**Release Date: March 2, 2005**

#### This Week's Games:

*SCSU (6-5) will play games from March 6-12 at the Rebel Games Tournament in Orlando, Fla.*



**UPCOMING GAMES:** The St. Cloud State softball team (6-5), which received a #4 ranking in this season's 2005 NFCA Division II preseason poll, will travel to the Orlando, Fla. area on on March 6-12, for a series of games down south. On March 6, the Huskies will play Kutztown and Ashland and on March 7, SCSU will battle Central Missouri State and CW Post-Long Island. On March 8, SCSU will play Ferris State and Southern Illinois-Edwardsville. On March 10, SCSU will play American International and Lock Haven, and on March 11, SCSU will play Findlay and East Stroudsburg. On March 12, SCSU will complete its trip with games against Wayne State and Southern Indiana.

**NO PLACE LIKE DOME:** In the two-day SCSU Husky Dome Classic on Feb. 26-27, the Huskies charted a 2-3 overall record. SCSU completed the second day of the Husky Dome Classic on Sunday, Feb. 27, with a pair of losses. In the first game of the day, SCSU dropped a hard-fought battle against Winona State by the tally of 4-2. In the second game of the day, SCSU posted a 7-1 loss to Minnesota Duluth. In the UMD contest, Stef Schroeder was the pitcher of record for SCSU with six strikeouts and eight hits allowed. A five-run second inning provided the Bulldogs with the winning edge. The Huskies had three hits in the game and Ashley Homan scored the team's lone run in the fifth inning. Against Winona State, the Huskies battled back from a 2-0 deficit with a two-run third inning, but WSU posted the winning two runs in the fifth inning. Lacey Trossbach pitched four innings in the game, and provided four strikeouts. Meggan Staton had two hits in the game for SCSU, while Abby Velta had one hit and one run.

In the first day of play, SCSU posted a 2-1 record on Saturday, Feb. 26. In the first game of the day, SCSU posted a solid 5-1 win over Pittsburg State. Trossbach was the pitcher of record for SCSU with two strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work. She allowed just two hits in the contest. The Huskies posted one run in the first and gained the game winner in the second inning. To ice the contest, SCSU charted three runs in the top of the seventh. In the game, Staton had two hits and one RBI, while Jenny Gensch added three hits and one RBI. Jessica Preiner carded a two-run double in the game and Jess Swartout had two hits. In game two, the Huskies charted a 5-3 win over Montana State-Billings. SCSU had three runs in the third and two runs in the fourth on route to the win. Staton was the winning pitcher in the game, as she went 5.0 innings and struck out three. Abby Augdahl had three hits, three RBIs and one run to lead the Huskies. In the final game of the day for SCSU, the Huskies dropped a tough 4-0 decision to #19 ranked Emporia State. Trossbach was the pitcher of record for SCSU with six strikeouts to her credit and just five hits allowed. Emporia had two runs in the fourth and two in the fifth to gain the win. SCSU had four hits in the game and they were posted by Velta, Augdahl, Megan Fuches and Mackenzie Johnson.

## MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

**HELPING OUT IN 2005:** SCSU coach Paula U'Ren will be assisted this year on her coaching staff by Katie Moore, former SCSU softball standout Lindsay Mutcherson, Becky Henning, former SCSU All-Conference pitcher Nicole Webb and Krista Unger. SCSU's softball athletic trainer is Craig Anderson, while the directors of equipment procurement and distribution are Josh Williams and Chris Garner.

**NEW FACES, NEW POWER:** A pair of first year players have made a quick impact on the SCSU roster in 2005. Sophomore Meggan Staton, who was a redshirt at SCSU last year and is a transfer from South Dakota State University, leads the club in batting at .444. In 11 games, Staton has 16 hits in 36 at bats, which includes three doubles, one home run and 11 RBIs. In SCSU's loss to Lewis University, Staton had four hits to lead the Huskies. Freshman shortstop Jenny Gensch, also a member of the SCSU women's hockey program, ranks second on the team with a .395 batting average. A resident of Apple Valley and grad of Eastview H.S., Gensch has 15 hits in 38 at bats, with two doubles, one home run and three RBIs.

**TOP THREE FINISH IN 2004:** The Huskies advanced to the Final Eight for the first time and came away with third place in the Division II tournament. The finish is the highest placing of any women's team in SCSU's DII history. The Huskies beat Northern Kentucky 1-0, then beat Western New Mexico 2-0. The Huskies came within one strike of beating Angelo State before falling 4-2 and the Huskies' season ended with a 2-0 loss to Florida Southern, earning SCSU third-place honors.

**THE HONOR ROLL:** Abby Velta earned NFCA All-America second team honors, headlining a long list of honors that players received this season. Nicole Webb (MVP), Megan Fuches, Angie Berg, Cally Stewart and Jessica Swartout all earned North Central Regional All-Tournament Team honors while Velta (first team), Brooke Gentzler, Webb and Berg (all second team) were named to the North Central Region team. Earning North Central Conference team honors were Berg, Gentzler, Webb and Velta while Berg, Gentzler and Webb earned NCC All-Academic Team honors. And Gentzler won St. Cloud State's Female Athlete of the Year.

**U'REN WINS 300th AT SCSU:** SCSU coach Paula U'Ren added another career milestone to her resume during the Husky Dome Invitational on Feb. 19. Thanks to a 3-2 win over Washburn, U'Ren posted her 300th career victory at SCSU. In just eight seasons, U'Ren has marked a 302-102 career record with the Huskies. She has won the most games in the history of SCSU softball, and she entered the 2005 season as the ninth ranked coach for winning percentage among active NCAA Division II coaches. U'Ren's teams have posted three NCC titles and six NCAA bids since she took over at SCSU in 1998.

**VELTA RE-WRITES RECORD BOOK AGAIN:** Senior outfielder Abby Velta continued her one-person assault on the SCSU recordbook. Since the start of the season, Velta has set a new team record for career runs scored with 146 through March 1. The old recordholder was Brooke Gentzler, who had 143 runs from 2001-04. She broke the record during SCSU's 5-3 win over MSU-Billings on Feb. 26, with two runs. Velta also owns team records for career singles with 213, career stolen bases with 72, season at bats with 214 in 2003, season singles with 61 in 2004, hits with 83 in 2003, and stolen bases with 28 in 2003.

### SCSU Head Coach Paula U'Ren 8 Seasons of Excellence at SCSU

Paula U'Ren begins her eighth season as head coach at St. Cloud State in 2005, and ranks among in top 9 for winning percent among active Division II coaches.



In her first year with the program, U'Ren brought home SCSU's first NCC championship during 1998. The Huskies also advanced to the championship round of the NCAA DII North Central Regional .

SCSU has since gained NCAA bids in 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003 and 2004. In 2003, SCSU added another NCC title and it was 2004 that put the Huskies on the map, as they won the NCC championship for the second year in a row and finished third at the NCAA National Tournament.

In her career, U'Ren owns an impressive 302-102 record as a collegiate coach and she is the school's coaching victory leader.

She is a 1995 graduate of Augustana College (S.D.), where she majored in Fitness/Exercise Physiology. U'Ren received her M.S. in exercise sports science from St. Cloud State University. As a graduate student at SCSU, U'Ren served as a graduate assistant coach under Sue Becker.

As a collegiate player at Augustana, U'Ren was named a three-time All-Region, All-NCC and NCAA Division II All-America selection in 1993, 1994 and 1995 and finished among the top 10 players in NCAA Division II softball in batting average, home runs and RBIs. In her tenure at Augie, the Vikings posted a 207-45 record - including a 57-7 record her junior season. In the all-time NCAA Division II records, U'Ren ranks fourth for career RBIs with 192, sixth with 32 career homers and 15th with 41 career doubles. She is a native of Mapleton, Minnesota.
