## 2006-07 SCSU WOMEN'S HOCKEY NEWS



Release Date: Oct. 3, 2006

**HUSKIES HEAD TO #1 WISCONSIN:** The St. Cloud State University women's hockey team (1-0-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) will open its 2006-07 WCHA schedule with a two-game series at Madison, Wisc., against the defending national champions, the No.1 ranked University of Wisconsin Badgers (2-0-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 6th and 7th. Both games will be played in the Kohl Center and are set to face off at 7:07 p.m.

**A NEW CHAPTER HAS BEGUN:** A new chapter has begun in the SCSU women's hockey program with Jeff Giesen taking over as head coach in 2006-07. Giesen tallied his first career win on Friday, Sept. 29th, with a 4-0 shutout victory over Robert Morris University in the National Hockey Center. The Huskies are coming off their most successful season in school history in 2005-06. SCSU finished 18-18-1 overall and finished in fourth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) with a 13-14-1 conference record.

**ON THE RADIO:** The SCSU women's hockey team can be heard live on KVSC 88.1 FM on Friday, October 27th, against Minnesota Duluth. The game will also be broadcast via Internet @kvsc.org. Sports director John Hadden and the KVSC sports department will broadcast numerous games throughout the season.

**LIVE STATS:** St. Cloud State women's hockey fans can enjoy live stats on the web for all Husky home games in 2006-07. Live Stats can be viewed by going to the Husky athletics home page at [www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics](http://www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics) and following the directions.

**TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for the women's hockey home games are \$6 for adults and \$3 for youth, ages 2 through college. SCSU student admission is free with validated ID. Tickets can be purchased the day of the game, beginning 90 minutes prior to the initial face-off. Advance single game tickets can be purchased in person at the SCSU Athletic Ticket Office located in the National Hockey Center or by phone at 320-308-2137 or 1-877-SCSUTIX.

**NEW CHAPTER, NEW FACES:** Women's hockey at SCSU sports an entirely new staff for the 2006-07 season. Jeff Giesen, who was named the new head coach in June of 2006, extended his staff with the hiring of two new full-time assistants. Brian Idalski joins the Husky staff after serving as the women's hockey head coach at UW-Stevens Point from 2001-2006, and Jennifer Kranz comes to SCSU as Giesen's second assistant after coaching at Shattuck-St. Mary's prep school since 2004. Brandon Klement, a native of Antigo, Wisc., is serving as the volunteer goaltending coach in 2006-07.

**SCSU HEAD COACH JEFF GIESEN:** Jeff Giesen begins his first season as the head coach of the SCSU women's hockey program in 2006-07. A native of Blaine, Minn., Giesen becomes the third head coach since the inception of the women's program in 1998. Giesen served as the SCSU assistant women's hockey coach from 2003-2006, working with the Huskies' defensive players and recruiting. He came to SCSU from Saint John's University, where he was an assistant coach from 1992-98 and an associate head coach from 1998-2003. In addition to his experience at Saint John's, Giesen has worked extensively with the USA Hockey Development program. His most recent work was with the girls' 17/18 camp in Lake Placid, NY, this past summer. A 1993 graduate of St. Cloud State University and a true student of the game, Coach Giesen and his wife Karla reside in St. Cloud, Minn., with their daughter Delaney. Giesen's career record stands at 1-0-1 overall.

SCSU ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF:

BRIAN IDALSKI: The former head coach at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, Idalski brings a multitude of success to St. Cloud State University as he begins his first season as a full-time assistant to first-year head women's hockey coach Jeff Giesen. Idalski served as the head women's coach at UW-Stevens Point from 2001-2006 and posted a 108-21-11 record (.811 winning percentage) in the last five seasons. During his tenure with the Pointers, he guided his teams to an NCAA Division III national runner-up finish in 2003-04, an NCAA Division III quarterfinal showing in 2004-05 and a third place finish at the NCAA Division III Tournament in 2005-06. Leaving behind a notable list of accomplishments, Idalski charted 2002, 2005 and 2006 Northern Collegiate Hockey Association (NCHA) regular season championships and NCHA playoff championships in 2002, 2004, 2005 and 2006. A four-year letterwinner at UW-Stevens Point from 1991-1995, Idalski was a member of the Pointers' NCAA Division III runner-up team in 1992 and was a sophomore on the 1993 Division III national championship team. Playing 97 career games as a defenseman, he tallied five goals and 20 assists. Following his Pointer playing days, Idalski went on to play professional hockey for two years with the Madison Monsters of the United Hockey League from 1995-1997. He then played two seasons with the Columbus (Ga.) Cottonmouths of the Central Hockey League from 1997-1999, and won the 1998 CHL regular season and playoff championship. A Warren, Mich. native, Idalski his wife, Nicole, have four sons, Beau, Jason, David and Mitchel.

JENNIFER KRANZ: Jennifer Kranz, a native of Waukesha, Wis., joins the SCSU women's hockey staff in 2006 after serving as the assistant girls' prep ice hockey coach at Shattuck-St. Mary's School in Faribault, Minn., since 2004. At SCSU, Kranz's responsibilities will include recruiting, working with the forwards and monitoring team academics. No stranger to the game, Kranz was a member of the Providence College women's varsity ice hockey team from 1998-2002. She tallied 22 points (12 g, 10a) in 104 career games played with the Friars. After graduating from Providence College with a Bachelor's of Arts in English in 2002, Kranz joined the Shattuck-St. Mary's School as the assistant coach for the girls' junior prep ice hockey team. In 2003, Kranz was promoted to the head coach position for the girls' junior prep ice hockey team. During her tenure at Shattuck-St. Mary's, Kranz also served as an academic advisor for the student-athletes, and since 2004, also held the community service coordinator responsibilities for the girls' hockey program. Kranz recently served as the Team Leader at the 15/16's USA Player Development Camp in Lake Placid, and has been actively involved with the Wisconsin Amateur Hockey Association since 2000 serving as an evaluator.

KUYPER NAMED TO U.S. UNDER-22 SELECT TEAM: SCSU's junior defender Brittni Kuyper (Eden Prairie) became the first SCSU women's hockey player to earn a spot at the U.S. National Women's Festival in Lake Placid, N.Y. in August of 2006 and later was the first SCSU women's hockey player to be selected as one of 20 players to play on the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select Team in a three-game series with Canada from August 24-27, 2006.

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT:

#1 UNIVERSITY of WISCONSIN (Oct. 6-7)

The St. Cloud State University women's hockey team opens its 2006-07 WCHA schedule with a two-game series against the defending national champions, the University of Wisconsin Badgers...UW-Madison currently leads the all-time series against the Huskies, 26-4-0... the last time the Huskies defeated the Badgers was on February 4, 2006, when SCSU's goaltender Lauri St. Jacques handed UW their first and eventual only shutout of the 2005-06 season...SCSU's Hailey Clarkson scored the game-winning goal against UW at the 13:18 mark of the third period on Feb. 4, 2006 in the 1-0 victory over the Badgers...the Huskies are off to the best start in school history with a 1-0-1 overall record.

UW-MADISON PLAYERS TO WATCH: Three of Wisconsin's top scoring players from the 2005-06 national championship team return to the 2006-07 roster. Junior forward Jinelle Zaugg currently leads UW with five points (2g, 3a). Senior defender Bobbi-Jo Slusar is second on the team with three points (1g, 2a) and senior forward Sara Bauer, the returning 2006 Patty Kazmaier Award winner, has chipped in one goal and one assist in 2006-07. The goaltending has been split between senior Christine Dufour and sophomore Jessie Vetter. Dufour has 15 saves on the season and a 1.01 GAA as Vetter has posted 13 saves and a GAA of 0.00.

BADGER'S HEAD COACH MARK JOHNSON: With strong ties to Wisconsin as a coach's son, player and assistant coach, former Olympian Mark Johnson stepped into the role of head women's hockey coach beginning with the 2002-03 season. In four seasons, Johnson and the Wisconsin women's hockey team have continued to shatter school records and make program history. Johnson's crew has set a new school record for wins each season he has been at the helm, including an NCAA record-tying 36 victories in the 2005-06 campaign. Johnson was named the 2006 American Hockey Coaches Association Division I Coach of the Year after leading the Badgers to their first WCHA regular season, playoff and NCAA championships as well as having one of his players, Sara Bauer, earn the program's first Patty Kazmaier Award. Johnson's career record at UW-Madison stands at 111-27-10.

JACQUES EARNS WCHA POW HONORS:** SCSU's senior goaltender, Lauri St. Jacques (Sturgeon Falls, Ont.), was recently named the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week for her efforts against Robert Morris University in the season-opening game. St. Jacques backstopped the Huskies to their first shutout victory of the 2006-07 season on Friday, Sept. 29th. The assistant captain for the Huskies collected 20 saves in the 4-0 victory and 59:56 minutes of playing time. St. Jacques now has five shutouts in her career at SCSU.
