2011 SCSU SOFTBALL NEWS

Final Release Date: June 7, 2011

THE RECORD: The Huskies completed the 2011 season 25-26 overall and 10-16 in their third year of competition in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference, good for ninth place.

EYE EYE CAPTAIN: The captains for this year included senior Emily Edgerton (Wausau, Wis.), junior Jackie Dooley (St. Paul) and sophomore Mikayla Hogan (Chippewa Falls, Wis.).

SAIZ CHARTS ALL-REGION RECOGNITION: St. Cloud State University junior softball player Chris Saiz (Aylmar, Calif.) was named to the 2011 Louisville Slugger/National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Division II All-Central Region Second Team. Saiz is a pitcher/utility player for the Huskies and transferred to St. Cloud State from Iowa Lakes Community College.

EDGERTON GAINS DISTRICT AWARD: Emily Edgerton, St. Cloud State University's senior right fielder, landed on the 2011 Capital One Academic All-District Five College Division Softball Team as a third team selection. A native of Wausau, Wis., Edgerton boasts a 3.37 grade point average as a biomedical science major at St. Cloud State.

THE STREAKS: The longest win streak of the season for SCSU was six games, stretching from March 6-11, down in Kissimmee, Florida. The longest winless streak for the Huskies pushed eight games from Apr. 17-22.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE: The Huskies landed five student-athletes on the 2011 Spring NSIC All-Academic Team. Among the list for St. Cloud State was Emily Edgerton (Sr./Wausau, Wis.), Mikayla Hogan (So./Chippewa Falls, Wis.), Kelly Olson (So./Oak Grove), Alyssa Roberts (So./Kenosha, Wis.) and Carlyne Schlichte (So./Waterloo, Iowa).

BEST AT SCSU: Head Coach Paula U'Ren continues to have the best winning percentage in SCSU softball history, going 493-288 in the past 14 years of coaching for a .631 winning percentage.

OLSON MAKES HER MARK IN THE NSIC: St. Cloud State's Kelly Olson (Oak Grove) completed the season with 17 doubles, which ranked fourth in the NSIC and led the Husky squad. Olson also tied for fourth in the league after being hit seven times at the plate. Olson was just one HBP shy of the school's 20-year-old season record of 8, which was set by Shelly Jensen in 1991.

SIX IS BLISS: St. Cloud State's sophomore catcher Mikayla Hogan (Chippewa Falls, Wis.) threw out six runners from home plate in conference action, which tied for first in the NSIC with Concordia University, St. Paul's Missie Feuerbach.

STRONG FINISH: The Huskies recorded a 4-2 tally to complete the 2011 season, including an upset 7-6 victory over #16 Minnesota State on April 29 at Selke Field.

HUSKIES MOURN LOSS OF #9 KELLY LAAS: SCSU'S senior softball player Kelly Laas lost her battle with ovarian cancer on Wednesday morning, March 2, in her home in Frankfort, Illinois. Laas began her Husky softball career in 2008 and was an elementary education major at SCSU. "Kelly (Laas) truly touched many people's lives with her love for life and passion for

the game of softball," said St. Cloud State head softball coach Paula U'Ren. "We will miss Kelly, her enthusiasm for life and her #9 on the softball field." Laas posted a career .345 batting average and collected 123 hits in 116 games played in the Cardinal and Black.

COACHES VS. CANCER: The Husky softball program promoted a weekend of Coaches vs. Cancer on Friday-Sunday, Feb. 25-27, in the Husky Dome, all in part of the Husky Dome Classic. The Huskies hoped to spark the awareness of cancer and raised over \$600 towards the fight against ovarian cancer. For all softball fans who attended the games in the Husky Dome, there was an opportunity to "PLEDGE" in the fight against cancer or "DONATE" funds into a bucket at the ticket table. Also, the Husky softball program donated \$1 from every admission to go towards the ovarian cancer fund via American Cancer Society in the name of "Kelly Laas." In addition, there was a table set up near the entrance with educational materials about cancer.

SO CLOSE: The Huskies ended up just shy of making the NSIC Tournament, finishing ninth in the league with a 10-16 record, missing the conference tourney by just one game.

OLSON CLOSES OUT SEASON STRONG: Kelly Olson helped lead the Huskies to a 4-2 record to close out the 2011 season, batting .583, including 14 hits, four doubles, three runs batted in and eight runs scored in 24 at-bats. The sophomore shortstop amassed an impressive .750 slugging percentage and she was three-for-four in the stolen base category.

COLLEGIATE CAREER COMES TO A CLOSE: Emily Edgerton (Wausau, Wis.) completed her collegiate career on a high note, blasting her tenth career homer in the second frame to give St. Cloud State a 2-1 lead over Minnesota, Crookston on May 2. She also swung for her first career grand slam in her last at-bat at historic Selke Field. The Huskies went on to sweep the Golden Eagles by scores of 12-8 and 12-9 to complete the season. Edgerton posted 140 hits, 17 doubles, one triple and ten home runs in a Husky uniform. In 196 games played, she amassed a .307 batting average and leaves SCSU ranking fifth all-time with 47 stolen bases (47-52).

AT THE HELM IN 2011: The Huskies were coached by 14th-year head coach Paula U'Ren and assisted Meghan Ward and volunteer assistant coach Jen Williams in 2011.

U'Ren

COACH U'REN'S CORNER: Paula U'Ren has an impressive 493-288 (.631) overall career mark after 14 seasons as head coach of the St. Cloud State University softball team. In U'Ren's tenure the Huskies have qualified for the NCAA Regional Tournament six times and have won the North Central Conference playoff championship three times (including the 2003 and 2004 NCC titles).

U'Ren continues to have the best winning percentage in SCSU softball history at .631 in 14 years.

On Sunday, Feb. 24, 2008, Coach U'Ren reached a milestone, garnering her 400th career coaching win against the University of Minnesota, Crookston, by a score of 9-1.

She is a 1995 graduate of Augustana College (S.D.), where she majored in Fitness/Exercise Physiology. U'Ren received her M.S. in exercise sports science from St. Cloud State University. As a graduate student at SCSU, U'Ren served as a graduate assistant softball coach under Dr. Sue Becker. As a collegiate player at Augustana, U'Ren was named a three-time All-Region, All-NCC and NCAA Division II All-American selection in 1993, 1994 and 1995 and finished among the top 10 players in NCAA Division II softball in batting average, home runs and RBIs. In the all-time NCAA Division II records, U'Ren ranks fourth for career RBIs with 192, sixth with 32 career homers and 15th with 41 career doubles.

“She (Laas) battled until the end,” added U’Ren. “Her courage and strength were an inspiration and taught us all how precious each moment of life is. Kelly’s beaming personality lit up a room and we are blessed to have her family (Mike, Denise, and Lindsey) as a part of our Husky program.”

St. Cloud State University President, Dr. Earl H. Potter III, attended the memorial and delivered a heart-felt speech to the Laas family. The President reflected on Kelly’s optimism and resilience, her loyalty and passion for her team, her studies, her friends and family.
