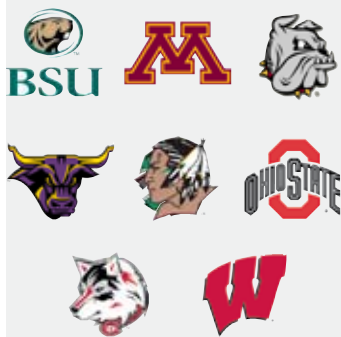

WCHA PLAYOFFS COMMENCE FRIDAY IN FOUR BEST-OF-THREE SERIES; WCHA TO NAME DECADE'S TOP 10 PLAYERS

MADISON, Wis. – It went down to the final game of the season, but Minnesota defeated St. Cloud State, 3-1, at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis to earn the school's fifth Western Collegiate Hockey Association regular season title and the first since 2005. The Golden Gophers (28-3-3 overall) won the conference title with 51 conference points, one more than rival Wisconsin.

The Gophers enter the league playoffs as the top ranked women's team in the country in both national polls – against ahead of No. 2-ranked Wisconsin and No. 4 Minnesota Duluth – and as the No. 1 playoff seed in the league. Their ranking is based on a 23-2-3 mark in conference games and they swept conference opponents 11 times this season, including the season finale against St. Cloud State, en route to the championship. Minnesota's other regular season WCHA championships came in 2001, 2002, 2004, 2005.

The Golden Gophers also had the 2008-09 conference scoring and goaltending champions. Rookie forward

Monique Lamoureux finished the regular season as the WCHA scoring champ, tallying 61 of her 67 points against conference opponents. Minnesota freshman Alyssa Grogan captured the WCHA's Goaltending Champion award when she posted a goals-against average of 1.37 during conference action.

With the regular season championship under their belts, Coach Brad Frost's Golden Gophers enters the playoffs with the No. 1 seed and will play No. 8-seeded Bemidji State (6-23-5) at 6:07 pm CT Friday and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday and Sunday (if needed) at Ridder Arena. UM was 4-0-0 vs BSU during the regular season.

The other three best-of-three first round WCHA Playoff series will be conducted Friday through Sunday. Wisconsin (27-2-5), the No. 2-ranked team in the country, are the No. 2 seed for the WCHA Playoffs and will entertain No. 7 seed Ohio State (8-23-3) at Eagles' Nest in Verona, Wis., because the Badgers' normal home ice, the Kohl Center, is being used to accommodate the state high school wrestling tournament. Face-offs are 7:07 pm CT each evening. The Badgers went 4-0 vs the Buckeyes during the regular season.

Defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and national champion Minnesota Duluth (23-7-4) is the No. 3 seed and the Bulldogs will play host to No. 7 seed North Dakota (13-17-4) in a rematch of last weekend's series. The playoff series will be held at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center Friday, Saturday and Sunday (if necessary) with face-offs at 7:07 pm CT, 7:07 pm CT and 5:07 pm CT. The Bulldogs were 3-1-0 vs the Fighting Sioux during the regular season, including 3-0 and 3-2 victories over UND last week.

And at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud, No. 4 seed St. Cloud State (14-16-4) will host No. 5-seed Minnesota State (10-17-5) with face-offs at 7:07 pm CT each evening. St. Cloud State went 2-1-1 vs Minnesota State during their four-game regular season series.

Following the first round of WCHA Playoffs, the four winning teams will be re-seeded No. 1 thru No. 4 according to their regular season finish and advance to the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 7-8 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn.

At the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, there will be two semi-final games played on Saturday (March 7) at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship on Sunday (March 8) at 1:07 pm CT.

In this week's (Feb. 23, 2009) USCHO.com Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota is again ranked No. 1, Wisconsin is again No. 2, and Minnesota Duluth is again No. 4.

FEB. 20-21 WEEKEND HIGHLIGHTS

On the final weekend of the 2008-09 regular season, two teams – Minnesota and Wisconsin – swept their WCHA series at home while two others – Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota State – won twice on the road.

The Golden Gophers won a home-and-home set against St. Cloud State, prevailing 7-0 at St. Cloud last Friday and 3-1 on Saturday in Minneapolis. In the Feb. 20 contest at the National Hockey Center, right winger Gigi Marvin had two goals and an assist for UM, left winger Emily West scored twice, including the game-winner, defenseman Melanie Gagnon added

1-1-2 and Alyssa Grogan stopped all 18 shots on goal for the shutout. On Feb. 21 at Ridder Arena, right winger Monique Lamoreux had a goal and an assist and center Sarah Erickson knocked home the game-winner for Minnesota, while for the Huskies, center Caitlin Hogan scored the game's first goal in the first period.

At the Kohl Center in Madison, host Wisconsin won twice over Bemidji State, 3-0 and 5-2. This past Friday afternoon, defenseman Brittany Haverstock scored the game-winner and Jessie Vetter pitched a 10-save shutout for the Badgers. On Saturday afternoon, UW left winger Hilary Knight had two goals and two assists and center Erika Lawler had a goal and three assists to pace the attack while for the Beavers, wingers Erin Babineau and Annie Bauerfeld scored goals. Also for BSU, goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova had a total of 84 saves in the series.

In Grand Forks on Feb. 20-21, visiting Minnesota Duluth won twice at North Dakota, 3-2 and 3-0. For UMD on Friday, defenseman Jaime Rasmussen tallied the game-winner as the Bulldogs outshot the Sioux, 34-15. For UND, winger Casie Hanson and center Melissa Jaques scored goals in the second and third period, respectively. On Saturday, UMD goaltender Johanna Ellison had a 14-save shutout while center Haley Irwin's first period goal held up as the winner. For UND, Stephanie Ney had 34 saves in nets.

And in Columbus, visiting Minnesota State came up big with a 6-5, 2-1 sweep over host Ohio State, four points that enabled the Mavericks to earn a share of fifth place and the No. 5 seed for the playoffs. On Feb. 20, MSU received two goals from center Nina Tikkinen and a third period winner from right winger Maggie Fisher. For the Buckeyes, center Laura McIntosh notched a three-goal hat trick. On Saturday, Mavericks' goaltender Paige Thunder stopped 32 of 33 shots on goal and right winger Lisa Edman scored the game-winner at 7:26 of the third. For OSU, defenseman Shannon Reilly had the lone goal.

WCHA MARKING 10TH SEASON IN 2008-09 LEAGUE LOOKS TO DEFEND RECORD RUN OF NINE STRAIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS; WCHA APPROVES SHOOTOUTS TO BREAK TIES

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, celebrating the 10th season of women's hockey, has plenty of new developments and exciting events that earmark the 2008-09 season.

The battle for the WCHA regular season championship again consists of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. The opening weekend of league competition was Oct. 10-11 with the regular season concluding the weekend of Feb. 20-22. The conference's post-season championship tournament gets underway the weekend of Feb. 27-Mar. 1 (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) with a first round, best-of-three series format at campus sites. The No. 1 seeded team will host the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed will host the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed will host the No. 5 seed.

The four first-round winners will then advance to the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., on Saturday and Sunday, March 7-8. On Saturday, there will be two semi-final match-ups at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game set for Sunday at 1:07 pm CT.

Following two weeks of WCHA playoffs, the NCAA Women's Div. 1 championship tournament will commence the weekend of March 13-15 at regional sites (TBA), followed by the 2008 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held March 20-22 at Boston, Mass.

WCHA TO SELECT 10 BEST PLAYERS OVER THE FIRST 10 YEARS OF PLAY

As part of a celebration of its first 10 years of play, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association will name a team of its 10 best women's players, Commissioner Sara R. Martin announced. She said the 10 selectees will be announced the week of Feb. 23 and the players will be honored at the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the league's playoff championship which will be held at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis March 7-8.

Nominations for the WCHA's Top 10 Players in 10 Years came from a list of All-Americans, Olympians and post-season awards winners over the first decade that were reviewed by league coaches and officials and then submitted to a selection committee, which was appointed by the Commissioner's Office to choose the team.

PAIR OF MINNESOTA PLAYERS REIGN AS WCHA SCORING, GOALTENDING CHAMPIONS GOLDEN GOPHERS/MONIQUE LAMOUREUX TOPS SCORERS; MINNESOTA'S ALYSSA GROGAN NO. 1 AMONG LEAGUE NETMINDERS

The individual races for the 2008-09 WCHA scoring and goaltending championships, which are based on league games only, were decided on the final weekend of the regular season and both titles went to players from league champion University of Minnesota.

Earning the league scoring title was Minnesota freshman forward Monique Lamoureux, who produced 61 scoring points in 28 league games. Lamoureux finished with 30 goals and 31 assists.

The WCHA goaltending championship, which is based on goals-against average in league play, went to Minnesota freshman Alyssa Grogan, who carried a 1.37 goals-against average over 833:24 of conference action. Grogan also topped all league netminders in saves percentage at .934, and was third in winning percentage at .857 on a 11-1-2 WCHA mark.

MINNESOTA'S DAGNEY WILLEY NAMED FINALIST FOR 2009 HOCKEY HUMANITARIAN AWARD

Dagney Willey, a senior from the University of Minnesota, is one of the 10 finalists for the Bank of New York Mellon Hockey Humanitarian Award, presented annually to college hockey's finest citizen. Willey, a defenseman from Maple Grove, Minn. is one of four finalists who were also nominees last year. She is the only Western Collegiate Hockey Association player (both men and women) among the finalists.

All 10 finalists will be interviewed by the Hockey Humanitarian committee. The 14th recipient of the Hockey Humanitarian Award will be named in a ceremony on Friday, April 10 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C., in conjunction with the 2009 NCAA Frozen Four.

WCHA WOMEN USED SHOOTOUT IN 2008-09

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association helped to re-introduce the shootout to women's college hockey during the 2008-09 regular season. A National Hockey League-style three-player shootout was used to determine a winner for all WCHA regular season games still tied after regulation and the standard five-minute overtime.

The shootout will not be used in league playoffs. If the teams are tied after regulation, they play to a winner in a series of 20-minute overtimes.

- During the regular season a total of 14 games went to a shootout:

 - Minnesota beat Wisconsin Oct. 24 at Wisconsin (Minnesota won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Sarah Erickson with GWG)
 - Wisconsin beat Minnesota Duluth, Nov. 1 at Wisconsin (UW won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Kelly Nash with GWG)
 - Ohio State beat Minnesota State Dec. 13 at Mankato (OSU won 1-0 in 9 rounds of shootout – Jenna Kilpatrick with GWG)
 - Minnesota Duluth beat Wisconsin Jan. 11 at Duluth (UMD won 2-0 in 2 rounds of shootout – Sara O'Toole with GWG)

The NCAA Rules and Ice Hockey Committees have allowed conferences the ability to implement this tie-breaking protocol so that every regular season league game will have a winner while preserving the integrity of the national rankings. Regular season games decided by a shootout will still be considered ties for NCAA purposes so there will be no effect on NCAA records for the purposes of the Pairwise and determining the national tournament field. Bonus points awarded will impact WCHA standings only. The WCHA standings should be read with two points for a win, zero points for losses, one point for a tie and one point for shootout wins.

WCHA TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES FOR PLAYOFF SEEDING PURPOSES ONLY

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round WCHA Playoff pairings will be as follows: No. 1 rank vs No. 8 rank, No. 2 rank vs No. 7 rank, No. 3 vs No. 6, No. 4 vs No. 5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded No. 1 thru No. 4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition, and will then advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

At the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, there will be two semi-final games on the first day of the tournament and then the championship game on the second day.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.

b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.

c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank.

d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest 'winning margin' during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.

e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

f) Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.

She continues to add to her record with 36 career shutouts ... Vetter has etched her name at the top of the record books as the winningest goalie at UW ... Vetter has the most victories with 84 as the career record holder for all-time victories at Wisconsin ... Vetter is two short of tying the NCAA record for career victories which is 86 ... Vetter has 11 shutouts for the season with 618 saves only allowing 43 goals on the season ... The record for shutouts in a season is now 12 after Christina Kessler of Harvard broke it in 2008 ... Vetter is ranked third in the nation for goals-against average with 1.34 ... She owns a .935 save percentage which is good for fifth and a .864 winning percentage which is sixth in the nation ... Wisconsin is among the top of the list in nearly every category as one of the nation's best programs ...
