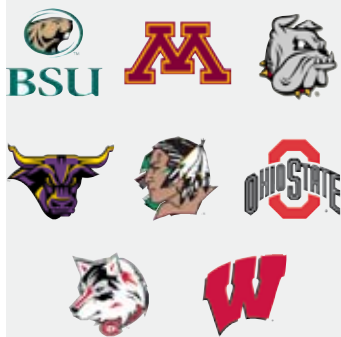

WCHA LEAD AT STAKE AS BORDER BATTLE ENSUES AT RIDDER LEAGUE CO-LEADERS MINNESOTA, WISCONSIN COLLIDE SATURDAY-SUNDAY; THIRD PLACE MINNESOTA DULUTH VISITS BEMIDJI STATE; ST. CLOUD STATE, OFF SPLIT WITH UMD, HOSTS MINNESOTA STATE; NORTH DAKOTA TRAVELS TO OHIO STATE; LATEST NATIONAL RANKINGS HAVE UW NO. 1, UM NO. 2, UMD NO. 3/4 ... SCSU ALSO RECEIVES VOTES; 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF TICKETS CONTINUE ON SALE, CHAMPIONSHIP TO BE STREAMED LIVE AT WCHA.COM ON WCHA.TV, CARRIED TAPE-DELAYED ON FSN

MADISON, Wis. – Wisconsin and Minnesota, standing No. 1 and No. 2 respectively in the latest national rankings and both coming off one-sided sweeps in their conference series last weekend, will meet this weekend (Feb. 7-8) at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis in a battle of first place teams in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Game times both Saturday and Sunday are 2:07 pm CT.

The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers enter the big series with the Badgers after a Jan. 30-31 weekend WCHA sweep over host Minnesota State by scores of 9-1 and 7-4. Meanwhile, No. 1-ranked Wisconsin beat Ohio State twice at the Kohl Center this past Saturday and Sunday by identical 7-0 scores. The decision on Feb. 1 gave coach Mark Johnson, who was selected to coach the U.S. Women's Olympic Hockey Team in 2010 earlier in the week, his 200th victory behind the UW bench.

Heading into the Border Battle for the league lead, the teams are evenly matched. Minnesota has many weapons including freshman Monique Lamoureux who scored four goals against Minnesota State last Saturday. Lamoureux leads the team in scoring with 31 goals to tie UW sophomore Hilary Knight for the most goals in the nation. Statistically speaking, both teams have eye-popping numbers but the Badgers hold a slight edge in special teams and scoring offense and defense. The Golden Gophers have not won a home game against UW since January 30, 2005. Since then, the Gophers have held a 0-5-1 mark during regular season play. The Gophers' tie, however, came in the Badgers' last visit to Ridder Arena on Feb. 24, 2008.

Earlier this season, Minnesota and Wisconsin tied 1-1 in the series opener in Madison and Minnesota won the shootout and, in the series finale, the Badgers took a 2-1 victory on Erika Lawler's third period, tie-breaking shorthanded goal. Both teams have clinched home playoff spots and, mathematically, they are the only teams

that can win the 2008-09 regular season championship as play heads into the final three weekends.

In Friday-Saturday series this weekend, defending NCAA and WCHA champion and No. 3/4-ranked Minnesota Duluth, which saw a seven-game unbeaten snapped in a series split at home with St. Cloud State last weekend, travels to Bemidji State, which is a much-improved 5-3-2 since New Year's. Face-offs at John Glas Fieldhouse are 2:07 pm CT both afternoons. Minnesota State plays at St. Cloud State and the National Hockey Center at 7:07 pm CT on Friday and then the teams play game two on Saturday at 7:07 pm CT at Buffalo Civic Center in Buffalo, Minn. And in Columbus, Ohio State entertains North Dakota at the OSU Ice Rink on Friday at 7:07 pm ET and Saturday at 4:07 pm ET.

With six games left in the regular season here are the standings: Minnesota (23-3-2, 18-2-2-2 in WCHA play with 40 points) and Wisconsin (24-1-3, 18-1-3-1 WCHA, 40 points) are tied for first with Minnesota Duluth (17-7-4, 12-6-4-1 WCHA, 29 points) third. St. Cloud State (13-13-2, 10-11-1-1 WCHA, 22 points) is in fourth place, one point ahead of North Dakota (13-11-4, 9-10-3-0 WCHA, 21 points) in fifth. Minnesota State (7-16-3, 4-15-3-2 WCHA, 13 points) is in sixth place, ahead of Ohio State (6-19-3, 4-15-2-2 WCHA, 12 points) and Bemidji State (6-18-4, 3-17-1-1 WCHA, 8 points).

Looking ahead to the final three weeks of the regular season, here is the remaining schedule:

JAN. 30-FEB. 1 WEEKEND HIGHLIGHTS

The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers won a pair of road contests at Minnesota State, 9-1 on Friday and 7-4 on Saturday. Leading the way for Minnesota in the win on Jan. 30 were seven players who had multiple-point nights, including right wingers Monique Lamoureux (2g,1a), who had the game-winner, and Gigi Marvin (1g,3a). In the Jan. 31 victory, Monique Lamoureux scored four goals, including another game-winner, and set up another, defenseman Rachael Drazan had 1-3-4, and center Jocelyne Lamoureux scored twice. For Minnesota State in the series, right winger Maggie Fisher scored three goals.

The No. 1-ranked Badgers prevailed twice at the Kohl Center over visiting Ohio State with a pair of 7-0 shutout victories on Saturday and Sunday. On Jan. 31, UW right winger Hilary Knight had two goals and two assists while center Erika Lawler had 2-1-3, including the winner. On Feb. 1, Wisconsin was led by left winger Angie Keseley's two goal, three assist performance, one of which was the game-winner, while Lawler had four assists and Knight added a goal and two assists. The Badgers won the season series vs the Buckeyes, 4-0.

In Duluth, defending WCHA and national champion Minnesota Duluth split with St. Cloud State. The host Bulldogs earned a 7-2 triumph over the Huskies on Friday, before SCSU came back to upset UMD on Saturday by a 4-3 count. In the Jan. 30 triumph, left winger Laura Fridfinnson had a three-goal hat trick for the Bulldogs, including the winner, while defenseman Jocelyne Larocque added three assists. For the Huskies, right winger Megan McCarthy had a goal and an assist. In Saturday's 4-3 SCSU win, McCarthy scored two more goals, including the winner in the third period, while Ashley Nixon made 52 saves in nets. For the Bulldogs, left winger Elin Holmlov led the way with two goals and one assist. The win on Saturday gives St. Cloud State a 2-1-1-1 (inc. one shootout win) advantage in their head-to-head series vs UMD. Earlier this season, the two teams tied 1-1 in St. Cloud on Oct. 17, with the Huskies claiming a 2-1 shootout win, while SCSU won 3-2 on Oct. 18.

And in Grand Forks on Jan. 30-31, host North Dakota downed Bemidji State 6-3 in the series opener before the two teams played to a 0-0 overtime tie on Saturday. The Beavers, however, won the shootout against the Sioux, 2-0. For UND on Jan. 30, center Maria-Michelle Poirier had two goals, including the winner, and one assist while forwards Alyssa Wiebe and Randi Motsko each had a goal and an assist. For BSU in the loss, left winger Erin Johnson had 1-1-2. In the 0-0 tie on Jan. 31, wingers Erin Cody and Erin Johnson had shootout goals to give the Beavers the extra point while in goal, Zuzana Tomcikova had 24 saves for BSU and Stephanie Ney had 20 for North Dakota. In the first pair of games between the two clubs this season, UND won 2-1 and 4-3 (ot) at Bemidji on Dec. 12-13.

WCHA MARKING 10TH SEASON IN 2008-09 LEAGUE LOOKS TO DEFEND RECORD RUN OF NINE STRAIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS; WCHA APPROVES SHOOTOUTS TO BREAK TIES

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, celebrating the 10th season of women's hockey, has plenty of new developments and exciting events that earmark the 2008-09 season.

The battle for the WCHA regular season championship again consists of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. The opening weekend of league competition was Oct. 10-11 with the regular season concluding the weekend of Feb. 20-22. The conference's post-season championship tournament gets underway the weekend of Feb. 27-Mar. 1 (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) with a first round, best-of-three series format at campus sites. The No. 1 seeded team will host the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed will host the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed will host the No. 5 seed.

The four first-round winners will then advance to the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., on Saturday and Sunday, March 7-8. On Saturday, there will be two semi-final match-ups at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game set for Sunday at 1:07 pm CT.

Following two weeks of WCHA playoffs, the NCAA Women's Div. 1 championship tournament will commence the weekend of March 13-15 at regional sites (TBA), followed by the 2008 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held March 20-22 at Boston, Mass.

WCHA WOMEN USING SHOOTOUT IN 2008-09

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association is helping to re-introduce the shootout to women's college hockey. A National Hockey League-style three-player shootout is being used to determine a winner for all WCHA regular season games still tied after regulation and the standard five-minute overtime.

Thus far this season ten games have gone to a shootout:

- St. Cloud State beat Minnesota-Duluth Oct. 17 at St. Cloud (SCSU won 2-1 in 3 rounds – Holly Roberts GWG)
- Minnesota State beat North Dakota Oct. 17 at North Dakota (MSM won 2-1 in 5 rounds of shootout – Lisa Edman with GWG)
- Minnesota beat Wisconsin Oct. 24 at Wisconsin (Minnesota won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Sarah Erickson with GWG)
- Wisconsin beat Minnesota Duluth, Nov. 1 at Wisconsin (UW won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Kelly Nash with GWG)
- Ohio State beat Minnesota State Dec. 13 at Mankato (OSU won 1-0 in 9 rounds of shootout – Jenna Kilpatrick with GWG)
- Minnesota Duluth beat Wisconsin Jan. 11 at Duluth (UMD won 2-0 in 2 rounds of shootout – Sara O'Toole with GWG)
- Ohio State beat Bemidji State Jan. 23 at Bemidji (OSU won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Natalie Spooner with GWG)
- Minnesota State beat North Dakota Jan. 24 at Mankato (MSM won 2-1 in 3 rounds of shootout – Maggie Fisher with GWG)
- Minnesota beat Minnesota Duluth Jan. 24 at Minnesota (Minnesota won 2-0 in 2 rounds of shootout – Sarah Erickson with GWG)
- Bemidji beat North Dakota Jan. 31 at North Dakota (Bemidji won 20 in 2 rounds of shootout – Erin Johnson with GWG).

The NCAA Rules and Ice Hockey Committees have allowed conferences the ability to implement this tie-breaking protocol so that every regular season league game will have a winner while preserving the integrity of the national rankings. Regular season games decided by a shootout will still be considered ties for NCAA purposes so there will be no effect on NCAA records for the purposes of the Pairwise and determining the national tournament field. Bonus points awarded will impact WCHA standings only. The WCHA standings should be read with two points for a win, zero points for losses, one point for a tie and one point for shootout wins.

Note: each WCHA-member team plays the other seven conference-member teams four times during the regular season – two home and two away – for a total of 28 league games. In the event of ties for first place, teams will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The Beavers (6-17-3, 3-16-1 WCHA) took two points from North Dakota in a series at Grand Forks, N.D. last weekend ... On a day when Brooke Collins broke the school record for the most consecutive games played in a career and coach Steve Sertich manned the helm for the 100th time, Erin Cody and Erin Johnson stole the show as they notched shootout goals to give the Bemidji its first-ever shootout win after a 0-0 tie with North Dakota last Saturday ... It was BSU's fourth shootout of the season and its second against a conference opponent ... North Dakota's Susanne Fellner went first and was denied by Bemidji State netminder Zuzana Tomcikova who was on top of her game after allowing five goals during last Friday's 6-3 loss ... Lawler ranks second in the nation for assists per game averaging 1.11 a game ... Knight, Lawler, Brooke Ammerman, Keseley and Meghan Duggan all rank in the top-25 for points per game with four other Badgers making the top-100 list ... After a dominate first half of the season, the Badgers are on pace to have a record-breaking season ... Knight has cracked into season-high lists for goals, points and power-play goals ... Knight is also on the verge of cracking career lists as a sophomore ... Knight is just two goals away from cracking the top-six for career goals at UW ... Knight is fourth for points in a season, and second for goals in a season ... Also, her 10 power-play goals is enough to tie her for fourth ...
