2004 Season Review

2004 RESULTS: It was a year of records as St. Cloud State posted a 42-15 record — claimed the North Central Conference championship for the second year and a row, and went on to place first in the North Central Regional NCAA Tournament. It was the sixth time the Huskies have qualified for the National tournament under the leadership of head coach Paula U'Ren. After winning the North Central Regional NCAA Tournament, the Huskies went to the NCAA National Tournament to take 3rd place. Along the way the Huskies had winning streaks of nine and seven games, and one winning streak of six straight.

2004 REGIONAL RESULTS: The Huskies entered the North Central Regional after claiming the NCC championship for the second year in a row. The Huskies went 4-0, as they defeated South Dakota State 6-0, North Dakota State 2-0, Nebraska-Omaha 1-0, and Augustana 2-0 in the championship game.

2004 NCAA NATIONAL TOURNEY RESULTS: The Huskies advanced to the Final Eight for the first time and came away with a third place finish in the Division II tournament. The finish is the highest placing of any women's team in SCSU Division II history. The Huskies beat Northern Kentucky, 1-0, then beat Western New Mexico 2-0. The Huskies came within one strike of beating Angelo State before falling 4-2, and the Huskies ended their season with a 2-0 loss to eventual national champion Florida Southern, earning SCSU third-place honors.

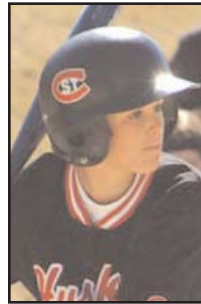

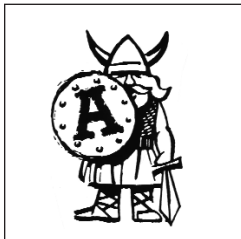

The North Central Conference has prided itself on the success of its student-athletes on and off the field of play.

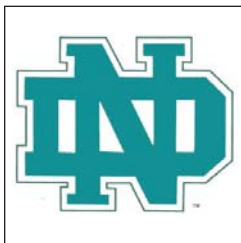
In the 50 years since the NCC joined the NCAA, member schools have brought home over 37 NCAA Division II national championships and over 100 individual national titles. NCC student-athletes have also earned numerous GTE Academic All-America honors and NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarships.



The NCC, comprised of 9 institutions in North Dakota, Minnesota, South Dakota, Nebraska and Colorado, has five national team championships in the past five years. The tradition of success is especially strong in women's basketball, where NCC schools have claimed the seven of the last nine national titles.



The conference was formed at a meeting in the fall of 1921 and the first conference championship was the track and field championships held in the spring of 1922 in Brookings, S.D. Several institutions have been members of the North Central Conference over the last 79 years, but the conference membership has been among the most stable in college athletics with no change occurring since 1981.



The North Central Conference awards championships in 20 sports. The 10 men's sports are baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track, outdoor track, swimming and diving, tennis and wrestling. The 10 women's sports are basketball, cross country, golf, indoor track, outdoor track, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball.



Each spring the NCC awards an all-sport champion trophy for men and women. The conference also honors one male and one female student-athlete each year with the Stan Marshall Award, which strives to honor the league's top senior student-athlete.
