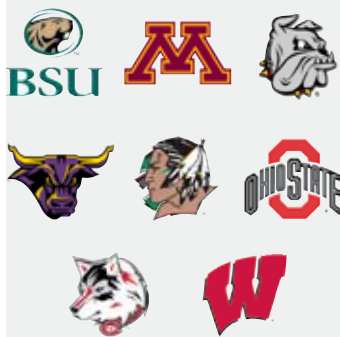

TOP THREE TEAMS IN WCHA – WISCONSIN, MINNESOTA, MINNESOTA DULUTH – ARE TOP THREE IN NATIONAL POLLS AGAIN; LEAGUE RACE RESUMES WITH FULL SLATE OF FOUR SERIES STREAKING NORTH DAKOTA VISITS ST. CLOUD STATE, BEMIDJI STATE HOSTS MINNESOTA STATE, NO. 2 MINNESOTA HEADS TO OHIO STATE, NO. 3 UMD ENTERTAINS NO. 1, UNBEATEN WISCONSIN; UW, UM, UMD RUN NO. 1, NO. 2, NO. 3 IN NATIONAL POLLS ... UND ALSO RECEIVES VOTES; TICKETS ON SALE FOR 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, CHAMPIONSHIP SET FOR MARCH 7-8 AT RIDDER ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – North Dakota, Bemidji State and Minnesota will resume Western Collegiate Hockey Association play this weekend on winning streaks after posting sweeps in their first non-conference series of the 2009 calendar year.

North Dakota (11-7-2) is unbeaten over the last four games at 3-0-1 after prevailing in a pair of overtime games in the Easton Holiday Showcase tournament last weekend in St. Cloud, Minn. The Fighting Sioux, who beat Rensselaer 3-2 in overtime and tied Wayne State 3-3 (ot), but won the shootout on Melissa Jaques' goal, will travel back to St. Cloud to face the Huskies (9-9-2), who lost their tournament games to Rensselaer and Wayne State by 3-2 and 2-0 counts. The Sioux and the Huskies will face-off at 2:07 pm CT both Friday (Jan. 9) and Saturday (Jan. 10) at the National Hockey Center. Back on Oct. 10-11, North Dakota swept SCSU in Grand Forks, 2-1 and 3-2.

Bemidji State (3-15-2), scored its first two-game sweep of the season last weekend, beating Robert Morris on the road, 2-0 and 3-1, and will try to build on the momentum of those back-to-back victories when the Beavers host league rival Minnesota State (6-10-2) at John Glas Fieldhouse Friday at 7:07 pm CT and again on Saturday afternoon at 2:07 pm CT. The Mavericks swept BSU, 3-2 and 4-3, back on Oct. 31-Nov. 1 in Mankato.

The top three teams in the country, according to current national polls, and the top three teams in the WCHA will also resume league play this weekend of Jan. 9-11 as No. 2-ranked Minnesota visits Ohio State (Friday, 7:07 pm ET; Saturday, 4:07 pm ET) and No. 1-ranked Wisconsin heads to No. 3-ranked Minnesota Duluth (Saturday,

The top-ranked Badgers, who have a record unbeaten streak of 20 games at 18-0-2 to start the season and No. 2 Minnesota, which has won 12 straight games, have a sizable lead in the race for the league title at the holiday break. The Badgers won (2-1) and tied (2-2 ot) against UMD in Madison in the first series this season played on Oct. 31-Nov. 1. The Golden Gophers, who are coming off a 8-0, 5-3 non-conference sweep at Niagara last weekend, swept the Buckeyes in Minneapolis back on Oct. 17-18 by 8-1 and 8-2 margins.

At the halfway mark in the season, Wisconsin (18-0-2, 10-0-2-1 WCHA) has 27 points, one more than Minnesota (17-2-1, 12-1-1-0 WCHA). Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth (12-6-2, 7-5-2 WCHA) is third with 16 points, one point ahead of North Dakota (12-7-1, 7-6-1-0 WCHA) and two points ahead of St. Cloud State (9-9-2, 6-7-1-1 WCHA). Ohio State (6-12-2, 4-9-1-1 WCHA) has jumped into sixth place with 10 points, one more than Minnesota State (6-10-2, 3-9-2-1 WCHA). Bemidji State (3-15-2, 0-14-0-0 WCHA) is in eighth place without a point.

Through games of Jan. 5, four of the WCHA's eight-member teams have winning records overall in Wisconsin (18-0-2, .950), Minnesota (17-2-1, .875), Minnesota Duluth (12-6-2, .650), and North Dakota (11-7-2, .600). St. Cloud State, meanwhile, is at .500 overall with a 9-9-2 mark.

coaches to an ever-growing legion of fans. Coming off our ninth consecutive national championship, and based on the continuing emergence of all of our member teams, we're confident the WCHA as a whole will be even more competitive from top to bottom this season."

The battle for the WCHA regular season championship will again consist of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. The opening weekend of league competition was Oct. 10-11 with the regular season concluding the weekend of Feb. 20-22. The conference's post-season championship tournament gets underway the weekend of Feb. 27-Mar. 1 (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) with a first round, best-of-three series format at campus sites. The No. 1 seeded team will host the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed will host the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed will host the No. 5 seed.

The four first-round winners will then advance to the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., on Saturday and Sunday, March 7-8. On Saturday, there will be two semi-final match-ups at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game set for Sunday at 1:07 pm CT.

Following two weeks of WCHA playoffs, the NCAA Women's Div. 1 championship tournament will commence the weekend of March 13-15 at regional sites (TBA), followed by the 2008 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held March 20-22 at Boston, Mass.

WCHA WOMEN USING SHOOTOUT IN 2008-09

The WCHA is helping to re-introduce the shootout to women's college hockey. A National Hockey League-style three-player shootout is being used to determine a winner for all WCHA regular season games still tied after regulation and the standard five-minute overtime.

In the first half of the season five games went to a shootout. They were:

- St. Cloud State beat Minnesota-Duluth Oct. 17 at St. Cloud (SCSU won 2-1 in 3 rounds Holly Roberts GWG)
- Minnesota State beat North Dakota Oct. 17 at North Dakota (MSM won 2-1 in 5 rounds of shootout – Lisa Edman with GWG)
- Minnesota beat Wisconsin Oct. 24 at Wisconsin (Minn won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Sarah Erickson with GWG)
- Wisconsin beat Minnesota Duluth, Nov. 1 at Wisconsin (UW won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Kelly Nash with GWG)
- Ohio State beat Minnesota State Dec. 13 at Mankato (OSU won 1-0 in 9 rounds of shotout – Jenna Kilpatrick with GWG)

The NCAA Rules and Ice Hockey Committees have allowed conferences the ability to implement this tie-breaking protocol so that every regular season league game will have a winner while preserving the integrity of the national rankings. Regular season games decided by a shootout will still be considered ties for NCAA purposes so there will be no effect on NCAA records for the purposes of the Pairwise and determining the national tournament field. Bonus points awarded will impact WCHA standings only. The WCHA standings should be read with two points for a win, zero points for losses, one point for a tie and one point for shootout wins.
