Season Wrap-up:

SCSU finishes 2005 season with a 34-25 overall record and 7-5 in the North Central Conference.



THE HUSKIES CONTINUED BATTLE IN 2005: The St. Cloud State softball team (34-25, 7-5 NCC) wrapped up their 2005 season with a NCC Championship game loss to Nebraska-Omaha on May 7, 6-2. Although the Huskies suffered key injuries during the year and played through miserable weather at times, SCSU's head coach Paula U'Ren still managed to achieve over 30 wins on the season, marking the ninth season in a row that the Huskies have won 30 or more games. Of note, U'Ren has won over 30 games in each of her eight seasons during her tenure here at SCSU. This season marks the first time since 2001 that SCSU has not received an NCAA tournament bid, and only the second time since 1998 that SCSU has not been invited to the tournament. The North Central Conference runner-up in 2005, the Huskies won the conference title in 2003 and 2004. A top NCAA Division II softball power, SCSU owns a 331-122 record during Coach Paula U'Ren's tenure as head coach since 1998. Over that period of time, SCSU has won three conference titles, one regional title and the Huskies placed third in the nation at the NCAA Division II championships in 2004.



NORTH CENTRAL CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Vermillion, S.D. -- The St. Cloud State softball team (34-25) did not bring home the top prize, but the Huskies still had an outstanding weekend at the 2005 North Central Conference championships in Vermillion, S.D. on May 6-7. SCSU placed second at the tournament, after entering the tournament as the number four seed. SCSU lost its first game of the weekend to North Dakota, 2-1, but the Huskies fought back with four consecutive wins. On May 7, the Huskies started the day with a crucial 5-3 win over Minnesota Duluth. In the second game of the day for SCSU, the Huskies eliminated Minnesota State with a 2-1 win. The Huskies continued to roll in game three of the day, as they posted a 6-4 win over undefeated UNO. In the title game, SCSU dropped a 6-2 loss to UNO. "We had great pitching throughout the tournament and some very timely hitting," SCSU coach Paula U'Ren said. "I was very proud of the way this team battled back after our loss to UND. They showed a lot of character and determination."

THREE HUSKIES EARN ALL-NCC HONORS IN 2005: Three SCSU softball members were named to the 2005 All-North Central Conference team this season. Seniors Abby Velta and Megan Fuches were chosen to the team, along with first-year designated hitter Ashley Homan. Senior outfielder Abby Velta (Winnebago, Minn.) is a four-time nominee for the All-NCC award. This season she has posted a .376 batting average, along with two homeruns and 22 RBIs. Senior infielder Megan Fuches (Stillwater, Minn.) was selected by earning a .304 batting average, two homeruns and 19 RBIs on the season. SCSU's first-year infielder and designated hitter, Ashley Homan (Cottage Grove, Minn.) was the lone freshman to earn All-NCC honors in 2005. She also was named the Freshman of the Year in the NCC, by earning a .318 batting average on the season, hitting 7 homeruns and batting in 23 runs. Of note, the last Husky to earn NCC Freshman of the Year honors was Megan Fuches in 2002.

Velta

ABBY VELTA LEAVES HER MARK IN THE SCSU CAREER RECORD BOOK: On Tuesday, April 19, in Husky softball action, senior outfielder Abby Velta (Winnebago, Minn.) managed two of the SCSU's four hits against Concordia-St. Paul to tie the all-time hits in a career record at 273, which was held by Brooke Genztler (2001-2004).

Now, after finishing her stand-out career here at SCSU, Velta is the lone record-holder with 296 career hits. Velta gained first team National Fastpitch Coaches Association's 2005 Division II All-North Central Region team honors this spring. A three-time All-Region selection, Velta gained NFCA All-America Second Team accolades in 2004. She is a four-time All-North Central Conference selection and in 2005, Velta was selected as SCSU's Senior Female Athlete of the Year. A four-year starter in centerfield for the Huskies, Velta led SCSU this spring with a .384 batting average. She had 42 runs, 78 hits, nine doubles, eight triples, two homers and 23 RBIs. In the field, Velta was flawless with 62 putouts, five assists and no errors. Velta owns many team records including, most career at bats (817), most career runs (175), most career hits (296), best career fielding rate (.993) and most stolen bases (85). She also owns team season records with 83 hits in 2003, 72 singles in 2004, 49 runs in 2003 and 28 stolen bases in 2003. To complete the picture, Velta was named to the Academic All-NCC squad as an honorable mention selection in 2004 and 2005.

FOUR HUSKIES EARN NCC ALL-ACADEMIC HONORS:

The SCSU Softball Team earned four All-NCC Academic Team Honors this season. Junior infielder Abby Augdahl earned first team honors and the three seniors; Megan Fuches, Jessica Swartout and Abby Velta each earned Honorable Mention honors.

PRIENER NAMED TO ALL-REGION TEAM: St. Cloud State University junior catcher/first base Jessica Preiner (Stillwater/H.S.) was selected to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association's 2005 Division II All-North Central Region team. Preiner was named to the All-Region second team and is making her first appearance on the NFCA All-Region team in 2005. A starter at catcher and first base for the Huskies this season, Preiner batted a career-high .331 this season with 32 runs, 58 hits, 13 doubles, two triples, two homers and 30 RBIs. She posted 354 putouts, 31 assists, a .995 fielding rate and only two errors.

fielding percentage.

8 *Jillian Graham (sophomore) started in 27 games and played in 41 for SCSU in 2005...connected for seven hits and two RBIs...63 at bats...went 8-12 in stolen base category and had 25 putouts on the season with a .929 fielding percentage.

SCSU Head Coach Paula U'Ren
8 Seasons of Excellence at SCSU

Paula U'Ren finished her eighth season as head coach at St. Cloud State in 2005, and ranks among in top 9 for winning percent among active Division II coaches.



In her first year with the program, U'Ren brought home SCSU's first NCC championship during 1998. The Huskies also advanced to the championship round of the NCAA DII North Central Regional .

SCSU has since gained NCAA bids in 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003 and 2004. In 2003, SCSU added another NCC title and it was 2004 that put the Huskies on the map, as they won the NCC championship for the second year in a row and finished third at the NCAA National Tournament.

In her career, U'Ren owns an impressive 330-122 record as a collegiate coach and she is the school's coaching victory leader.

She is a 1995 graduate of Augustana College (S.D.), where she majored in Fitness/Exercise Physiology. U'Ren received her M.S. in exercise sports science from St. Cloud State University. As a graduate student at SCSU, U'Ren served as a graduate assistant coach under Sue Becker.

As a collegiate player at Augustana, U'Ren was named a three-time All-Region, All-NCC and NCAA Division II All-America selection in 1993, 1994 and 1995 and finished among the top 10 players in NCAA Division II softball in batting average, home runs and RBIs. In her tenure at Augie, the Vikings posted a 207-45 record - including a 57-7 record her junior season. In the all-time NCAA Division II records, U'Ren ranks fourth for career RBIs with 192, sixth with 32 career homers and 15th with 41 career doubles. She is a native of Mapleton, Minnesota.

9 *Abby Velta (senior) finished off a standout four-year career for the Huskies by leaving a permanent mark in the SCSU recordbooks...in 2005, she led the team with 78 hits, a .385 batting average, 203 at bats and 42 runs scored...was second on the team with nine doubles and led the team with eight triples and a .537 slugging percentage...led the team with 20 stolen bases (20-22) and was a perfect in the field with 62 putouts and a fielding percentage of 1.000...named SCSU's Senior Female Athlete of the Year...named to the All-NCC Team and to the All-NCC Academic Honorable Mention Team...two-time Division II All-North Central Region pick.



O. Graham

10 *Olivia Graham (first year) was a fine addition to the Huskies in 2005...played in 39 games as a catcher and started in 33 games...96 at bats with 22 hits and 10 runs scored...1-1 in stolen bases...151 putouts on the season along with 12 assists and a fielding percentage of .976.

11 *Jessica Swartout (senior) finished off a fine career by being named to the All-NCC Honorable Mention Academic Team...played in 53 games and started in 50 games in right field...batting average of .319, 141 at bats with 45 hits and 12 runs scored...third on the team with eight doubles...19 RBIs on the season...perfect 2-2 stolen bases...32 putouts with .943 fielding percentage.

16 *Meggan Staton (sophomore) made an immediate impact for the Huskies in 2005 in both the pitching and hitting categories...was third on the team in batting percentage with a .323 average...made 31 appearances for the Huskies and 28 starts...had 96 at bats with nine runs scored, 31 hits, six doubles and three home runs...third on the team with a .479 slugging percentage...had one stolen base on the season...second on the team with 166 putouts, 19 assists and a .969 fielding percentage...pitched 27.1 innings in nine games...had an era of 4.28...struckout 12 opponents and finished season with a 2-2 record.

17 *Lacey Trossbach (sophomore) was the lone experienced pitcher coming into the 2005 season for the Huskies...appeared in 39 games and made 25 starts...pitched 191.2 innings...had an ERA of 3.47...struckout 138 opponents...tallied two saves on the season and finished with a 16-14 overall record in 2005.



Johnson

24 *Mackenzie Johnson (first year) appeared in 20 games for the Huskies and made eight starts... finished with a .290 batting average and nine hits...four runs scored along with five RBIs...two doubles and one homerun on the season...fifth on team with .452 slugging percentage...15 putouts and 1.000 fielding percentage.



Homan

18 *Ashley Homan (first year) had a standout first year for the Huskies...named the NCC Freshman of the Year after leading SCSU in home runs with eight on the season...was fifth on the team with a .315 batting average...appeared in 51 games and made 41 starts for the Huskies...scored 19 runs, had 41 hits and 30 RBI's on the season...was second on the team with a .523 slugging percentage...tallied one stolen base on the season along with 13 putouts and four assists in the field.



Fuches

19 *Megan Fuches (senior) finished her four-year standout career for the Huskies with a bang...appeared in all 59 games and made 58 starts...spent most of the season batting over .300, but finished with a batting average of .293...in 184 at bats, tallied 26 runs, 54 hits, nine doubles, two homeruns and 21 RBIs...7-8 in the stolen base category...had 83 putouts at third base and finished with 125 assists and a fielding percentage of .920.



Preiner

21 *Jessica Preiner (junior) had a standout junior season as she was named to the NFCA All-North Central Region second team for the first time in her career...started the season catching behind the plate and made her way into the infield at first base...appeared and started in all 59 games for the Huskies...second on the team in batting with a .331 percentage...175 at bats on the season along with 32 runs scored, 58 hits and a team-leading 30 RBIs...led the team with 13 doubles...connected for two triples and two homeruns in 2005...was 10-12 in stolen base category...led the team with 354 putouts...had 31 assists and a .995 fielding percentage.



Gensch
