2012 SCSU SOFTBALL NEWS

Release Date: February 8, 2012

SEASON BEGINS: The 2012 softball season is upon us, and with a few weeks of practice in already the Huskies are ready to begin play this weekend as they travel to Las Vegas, Nev. to take part in the Desert Stinger Classic, Feb. 10-12.

DESERT STINGER CLASSIC: SCSU will play five games out in Las Vegas, including two on Friday, two on Saturday and one more on Sunday. They open up with New Mexico Highlands, followed by matchups with Metro State, Colorado School of Mines, Fort Lewis College, and Chadron State.

THE RECORD: The Huskies completed the 2011 season 25-26 overall and 10-16 in their third year of competition in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference, good for ninth place.

SO CLOSE: The Huskies ended up just shy of making the NSIC Tournament, finishing ninth in the league with a 10-16 record, missing the conference tourney by just one game.

STRONG FINISH: The Huskies recorded a 4-2 tally to complete the 2011 season, including an upset 7-6 victory over #16 Minnesota State on April 29 at Selke Field.

U'REN CLOSING IN ON 500: St. Cloud State head coach Paula U'Ren is back for her 15th season at the helm of the softball program. U'Ren has a career record of 493-288 for SCSU, good for a .631 winning percentage, the best in SCSU history. She is now just seven wins shy of 500 for her career.

EYE EYE CAPTAIN: The captain for this season will be senior outfielder Jackie Dooley (St. Paul, Minn.). Dooley batted .341, scored 27 runs, and stole 17 bases last season for the Huskies.

ALL-REGION PLAYER SAIZ RETURNS: St. Cloud State University senior Chris Saiz (Aylmar, Calif.) is back for another season with the Huskies. As a junior Saiz was named to the 2011 Louisville Slugger/National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Division II All-Central Region Second Team. Saiz is a pitcher/utility player for the Huskies and transferred to St. Cloud State from Iowa Lakes Community College. Saiz, in her first season with the Huskies in 2011, made 24 mound appearances and 14 starts. She was 8-8 with a 3.79 earned run average. She pitched 98 innings and struck out 40 batters. She was a .305 hitter and played in 48 games.

OLSON LOOKS TO BUILD OFF SUCCESS: St. Cloud State junior Kelly Olson (Oak Grove, Minn.) completed the 2011 season with 17 doubles, which ranked fourth in the NSIC and led the Husky squad. Olson also tied for fourth in the league after being hit seven times at the plate. Olson was just one HBP shy of the school's 20-year-old season record of 8, which was set by Shelly Jensen in 1991. Olson helped lead the Huskies to a 4-2 record to close out the 2011 season, batting .583, including 14 hits, four doubles, three runs batted in and eight runs scored in 24 at-bats. The sophomore shortstop amassed an impressive .750 slugging percentage and she was three-for-four in the stolen base category.

HOGAN WILL BACKSTOP HUSKIES ONCE AGAIN: St. Cloud State junior catcher Mikayla Hogan (Chippewa Falls, Wis.) was behind the plate in all 51 games in 2011. She hit .321 for the Huskies, led the team in rbi with 44 and was second in homeruns with seven. In addition, she had a .962 fielding percentage and threw out six runners from home plate in conference action, which tied for first in the NSIC with Concordia-St. Paul's Missie Feuerbach. Hogan excelled off the field as well as she earned NSIC All-Academic honors.

NEW FACES IN 2012: The Huskies welcome seven new faces to the squad in 2012, including juniors Nicole Steinle and Jordan Grell, and freshman Arianna Roberts, Kendra Merritt, Kelly Franks, Samantha Kayak, and Megan Lehnen.

HARPS AND SEIBRING JOIN STAFF: William Harps joined the staff in the Fall of 2011 as a graduate assistant coach. Familiar with the world of athletics, Harps has worked as an athletic trainer, assistant softball coach and as a strength coach since 2005. A 2009 graduate of the University of Mary with a bachelor's of science in athletic training, Harps also earned two associate degrees from Pasadena City College in 2006. Micki Seibring joins the Husky Softball staff in 2011-12 as a volunteer student assistant coach. The St. Cloud native was a three-time NFCA Academic All-American and three-time All-NSIC Academic choice for the Southwest Minnesota State University Mustangs from 2008-11. Following a strong senior season 2011, Seibring garnered the prestigious NSIC Miles Brand Award.

HUSKIES MOURN LOSS OF #9 KELLY LAAS: SCSU's senior softball player Kelly Laas lost her battle with ovarian cancer on Wednesday morning, March 2, 2011, in her home in Frankfort, Illinois. Laas began her Husky softball career in 2008 and was an elementary education major at SCSU. "Kelly (Laas) truly touched many people's lives with her love for life and passion for the game of softball," said St. Cloud State head softball coach Paula U'Ren. "We will miss Kelly, her enthusiasm for life and her #9 on the softball field." Laas posted a career .345 batting average and collected 123 hits in 116 games played in the Cardinal and Black.

COACHES VS. CANCER: After a successful Coaches vs. Cancer weekend last season during the Husky Dome Classic, Feb. 25-27, 2011, the Husky softball program will be promoting the event once again in 2012. Coaches vs. Cancer weekend will take place during the Kelly Laas Memorial Husky Dome Invite, Feb. 24-26 in St. Cloud. Last season the Huskies hoped to spark the awareness of cancer and raised over \$600 towards the fight against ovarian cancer. For all softball fans who attended the games in the Husky Dome, there was an opportunity to "PLEDGE" in the fight against cancer or "DONATE" funds into a bucket at the ticket table. Also, the Husky softball program donated \$1 from every admission to go towards the ovarian cancer fund via American Cancer Society in the name of "Kelly Laas." In addition, there was a table set up near the entrance with educational materials about cancer.

COACH U'REN'S CORNER: Paula U'Ren has an impressive 493-288 (.631) overall career mark after 14 seasons as head coach of the St. Cloud State University softball team. In U'Ren's tenure the Huskies have qualified for the NCAA Regional Tournament six times and have won the North Central Conference playoff championship three times (including the 2003 and 2004 NCC titles).

U'Ren continues to have the best winning percentage in SCSU softball history at .631 in 14 years.

On Sunday, Feb. 24, 2008, Coach U'Ren reached a milestone, garnering her 400th career coaching win against the University of Minnesota, Crookston, by a score of 9-1.

She is a 1995 graduate of Augustana College (S.D.), where she majored in Fitness/Exercise Physiology. U'Ren received her M.S. in exercise sports science from St. Cloud State University. As a graduate student at SCSU, U'Ren served as a graduate assistant softball coach under Dr. Sue Becker. As a collegiate player at Augustana, U'Ren was named a three-time All-Region, All-NCC and NCAA Division II All-American selection in 1993, 1994 and 1995 and finished among the top 10 players in NCAA Division II softball in batting average, home runs and RBIs. In the all-time NCAA Division II records, U'Ren ranks fourth for career RBIs with 192, sixth with 32 career homers and 15th with 41 career doubles.
