St. Cloud, Minn.: St. Cloud State University is pleased to announce the signing of Emily Edgerton to North Central Conference and National Letters of Intent to play softball in the fall of 2007.

“Emily is a versatile, well-rounded student-athlete who we feel is a great addition to our program,” said SCSU’s head softball coach Paula U’Ren. “She has the ability to catch or play in the outfield and has a great instinct for the game. We are excited to have her and her family join our Husky softball program.”

A native of Wausau, Wisc., Edgerton is a four-time softball letter winner at Wausau West High School. Coached by Janna Pingle, the 2006 All-Conference second team catcher led her Wausau Intensity 18U 2006 summer softball club with a .350 batting average and a .429 on-base percentage. A three-sport prep athlete, Edgerton is a two-time All-Conference volleyball player and has lettered three times in volleyball and twice in basketball.

“Emily has the work ethic to achieve success at the Division II level,” added U’Ren.

The daughter of Scott and Debra Edgerton and Valedictorian of her class, Emily plans to pursue a degree in biology with a physical therapy emphasis.
