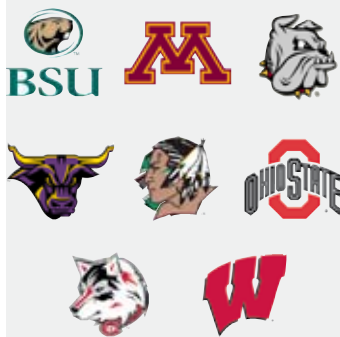

THREE WCHA SERIES ON SCHEDULE FOR UPCOMING WEEKEND OF NOV. 21-23, NO. 1-RANKED UW TO TAKE ON NO. 3 UNH IN FLORIDA GOLDEN GOPHERS HOST MSU, BULLDOGS HOST UND, HUSKIES HOST BSU; TOP-RANKED BADGERS, NO. 2 MINNESOTA, NO. 7 MINNESOTA DULUTH, ST. CLOUD STATE ALL POST LEAGUE SWEEPS NOV. 14-16; THREE WCHA TEAMS RANKED AMONG NATION'S TOP 10 IN LATEST NATIONAL POLL ... WISCONSIN AGAIN NO. 1, MINNESOTA NO. 2, MINNESOTA DULUTH NO. 7 ... UND, SCSU ALSO RECEIVE VOTES; TICKETS FOR 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF MARCH 7-8 AT RIDDER ARENA ON SALE NOW

MADISON, Wis. – Top-ranked and league-leading Wisconsin (12-0-2, 8-0-2-2 WCHA) stayed unbeaten with two victories at North Dakota Nov. 15-16 and faces a non-conference test when it takes on No. 3-ranked New Hampshire this weekend. The women's intersectional showdown takes place in Florida, of all places, at the Fort Myers Skatium on Friday, Nov. 21, and Sat. Nov. 22.

There are also three Western Collegiate Hockey Association series this weekend. Second place Minnesota hopes to jump over Wisconsin and into first place when it hosts Minnesota State and St. Cloud State, fresh off two victories at Minnesota State, hosts Bemidji State in series on Nov. 21-22 while North Dakota plays its first road WCHA series, at defending national champion Minnesota Duluth Nov. 22-23.

The Badgers have 19 points, one more than No. 2-ranked Minnesota (9-2-1, 8-1-1-0 WCHA). Five teams are then separated by four points in the battle for third place. Minnesota Duluth (6-4-2, 4-4-2-0 WCHA) and St. Cloud State (7-5-2, 4-5-1-1 WCHA) each have 10 points, one more than North Dakota (7-4-1, 4-3-1-0 WCHA) and two better than Minnesota State (6-5-1, 3-4-1-1 WCHA). Ohio State (5-9-0, 3-9-0 WCHA), idle this weekend, is in seventh place with six points and Bemidji State (1-9-2, 0-8-0-0 WCHA) is in eighth place.

Last weekend (Nov. 14-16), Wisconsin's Hilary Knight had three assists in a 5-1 victory over host North Dakota last Saturday at Grand Forks and in the second game of the series, a 4-0 UW victory last Sunday, the sophomore winger recorded her third career three-goal hat trick, and second of the season. Her natural hat

trick (three consecutive goals in a game) kept her on the top of the point and goal scoring columns in the WCHA. In goal, Jessie Vetter had an 11-save shutout, her fifth of the season and conference record 30th of her career.

St. Cloud State's Megan McCarthy scored both game-winning goals over the weekend against Minnesota State as she continues to lead the Huskies in scoring this season with 16 (6g,10a) total points. McCarthy scored on a breakaway 1:27 into overtime to give St. Cloud State a 3-2 victory over Minnesota State at the Alltel Center in Mankato last Friday and Saturday McCarthy scored in her third straight game and the Huskies took a 4-3 victory. Christina Lee had four goals in the series for the Mavericks.

Minnesota blanked Bemidji State twice, 3-0 and 7-0, in Bemidji and Minnesota Duluth swept at Ohio State, 3-0 and 8-3. Kim Martin had her first shutout of the season for the visiting Bulldogs in last Friday's game while Haley Irwin had a natural hat trick in the series finale for UMD.

In this week's national polls, the WCHA has three teams ranked among the top 10. Wisconsin remains No. 1, Minnesota is No. 2, and Minnesota Duluth is up to No. 7. Also receiving votes were UND and SCSU.

Commissioner, "and we look forward to celebrating our tenth season of play by continuing to develop our sport and expose our student-athletes and coaches to an ever-growing legion of fans.

"Coming off our ninth consecutive national championship, and based on the continuing emergence of all of our member teams, we're confident the WCHA as a whole will be even more competitive from top to bottom this coming season."

The battle for the 2008-09 WCHA regular season championship will again consist of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. The opening weekend of league competition was Oct. 10-11 with the regular season concluding the weekend of Feb. 20-22. The conference's post-season championship tournament will open the weekend of Feb. 27-Mar. 1 (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) with a first round, best-of-three series format at campus sites. The No. 1 seeded team will host the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed will host the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed will host the No. 5 seed.

The four first-round winners will then advance to the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., on Saturday and Sunday, March 7-8. On Saturday, there will be two semi-final match-ups at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game set for Sunday at 1:07 pm CT.

Following two weeks of WCHA playoffs, the NCAA Women's Division 1 championship tournament will commence the weekend of March 13-15 at regional sites (TBA), followed by the 2008 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held March 20-22 at Boston, Mass.

All Association home games will again face-off at either :07 or :37 after the hour in 2008-09.

WCHA WOMEN USING SHOOTOUT IN 2008-09

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association is helping to re-introduce the shootout to women's college hockey. A National Hockey League-style three-player shootout is being used to determine a winner for all WCHA regular season games still tied after regulation and the standard five-minute (5:00) overtime.

Thus far this season four games have gone to shootout. SCSU beat UMD Oct. 17 at St. Cloud (SCSU won 2-1 in 3 rounds – Holly Roberts GWG). MSU beat UND Oct. 17 at Grand Forks (MSU won 2-1 in 5 rounds of shootout – Lisa Edman GWG). UM beat UW Oct. 24 at Madison (UM won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Sarah Erickson GWG). UW beat UMD Nov. 1 at Madison (UW won 1-0 in 3 rounds of shootout – Kelly Nash GWG).

The NCAA Rules and Ice Hockey Committees have allowed conferences the ability to implement this tie-breaking protocol so that every regular season league game will have a winner while preserving the integrity of the national rankings. Regular season games decided by a shootout will still be considered ties for NCAA purposes so there will be no effect on NCAA records for the purposes of the Pairwise and determining the national tournament field. Bonus points awarded will impact WCHA standings only. The WCHA standings should be read with two points for a win, zero points for losses, one point for a tie and one point for shootout wins.
