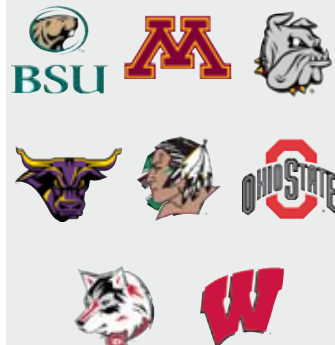

UNBEATEN, NO. 2 MINNESOTA TAKES ON UPSET-MINDED ST. CLOUD STATE IN ONE OF THREE WEEKEND WCHA SERIES

GOLDEN GOPHERS, HUSKIES TO PLAY HOME-AND-HOME SET OCT. 23-24; OHIO STATE VISITS NO. 5 WISCONSIN; NO. 6/8 MINNESOTA DULUTH HOSTS NORTH DAKOTA; BEMIDJI STATE TRAVELS TO NORTHEASTERN IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY; MINNESOTA STATE, MANKATO STILL UNBEATEN UNDER NEW COACH ERIC MEANS, MAVERICKS RECEIVE VOTES IN NATIONAL POLL

MADISON, Wis. –Defending Western Collegiate Hockey Association champion Minnesota, coming off a conference series sweep against one in-state rival last weekend, takes on another in-state opponent, St. Cloud State, in a home and home series which highlights the women's WCHA schedule for the weekend of Oct 23-24.

The unbeaten Golden Gophers are 6-0-0 overall and 4-0-0 in WCHA play and ranked second in the country, following 3-1 and 2-0 victories over league-rival Minnesota Duluth at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis last weekend (Oct. 16-17). Freshman Nora Rätty had 22 saves in last Friday's victory and then registered 29 more stops in recording her first career shutout last Saturday. Minnesota's last sweep over the Bulldogs came last season in Duluth, Minn., when the Gophers won 4-3 in overtime on Oct. 10, 2008 and 2-0 on Oct. 11. It was the last time the Gophers shutout the Bulldogs as well.

The Gophers hold a 39-2-1 all-time record against St. Cloud State. The Huskies, who were idle last week, are 1-3-0 overall and 0-2-0 in WCHA play. The Gophers visit the National Hockey Center on Friday for a 2:07 pm CT face-off, with the Huskies coming to Ridder Arena in Minneapolis on Saturday at 4:07 pm CT.

In other league series last weekend, Minnesota State (3-0-1, 1-0-1-1 WCHA) and Ohio State (1-2-3, 1-2-1 WCHA) both had great success on the road. Minnesota State got off to its best start in six years with a 4-2 victory over host North Dakota last Saturday, behind two goals by Emmi Leinonen. The two teams

then tied 1-1 (ot) last Sunday (Oct. 18) with the Mavericks taking the shootout 1-0 on Leinonen's goal. Eric Means is the first Mavs' coach to ever start his career 3-0-1.

Ohio State kicked off a four-game road trip at Bemidji State (1-4-1, 1-2-1-1 WCHA) with 5-2 victory in game one last Friday and then earned a point in a 2-2 overtime tie against the Beavers in game two last Saturday. Bemidji State, however, gained the additional point in the tie by getting a goal from Emily Erickson and winning, 2-1, in a four-round shootout. This weekend, the Buckeyes travel to Madison to face defending national champion and No. 5-ranked Wisconsin (2-2-0, 2-2-0 WCHA), which was idle last weekend.

Just four games into the conference season, the Golden Gophers have eight points and hold a four-point lead in the WCHA race. Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin have two conference wins, and are in a four-way for second place with Bemidji State and Minnesota State with four points each. North Dakota and Ohio State have three points while St. Cloud State has yet to record a point while playing just two games.

In other conference play this weekend, No. 6/8-ranked Minnesota Duluth (3-3-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) hosts North Dakota (1-2-1, 1-2-1-0 WCHA).

In non-conference action this Friday and Saturday, Bemidji State travels to Boston to face Northeastern. Minnesota State has a bye week.

A GLANCE AT THE 2009-10 SEASON

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association and its eight member teams seek a record 11th consecutive national championship in 2009-10. Since the inception of the NCAA Women's Frozen Four in 2001, three different WCHA teams have won the national championship. The Badgers extended the string and kept the WCHA's national title streak alive in 2008-09 when they won their third national title by defeating Mercyhurst, 4-0, in Boston in the NCAA title game last March. The victory capped a memorable season for the WCHA, which placed three teams in the Frozen Four including league champion Minnesota, traditional power Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin, which won the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the league playoff championships.

Last season's (2008-09) success marked the 10th straight national championship won by a WCHA-member institution. Minnesota Duluth won the first three NCAA titles in 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2008. The Badgers have won national crowns in 2006, 2007 in addition to last season. Minnesota took home the titles in 2004 and 2005, and the Golden Gophers also won the 2000 AWCHA Div. 1 national collegiate championship, prior to the inception of the NCAA tournament, giving the league nine straight national championships in nine years.

The battle for the 2010 WCHA regular season championship will again consist of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. During the course of the season, there will be a total of seven weekends that will consist of all eight member teams engaged in WCHA play. They are Dec. 11-13, Jan. 15-17, Jan. 22-23, Jan. 29-31, Feb. 5-8, Feb. 12-13 and Feb. 19-20. The league regular season schedule concludes Feb. 20.

The first round of WCHA Playoffs, a best-of-three series format at campus locations, will be contested Friday, Feb. 26, Saturday, Feb. 27 and Sunday, Feb. 28 (if necessary). The opening round will match the No. 1 seed vs the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed vs the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed vs the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed vs the No. 5 seed.

The four first round playoff winners will then advance to the 2010 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for Saturday, March 6 and Sunday, March 7 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. There will be two semi-final games played on Saturday at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, followed by the

championship game on Sunday.

The weekend of Friday, March 12 through Sunday, March 14 will bring about the NCAA Regionals (sites, times TBA), followed by the 2010 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, set for Friday, March 19 and Sunday, March 21 at UM's Ridder Arena.

Since this season will be contested during an Olympic year, the race for the league title may be more wide open than ever. There are two new coaches – Eric Means moves from being a men's assistant at Minnesota State, Mankato to leading the Mavericks' women and Tracey DeKeyser takes over at Wisconsin for Mark Johnson, who is taking a sabbatical to coach the U.S. Olympic team.

The WCHA family will watch the 2010 Winter Olympics with great pride, knowing that many familiar faces will dot various Olympic team rosters. There are 17 underclassmen among the 36 former WCHA stars who are on national team rosters as of Sept. 25. Here is the list of WCHA players, underclassmen and alums, who hope to play in Vancouver in the Winter Games in February. DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPION WISCONSIN

PICKED TO WIN WCHA IN 2009-10

COACHES PICK DEFENDING WCHA CHAMP MINNESOTA SECOND, UMD THIRD IN PRESEASON POLL; UW'S AMMERMAN IS PRE-SEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR, UW'S DECKER IS PRE-SEASON ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

MADISON, Wis. – Defending national champion University of Wisconsin is without its head coach and many familiar faces, but the Badgers are still the preseason pick to win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association women's title, according to a poll of league-member head coaches.

The Badgers collected six first place votes and 48 total points in the poll of the eight head coaches and edged out defending WCHA regular season champion University of Minnesota, which placed second with 43 points and two first place votes. The University of Minnesota Duluth, with 38 points, was selected to finish third. All three of those teams qualified for the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Frozen Four last season.

St. Cloud State University was picked to finish fourth in the final regular season standings, followed by Ohio State University in fifth, University of North Dakota in sixth, Minnesota State University, Mankato in seventh place and Bemidji State University in eighth.

Wisconsin's sophomore forward Brooke Ammerman (River Vale, NJ) received five votes and is the head coaches' pick to be preseason player of the year in the WCHA. Ohio State sophomore forward Natalie Spooner (Scarborough, ON) is the pick of two coaches for player of year and Minnesota Duluth senior forward Saara Tuominen (Ylojarvi, Finland) also received a vote.

Wisconsin's Brianna Decker (Dousman, WI), a forward, received six votes and is the coaches' choice as preseason conference rookie of the year while Ohio State forward Hokey Langan (Chatham, ON) and Minnesota Duluth goaltender Jennifer Harss (Rieden, Germany) each received a vote.

With the 2010 Winter Olympics taking place in February, many WCHA-member team rosters are juggled this season. Wisconsin coach Mark Johnson has taken a sabbatical to coach Team USA and his job at UW has been filled by veteran assistant coach Tracey DeKeyser. Johnson's 22-member Team USA roster is filled with 15 current and former WCHA players, including UW's Hilary Knight and Meghan Duggan and North Dakota's Monique and Jocelyn Lamoureux who are all underclassmen. Currently there are 33 current and former WCHA players listed on national team rosters and planning to play in the Winter Games in Vancouver, B.C. in February.

Eric Means, who takes over the coaching duties at Minnesota State, Mankato this season, joins DeKeyser as a new voice behind the bench in the WCHA.

BEMIDJI STATE UNIVERSITY

- The Beavers will travel to Boston, Mass., this weekend for a pair of games against the Northeastern Huskies – playing on Friday night and on Saturday afternoon.
- This will be the third and fourth all-time games played against the Huskies. Last year was the first time the two teams met, playing twice in Bemidji. Neither team holds the advantage in the series as both games ended in ties last year. The first game ended scoreless 0-0, while the second game ended deadlocked at two goals a piece. The Beavers are currently 3-5-3 against Hockey East teams.

UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

- The Golden Gophers earned a two-game sweep over No. 5-ranked Minnesota Duluth last Friday and Saturday. The Golden Gophers improve their overall record to 6-0-0 and 4-0-0 in the WCHA.
- Just four games into the 2009-10 conference season, the Gophers hold a four-point lead in the race for the regular season championship. Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin have two conference wins, while those two and Bemidji State and Minnesota State are in a four-way tie for second.
- In last Friday's game (10/16) Minnesota scored a goal in each period against the visiting Bulldogs to earn a 3-1 win. Anne Schleper scored at 12:53 in the first, while Terra Rasmussen scored at 16:38 in the second to give the Gophers a 2-0 lead heading into the final period. Sarah Erickson added a power-play goal at 2:53 in the third, while UMD scored at 10:51 to put the game at a 3-1 final.
- Noora Rätty was solid in the Gopher nets against UMD, stopping 22 of 23 shots on goal. She stopped two one-on-one UMD attempts and allowed just one goal enroute to her third win this season. Rätty's defense played well in front of her, allowing only three power-play shots on goal and held UMD without a shot for the beginning of the third period.
- Last Saturday (10/17), the Gophers scored two shorthanded goals and Rätty earned her first career shutout en route to a 3-0 win over the Bulldogs. After the two teams went scoreless in the first, Emily West scored a shorthanded goal at 12:10 in the second. Kelli Blankenship added to the Gopher lead when she scored at 2:04 in the third period on an even-strength attempt. Chelsey Jones followed with the Gophers' second shorthanded goal of the game at 12:38 in the third. Rätty earned her first career shutout when she stopped all 29 UMD shots on goal. She had nine saves in the first, 10 in the second and 10 in the third for the shutout. Of the 29 shots, eight came on the UMD power-play, but Rätty was able to hold off the Bulldogs for the evening.
- In four games played this season, Noora Rätty has a goals-against average of 0.75 and a saves percentage of .970.
- Minnesota's last sweep over the Bulldogs came last year in Duluth, Minn., when the Gophers won 4-3 in overtime on Oct. 10, 2008 and 2-0 on Oct. 11. It was the last time the Gophers shut out the Bulldogs as well.
- The Gophers hold a 39-2-1 all-time record against the SCSU Huskies. Minnesota takes on St. Cloud State this weekend in a home-and-home series. The Gophers visit the National Hockey Center on Friday at 2:07 pm, while the Huskies come to town on Saturday at 4:07 pm. SCSU was idle last weekend after falling to UMD, 5-3 and 2-0 in Duluth, Minn.



- Although its early in the season, Erickson and West sit at the top of the WCHA in scoring. Erickson has six goals to lead the league in points and goals, while West has three goals and three assists. Also in a tie for first in OSU's Natalie Spooner, who has two goals and four assists. In goal, Rätty ranks second in the league in goals-against average (0.67) and saves percentage (.976) and is first in winning percentage (1.000).

BULLDOGS

UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA DULUTH

- The No. 6 Bulldogs suffered their first sweep on the road in almost two years at the hands of No. 2 Minnesota this past weekend. UMD lost 3-1 last Friday (Oct. 16) night at Ridder Arena, with the Bulldogs' lone goal tallied by senior Emmanuelle Blais. Rookie netminder Jennifer Harss made a career-high 35 saves in the setback.
- Last Saturday (Oct. 17) afternoon UMD was dealt its first shutout on the road since Dec. 2, 2006 (a 4-0 loss to Harvard) when the Gophers blanked the Bulldogs 3-0.
- On the weekend, Harss stopped 69 shots on goal, but UMD was a dismal 0-of-9 on the power-play and is just 1-of-27 on the season with the extra skater.
- The Bulldogs are 17-26-5 all-time against Minnesota and are 4-13-1 vs the Gophers in the confines of Ridder Arena.
- Freshman forward Katie Wilson continues to be the No. 1 rookie scorer in the NCAA with a 1.00 points per game average, while three Bulldog players – Emmanuelle Blais, Wilson and Laura Fridfinnson lead UMD with six points each through six games.
- The Bulldogs own the nation's No. 8 penalty-kill, with a 93.3% success rate after dismantling 28-of-30 opponent power-plays.
- UMD hosts North Dakota at the DECC this weekend, and the Bulldogs were 5-1 against the Sioux just a season ago. The Maroon and Gold is 25-2-0 all-time against UND, including four straight wins between Feb. 20-28 last winter. The Bulldogs lone two setbacks to the Sioux have both happened at the DECC, including a 4-0 clean-sheet on Nov. 23, 2008, the last time prior to last weekend that UMD was held scoreless through an entire contest.



MAVERICKS

MINNESOTA STATE UNIVERSITY, MANKATO

- The Mavericks are 3-0-1 on the 2009-10 season and 1-0-1 in the WCHA after beating North Dakota 4-1 and skating to a 1-1 overtime tie and then winning the shootout against the Sioux in Grand Forks last weekend.
- Minnesota State is idle this week and then will continue conference play October 30-31 at Ohio State.
- Last Saturday's victory at UND marked the first time Minnesota State has started a season 3-0 since its 2003-04 season.
- First-Year Head Coach Eric Means is the first coach in program history to start his career at MSU 3-0-1.
- Minnesota State finished the weekend at North Dakota 1-of-7 on power-plays. MSU finished with a 2.5 goals per game average over the weekend and earned eight team assists. The Mavericks have scored three of their five goals in the first period. The Mavericks also outshot the Fighting Sioux, 51-43.



WCHA TEAM WEEKLY NOTEBOOKS CON'T**FIGHTING SIOUX
UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA**

- The Fighting Sioux hosted conference-rival Minnesota State, Mankato in its regular-season openers at the Ralph Englestad Arena last weekend. The Mavericks skated to four points in the conference standings while UND earned one point with a tie and shootout loss.
- Last Saturday (Oct. 17) UND allowed three goals in the first period, putting the Sioux in an early hole they were unable to climb out of as the Mavericks held on for a 4-2 win. Junior Stephanie Roy and sophomore Sara Dagenais scored for the Sioux. The Sioux outshot the Mavericks 30-17 and only twice last season did they outshoot their opponent and lose (vs St. Cloud State, Jan. 10; vs Maine, Oct. 4), once by double-digits at Maine losing 3-2 (UND 48, UM 18).
- Then last Sunday, Minnesota State's Emmi Leinonen's goal midway through the second period lifted the Mavericks to a 1-1 overtime tie with the Sioux. She then scored during the second round of the shootout to give MSU the extra point in the WCHA standings. Freshman Mary Loken scored the lone Sioux goal, her first collegiate goal.
- Sophomore Stephanie Ney entered the game for redshirt freshman Jorid Dagfinrud last Friday and then completed the weekend with 41 saves on 43 shots.
- The Sioux are 0-for-4 in WCHA shootouts since its inception at the beginning of last season, with three of those losses coming to the Mavericks.
- After four games played, the Sioux have nine different point scorers.
- The Sioux have started the season holding opponents 1-for-19 on power-play opportunities but have gone 0-for-24 with the extra attacker themselves.
- North Dakota is edging its opponents in draws early this season, winning 50.6% (135-of-267) of face-offs.
- UND next heads to Duluth, Minn., for a two-game WCHA stint against No. 6 Minnesota Duluth this Friday and Saturday, Oct. 23-24. The Sioux went 1-5-0 against the UMD last season with its lone win coming in the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center. Ney shutout the Bulldogs on Nov. 23, making 45 saves on the way to a 4-0 win. The Bulldogs hold a 2-25-0 mark all-time against the Sioux.

**BUCKEYES
OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY**

- The Buckeyes took three points from Bemidji State in a WCHA road series Oct. 16-17. The Buckeyes posted their first victory of the season in a 5-2 win last Friday and followed with a 2-2 (ot) tie last Saturday. Following a 5:00-minute scoreless overtime, the Beavers won the shootout, 2-1. It was the first shootout loss for Ohio State since the WCHA introduced them last season to determine the outcome of tied league contests (OSU moved to 2-1 all-time in conference shootouts).
- Sophomore Kim Theut scored the shootout goal for the Buckeyes.
- In the first game at BSU, both sophomore Natalie Spooner and rookie Minttu Tuominen had a goal and assist while junior Christina Mancuso had two assists to lead the team as a total of 12 Buckeyes recorded a point in the win. The two assists by Mancuso were a career-high and doubled her career total to four. Also in game one, junior Jenna Kilpatrick scored her first goal since her freshman season – a span of 44 games. She has recorded five of her 10 career points (3g, 2a) against the Beavers.
- It was the first win for Ohio State since a 4-2 victory vs North Dakota, Feb. 7, 2009 at the OSU Ice Rink.
- The Buckeyes' last road win was Dec. 12, 2008 at Minnesota State.
- Senior Raelyn LaRocque had a goal and assist to lead the Buckeyes in game two last Saturday, but Bemidji State scored with less than four minutes



remaining in the second and added an extra-skater goal with :46 seconds left in regulation to send it into overtime tied at 2-all. LaRocque and Tuominen led Ohio State in the series with a goal and two assists each. Spooner, Mancuso and sophomore Melissa Feste had two points apiece.

- Rookie goaltender Chelsea Knapp started both games at Bemidji State and made 38 saves with four goals allowed for a .905 saves percentage and 1.92 goals-against average.
- Ohio State did not score a power play goal in game one vs BSU – the first time the Buckeye power-play units have been held scoreless this season. They came back with a PP goal in the second game against BSU, however. The OSU power-play is operating at 25% this season (9-of-36).
- The Buckeyes successfully killed off 7-of-8 penalties at BSU. They have allowed just three PPGs to opponents this season with a 24-of-27 penalty-kill mark on the year (88.9%).
- With three series under their belts, four Buckeyes lead the team in scoring with Feste, LaRocque, Spooner and Tuominen tallying six points apiece. Feste and Tuominen lead the squad with three goals, while LaRocque has a WCHA-best five assists.
- Ohio State next travels to No. 5 Wisconsin for another WCHA road series, Oct. 23-24. Games begin at 7:07 pm (CT) both Friday and Saturday at the Kohl Center. The Buckeyes are looking to put an end to their 21-game winless streak against the Badgers (0-20-1). The last OSU win in Madison was in 2003.

**HUSKIES
ST. CLOUD STATE UNIVERSITY**

- After taking a week off the Huskies (1-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) return to action this Friday and Saturday, Oct. 23-24, for a home-and-home series against No. 2 Minnesota. Friday's game is slated for 2:07 pm in the National Hockey Center and Saturday's game is set for 4:07 pm at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.
- The Huskies are 1-3-0 overall in 2009-10 and 0-2-0 in the WCHA.
- SCSU's fourth-year head coach Jeff Giesen is 1-10-1 all-time against Minnesota.
- The No. 2-ranked Gophers bring an unbeaten record into the series at 6-0-0 overall and 4-0-0 in the league.
- Minnesota leads the all-time series with the Huskies, 39-2-1, dating back to Jan. 9, 1999. Last season, the Huskies went 0-4-0 against the nationally-ranked Gophers.
- In four games played in 2009-10, SCSU's senior forward Caitlin Hogan leads the squad with six points (5g, 1a), including one shorthanded goal, one game-winning goal, and one hat trick. Hogan's hat trick against Minnesota Duluth on Oct. 9 was the first for SCSU since senior Holly Roberts netted three goals against Vermont, during her rookie year, back on November 4, 2006 at Vermont.
- A total of 11 Huskies have tabbed points in this young season.

BADGERS **UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN**

- The Badgers, idle last weekend, host Ohio State Friday and Saturday at the Kohl Center. Game time both nights is 7:07 pm.
- The Badgers have not lost in 21 games to Ohio State. They are 20-0-1 in that span. The last OSU win in Madison was in 2003.
- In their last action Oct. 9-10, the Badgers split two road games, dropping a 1-0 decision to Bemidji State that Saturday in Coleraine, Minn. and bouncing back to score a 3-1 victory Sunday at Bemidji. They dropped their second game of the season, matching their loss total from the entire 2008-09 season, on its first road trip of the season. After splitting the series with Bemidji State the all-time series moves to 40-2-2 in favor of Wisconsin. The victory was only the second for Bemidji State and the first since Dec. 9, 2001.
- The Badgers' 2-2-0 record is the worst to start a season since the first season of the program (1999-2000) when they started 1-2-1.
- The Badgers scored their first power-play goal on that Sunday against BSU. Kelly Nash had the Badgers' first power-play goal. UW is 1-of-19 on the man-advantage.
- However, Wisconsin has successfully killed off all 19 penalties, not giving up any power-play goals in four games.
- Both of UW's goaltenders have each recorded a 1-1-0 record, splitting the first two series. Freshman Becca Ruegsegger had a shutout in her first collegiate start and then let in only one goal against Bemidji State which proved too much. In two games Ruegsegger has 42 saves and a .977 saves percentage. Senior Alannah McCready has allowed three goals holding a .946 saves percentage with 53 saves.
