Ross Eiden Honored By NCC:

Sioux Falls, S.D. – The North Central Conference office announced their weekly swimmers and divers of the week today, Jan. 29, and St. Cloud State junior Ross Eiden (Rosemount) was named NCC male diver of the week.

The honor is the third of the season for Eiden, after first being awarded on Nov. 6 & 20 this season.

The Huskies hosted Carleton College in a meet on Jan. 25, and beat the Knights 168-75 when it was all over. Eiden played a major roll in the win as he took the top spot in both one and three-meter diving. His winning mark on the one-meter board was 268.45 while his score on the three-meter was best at 277.30.

The Huskies were home again the following afternoon, to host NCC rival South Dakota, and SCSU completed the weekend sweep with a 142-82 win. Eiden earned a second place finish in one-meter diving (252.25) as part of a Husky trio that held the top three spots in the event. Finally in three meter diving he earned his third win of the weekend, and posted a qualifying mark in the process. Eiden's score was 299.35, and in addition to being a qualifying mark, was the best score in the event for an SCSU diver this season.

Eiden will be diving in the National Championship meet in both events this March, and has bettered the NCAA qualifying standards nine total times this season.

In the most recent NCAA Division II dual meet power rankings, St. Cloud State was ranked fourth nationally and the win over South Dakota was a victory against the #25 ranked team in the country. The Huskies will now set their sights on the NCC Championship Meet where the men will look to bring home the NCC crown after finishing second the past two season's. The meet is scheduled for Feb. 21-24 in Omaha, Neb.
