bulldogs, however, claimed a 2-0 shootout win to gain the extra point. Also for UMD, center Saara Tuominen had two assists while Jennifer Harss had 33 saves between the pipes. For the Badgers, center Brianna Decker and defenseman Geena Prough scored second period goals to give UW a 2-1 lead.

UND 2 @ BSU 3 ot (WCHA): At John Glas Fieldhouse in Bemidji on Sunday evening, the host Beavers completed a home-and-home weekend sweep against North Dakota with a 3-2 overtime win as left winger Erin Cody scored twice – including the game-winner at 0:55 of the extra session – and had one assist and center Sadie Lundquist added two helpers. For the Sioux, right winger Alyssa Wiebe led the way with a goal and an assist, with her third period tally sending the game into overtime.

A GLANCE AT THE 2009-10 SEASON

The WCHA and its eight member teams seek a record 11th consecutive national championship in 2009-10. Since the inception of the NCAA Women's Frozen Four in 2001, three different WCHA teams have won the national championship. The Badgers extended the string and kept the league's national title streak alive in 2008-09 when they won their third Frozen Four by defeating Mercyhurst, 4-0, in Boston in the NCAA title game last March. The WCHA placed three teams in the Frozen Four including league champion Minnesota, traditional power Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin, which won the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the league playoff championships.

Last season's success marked the 10th straight national championship won by a WCHA-member institution. UMD won the first three NCAA titles in 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2008. The Badgers have won national crowns in 2006, 2007 in addition to last season. UM took home the titles in 2004 and 2005, and the Golden Gophers also won the 2000 AWCHA Div. 1 national collegiate championship, prior to the inception of the NCAA tournament.

The battle for the WCHA regular season championship consists of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. During the course of the season, there are seven weekends that consist of all eight member teams engaged in WCHA play. They are Dec. 11-13, Jan. 15-17, Jan. 22-23, Jan. 29-31, Feb. 5-8, Feb. 12-13 and Feb. 19-20. The regular season schedule concludes Feb. 20.

The first round of WCHA Playoffs, a best-of-three series format at campus locations, will be contested Friday, Feb. 26, Saturday, Feb. 27 and Sunday, Feb. 28 (if necessary). The opening round will match the No. 1 seed vs the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 vs No. 7, No. 3 vs No. 6, and the No. 4 seed vs the No. 5 seed.

The four first round playoff winners will then advance to the 2010 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, Saturday, March 6 and Sunday, March 7 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. There will be two semi-final games played on Saturday at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, followed by the championship game on Sunday.

The weekend of Friday, March 12 through Sunday, March 14 will bring about the NCAA Regionals (sites, times TBA), followed by the 2010 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, set for Friday, March 19 and Sunday, March 21 at UM's Ridder Arena.

The WCHA will watch the 2010 Winter Olympics with pride, knowing that many familiar faces will dot various international team rosters. WCHA MEMBER TEAM WEEKLY NOTEBOOKS

BEAVERS

BEMIDJI STATE UNIVERSITY

- The Beavers will hit the road before taking a break for the winter holiday season when they travel to Duluth for a weekend series with the Bulldogs.
- Last time out BSU picked up its first weekend sweep of the year against the Fighting Sioux of North Dakota.
- On Saturday, Dec. 5 the Beavers' special teams led the way against the Sioux for the fifth win of the season. Erin Cody would score on both power-play opportunities. The penalty-kill unit was also flawless killing off all seven Beaver penalties. Zuzana Tomcikova would make 26 saves en route to a 3-0 shutout, her sixth-career and third of the season.
- On Sunday, Dec. 6, freshman Sadie Lundquist had a break-out night assisting on all three goals for BSU vs UND. Jackie Robertson would score first giving Bemidji State a 1-0 lead in the first. However, North Dakota was as accommodating as the night before as they would strike back forcing a deadlock going into the second. Cody would net her third goal of the weekend giving the Beavers the lead back at 2-1. UND would later equalize in the third period and send the game into overtime. Cody answered the call in overtime, netting her fourth goal and fifth point of the weekend.
- Minnesota Duluth is the only WCHA team that the Beavers have not gained a win against, going 0-43-1 all-time against the Bulldogs. Last season the Beavers only lost by one goal to the Bulldogs on Feb. 6, 2009 at the John S. Glas Fieldhouse. There have been a total of three other one-goal games in the history between the two teams. The only non-loss was on Feb. 3, 2002 at the DECC with a score of 3-3.



GOLDEN GOPHERS

UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

- After a two-week hiatus, the No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers return to conference action this week as they close out the first half at North Dakota on Saturday and Sunday, Dec. 12-13.
- The Gophers hold a 24-0 all-time mark against UND, dating back to November of 2003.
- Minnesota competed against No. 9-ranked Harvard last weekend. The Gophers fell 1-0 last Friday and skated to a 0-0 overtime tie last Saturday. After two scoreless periods on Dec. 4, Harvard's Liza Ryabkina scored a goal just :33 seconds into the third period. As Minnesota was exiting the penalty box at :32, Jillian Dempsey found Ryabkina in front of the net and fired in a shot, the first goal allowed by Noora Rätty in 217:30 consecutive minutes played. The Ryabkina goal would be all that Harvard goalie Christina Kessler needed to earn her seventh win of the season. Kessler had 24 saves and Rätty a 20-save night. The last time Minnesota had been shut out in a game came on Nov. 17, 2007 when the Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs earned a 5-0 win.
- The Gophers and Crimson then skated to a 0-0 tie last Saturday. The last time the Gophers skated to a 0-0 tie dates back to Jan. 30, 1999 when New Hampshire and Minnesota went scoreless in 65:00 played. The last time Harvard has been shut out came Feb. 10, 2009 in a 1-0 loss to Boston College. It's the first tie between the two teams in 14 meetings. Minnesota was 0-for-3 on the power-play with four shots, while Harvard of 0-for-8 with the extra attacker and had 10 of its 39 shots on goal in that span. Goaltender Noora Rätty tied a career-best 39 saves. The last time she had 39 saves came against Wisconsin in the 4-2 loss on Oct. 30.
- Following the North Dakota series this weekend, Minnesota will be off from competition until Jan. 8-9 when Ohio State comes to town for a WCHA set. Minnesota will then host the U.S. National Team on Jan. 12.



BULLDOGS

UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA DULUTH

- The No. 5 Bulldogs earned two points the hard way last weekend in Madison, dropping the Friday contest 3-1 to the No. 7-ranked Badgers before picking up a 2-2 tie and shootout win Sunday to stay in second place in the WCHA.
- Rookie netminder Jennifer Harss was the story of the weekend, making 73 saves on the 77 shots she faced. Harss turned away 40 shots in Friday's 3-1 setback (the third goal was an open-netter in the final four seconds), and then made 33 in Sunday's 2-2 tie. The Bulldogs received goals from senior forward Emmanuelle Blais and rookie forward Jessica Wong on Sunday, with junior forward Laura Fridfinnson picking up her 100th career point on Blais' tally with an assist. Three Bulldog rookies stepped up for the shootout, with Audrey Cournoyer and Katie Wilson scoring on their attempts. But it was Harss who kept the net empty to help UMD pick up the extra league point from the shootout win.
- Jennifer Harss leads the nation in minutes played (1178:18) and saves (559) and ranks 10th in the NCAA with a .927 saves percentage.
- The overtime game on Dec. 6 was the 14th in history between the Bulldogs and Badgers, and the eighth in the past four seasons. UMD is 23-19-9 all-time against Wisconsin, and the Bulldogs' nine ties is the most UMD shares with any other team in the NCAA.
- Emmanuelle Blais ranks 11th in points scoring with a 1.37 points per game average, and has scored 27 points (12g, 15a) in 20 games so far this season.
- Laura Fridfinnson became the 13th member of UMD's 100 point-club last Sunday, and is the second Bulldog this year to join the club. She joins Blais and senior forward Saara Tuominen as the third currently rostered UMD player to reach the milestone.
- UMD has two rookies in the top-ten for scoring by freshmen in the nation, with Katie Wilson at No. 4 (9g, 11a) and Audrey Cournoyer at No. 8 with 16 (4g, 12a).
- The Bulldogs will host Bemidji State this weekend at the DECC to put the wraps on the 2009 portion of the season. The Beavers remain the only WCHA squad UMD has not surrendered a loss to, with a 43-0-1 all-time record against BSU.



MAVERICKS

MINNESOTA STATE UNIVERSITY, MANKATO

- The Mavericks captured one point out of a home and home series with St. Cloud State last weekend (Dec. 4-5). MSU finished last Friday's home contest with a 4-4 overtime tie but earned the extra point with a shootout win. St. Cloud State then defeated Minnesota State in Saturday's contest, 1-0.
- On Dec. 4, the Mavericks got on the board first as sophomore defenseman Jackie Otto scored at 9:14 in the first period, her first goal of the season. St. Cloud State captain and left wing Felicia Nelson answered when she found the back of the net 12:59 in the first period. Caitlin Hogan scored at 7:38 of the second period as the Huskies took advantage of a power-play. Hogan found the loose puck in front of the Maverick net and capitalized to give the Huskies a 2-1 advantage early in the second. The lead was short lived however as Maverick left wing Emmi Leinonen finished off a Maverick attack for her seventh goal of the season at 10:02 in the second period. The fast paced action continued as the Huskies finished off their second consecutive power play as senior right wing Holly Roberts beat the Mavericks' goalie Ali Altmann. The Mavericks answered 14:42 in the second as Holly Snyder beat SCSU's Ashley Nixon. The seesaw battle continued early in the third as Roberts recorded her second goal of the night giving SCSU a 4-3 advantage. Ashley Young recorded the equalizer and a winner wasn't decided in regulation or overtime so the teams headed to a shootout. MSU's

captain Kala Buganski scored the only goal of the shootout as she beat SCSU's backup goaltender Tayler VanDenakker. She replaced Nixon with :30 seconds remaining in the third after Nixon collided with a Maverick skater. Altmann denied all three SCSU attempts in the shootout. Altmann finished with 27 saves, allowing only four goals giving her a .871 save percentage. The Maverick finished the game with 30 shots on goal compared to St. Cloud State's 31. MSU finished 0-of-2 on power-play attempts as the Huskies ended the night 2-9 with the extra skater.

- In last Saturday's contest, St. Cloud's Holly Roberts scored the only goal. Altmann finished the contest with 22 saves, five of them coming on Huskies' power-plays. The Mavericks finished the game with 32 shots compared to St. Cloud State's 23. Both teams finished 0-of-6 with the extra skater.
- Leading the Mavericks in scoring over the Dec. 4-5 weekend was Emmi Leinonen who finished with one goal and an assist. Eight other MSU skaters finished with one point each.
- Ashley Young currently leads the MSU team in points with 5-8=13.
- Emmi Leinonen currently sits second on the team in scoring with 7-5=12 and Lauren Smith third with 3-8=11.
- The MSU team currently sits 9-of-65 on power-play chances and 16-of-91 on penalty-kills.
- The Mavericks (4-6-4, 2-6-4-2 WCHA) play host to Wisconsin on December 11 and 12 at All Seasons Arena. Friday's game will start at 7:07 pm CT and Saturday's game at 3:07 pm CT.

FIGHTING SIOUX UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA

- The Fighting Sioux lost a pair of WCHA games this past weekend in a home-and-home series with Bemidji State by scores of 3-0 and 3-2 (ot).
- In Grand Forks, N.D., last Saturday, the Sioux were shut out although out-shooting the Beavers 26-16 in the game. BSU only put three shots on net in the opening period but scored on two of them while adding a second period goal.
- Moving to Bemidji, Minn., on Sunday, the Sioux were finally able to figure out goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova. After the Beavers jumped out to an early lead, the Sioux were able to tie the game at one when defenseman Susanne Fellner scored in the first period. With 2:29 left in the third period, the Sioux were again able to come from behind to tie the game at two when Sara Dagenais connected on a stretch pass to catch Alyssa Wiebe behind the Beavers' defense. Wiebe scored on the breakaway. The Beavers were able to capitalize with only :55 seconds off the clock in overtime.
- The Sioux will finish up the first half of 2009-10 play when they face-off against the Minnesota Gophers. The series is scheduled for 2:07 pm CT on Saturday and Sunday (Dec. 12-13) at the Ralph Englestad Arena.



BUCKEYES OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY

- For the second-consecutive week, the Buckeyes were off the ice. It was the first time, outside of the annual holiday break, in which Ohio State has been off for back-to-back weeks in season.
- Ohio State closes out the first half of its 2009-10 season this weekend with a WCHA road series at St. Cloud State. Both teams are tied for fifth in the conference with 11 points.
- The Huskies lead the all-time series vs OSU with a 22-21-4 record. The Buckeyes were 1-3-0 against SCSU last year with the lone victory coming in St. Cloud.
- Ohio State rookie forward Hokey Langan remains the highest scoring freshman in the NCAA with 1.50 points per game and overall in the WCHA (24 points). Langan also still ranks second overall in the conference with 24 points as well as second in assists with 14.
- Ohio State's leading scorer vs St. Cloud State is junior defenseman Shannon Reilly with 10 points (1g, 9a). Seniors Rachel Davis and Raelyn LaRocque, as well as sophomore Laura McIntosh, are tied for second with five points apiece.
- St. Cloud State is the only WCHA opponent Natalie Spooner has not scored a goal against.
- On the road this season, the Buckeyes are 3-2-3 and have picked up a win in each of their three WCHA series (along with two ties at Boston University).
- Raelyn LaRocque leads the team with 11 points (3g, 8a) in road games while Natalie Spooner and Hokey Langan have scored four goals each away from Columbus.
- Rookie goaltender Chelsea Knapp has started all eight road games with a 3-2-3 record, 2.80 goals-against average and .881 save percentage.



HUSKIES ST. CLOUD STATE UNIVERSITY

- The Huskies (8-9-1 overall and 5-8-1-0 in the WCHA) took three points, after posting a 4-4 overtime tie against Minnesota State on Friday, Dec. 4, and a 1-0 shutout victory on Saturday, Dec. 5. The Huskies ended up losing the extra league point on Friday, falling in the shootout 1-0 in the All Seasons Arena. The all-time series between the Mavericks and Huskies is all knotted up at 21-21-5, dating back to Nov. 21, 1998.
- Last Friday night's contest at MSU marked the first tie of the season for the Huskies and the first time SCSU had played in a shootout in 2009-10.
- Senior winger Holly Roberts recorded her seventh career game-winning goal on Dec. 5 against Minnesota State University, Mankato to lift the Huskies to a 1-0 victory in the National Hockey Center. With the goal, Roberts now has 97 career points (42g, 55a). She hopes to become the third women's hockey player in school history to score 100 career points at SCSU after leading the Huskies with four points (3g, 1a) last weekend against Minnesota State in the home-and-home series, including a team-best 13 shots on net.
- Junior netminder Ashley Nixon garnered her fourth career shutout and improved to 6-5-1 on the season. She totaled 58 saves, a 1.92 goals-against average and a .935 save percentage in the home-and-home tilt against MSU last weekend.
- The Huskies are unbeaten in their last five games, going 4-0-1 during that stretch.
- Team alternate captain Caitlin Hogan rattled off three more points (1g, 2a) over the Dec. 4-5 weekend to bring her career mark to 106 points (47g, 59a) in 130 games played at SCSU. Hogan tops the WCHA in goal scoring with 13 goals (0.72 gpg). She continues to rank third in the league in overall scoring with 22 points (13g, 9a) in 18 games played this season.
- Meaghan Pezon posted two more helpers in the series against Minnesota State, bringing her career total to 78 points (37g, 41a). Pezon was on a scoring tear, charting 10 points (3g, 7a) in the last four games, but her scoring streak

was snapped last Saturday. However her 13 helpers this season are a team-high and rank third in the league.

- Seniors Felicia Nelson and Kelly Meierhofer each had one point in the MSU series. Nelson garnered her ninth goal of the season last Friday while Meierhofer dished out the assist in the lone Husky goal last Saturday.
- St. Cloud State's power-play has improved dramatically since the beginning of the season. Individually, the Huskies have four of the top five scorers in the league in power-play points, led by Pezon with 13 (3g, 10a) power-play points in 18 games played (0.72 ppg). Nelson leads the league with five power-play goals this season and as a team, the Huskies rank third (18/105) with a 17.1 power-play completion percentage, just behind nationally-ranked Minnesota with a 17.4 power-play percentage.
- The Huskies are tied with Ohio State for fifth in the WCHA with 11 league points and the Huskies entertain OSU this Friday and Saturday, Dec. 11-12. Friday's game is slated for 2:07 pm CT with Saturday's game scheduled for a 1:07 pm CT start time in the National Hockey Center.
- The Huskies hold the slight advantage in the all-time series over Ohio State, 22-21-4, dating back to Oct. 22, 1999. SCSU's head coach Jeff Giesen is 9-4-2 all-time against OSU. Last season the Huskies went 3-1-0 against the Buckeyes, including a weekend sweep at OSU's Ice Rink in January.

BADGERS UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN

- The No. 7-ranked Badgers will close out the first half of their season on the road against WCHA-rival Minnesota State.
- The Badgers enter the league series in third place, three points behind Minnesota Duluth and five points back from the leader, Minnesota.
- The Badgers look to improve upon its four-game unbeaten streak, its longest of the season.
- Last weekend Wisconsin tallied a win and a tie, picking up three points against Minnesota Duluth after dropping the shootout decision. Wisconsin stifled UMD's offense holding the Bulldogs to only 14 shots as the Badgers pulled out a 3-1 victory. UW outshot UMD 78-38 over the weekend, while also picking up two power-play goals.
- In last Friday's win, Saige Pacholok started the scoring on the man-advantage. Brooke Ammerman scored the go-ahead goal before Carlyne Prevost secured the win with an empty net goal.
- In the series finale vs UMD on Sunday, the Bulldogs went up 1-0 in the first period before UW countered with back-to-back goals in the second period from Brianna Decker and Geena Prough. UMD tallied the equalizer in the third frame and after a scoreless five-minute overtime period, the Bulldogs pulled out a 2-0 shootout win. Playing in their 14th overtime game against one another, and eighth in the past four seasons, the Badgers dropped their third shootout of the season. The shootout loss allowed the Bulldogs to pick up an extra point in conference standings, marking the only shootout that counted for points this season.
- The Badgers have netted 50 goals by 14 different Badgers.
- Wisconsin has out-shot opponents in every game but one this season totaling 643 shots compared to 429.
- Already 18 Badger skaters have contributed a point this season.
- Brooke Ammerman is the team's leading scorer with 20 points (12g, 8a) followed by Mallory Deluce (8g, 7a).
- The Badgers broke a four-game scoreless streak while on the power-play after knocking in two power-play goals over the Dec. 4-6 weekend. UW is 7-for-82 on the man-advantage, after coming up 2-for-8 in the last two outings. Wisconsin has had 134 power-play shot attempts for a .052 shot percent.
- Wisconsin ranks 12th in the nation on the penalty-kill with an 88.8% success rate allowing only 10 goals on 89 opportunities. The Badgers have netted two shorthanded goals this season.
- Wisconsin relies on the strength of two goaltenders this season. Freshman Becca Ruegsegger had a shutout in her first collegiate start and has recorded a 5-4-3 record this season. Ruegsegger has 281 saves and a .918 save percentage



with a 2.05 goals-against average. Senior Alannah McCready (5-1-0) holds a .926 save percentage and a 1.48 goals-against average tallying 113 saves. McCready ranks seventh overall in goals-against average.

- Ammerman ranks 15th in the nation in scoring this season, she is tied for third for goals, two goals behind the nation's leader, Bailey Bram of Mercyhurst. Ammerman remains a balanced forward with 39 career goals and 35 career assists in only her second season.
- Wisconsin's defense has played aggressively helping the scoring output for UW notching seven goals this season. McKeough and Pacholok have been a positive asset to the Badger defense, leading the defenseman in scoring with eight points apiece. The Badger freshmen lead the team in plus/minus with a plus-14 and a plus-15 rating, respectively. McKeough and Pacholok are tied for 30th in the nation for points per game for a defenseman while Prough ranks 20th.
- Since Decker's return from injury, the freshman forward has earned 11 points, including six goals and five assists. Decker is quickly making her presence known with three multi-point games.
- After two months and 14 games, Alev and Derya Kelter have joined the Badgers. Alev stepped in immediately, filling a spot on the defense, while Derya filled a spot on the Badgers fourth line. The twins, who came to Wisconsin as multi-sport athletes advanced to the Sweet 16 with the Wisconsin women's soccer team. Alev earned second-team All-Big Ten honors and was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team with the Badger soccer team.
- This weekend's foe, the Mavericks, enter the weekend after recording a tie and a loss on Dec. 4 and 5 against in-state rival and fellow WCHA opponent, St. Cloud State. So far this season, the Mavericks have found the most success while on the road with a 4-4-1 record in comparison to a 0-2-3 record at home, as the Badgers visit the Mavericks.
- The Badgers have never dropped a game to Minnesota State in 39 meetings; Wisconsin is 37-0-2 all-time with the Mavericks, with one of its two ties coming in its last meeting on February 14, 2009. The Badgers tied the Mavericks 3-3 at All Season Arena, however, UW pulled out the 2-1 shootout win to earn an extra point in league standings. UW has shut out MSU 13 times while scoring more than three goals. In all contests, Wisconsin has scored at least three goals and never allowed more than three goals.
