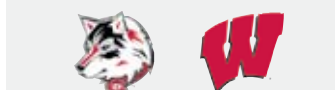
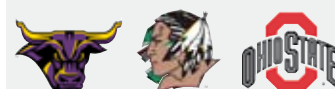

DEFENDING WCHA CHAMPION MINNESOTA, MINNESOTA DULUTH POST LEAGUE SWEEPS TO SET UP EARLY SEASON SHOWDOWN; FOUR WCHA SERIES UPCOMING OCT. 16-18

GOLDEN GOPHERS, BULLDOGS PLAY FOR FIRST PLACE IN MINNEAPOLIS; UM WINS TWICE AT OSU LAST WEEKEND; UMD SWEEPS SCSU AT HOME; BEMIDJI STATE SPLITS WITH DEFENDING NCAA CHAMP WISCONSIN BEHIND TOMCIKOVA SHUTOUT; MINNESOTA STATE GRABS TWO VICTORIES AT MAINE IN HEAD COACHING DEBUT OF ERIC MEANS

MADISON, Wis. – Defending conference champion Minnesota and Minnesota Duluth, coming off league season-opening series sweeps, renew their intense intra-state rivalry and face-off this Friday and Saturday, Oct. 16-17, at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis in an early season showdown for the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association lead. Game times are 7:07 pm CT on Friday evening and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon.

The Golden Gophers enter the series with a 4-0-0 overall record and 2-0-0 conference mark following two WCHA victories over host Ohio State at Columbus last weekend, Oct. 9-10. Sarah Erickson scored two goals to lead the Gophers to a 6-5 victory last Friday and then the sophomore from Roseau, Minn., had three more goals last Saturday in a 5-1 decision over the Buckeyes.

Minnesota Duluth ran its 2009-10 overall record to 3-1-0 and league mark to 2-0-0 with a pair of home-ice victories over St. Cloud State in the WCHA season debut for both clubs at the DECC. The Bulldogs received goals from five different players and scored a 5-3 victory over the Huskies last Saturday (Oct. 10). Freshman Katie Wilson had a goal and two assists for the Bulldogs and helped overcome a three-goal night from the Huskies' Caitlin Hogan. Then last Sunday (Oct. 11), Minnesota Duluth freshman goalie Jennifer Harss made 24 saves and collected her first shutout in a 2-0 victory over SCSU.

In other conference action last weekend, Bemidji State split a pair of games with visiting Wisconsin, the defending national champions. Sophomore goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova had 35 saves in blanking the Badgers, 1-0, in Coleraine, Minn., last Saturday, but Wisconsin came back to take a 3-1 victory in Bemidji on Sunday.

In non-conference play, visiting Minnesota State beat host Maine twice in Orono, winning 5-2 in Eric Means' first game as the Mavericks' new head coach and then completing the sweep with a 2-1 victory over the Black Bears last Saturday.

And in exhibition play on Oct. 10, the U.S. Women's National Team beat North Dakota, 11-1, in Warroad, Minn.

In other Western Collegiate Hockey Association games this coming weekend, Ohio State (0-2-0, 0-2-2 WCHA) visits Bemidji State (1-3-0, 1-0-0 WCHA) for a Friday, 7:07 pm CT face-off and a Saturday, 2:07 pm CT start while Minnesota State (2-0-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) plays at North Dakota (1-1-0, 1-1-0 WCHA) in a pair of matinees on Saturday at 2:07 pm CT and Sunday at 2:07 pm CT. Both Wisconsin (2-2-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) and St. Cloud State (1-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) are idle this week.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Oct. 23-24, conference series will find Ohio State at Wisconsin, Minnesota Duluth hosting North Dakota, and Minnesota and St. Cloud State playing home-and-home. In non-conference action, Bemidji State travels to Northeastern.

A GLANCE AT THE 2009-10 SEASON

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association and its eight member teams seek a record 11th consecutive national championship in 2009-10. Since the inception of the NCAA Women's Frozen Four in 2001, three different WCHA teams have won the national championship. The Badgers extended the string and kept the WCHA's national title streak alive in 2008-09 when they won their third national title by defeating Mercyhurst, 4-0, in Boston in the NCAA title game last March. The victory capped a memorable season for the WCHA, which placed three teams in the Frozen Four including league champion Minnesota, traditional power Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin, which won the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the league playoff championships.

Last season's (2008-09) success marked the 10th straight national championship won by a WCHA-member institution. Minnesota Duluth won the first three NCAA titles in 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2008. The Badgers have won national crowns in 2006, 2007 in addition to last season. Minnesota took home the titles in 2004 and 2005, and the Golden Gophers also won the 2000 AWCHA Div. 1 national collegiate championship, prior to the inception of the NCAA tournament, giving the league nine straight national championships in nine years.

The battle for the 2010 WCHA regular season championship will again consist of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. During the course of the season, there will be a total of seven weekends that will consist of all eight member teams engaged in WCHA play. They are Dec. 11-13, Jan. 15-17, Jan. 22-23, Jan. 29-31, Feb. 5-8, Feb. 12-13 and Feb. 19-20. The league regular season schedule concludes Feb. 20.

The first round of WCHA Playoffs, a best-of-three series format at campus locations, will be contested Friday, Feb. 26, Saturday, Feb. 27 and Sunday, Feb. 28 (if necessary). The opening round will match the No. 1 seed vs the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed vs the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed vs the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed vs the No. 5 seed.

The four first round playoff winners will then advance to the 2010 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for Saturday, March 6 and Sunday, March 7 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. There will be two semi-final games played on Saturday at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, followed by the championship game on Sunday.

bring about the NCAA Regionals (sites, times TBA), followed by the 2010 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, set for Friday, March 19 and Sunday, March 21 at UM's Ridder Arena.

Since this season will be contested during an Olympic year, the race for the league title may be more wide open than ever. There are two new coaches – Eric Means moves from being a men's assistant at Minnesota State, Mankato to leading the Mavericks' women and Tracey DeKeyser takes over at Wisconsin for Mark Johnson, who is taking a sabbatical to coach the U.S. Olympic team.

The WCHA family will watch the 2010 Winter Olympics with great pride, knowing that many familiar faces will dot various Olympic team rosters. There are 17 underclassmen among the 36 former WCHA stars who are on national team rosters as of Sept. 25. Here is the list of WCHA players, underclassmen and alums, who hope to play in Vancouver in the Winter Games in February. DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPION WISCONSIN

PICKED TO WIN WCHA IN 2009-10

COACHES PICK DEFENDING WCHA CHAMP MINNESOTA SECOND, UMD THIRD IN PRESEASON POLL; UW'S AMMERMAN IS PRE-SEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR, UW'S DECKER IS PRE-SEASON ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

MADISON, Wis. – Defending national champion University of Wisconsin is without its head coach and many familiar faces, but the Badgers are still the preseason pick to win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association women's title, according to a poll of league-member head coaches.

The Badgers collected six first place votes and 48 total points in the poll of the eight head coaches and edged out defending WCHA regular season champion University of Minnesota, which placed second with 43 points and two first place votes. The University of Minnesota Duluth, with 38 points, was selected to finish third. All three of those teams qualified for the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Frozen Four last season.

St. Cloud State University was picked to finish fourth in the final regular season standings, followed by Ohio State University in fifth, University of North Dakota in sixth, Minnesota State University, Mankato in seventh place and Bemidji State University in eighth.

Wisconsin's sophomore forward Brooke Ammerman (River Vale, NJ) received five votes and is the head coaches' pick to be preseason player of the year in the WCHA. Ohio State sophomore forward Natalie Spooner (Scarborough, ON) is the pick of two coaches for player of year and Minnesota Duluth senior forward Saara Tuominen (Ylojarvi, Finland) also received a vote.

Wisconsin's Brianna Decker (Dousman, WI), a forward, received six votes and is the coaches' choice as preseason conference rookie of the year while Ohio State forward Hokey Langan (Chatham, ON) and Minnesota Duluth goaltender Jennifer Harss (Rieden, Germany) each received a vote.

With the 2010 Winter Olympics taking place in February, many WCHA-member team rosters are juggled this season. Wisconsin coach Mark Johnson has taken a sabbatical to coach Team USA and his job at UW has been filled by veteran assistant coach Tracey DeKeyser. Johnson's 22-member Team USA roster is filled with 15 current and former WCHA players, including UW's Hilary Knight and Meghan Duggan and North Dakota's Monique and Jocelyn Lamoureux who are all underclassmen. Currently there are 33 current and former WCHA players listed on national team rosters and planning to play in the Winter Games in Vancouver, B.C. in February.

Eric Means, who takes over the coaching duties at Minnesota State, Mankato this season, joins DeKeyser as a new voice behind the bench in the WCHA.

BEMIDJI STATE UNIVERSITY

- The Beavers will host Ohio State University on Friday, Oct. 16 and Saturday, Oct. 17.
- The Beavers are coming off a big weekend after upsetting then No. 4-ranked Wisconsin 1-0 last Saturday (Oct. 10). The Badgers were able to split the weekend series, winning last Sunday's game, 3-1.
- The last time Bemidji State beat a ranked team was on Oct. 3, 2008 against then No. 10-ranked Wayne State.
- The two games played this weekend between BSU and OSU will be the 41st and 42nd meetings between the two teams. Ohio State holds the advantage in the series, going 22-12-6 against Bemidji State. Last season saw the Beavers go 1-2-1 against the Buckeyes. BSU lost the two games in Columbus, while gaining the win and tie at home.
- Erin Cody (0g, 2a), Erin Johnson (2g, 0a), and Annie Bauerfeld (1g, 2a) have accounted for nearly all of the offensive production so far this season for the Beavers.
- Goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova has made 111 saves on 117 shots. She has a .941 saves percentage on the 2009-10 season while recording a 2.34 goals-against average. Her shutout against Wisconsin on Oct. 10, 2009 was the second time Bemidji State has recorded a shutout against the Badgers.
- Sisters and defensive pair Erika Wheelhouse and Marlee Wheelhouse recorded a total of 23 blocks over the weekend against Wisconsin, including a total of 15 in the 1-0 shutout against the Badgers on Oct. 10.



GOLDEN GOPHERS

UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

- The Golden Gophers earned a series sweep over Ohio State last weekend (Oct. 9-10) to hold a 4-0-0 overall record and a 2-0-0 mark within league competition.
- Last Friday (Oct. 9), Terra Rasmussen scored her first goal of the season at 11:06 in the first period. OSU tied the game at 1-1 when Kelly Wild scored a power-play goal at 17:04 in the first, but Minnesota regained the lead at 18:11 to hold a 2-1 lead after one. Five goals were scored in the second period, including three by the Gophers. Sarah Erickson scored just :15 into the second. OSU followed with a goal at 5:20 in the second by Minttu Tuominen. Becky Kortum scored her first goal as a Golden Gopher at 16:26 in the second. Melissa Feste cut the lead to one when she scored at 16:52 in the second to put the game at 4-3. Emily West scored her third goal of the season at 18:18 in the second. OSU battled back and scored at 2:37 to again, cut the lead to one. Minnesota, however, battled back to put the game to a two-goal deficit with 5:03 remaining in the period. OSU pulled Knapp with 1:45 remaining in the game. With the extra attacker, Hokey Langan scored at 19:39 to put the game at 6-5. Goaltender Alyssa Grogan earned her second win of the season. She faced the most shots in her career and 39 and had the most saves of her career at 34. Her previous best was 36 shots and 33 saves against Minnesota Duluth on Oct. 10, 2008.
- Minnesota took a commanding 3-0 lead over Ohio State last Saturday (Oct. 10) en route to a 6-1 win over the host Buckeyes. Sam Downey got the Gophers on the board early when she scored at 2:29 in the first period. Minnesota added to its lead at 7:28 in the first when Erickson scored on a rebound attempt and scored again at 18:28. Minnesota continued to add another two goals in the second period when Erickson completed the hat trick just 3:37 in the second. West scored a goal of her own at 6:08 in the second when she wound up for a slapshot. OSU cut the Gophers' lead to four when Natalie Spooner scored a power-play goal at 16:22 in the second. The Maroon and Gold added the final blow when Anne Schelper scored at 18:42



in the third.

- In the Ohio State series, 15 Gophers earned a point in the sweep, including Sarah Erickson and Emily West with five points each.
- Freshman goaltender Noora Rätty tallied two assists in the 6-1 victory at Ohio State on Oct. 10. It's the first time a Gopher goalie has recorded two assists in one game, let alone two in one season. In addition Rätty, stopped 29 of 30 shots on goal in the victory.
- Defenseman Anne Schelper and forward Emily West led the Minnesota team with a +7 plus/minus rating on the Oct. 9-10 weekend.
- Forward Sarah Erickson scored five goals during the Ohio State series last weekend, including a hat trick on Saturday (Oct. 10). It was a career-high night for Erickson, who netted a natural hat trick.

BULLDOGS

UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA DULUTH

- The No. 6-ranked Bulldogs are now 3-1-0 overall and 2-0-0 in the WCHA, as well as 36-8-2 all-time against St. Cloud State after sweeping the Huskies over the weekend (Oct. 10-11) at the DECC.
- Five players, including three freshmen, recorded two or more points in last Saturday's 5-3 triumph over visiting SCSU, with rookie forward Katie Wilson turning in a one-goal, two-assist performance to help lead UMD.
- Goaltender Jennifer Harss recorded her first shutout as a Bulldog last Sunday, blanking the Huskies 2-0. Harss made 24 saves and guarded the pipes through eight St. Cloud State power-play attempts to earn her third victory of the season.
- UMD received goals from freshman forward Katherine Wilson, who tallied the game-winner, and freshman blueliner Mariia Posa, whose goal with just :08 seconds remaining in the contest is the first of her Bulldog career. Wilson leads all NCAA rookies with a 1.50 points per game scoring average.
- Katherine Wilson and Emmanuelle Blais have now logged a point in four-straight games. Wilson has two goals and four assists, while Blais has two goals and three assists over that span.
- Jennifer Harss' shutout on Oct. 11 is the first since Johanna Ellison blanked North Dakota just a season ago, 4-0 at the DECC on Feb. 28.
- UMD had a season-high nine penalties for 18 minutes served in last Sunday's contest.
- The Bulldogs are just 1-of-18 on the power-play this season, but are 20-of-21 on their penalty-kill.
- UMD next faces Minnesota in Minneapolis this weekend. The Gophers are the only school in program history the Bulldogs are less than .500 against all-time.



WCHA TEAM WEEKLY NOTEBOOKS CON'T**MAVERICKS****MINNESOTA STATE UNIVERSITY, MANKATO**

- The Mavericks are 2-0-0 overall on the 2009-10 season and will open up Western Collegiate Hockey Association play this weekend (Oct. 17-18) at North Dakota.
- After beating host Maine twice last weekend (Oct. 9-10), this is the first time Minnesota State has started a season 2-0-0 since the 2003-04 season.
- New Mavericks' head coach Eric Means is the first coach in program history to start his career at MSU 2-0.
- Minnesota State finished the Maine weekend 3-of-7 on power-plays, giving them a .429 conversion percentage.
- Minnesota State holds a 3.5 goals per game average and holds 10 team assists.
- The Mavericks have scored six of their ten goals in the third period.

**FIGHTING SIOUX****UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA**

- The Fighting Sioux will host WCHA rival Minnesota State, opening conference play at the Ralph Englestad Arena, with a two-game stint this Saturday (Oct. 17) and Sunday (Oct. 18). UND and the Mavericks tied for fifth place in the WCHA last year with 21 points. The Sioux would finish with a better winning percentage than the Mavericks, but lost to them twice in the shootout leading to MSU getting bumped up to the fifth-place seeding in the conference playoffs.
- The Sioux went 0-2-2-0 against the Mavericks in 2008-09 with three games going to overtime, two games going to a shootout (Mavericks won both) and MSU winning in overtime once. The Mavericks lead the all-time series 17-5-4-2, dating back to Nov. 8, 2002.
- The Sioux faced off against the U.S. Women's National Team and teammates Jocelyne and Monique Lamoureux last Saturday in the second game of the Qwest Tour in Warroad, Minn. The U.S. National team skated to an 11-1 win with Alyssa Wiebe scoring the lone goal for the Sioux and the Lamoureux twins combining for three goals.
- UND opened the 2009-10 regular season with a series split against defending national champion Wisconsin on Oct. 2-3. The Sioux went into the Kohl Center and shutout the Badgers 2-0 on the night they hung their national championship banner.
- Redshirt freshman Jorid Dagfinrud made 62 saves in the series at Wisconsin earning her WCHA Defensive Player of the Week, with 29 of them coming in Friday's shutout, her first collegiate start.
- North Dakota was ranked 11th and received 14 points in the USCHO.com poll.

**BUCKEYES**
OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY

- The Buckeyes (0-2-2, 0-2-0 WCHA) faced No. 2 Minnesota in both its WCHA and home opener last weekend, falling to the Golden Gophers by scores of 6-5 last Friday and 6-1 Saturday. The Buckeyes cut the Minnesota lead to one-goal four times in the first game, but fell just short of tying it up.
- Nine Buckeyes recorded a point in the Friday (Oct. 9) contest and five had multiple-point games, led by sophomore forward Natalie Spooner with three assists. Sophomore defenseman Kelly Wild scored twice, while Melissa Feste, Hokey Langan had a goal and assist and Kim Theut had two assists.
- In game two, Ohio State allowed five goals in the first 26 minutes of the game. The Buckeyes erased the shutout at 16:22 of the second period when they took advantage of a power-play opportunity. Spooner swatted in a pass from along the boards by Langan with McIntosh picking up the second assist. Also recording a point in the series were freshman Minttu Tuominen (1g) and seniors Rachel Davis (1a) and Raelyn LaRocque (1a).
- The six goals scored vs. Minnesota matched how many OSU scored in all four meetings combined vs. the Gophers last year. The five-goals netted in game one were the most vs. Minnesota since a 7-1 victory Jan. 12, 2007 in Minneapolis.
- It was alumni weekend at the OSU Ice Rink, with 20 former Buckeyes returning to Columbus. Included in the group were Tessa Bonhomme (2008 WCHA Player and Defensive Player of the Year), Amber Bowman (2006 First Team All-WCHA), Jana Harrigan (2006 First Team All-WCHA) and Erin Keys (2008 First Team All-WCHA).
- Rookie goaltender Chelsea Knapp started both games in the Minnesota series last weekend, making a total of 43 saves. She was relieved by junior netminder Deidre Facklis halfway through the second game. Facklis finished with 16 saves and one goal-allowed. It was Facklis' first appearance in net since last Feb. 1 at Wisconsin.
- The Buckeyes have scored a power-play goal in all four games so far this season (8-of-27, 29.6%).
- Ohio State's penalty-kill also has performed well, with a 17-of-19 mark for an 89.5% rate.
- Leading the team early in scoring is sophomore forward Melissa Feste with three goals and an assist for four points. - Aenior forward Caitlin Hogan was the lone Husky to score on the Oct. 10-11 weekend, charting St. Cloud's first hat trick since senior Holly Roberts netted three goals against Vermont, during her first year, back on November 4, 2006 at Vermont. Hogan's three goals last Saturday night were the most ever in a game for the team alternate captain.
- Garnering assists on the weekend for SCSU were Kylie Lane, Roberts and Diana Karouzos.
- Both Husky goalies saw action at Minnesota Duluth last weekend. Ashley Nixon had her hands full for the Huskies stopping 39 of 44 Bulldogs shots in the first game of the series last Saturday. The loss drops Nixon's record to 1-1-0 and 0-1-0 in the WCHA. Sophomore Tayler VanDenakker stopped 29 of 31 Bulldogs shots in the loss for SCSU on Sunday, dropping her record to 0-2-0 and 0-1-0 in the WCHA.
- Minnesota Duluth continues to lead the all-time series vs SCSU, 36-8-2.
- Senior forward Caitlin Hogan leads the SCSU squad with six points (5g, 1a) in four games played and is a +4 on the young season.
- The Huskies have an off week before playing the University of Minnesota in a home-and-home series. On Friday, Oct. 23, the Huskies host UM at 2:07 pm at the National Hockey Center. The Huskies and Gophers will then travel to Ridder Arena on Saturday, Oct. 24, for game two of the series. Minnesota leads the all-time series with St. Cloud State, 39-2-1, dating back to the 1998-99 season.

**BADGERS****UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN**
