WCHA Play Resumes Friday with Two Series as North Dakota Hosts Minnesota State, Bemidji State Visits Minnesota Duluth Non-Conference Matchups for Nov. 18-19 Weekend Feature Ohio State at Syracuse, Wisconsin at Rensselaer, Minnesota Hosting New Hampshire, St. Cloud State at Niagara; Six WCHA Players Win Gold Medals with USA at Four Nations Cup in Sweden; Four WCHA Teams Ranked Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Weekly Polls ... UW at No. 1, UM at No. 2, UMD at No. 6, UND at No. 7 ... BSU Receives Votes

MADISON, Wis. – After taking a week-long break while 15 of its elite players from six member institutions competed for their national teams in the Four Nations Cup in Sweden, the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association swings back into action with two league series Nov. 18-20 and a number of non-conference matchups.

The two weekend WCHA series will feature North Dakota (7-4-1, 4-3-1-0 WCHA) hosting Minnesota State (5-7-0, 1-5-0 WCHA) at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks on Friday and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT and Minnesota Duluth (4-5-1, 1-4-1-1 WCHA) entertaining Bemidji State (8-3-2, 4-3-1 WCHA) at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth on Saturday and Sunday afternoon at 3:07 pm CT.

In non-conference play Friday and Saturday, Ohio State (5-4-1) travels to Syracuse (5-7-0) of College Hockey America, St. Cloud State (1-10-1) visits College Hockey America-member Niagara (6-6-3), Wisconsin (11-1-0) heads to ECAC Hockey-member Rensselaer (3-7-4) and Minnesota (10-2-0) plays host to New Hampshire (4-6-2) of the Hockey East Association.

As play resumes this week, No. 2-ranked Minnesota has the league lead with 24 points, three more

than defending national champion and No. 1-ranked Wisconsin, but the Golden Gophers (10-2-0, 8-2-0-0 WCHA) have played two more games than the Badgers (11-1-0, 7-1-0-0 WCHA). Ohio State (5-4-1, 5-4-1-1 WCHA) is currently in third place with 17 points, four ahead of both No. 7-ranked North Dakota (7-4-1, 4-3-1-0 WCHA) and Bemidji State (7-3-2, 4-3-1-0 WCHA), who are tied for fourth with 13 points each but have played two fewer games than the Buckeyes. No. 5/6-ranked Minnesota Duluth is in sixth place with five points, but the Bulldogs (4-5-1, 1-4-1-1 WCHA) have played four fewer games than the league leader and eight of their 10 games to date have come against nationally-ranked teams. Minnesota State (5-7-0, 1-5-0-0 WCHA) has three points for the seventh spot while St. Cloud State (1-10-1, 0-8-0-0 WCHA) is eighth and has yet to record a point.

In the only game involving a WCHA team last week, Bemidji State set a school record with 72 shots on goal and defeated Lindenwood University 11-0 in the United States Hockey Hall of Fame Face-off Classic at the Hippodrome in Eveleth, Minn., on Thursday, Nov. 10. The Beavers had eight different players score a goal, including three freshmen – Kristin Huber, Natasha Kostenko and Whitney Wivoda – who each tallied their first collegiate goals. Alana McElhinney notched the shutout in goal for BSU as she tallied nine saves in two periods and Jessica Havel followed up with 10 third period saves. Sadie Lundquist tallied a goal and five assists to lead the Beavers in scoring.

The victory against Lindenwood means that, against opponents from other Division 1 conferences so far this season, WCHA teams are 21-6-2 overall for a .758 winning percentage. WCHA teams are 2-0-0 (1.000) vs ECAC Hockey, 11-2-1 (.821) vs the Hockey East Association, 3-4-1 (.438) vs College Hockey America, and 5-0-0 vs Independents.

Looking ahead to the Thanksgiving holiday weekend of Friday, Nov. 25 through Sunday, Nov. 27, there are three WCHA series on the docket as Ohio State hosts Minnesota Duluth (Friday/Saturday), North Dakota visits Bemidji State (Friday @ Crookston, MN/Saturday), and Wisconsin welcomes St. Cloud State (Friday/Sunday). Outside the loop, Minnesota travels to Harvard (Saturday/Sunday).

In this week's (Nov. 14) USCHO.com Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, four Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams are again among the nation's top 10. Wisconsin continues its reign at No. 1, Minnesota moved up to the No. 2 national rank, Minnesota Duluth is at No. 6 and North Dakota is at No. 7. Also receiving votes in the poll this week was Bemidji State.

And in the latest (Nov. 15) USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, Wisconsin is ranked No. 1, Minnesota is No. 3, North Dakota is No. 6 and Minnesota Duluth is No. 7. Also receiving votes was Bemidji State.

Five of the WCHA's eight-member teams sport winning percentages of .550 or above overall this season, led by Minnesota at 11-1-0 (.917), Wisconsin at 10-2-0 (.833), Bemidji State at 8-3-2 (.692), North Dakota at 7-4-1 (.625) and Ohio State at 5-4-1 (.550).

Home to a record 12 consecutive national championship teams, including the NCAA Frozen Four crown won by Wisconsin last spring, the WCHA marks its 13th season as a women's league in 2011-12.

Four Nation's Cup Re-Cap

Team USA Captures Gold in Sweden with Help from Six WCHA Member Team Players

While most WCHA teams got a break from play last week, 15 WCHA players from six conference schools, including six from gold medalist Team USA, competed in the Four Nations Cup Nov. 9-14 in Nyköping, Sweden. The Four Nations Cup brought together the top four women's hockey countries in the world – Canada, Finland, Sweden and the United States – for the international tournament.

The USA roster included six WCHA players – Wisconsin's Hilary Knight, who had the title-clinching goal in the 4-3 championship game shootout, and Brianna Decker, Minnesota's Amanda Kessel and Jen Schoullis, and North Dakota's Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and Jocelyne Lamoureux. Former Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner Jessie Vetter, the ex-Wisconsin goaltender, former UW players Meghan Duggan and Molly Engstrom, former Minnesota Duluth forward Jenny Potter, former Ohio State defenseman Lisa Chasson and ex-Minnesota player Gigi Marvin are among WCHA alumnae who won a gold medal.

Ohio State senior forward Natalie Spooner, Wisconsin defenseman Stefanie McKeough and Minnesota Duluth forward Haley Irwin represented Team Canada at the Four Nations. Former Wisconsin defenseman Bobbi Jo Slusar also was on Team Canada, which fell 4-3 in a shootout to the United States in the championship game.

Minnesota Duluth junior forward Pernilla Winberg and Minnesota State defenseman Emilia Andersson played for Team Sweden while UMD freshman defenseman Tea Villila played for Team Finland with North Dakota's Michelle Karvinen, Minttu Tuominen of Ohio State and Minnesota defenseman Mira Jaluso.

UND's Jocelyne Lamoureux (USA), Monique Lamoureux-Kolls (USA), Jorid Dagfinrud (Norway), Andrea Dalen (Norway) and Michelle Karvinen (Finland) all competed in the International Ice Hockey Federation's Four Nations Cup last week ... UND's Olympic line of Lamoureux, Lamoureux-Kolls and Karvinen combined for 11 of 12 total points against the Huskies in its 6-2 win on Friday at the National Hockey Center ... Lamoureux and Karvinen each had two goals and two assists while Lamoureux-Kolls added one goal and two assists ... The forward ranks third on Ohio State career points list with 141 and is the program's all-time leader in career assists with 102 ... Wild, a Mendota Heights, Minn., product, has five points on the year so far with one goal and four assists ... WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
