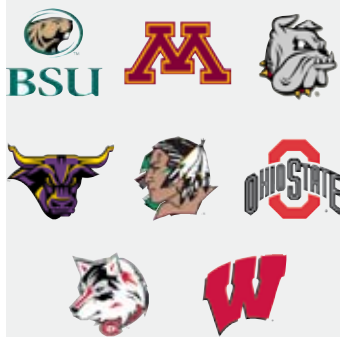

2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF FIELD SET

NO. 1-RANKED MINNESOTA FACES SURPRISING MINNESOTA STATE, NO. 2-RANKED WISCONSIN RENEWS RIVALRY WITH NO. 3-RANKED MINNESOTA DULUTH IN FINAL FACE-OFF SEMI-FINALS SATURDAY; WCHA HAS FIVE OF TOP 10 FINALISTS FOR 2009 PATTY KAZMAIER MEMORIAL AWARD; WCHA NAMES TOP 10 PLAYERS OF FIRST 10 YEARS; FINAL FACE-OFF TO BE STREAMED LIVE ON WCHA.TV, CARRIED TAPE-DELAYED ON FSN; UM'S WILLEY NAMED FINALIST FOR HOCKEY HUMANITARIAN AWARD; MINNESOTA'S RIDDER ARENA TO HOST 2010 NCAA FROZEN FOUR

MADISON, Wis. – Newcomer Minnesota State will join the only three teams to ever win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association playoff championships at the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF this weekend, March 7-8, at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn.

2008-09 league champion Minnesota, Wisconsin and defending playoff and national champion Minnesota Duluth, the top three seeded teams for the WCHA playoffs and the top three women's teams in the country according to the pollsters, won two games and easily swept their first round home-ice series on Feb. 27-28 to earn berths at Ridder Saturday and Sunday.

Visiting Minnesota State (12-18-5) pulled off a first round surprise and beat No. 4-seed St. Cloud State, 1-0, on Sunday, March 1 behind Kala Buganski's first period goal and Paige Thunder's 27-save shutout goaltending in the deciding game of the best of three series. The one-goal victory gave the Mavericks their first-ever WCHA playoff series triumph. One night earlier the Mavericks made school history with their first-ever league playoff victory, a 2-1 decision over St. Cloud State (15-17-4). The fifth-seeded Mavericks are the first team since the best-of-three series was implemented to upset a top seed in a series and to comeback to win a series after losing the first game.

The upset earned Minnesota State a date in the 1:07 pm CT semifinal game this Saturday afternoon against No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Minnesota (30-3-3) which ousted No. 8 seed Bemidji State (6-25-5) in their first round series 2-0.

No. 2-ranked and second seeded Wisconsin (29-2-5) defeated No. 7 seed Ohio State (8-25-3), 4-1 last Saturday, to claim its first round playoff series 2-0, and qualify the Badgers for a semifinal math up at 4:07 pm CT Saturday against a familiar foe – No. 3-ranked and No. 3 seeded Minnesota Duluth (25-7-4), which blanked No. 6 seed North Dakota (13-19-4) twice, 7-0 and 4-0, to complete their sweep.

The 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championship game is set for 1:07 pm CT on Sunday.

The UMD-Wisconsin semifinal matchup on Saturday pairs two teams streaking to the finish line. UMD has gone 14-1-2 down the stretch and won eight games in a row, the last three behind shutout goaltending from Johanna Ellison, while Wisconsin, which features three Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award finalists in goaltender Jessie Vetter and forwards Hilary

Knight, a 39-goal scorer, and Erika Lawler, has posted a 11-1-3 record since mid-January and is 5-0-2 in its last seven games. The long-time rivals went 1-1-2 in head-to-head competition during the regular season. The Bulldogs beat the Badgers 5-4 in the FINAL FACEOFF championship game a year ago and 4-0 in the NCAA title game. Both games were in Duluth, Minn. The previous year, the Badgers beat UMD in the NCAA title game in Lake Placid, N.Y.

Minnesota also streaked down the homestretch to earn the school's fifth Western Collegiate Hockey Association regular season title and the first since 2005. The Golden Gophers won the conference title with 51 conference points, one more than rival Wisconsin, by going 25-1-2 since Halloween. They have the two Patty Kazmaier finalists in forwards Gigi Marvin and Monique Lamoureux, the 2008-09 WCHA scoring champion, and the goaltender with the best goals-against average. Minnesota's rookie sensation Lamoureux finished the season as the WCHA scoring champ, tallying 61 of her 71 points against conference opponents. Gopher freshman Alyssa Grogan captured the WCHA's Goaltending Champion award when she posted a goals against average of 1.37 during conference action.

Minnesota beat Minnesota State in all four meetings this year, but the Mavericks have gotten hot at the right time, winning four of the last five games and going 5-2-2 since Jan. 31.

Tickets for the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championship are on sale at the University of Minnesota Ticket Office. Three-game session tickets for the women's playoff championship are available at three prices: \$20 for a reserved seat, \$18 for general admission, and \$15 for seniors and youth (age 18 and under). Tickets may be purchased by calling the Gopher Ticket Office at 612-624-8080, or 1-800-U-Gopher, or online at Gophersports.com. Single session tickets, priced at \$15, \$12 and \$8, will be available on the days of the semifinals and championship game.

FEB. 27-MAR. 1 WEEKEND HIGHLIGHTS

Results of the first round of WCHA playoffs set the field was set for the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, which will be conducted this Saturday (March 7) and Sunday (March 8) at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. The four qualifying teams for the women's conference playoff championship are No. 1 seed University of Minnesota, No. 2 seed University of Wisconsin, No. 3 seed University of Minnesota Duluth and No. 4 seed Minnesota State University, Mankato.

The Mavericks captured a decisive third game vs host St. Cloud State on Sunday night, prevailing 1-0 on a first period power-play goal by left winger Kala Buganski and a 27-save shutout from goaltender Paige Thunder.

After dropping the first round playoff series opener to host SCSU by a 2-1 count last Friday night, Minnesota State came up with a 2-1 victory on Saturday evening to force a game three as right winger Christina Lee scored both goals, including the game-winner at 7:19 of the second period, and Paige Thunder made 22 saves. Minnesota State outshot the Huskies, 37-23, and neither team was able to score on the power-play, with the Mavericks 0-of-9 and SCSU 0-of-5. The Huskies received their lone goal from center Amy Currier at 18:56 of the second period and 35 saves from goaltender Ashley Nixon.

In other first round WCHA Playoff action last Saturday, the No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Golden Gophers (30-3-3) downed No. 8 seed Bemidji State (6-25-5) by a 5-1 count to win their series 2-0, the No. 2-ranked Badgers (29-2-5) defeated No. 7 seed Ohio State (8-25-3), 4-1, to claim their series 2-0, and the No. 3/4-ranked and No. 3 seeded Bulldogs (25-7-4) again blanked No. 6 seed North Dakota (13-19-4), this time by a 4-0 count to complete their sweep.

Before a crowd of 808 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis on Saturday, center Jocelyne Lamoureux (2g,2a) and right winger Monique Lamoureux (2g,1a) led the way against the visiting Beavers. Monique Lamoureux's shorthanded goal at 7:04 of the second period proved to be the game-winner while in goal, Jenny Lura (15 saves) and Kim Hanlon (7 saves) combined for 22 stops for UM. For Bemidji State, goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova made 29 saves while left winger Erin Johnson tallied a power-play goal at 4:12 of the third period.

At Eagle's Nest in Verona, Wis., the host Wisconsin Badgers scored three times in the third period to break open a 1-1 tie and move on to a 4-1 victory over visiting Ohio State before a sellout crowd of 776. Center Erika Lawler and right winger Hilary Knight paced the UW attack with two goals apiece, with Lawler's power-play tally at 5:48 of the third proving to be the game-winner. Jessie Vetter had 26 saves for the UW while for the Buckeyes, right winger Hayley Klassen had a second period power-play goal to tie the game at 1-1 and Liana Bonanno made 37 saves between the pipes.

And at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center on Saturday, a crowd of 608 saw the host UMD Bulldogs complete a first round WCHA Playoff sweep over North Dakota with a 4-0 victory as left winger Pernilla Winberg scored a pair of goals – including the game-winner – and goaltender Johanna Ellison stopped all 25 shots on goal. The Bulldogs, who outshot the Fighting Sioux, 40-25, also had a pair of assists from right winger Elin Holmlov. For UND, Stephanie Ney had a 36-save effort in nets.

WCHA MARKING 10TH SEASON IN 2008-09 LEAGUE LOOKS TO DEFEND RECORD RUN OF NINE STRAIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS; WCHA APPROVES SHOOTOUTS TO BREAK TIES

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, celebrating the 10th season of women's hockey, has plenty of new developments and exciting events that earmark the 2008-09 season.

The battle for the WCHA regular season championship again consists of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. The opening weekend of league competition was Oct. 10-11 with the regular season concluding the weekend of Feb. 20-22. The conference's post-season championship tournament gets underway the weekend of Feb. 27-Mar. 1 (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) with a first round, best-of-three series format at campus sites. The No. 1 seeded team will host the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed will host the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed will host the No. 5 seed.

The four first-round winners will then advance to the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., on Saturday and Sunday, March 7-8. On Saturday, there will be two semi-final match-ups at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game set for Sunday at 1:07 pm CT.

Following two weeks of WCHA playoffs, the NCAA Women's Div. 1 championship tournament will commence the weekend of March 13-15 at regional sites (TBA), followed by the 2008 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held March 20-22 at Boston, Mass.

PAIR OF MINNESOTA PLAYERS REIGN AS

WCHA SCORING, GOALTENDING CHAMPIONS

GOLDEN GOPHERS' MONIQUE LAMOUREUX TOPS SCORERS; MINNESOTA'S ALYSSA GROGAN NO. 1 AMONG LEAGUE NETMINDERS

The individual races for the 2008-09 WCHA scoring and goaltending championships, which are based on league games only, were decided on the final weekend of the regular season and both titles went to players from league champion University of Minnesota.

Earning the league scoring title was Minnesota freshman forward Monique Lamoureux, who produced 61 scoring points in 28 league games. Lamoureux finished with 30 goals and 31 assists.

The WCHA goaltending championship, which is based on goals-against average in league play, went to Minnesota freshman Alyssa Grogan, who carried a 1.37 goals-against average over 833:24 of conference action. Grogan also topped all league netminders in saves percentage at .934, and was third in winning percentage at .857 on a 11-1-2 WCHA mark.

WCHA HAS FIVE OF TEN PATTY KAZMAIER

MEMORIAL AWARD FINALISTS

GROUP INCLUDES UW'S KNIGHT, LAWLER & VETTER AND UM'S LAMOUREUX AND MARVIN

The WCHA has five of the ten finalists for the 2009 Patty Kazmaier Award, the award presented to the top player in college hockey, USA Hockey announced.

For the first time in school history and only the second time ever, Wisconsin had three finalists, as selected by the nation's Division I coaches. They are sophomore forward Hilary Knight, who has scored a NCAA-leading 39 goals, and seniors Erika Lawler, a forward from Fitchburg, Mass. who leads the NCAA with 39 assists, and Jessie Vetter, a record-setting goalie from Cottage Grove, Wis. who is the only active player named to the league's all-time team (see stats in next story).

Wisconsin has had two finalists in the top 10 three different years, but Harvard is the only other school to have three finalists in a single year

back in 1999. The only Badger to win the award was Sara Bauer in 2006, she was also the only Badger to make the top-three finalists both in 2006 and in 2007.

Minnesota had two of the finalists—Monique Lamoureux of Grand Forks, N.D. and Gigi Marvin of Warroad, Minn. The WCHA scoring champion, Lamoureux has 71 points in 36 games played while Marvin, a finalist last year as well, has 25 goals and 49 points. Former Gopher Krissy Wendell won the Kazmaier in 2005.

Also named as finalists are last year's Kazmaier winner, Harvard's Sarah Vaillancourt, as well as Mercyhurst's Meghan Agosta, Cornell's Rebecca Johnston, Boston College's Molly Schaus, and New Hampshire's Jenn Wakefield. Lamoureux is the only freshman finalist, while three are sophomores (Johnston, Knight, Wakefield), two are juniors (Agosta and Schaus) and four are seniors (Lawler, Marvin, Vaillancourt and Vetter).

The top three finalists, including the recipient of the Kazmaier, are chosen by a 13-member selection committee comprised of NCAA Division I women's ice hockey coaches, representatives of the print and broadcast media and a representative of USA Hockey. The three finalists for this year's award will be announced March 10.

The 2009 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, which takes place in conjunction with the NCAA Women's Frozen Four, will be presented at a brunch ceremony on Sat., March 21, at the Royal Sonesta Hotel in Boston at 9 am CDT.

WCHA HONORS LEAGUE'S TOP 10 PLAYERS FROM FIRST DECADE

GROUP FOR 1999-2009 INCLUDES PATTY KAZMAIER MEMORIAL AWARD WINNERS, PLAYERS OF THE YEAR, ALL-AMERICANS, OLYMPIC GOLD MEDALISTS

MADISON, Wis. – Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin, the teams which have won national championships and turned the Western Collegiate Hockey Association into the best league in women's hockey over the last decade, each placed three players on the WCHA's Top Ten Players of the first ten years. The WCHA is marking its 10th season of women's hockey in 2008-09, with the first season of league play coming in 1999-2000.

The top players of the decade includes two Patty Kazmaier Award winners, All Americans and Olympic gold medalists. It includes one active player. In addition to players from Minnesota, Wisconsin and defending national champion Duluth, the team also includes one player from Ohio State.

"In this our anniversary season of celebrating 10 years of women's WCHA hockey, we recognize 10 of the names that have helped make this Association such a success," said Sara R. Martin, WCHA Associate Commissioner. "In a decade that has seen such tremendous development and growth of our sport, we today salute our 10 best players."

"These outstanding young women have made a significant impact on the history of this league and also left a lasting impression on the game of ice hockey itself," added Martin. "We are most grateful that we had the opportunity to watch them play in the WCHA and cherish the idea that we will always have them as special members of our extended family."

The top ten players from the first ten years are: Sara Bauer, Forward, University of Wisconsin; Tessa Bonhomme, Defenseman, Ohio State University; Ronda Curtin, Defenseman, University of Minnesota; Natalie Darwitz, Forward, University of Minnesota; Molly Engstrom, Defenseman, University of Wisconsin; Caroline Ouellette, Forward, University of Minnesota Duluth; Jenny Schmidgall Potter, Forward, University of Minnesota Duluth and University of Minnesota; Maria Rooth, Forward, University of Minnesota Duluth; Jessie Vetter, Goaltender, University of Wisconsin; and Krissy Wendell, Forward, University of Minnesota.

The players will be honored at the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF in Minneapolis March 7-8. Nominations for the WCHA's Top 10 Players in 10 Years came from a list of All-Americans, Olympians and post-season awards winners

over the first decade that were reviewed by league coaches and officials and then submitted to a selection committee, which was appointed by the Commissioner's Office to choose the team.

MINNESOTA, RIDDER ARENA TO HOST 2010 NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR

The NCAA Women's Ice Hockey Committee has selected the University of Minnesota and Ridder Arena as the site of the 2010 NCAA Frozen Four. The 2010 tournament marks the third time in 10 years the Golden Gophers will host the Women's Frozen Four and the first time in Ridder Arena. Minnesota hosted the inaugural Women's Frozen Four in 2001 and again in 2006 in Mariucci Arena. Along with announcing Ridder as the host site next year, the committee selected Mercyhurst (Erie, Pa.) and Tullio Arena to host the 2011 Frozen Four.

"We received several attractive bids, each presenting exciting opportunities in future years for showcasing the NCAA Women's Frozen Four. We are certain both schools and their respective communities will provide an outstanding experience for both the student-athletes and fans," said Jeff Schulman, chair of the National Collegiate Women's Ice Hockey committee and senior associate athletic director at the University of Vermont.

Mariucci Arena was the site of the 2001 and the 2006 Frozen Fours. In the two-day championship in 2006, Minnesota drew 7,577 fans. Minnesota hosted the inaugural Women's Frozen Four in 2001, bringing in an attendance of 5,114 during the two-day tournament. Mariucci Arena was also the site of the 1999 American Women's College Hockey Alliance National Championship. The tournament had an attendance of 4,954, including 2,507 for the championship game.

The university opened the doors to Ridder Arena at the start of the 2002-03 season. Ridder Arena, which seats approximately 3,400 people, has been host to a variety of events, including five WCHA conference championships and the Minnesota state girls' tournament in 2003, 2004 and 2005. The only arena in the nation built solely for a women's hockey team, Minnesota's largest single-game attendance came on January 6, 2007, when 3,251 fans entered the building.

MINNESOTA'S DAGNEY WILLEY NAMED FINALIST FOR HOCKEY HUMANITARIAN AWARD

Dagney Willey, a senior from the University of Minnesota, is one of the 10 finalists for the Bank of New York Mellon Hockey Humanitarian Award, presented annually to college hockey's finest citizen. Willey, a defenseman from Maple Grove, Minn. is one of four finalists who were also nominees last year. She is the only Western Collegiate Hockey Association player (both men and women) among the finalists.

All 10 finalists will be interviewed by the Hockey Humanitarian committee. The 14th recipient of the Hockey Humanitarian Award will be named in a ceremony on Friday, April 10 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C., in conjunction with the 2009 NCAA Frozen Four.

A National Hockey League-style three-player shootout was used to determine a winner for all WCHA regular season games still tied after regulation and the standard five-minute overtime.

The shootout will not be used in league playoffs. If the teams are tied after regulation, they play to a winner in a series of 20-minute overtimes.

The NCAA Rules and Ice Hockey Committees have allowed conferences the ability to implement this tie-breaking protocol so that every regular season league game will have a winner while preserving the integrity of the national rankings. Regular season games decided by a shootout will still be considered ties for NCAA purposes so there will be no effect on NCAA records for the purposes of the Pairwise and determining the national tournament field. Bonus points awarded will impact WCHA standings only. The WCHA standings should be read with two points for a win, zero points for losses, one point for a tie and one point for shootout wins.

Senior forward and two-year captain Tawni Mattila has tied UMD's all-time record for career games played with 141 ... Mattila is set to break the record Saturday against Wisconsin ... UMD is 23-26-8 overall against the Badgers, and 1-1-2 against them this season ... Each team grabbed a shoot-out victory in their home rink ... MSU did make the WCHA Final Five tournament in 2003-04 when it finished tied for fourth in the regular season conference standings with Ohio State ... the Mavericks – as the fifth-seed – lost to #4-seed OSU, 3-1 ... the Mavericks improved their season record to 12-18-5 ... the 12 wins sits fourth in school history for wins in a season ... MSU goaltender Paige Thunder was the hero of the weekend, posting a 1.00 goals-against average, .958 save percentage, pitching her first-career shutout and adding an assist to the game-winning goal Sunday ... in last Friday's 2-1 loss to the Huskies, MSU won the shots battle 26-22, marking the fifth time this season the Mavericks have outshot their opponent and lost ... both teams scored on

The Fighting Sioux's season came to an end with 7-0 and 4-0 shutout losses to the defending national champion Minnesota Duluth at the DECC in the first round of the WCHA Playoffs ... The Bulldogs and goaltender Johanna Ellison made it three straight games of blanking the Sioux on the scoreboard as she made 25 saves in Game Two of the best of three series after making just 16 in the series opener ... Stephanie Ney made six saves in the UND net in Saturday's game. ... "We competed," Coach Brian Idalski said. "We were very disciplined with the matchup and our changes. Going in to the third period down by one putting two pretty solid periods together. Unfortunately we gave up 5-on-3 goal to put them up a couple and then we really had to open it up a lot more to try to get one the board. That lead to the third (goal) and then an empty-netter, but our kids competed and have nothing to hang their heads about. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will receive the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament, which begins with quarterfinal action at campus sites March 13-15 ... The Badgers have a 21-8-0 record in the WCHA postseason as they enter the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF ... No. 2 Wisconsin hosted the first round of the WCHA playoffs in Verona, Wis. at the Eagle's Nest last Friday and Saturday against Ohio State ... The Badgers swept the Buckeyes to advance and received two goals and one assist from right winger Meghan Duggan, three assists from left winger Angie Keseley and 20 saves from goaltender Jessie Vetter in a 7-0 victory ... The shutout tied Vetter for the NCAA record for shutouts in a season ... The Badgers owned a 44-20 advantage in shots on goal, got the winning goal from defenseman Rachel Bible, and benefited from two-point games from centers Erika Lawler (1g,1a) and Mallory Deluce (1g,1a) and defenseman Alycia Matthews (1g,1a) ... The Badgers secured their spot in the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF when they scored three times in the third period to break open a 1-1 tie and move on to a 4-1 victory over Ohio State ... Lawler and right winger Hilary Knight paced the UW attack with two goals apiece, with Lawler's power-play tally at 5:48 of the third proving to be the game-winner ... Vetter had 26 saves for the UW and only allowed one goal on the weekend ... The Badgers have more wins than any team in the nation dating back to 2005-06 with 130 wins ... The Badgers only losses this season have come to ranked opponents, ranking at No. 2 and No. 3 ... Under Mark Johnson, Wisconsin is 109-18-9 during the second half of seasons (after Jan.1) for a winning percentage of .835 ... In the last four seasons, UW is 69-7-5 during the second half of the season for a winning percentage of .883 ... For the first time in school history and only the second time ever, three Badgers are named to the 2009 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award top 10 finalists ... Sophomore Knight and seniors Lawler and Vetter have been chosen by NCAA Division I women's ice hockey coaches as part of the 10 finalists, the award annually recognizes the top player in NCAA Division I women's ice hockey ... Wisconsin has had two finalists in the top 10 three different years, but Harvard is the only other school to have three finalists in a single year back in 1999 ... The only Badger to win the award was Sara Bauer in 2006, she was also the only Badger to make the top-three finalists both in 2006 and in 2007 ... Vetter has rewritten the Wisconsin record books and continues to break NCAA records ... Vetter holds the NCAA career shutout record with 37 career shutouts and is the winningest goaltender in UW history and is tied for the NCAA record with 86 all-time victories ... Vetter has 12 shutouts for the season with 664 saves only allowing 44 goals on the season ... Vetter's 12 shutouts this season ties the NCAA record for shutouts in a season ... Vetter shares the record with Christina Kessler of Harvard who set it in 2008 ... Vetter is ranked third in the nation for goals-against average with 1.29 ... She owns a .938 save percentage which is good for fourth and a .871 winning percentage which is sixth in the nation ... Knight leads the team in point scoring (67), goal scoring (39), power-play points (26) and power-play goals (13) ... Knight's 39 goals leads the nation in goal scoring ... Knight is ranked second in the nation for goals per game (1.15), fourth in points per game (1.97) and tied for first in power-play goals with 13 ... She is tied for 12th in game-winning goals with five ... Lawler has 55 points this season, surpassing her single-season point total from all three years, including her previous best 40 points from her junior season ... Lawler currently ranks second in the nation for assists per game averaging 1.11 a game ... Lawler leads the nation in assists with 39 ... Senior winger, Angie Keseley has 14 goals and 47 points for her personal best in a season ... Her scoring surge has helped her crack the UW record books for career points, in the No. 8 spot ... The 12 shorthanded goals the Badgers have scored this year are a new school record for shorthanded goals in a season beating the previous best of nine in the 2006-07 season ... For the first time in UW history, Wisconsin has six players who have tallied at least 40 points this season ... Knight (67), Lawler (55), Brooke Ammerman (48), Keseley (47), Duggan (47) and Jasmine Giles (42) ... Along with the 40-plus scorers, Deluce has 32 points.
