## 2003-04 SCSU WOMEN'S HOCKEY TEAM NEWS

Release Date: March 24, 2004



**THIS WEEK'S ACTION:** The St. Cloud State University women's hockey concluded their 2003-04 season with their weekend against #1 Minnesota. The Huskies finish with a 7-24-1 overall record, 4-19-1 in WCHA play. They finish with 9 points in league play, good for sixth place.

### HUSKY SENIORS FALL IN FINAL HOME SERIES TO #1 GOLDEN GOPHERS:

In the season finale for the Huskies, SCSU led Minnesota 2-1 after one period on goals by Kawamoto and Krista Simonson. In the second, UM's Krissy Wendell scored consecutive goals and Natalie Darwitz made it three straight to take a 4-2 lead midway thru the period. Roxy Stang scored on the power-play at 16:27 of the second to make it a 4-3 game after two periods. The third period saw five goals, including three straight to open the period by the Gophers. SCSU played to the bitter end, getting two more goals, this time by Jacqueline Jensen and Ashley Stewart. Minnesota outshot St. Cloud 44-34 in the game. Brinkman stopped 37 shots in her final game in net. In the series opener, St. Cloud State fell to #1 Minnesota 3-1. The Gophers got on the board early with a goal from Kelly Stephens on assists from Krissy Wendell and Natalie Darwitz at 11:29 of the first via the power play. In the second, the U of M took a 2-0 lead just 1:18 of the period with another power play goal, this time from Wendell on assists from Stephens and Darwitz. SCSU cut the lead in half on a goal by captain Kobi Kawamoto on assists from Ashley Stewart and Roxy Stang. The Gophers ended any hopes for the Huskies on Wendell's second goal of the game at 15:22 of the third on another power play goal from LaToya Clarke and Ashley Albrecht. Senior Ellen Brinkman made 37 saves in net for SCSU, while Minnesota goaltender stopped 18 of 19 shots to pick up the victory. Minnesota outshot St. Cloud 40-19 in the game.



**SCSU COACH JASON LESTEBERG:** Jason Lesteberg concluded his second season as the head coach of the St. Cloud State University women's ice hockey team in 2003-2004. In his first season at SCSU, he led the Huskies to an 11-23-0 record. Lesteberg was the head women's hockey coach at Bemidji State University during the 2001-2002 season, when he led Bemidji State to a 12-13-8 record, which included a school record eight game unbeaten streak. In addition, the Beavers earned a berth in the WCHA Final Five and Lesteberg was an NCAA Division I Coach of the Year Finalist. Prior to becoming the head coach at Bemidji State, Lesteberg served as women's hockey coach at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point from 2000 to 2001. He led the Pointers to a 13-13-1 record in their inaugural season of varsity women's ice hockey competition. He was named the NCHA Coach of the Year and was an NCAA Division III Coach of the Year Finalist. A 1996 graduate of Gustavus Adolphus College, Lesteberg, a Burnsville, Minn., native, was a first team All-American, College Hockey Player of the year Finalist, NCAA Division III Player of the Year Finalist, Conference Player of the Year, two-time first team All-Conference, and a two-time conference scoring champion for the hockey team. His career record stands at 43-71-10 in collegiate coaching.

**ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF:** Joining Lesteberg on the bench this season will be David Prokop, who coached his sixth season on the women's hockey staff. Jeff Giesen concluded his first season as an assistant coach. Giesen comes over from the St. John's men's program.

**TEAM CAPTAINS:** Senior Kobi Kawamoto concluded her second season as the team's captain. Senior defender Leanne Perrin and junior defender Tina Ciraulo served as the team's assistant captains for 2003-04.

**2002-03 RESULTS:** The Huskies finished their season with a 11-23-0 overall record, 5-19-0 in the WCHA, giving them a sixth place finish.

**KAWAMOTO ENDS CAREER WITH 99:**

Senior captain Kobi Kawamoto ended her illustrious career with 99 career points, just one short of becoming the school's second 100-point scorer. This season (10-16--26) was her second highest output of her career. Kawamoto ends her career with 35 goals and 64 assists. She is the school's all-time assists leader. The 99 points also puts her second on the school's all-time scoring list.

**STANG GOES OUT ON TOP:**

Senior forward Roxy Stang concluded her career on top of nearly every Husky record. In January of this season, she became the first player in Husky history to reach the 100-point plateau. Stang ends her career with 119 career points, tops on the school's all-time scoring list. She also has 71 career goals, which is also on the top of the Husky record books. In 2003-04, Stang bounced back to score 13 goals and 17 assists, good for second on the team in scoring.
