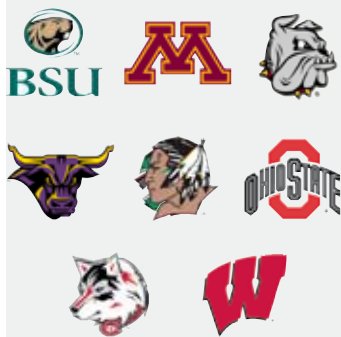

## UW BADGERS, UM GOLDEN GOPHERS SWEEP ... SET UP EARLY SEASON SHOWDOWN IN WCHA THIS WEEKEND

**TOP TWO RANKED TEAMS IN COUNTRY TO PLAY IN MADISON OCT. 24 & 26; BSU TRAVELS TO OSU, UMD HOSTS MSU; ST. CLOUD STATE, MINNESOTA STATE TAKE FOUR POINTS OCT. 17-18, SCORE FIRST SHOOTOUT VICTORIES; UW DOWNS BEMIDJI STATE IN FIRST WOMEN'S U.S. HOCKEY HALL OF FAME GAME OCT. 18; THREE WCHA TEAMS RANKED AMONG NATION'S TOP 10 IN LATEST NATIONAL POLLS ... WISCONSIN NO. 1, MINNESOTA NO. 2, MINNESOTA DULUTH NO. 8 ... MSU, SCSU, UND ALSO RECEIVE VOTES; TICKETS FOR 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF AT RIDDER ARENA ON SALE NOW**

MADISON, Wis. – Wisconsin, the top-ranked team in women's college hockey, and No. 2-ranked Minnesota set up an early season showdown with a pair of sweeps over the first full weekend of Western Collegiate Hockey Association play, Oct. 17-18.

The Badgers blanked Bemidji State twice, defeating the Beavers, 4-0, behind goalie Jessie Vetter's 29th career shutout, on Friday Oct. 17 in Bemidji and then blanking BSU, 9-0, last Saturday in the first-ever U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame women's game at Eveleth, Minn. Kyla Sanders had three goals for the unbeaten Badgers (8-0-0, 4-0-0 WCHA).

The Golden Gophers used two goals and six points from freshman Monique Lamoureux and three goals and two assists from Jen Schoullis to beat Ohio State twice, 8-1 and 8-2, in Minneapolis and set up the Border Battle at the Kohl Center in Madison this Friday and Sunday, Oct. 24 and 26.

Minnesota (5-1-0, 4-0-0 WCHA) has a five-game winning streak with series sweeps over conference

rivals Ohio State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth. and leads the all-time series vs the Badgers, 25-16-5. In just the last three years, however, Wisconsin has a 12-2-2 mark against UM. The last time the two teams met was in the 2008 NCAA tournament and the Badgers pulled out the 3-2 win in overtime.

In other WCHA action last weekend, St. Cloud State took four points from Minnesota Duluth on Homecoming weekend in St. Cloud. The Huskies (3-2-1, 1-2-1 WCHA) took the its first shootout victory after the teams skated through 65 minutes and tied 1-1 last Friday and also scored a 3-2 win last Saturday, making it just the second time in school history that the Huskies have taken four points from the Bulldogs in a series. Sophomore goaltender Ashley Nixon made a career-high 43 saves, including two big stops in the shootout. Last Saturday, Nixon had another spectacular performance, stopping 39 Bulldog shots. UMD has lost three in a row and is 2-3-1 overall and 0-3-1 in the WCHA.

Minnesota State had to go into overtime to take four points at North Dakota last weekend. On Friday (Oct. 17), the visiting Mavericks tied the Fighting Sioux 2-2 in overtime, but won the shootout, 2-1. Then last Saturday, Minnesota State rallied from a 4-2 deficit with 4:13 left in regulation and took a 5-4 overtime victory. Kala Buganski had two goals, including the game-tying score with :11.7 seconds left to play, and an assist for the Mavs (4-1-1, 1-0-1-1 WCHA) and Emilia Andersson scored the game-winner just :59 seconds into overtime. North Dakota has a 3-2-1 overall record and 2-1-1-0 record in the WCHA.

The WCHA again has three teams ranked among the nation's top 10 in this week's two Division 1 women's polls. Wisconsin is No. 1 in both the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll and the USCHO.com poll, Minnesota is No. 2 in both rankings, and Minnesota Duluth is No. 8 in both. Also receiving votes in the polls this week from the WCHA were Minnesota State, St. Cloud State and North Dakota.

On Tuesday night (Oct. 21), St. Cloud State hosts the U.S. Select Team in an exhibition matchup at the National Hockey Center. Then over the weekend, in addition to the Border Battle between Wisconsin and visiting Minnesota in Madison on Friday and Sunday, other league series have Bemidji State at Ohio State and Minnesota State at Minnesota Duluth. Non-conference series have Union College at North Dakota and Brown at St. Cloud State.

Following the series with the Gophers, Wisconsin will then host the defending national champions Minnesota Duluth in Madison on Oct. 31 and Nov. 1. Other WCHA series over the Halloween weekend have Bemidji State (1-3-2, 0-2-0 WCHA) at Minnesota State (Oct. 31, Nov. 1), St. Cloud State and Minnesota playing a home and home series (@ UM on Oct. 31 and @ SCSU on Nov. 1), and Ohio State traveling to North Dakota (Nov. 1, Nov. 2).

## 2008-09 WCHA PRE-SEASON COACHES' POLL

The University of Minnesota Duluth, which swept the national championship, the regular season championship and the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF title in a memorable streak last season, is the pre-season choice to repeat as Western Collegiate Hockey Association champions in 2008-09, according to league coaches.

This is the tenth season of WCHA women's play and league teams have won the national championship every season, including the inaugural campaign of 1999-2000. The Bulldogs kept the WCHA's national title streak alive in 2007-08 when they won their fourth national title by defeating two-time defending champion Wisconsin, 4-0, on their home ice in Duluth in the NCAA title game. The victory capped a memorable season for UMD, which went 33-4-1 and also scored an overtime victory over Wisconsin to win the title of the newly-renamed WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the league playoff championships.

The Bulldogs received five first-place votes and a total of 47 points in the pre-season poll (the eight league coaches couldn't vote for their own team). They edged Minnesota, which grabbed two first-place votes, and Wisconsin, which had one first place vote, and had a total of 41 points. UMD, Wisconsin and Minnesota were ranked first through third in the national USA Today/US Hockey Magazine preseason college hockey poll as well.

Ohio State rounds out the top four followed by St. Cloud State, Minnesota State, North Dakota and Bemidji State.

For the second straight season, league-member coaches have picked Minnesota senior forward Gigi Marvin as the pre-season most valuable player. Four other players – Wisconsin forwards Meghan Duggan and Erika Lawler plus Minnesota Duluth goaltender Kim Martin, a Patty Kazmaier finalist last year, and teammate Haley Irwin, the forward who led the league in scoring with 60 points last season – also received votes for preseason MVP.

Minnesota Duluth's Pernilla Winberg, a forward from Sweden who was Martin's teammate on the silver medalist Swedish Olympic team in 2006, was voted the league's pre-season rookie of the year. She received half the votes from the eight coaches. Minnesota forward Jocelyne Lamoureux, Ohio State forward Natalie Spooner, and Wisconsin forward Carlyne Prevost also each received a vote.

## A GLANCE AT THE 2008-09 SEASON

**CONFERENCE MARKS 10TH SEASON OF PLAY, LOOKS TO DEFEND RECORD RUN OF NINE CONSECUTIVE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS; CONFERENCE PLAY GETS UNDERWAY OCT. 10-11; RIDDER ARENA TO HOST WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF FOR NEXT THREE SEASONS; WCHA APPROVES SHOOTOUTS TO BREAK TIES THIS SEASON**

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, celebrating the 10th season of women's hockey, has plenty of new developments and exciting events that will earmark the 2008-09 season.

"We are all looking forward to the season," said Martin. "We have enjoyed great fortune and success throughout the first nine seasons of WCHA women's hockey and we look forward to celebrating our tenth season of play by continuing to develop our sport and expose our student-athletes and coaches to an ever-growing legion of fans.

"Coming off our ninth consecutive national championship, and based on the continuing emergence of all of our member teams, we're confident the WCHA as a whole will be even more competitive from top to bottom this coming season."

The conference's post-season championship tournament will open the weekend of February 27-March 1 (Friday, Saturday and Sunday) with a first round, best-of-three series format at campus sites. The No. 1 seeded team will host the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed will host the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed will host the No. 6 seed, and the No. 4 seed will host the No. 5 seed.

The four first-round winners will then advance to the 2009 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., on Saturday and Sunday, March 7-8. On Saturday, there will be two semi-final match-ups at 1:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game set for Sunday at 1:07 pm CT.

The WCHA has introduced the shootout this season, after the option was installed recently by the rules committee. An NHL-style three-player shootout will be used to determine a winner for all WCHA games tied after regulation and five-minute overtime. For non-conference games involving WCHA home teams, the shootout procedure will be optional.

The NCAA rules and ice hockey committees have allowed conferences the ability to implement this tie-breaker protocol so that every regular-season league game will have a winner while preserving the integrity of the national rankings. Games decided by a shootout will still be considered ties for NCAA purposes so there will be no effect on NCAA records for the purposes of the Pairwise and determining the NCAA tournament field. Bonus points awarded will impact the conference standings only.

season play; two (2) points for a win in regulation or overtime, one (1) point for each school if the game is tied at the conclusion of the five-minute overtime period, and one (1) point is awarded to the team who wins the shootout. Overtime will continue to be played similar to regulation time with five skaters for each team (penalties excepted).

All Association home games will again face-off at either :07 or :37 after the hour in 2008-09.

The battle for the 2008-09 WCHA regular season championship will again consist of a 28-game schedule for each of the league's eight clubs, with each team playing the other seven four times – twice at home and twice on the road. The opening weekend of league competition – October 10-11 – will have defending national champion and WCHA champion Minnesota Duluth hosting Minnesota, the league runner-rup last year, St. Cloud State at North Dakota and Wisconsin at Ohio State. Minnesota State opens WCHA play at North Dakota on Oct. 17-18 and that same weekend Bemidji State opens league play at home against Wisconsin on Oct. 17. The series concludes on Oct. 18 when the Badgers and Beavers will play in the first ever U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame women's game in Eveleth, Minn.

The regular season will conclude the weekend of Feb. 20-22.

Following two weeks of WCHA playoffs, the NCAA Women's Division 1 championship tournament will commence the weekend of March 13-15 at regional sites (TBA), followed by the 2008 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held March 20-22 at Boston, Mass.

## WCHA WOMEN ADOPT SHOOTOUT FOR 2008-09

### REGULAR SEASON PLAY

#### LEAGUE TO USE NEW OPTION TO DETERMINE WINNER AFTER CONCLUSION OF STANDARD 5:00 OVERTIME PERIOD

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association has become the first NCAA Division 1 women's conference to officially re-introduce the shootout to college hockey, after the option was installed recently by the rules committee, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin announced today (August 28).

A National Hockey League-style three-player shootout will be used to determine a winner for all WCHA regular season games still tied after regulation and the standard five-minute (5:00) overtime.

The NCAA Rules and Ice Hockey Committees have allowed conferences the ability to implement this tie-breaking protocol so that every regular-season league game will have a winner while preserving the integrity of the national rankings. Regular season games decided by a shootout

will still be considered ties for NCAA purposes so there will be no effect on NCAA records for the purposes of the Pairwise and determining the national tournament field. Bonus points awarded will impact conference standings only.

"As a group, our head coaches were unanimous in adopting this exciting tie-breaking procedure to determine a winner for our regular season games," said Martin. "Over our first nine seasons as a Division 1 league, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association has continued to bring an impressive brand of women's hockey to the ice and collectively we think the adoption of the shootout will add an extra element of drama to our games for student-athletes, coaches, fans and media."

The WCHA has also approved the following point system for regular-season play; two (2) points for a win in regulation or overtime, one (1) point for each team if the game is still tied at the conclusion of the five-minute (5:00) overtime period, and one (1) additional point being awarded to the team who wins the shootout. Overtime will continue to be played similar to regulation time with five skaters and one goaltender for each team (penalties excepted).
