## 2004-05 SCSU WOMEN'S HOCKEY TEAM NEWS

Release Date: November 15, 2004



**HUSKIES HAVE A WEEK OFF BEFORE THEY RETURN TO WCHA PLAY:** The St. Cloud State University women's hockey team will have a much needed week off before they return to WCHA action on Nov. 26-27 against Bemidji State. The puck is set to be dropped at 7:05 pm on Friday, November 26, and 2:05 pm on Saturday, November 27 in Bemidji, Minn.

**HUSKIES SPLIT WITH WAYNE STATE:** The St. Cloud State women's hockey team split with Wayne State (Mich.) this past weekend, getting the win on Friday 7-2, and falling short on Saturday, 2-3. SCSU's big win on Friday, 7-2, marks the first game that the Huskies have scored seven goals since their 7-3 victory over Bemidji State on January 9, 2004. The Huskies were focused right from the get-go. At 11:36 in the first period, junior forward Kristy Oonincx sparked the Huskies with her fourth goal of the season and her second power play goal of the season from the high slot. She was assisted by Ashley Stewart and Hailey Clarkson. Shortly after, Clarkson did a little dangle down the slot for the second Husky goal of the game. "It's nice to finally put the puck in the net, both individually and as a team," stated Clarkson. SCSU's Kelly Stewart finished the first period off with a nice one-timer from the low slot. First-year defender Gretchen Norby (Detroit Lakes, Minn.) tallied for her first career assist and point as a Husky. Clarkson also tallied in with her second assist of the game and fifth assist of the season.

The Huskies had a little bit of a lull in the second period. "We just got out-worked in the period and that's not acceptable," said Husky head coach Jason Lesteberg. They were outshot 10-5 in the period, however matched goals with the Warriors, 1-1. It was SCSU's first-year forward, Laura Fast (Calgary, Alberta) getting her first career goal and point at 19:17 in the period. She also had a nice dangle in the low slot to put the Huskies ahead of the Warriors, 4-1.

The third period is when SCSU shined. The team flat-out never gave up. "It's been our focus all season to finish games, and we finally did," commented Coach Lesteberg. Again, it was Oonincx scoring on the power play with a slap shot just inside the blue line. She was assisted by K. Stewart and Clarkson. Wayne State answered with a goal of their own, however at 5:11, it was SCSU's Ashley Andrews (Lakeville, Minn.) getting her first goal of the season and in her career from the low slot. Norby earned her second point of the game with the assist. Lastly, it was A. Stewart finishing the game with another goal from the slot at 17:26 in the period. She was assisted by her sister, K. Stewart. "Today, we really fed off each other's goals and we worked hard the entire game," said A. Stewart after the game. Her sister K. Stewart added, "It really is nice to get the win." SCSU's goaltender Kendall Newell finished the game with 22 saves in 60:00 minutes of play. Her record improves to 2-3-1 on the season. Hailey Clarkson was the first star of the game, as she scored four points in the afternoon victory.

**UPCOMING GAME AGAINST BEMIDJI STATE:** Head Coach Jason Lesteberg says his team has a lot to work on before they return to WCHA play. "This year we have many areas of emphasis. Number one, we need to start preparing better for games, and second, start finishing games," stated Lesteberg. The Huskies have a great opportunity coming up in these next two weeks. "Our team is very capable of winning two games in Bemidji. We need to focus these next two weeks on the little things and start playing consistent hockey," added Lesteberg.

**SCSU COACH JASON LESTEBERG:** Jason Lesteberg, A 1996 graduate of Gustavus Adolphus College, is in his third season with the Huskies as he joined the St. Cloud State University women's hockey program as its head coach in July, 2002. He is the second coach in the history of the program. In his first season at SCSU, the Huskies posted an 11-23-0, 5-19-0

**Lesteberg** WCHA record under Lesteberg's leadership. Last season the Huskies finished 7-24-1, 4-19-1 WCHA, which was good for a 6th place finish in the conference. His career record stands at 46-79-11 in collegiate coaching.

**ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF:** Joining Lesteberg on the bench this season is David Prokop, who is in his seventh season on the women's hockey staff. Prokop is one of team's top recruiters. Jeff Giesen is in his second season as an assistant coach. His primary duties are to work with the Huskies' defensive players and recruiting.



**FIRST-YEAR GOALTENDER PLAYING SOLID:** First-year goaltender Kendall Newell (Phoenix, Ariz.) continues to play well for the Huskies in 2004-05. She has a total of 203 saves on the season with a 3.00 GAA. "I'm seeing the puck really well right now," stated Newell after the Friday afternoon victory. "I'm feeling confident in my play and every day I just want to give my team a chance to win," added Newell.

**SATURDAY'S LOSS TO WSU:** The St. Cloud State women's hockey team fell short on Saturday against the Wayne State Warriors, 3-2, in the National Hockey Center. SCSU's junior forward Kelly Stewart answered WSU's first goal with a power play goal from the low slot to make the game 2-1. She was assisted by senior captain Tina Ciraulo and junior forward Ashley Stewart. Early in the third period, it was SCSU's first-year forward Laura Fast evening up the score with a goal just 18 seconds into the period. She was assisted by Ciraulo and Kristy Oonincx. However, Wayne State proved to be too much for the Huskies as they scored the game-winner on a power play at 7:18 in the third.

The Bemidji State University women's hockey team is coming off a weekend series against WCHA rival Minnesota State. BSU lost both games; 3-5 and 2-4.

The Beavers are led in scoring by sophomore forward Kelly Hart (Ajax, Ontario). She has scored four goals and five assists on the season in just 11 games. Nikki Eckebrecht (Hamilton, Ontario), a sophomore forward, is the next leading scorer with four goals and three assists on the season. Junior forward Carly Napier (Toronto, Ontario) also has seven points on the season. There are four Beavers with four total points and two Beavers with three points.

Bemidji State is coached by Bruce Olson. He is in his third season with the Beavers and is trying to avenge a disappointing 2003-2004 season. Olson is assisted by Jim Ingman, who is in his fourth year, and Sis Paulsen, who is in her first year at BSU.
